



# Road Safety and Traffic Calming in Faton Bray

Mid 2002	Gateways were erected at two entrances to the village	
May 2003	30mph roundels at the gateways repainted due to traffic wear	
June 2003	Kerbs Dropped for safety of push chairs and electric chairs	
July 2003	PC Pollard advises more people caught speeding during the past year	
Sept 2003	Councillor attends Chilterns Road Transport project for prevention of

Nov 2003	Road humps considered. Advised cost by Traffic Management at County Hall to the PC could be up to anywhere between £2000 to £25000 depending on what was found at the site of the humps plus consideration must be given to the emergency vehicles responding to a call. No one wants the humps installed outside their property!	
Jan 2004	Beds police advised no regular speeding activity will be provided by them until at least April.	
Jan 2004	Investigation of Chicanes along School lane, information gathered suggested road not wide enough.	
Feb 2004	Police reported 4 people dealt with for speeding.	
March 2004	Meeting with Rep. of Raynesway to discuss state of road sensors monitoring speed of vehicles.

PC Smith's team requested to attend village for further speed checks. Barry Fields at Beds CC invited to attend village and advise councillors on further traffic calming measures.

Cameras are in place in the village but speed checks are not normally carried out now by traffic police unless specific complaints are made, currently we are waiting for complaints made by the Parish Council to be dealt with. There are only three police officers in the county who carry out these operations. Village folk can help by making traffic/speeding complaints direct to the police.







"The sky's the limit" – at least, it is if the story of Jesus being raised from the dead is true. That is something we all have to decide for ourselves. The evidence is there – the stories in the Gospels, the history of Christianity, the personal experience of men and women all over the world that Jesus is alive and active – but we have to make up our own minds about it.

Once we say "yes" to the Easter story, everything is different. Life is not just this mortal, physical existence for a few short years, but leads on to something greater, something we can hardly even begin to imagine. Death does not lead to an empty void but to life with God. And in that context everything we do here and now has to be set against the backcloth of God's eternity. Deeds – and even thoughts – have consequences, and we have to accept responsibility for what we do.

That could be an utterly depressing thought. We know our own frailty and fallibility. But, Jesus raised from the dead is Jesus vindicated, and what He showed us of God is the definitive truth about God's nature. So we have to put the love and compassion of God alongside His holiness, and we know, through the cross that God is prepared to go to infinite lengths to forgive our failings and restore us to friendship with Him. The living Jesus shows us God as Father and Friend as well as Lord and Judge, and opens up for us the possibility of a personal relationship with Him.

More than that, Jesus shows us that evil and death are conquered powers, and that brings a glorious ray of hope into the darkness and tragedy of human life. Because of Easter, the world is a different place. How we need to be assured of this! To look for sunshine beyond the clouds is not just wishful thinking: because of the resurrection of Jesus it is a definite promise. And the challenge to Christians is to live out that hope now, in order to help make it a reality here and now. Beyond all the troubles of life is the triumph of God, which Jesus's resurrection foreshadows and inaugurates.

That's why we can say, "the sky's the limit". In the old-fashioned world-view, the sky (heaven) is the limit and the goal of human life. In terms of human aspirations there is nothing good and loving that we cannot dream of, and the God who raised Jesus from death can make our dreams come true. What a wonderful message of hope this is for our troubled world. I hope and pray that you will glimpse something of this transforming miracle this Easter, and recognize for yourself the power and activity of the living Jesus in your own life and in the world around us.

"Christ is risen – He is risen indeed. Alleluia". That Easter greeting of the Eastern Orthodox Churches is my Easter greeting to all readers of *Focus*, and I invite you to come and share the joy in the worship of our Church congregations this Easter.

#### St. Mary's Parochial Church Council

At the February meeting of the Parochial Church Council it was reported that the inaugural event to raise funds for the church roof, a coffee morning, was a great success raising a considerable sum.

Details of the upcoming lent courses were outlined and it was suggested that all members of the PCC may like to attend at least some of the sessions. There will also be a Passover meal in Church on the Wednesday of Holy Week.

A Chairman has been found to start the ball rolling on the 'Friends of Edlesborough Church' project. Their first task is to get together a group of like minded people to take the plan forward.

All PCC members were reminded that they have to submit their nominations if they wish to continue as a member of the PCC.

Plans are in hand to replace the existing pulpit in church which is in a rather poor state. Designs for a new pulpit are to be drawn up and submitted for approval.

The Church architect has provided the specifications for the roof repairs and these have been passed to the builder to submit a quotation for the work.

There was a discussion about raising the awareness of legacies and the contribution they make to the Church finances.

The PCC met on 9th March. The path from the Church to the toilet in the Village Hall is now safe to use. The arrangement is for the toilet near the Green Room, accessed from the side door, to be available to the Church when services, such as weddings and funerals are being held. A grant to replace the cooker in the Village Hall has been obtained and as soon as it is installed a Sunday Luncheon Club will be instigated.

Work on Edlesborough Church will be completed in time for the Easter Day evening service to be held there.

Various events have been planned to raise funds for the Parish Project, Kagando, starting with a Beetle Drive at Edlesborough Memorial Hall on 21st April. The Open Gardens scheme will be held on Sunday, 11 June when local gardens will be open to the public and refreshments and stalls will be available in Eaton Bray Village Hall. Other planned events include a Hog Roast in the Vicarage garden on 9th July (to be held early enough in the day to accommodate the football) and a Barn Dance on 30th September. It is hoped to have an African evening, details of which will be announced later.

Other fund raising plans were discussed, this time for repairs to the Church roof, with maybe a "talents" scheme, whereby parishioners are given a "talent" i.e. money, to use (legally!) to make more money. (Matthew 25 v14-30 was the inspiration)

A Vision for Action Study Pack has been received from the Diocese, which is a 6 week study course to be run later in the year.

A revised Electoral Roll for St Mary's is currently being prepared and it was agreed that the enrolment forms for parishioners should be more easily available, perhaps by including them in the Welcome Pack for new residents.

### **Introduction to Wills & Intestacy**

**INTESTACY** – The Rules of Intestacy will apply to the distribution of your Estate's assets if you die without leaving a valid Will. The Court of Protection appoints any guardians. The Court of Probate decides who will administer your estate.

The Rules of Intestacy are inequitable in their application. For example, the surviving widow(er) with no children is entitled to a larger lump sum than if they had had children, whilst 50% of the assets over £200,000 will be inherited by a hierarchy of beneficiaries starting with the Deceased's parents, if alive, and finishing with the Crown.

Common law partners (and step children) have no status under the Rules of Intestacy so have no rights to inherit anything. There is no guarantee that a bereaved common law parent will retain custody of any children, e.g. the parents of the Deceased may seek to demonstrate a stronger claim on any children to the Court of Protection. If there are no children, then the whole estate is left to a hierarchy of beneficiaries starting with the Deceased's parents, if alive, and finishing with the Crown.

Intestacy can result in extreme family hardship, whilst family disputes and long term bitterness are common. The Rules of Intestacy never match the Deceased's own or the family's wishes. The person(s) administrating probate is often placed in an invidious position becoming the butt of everybody's ill will. They can seem to do no right, yet are required by law to administer the estate correctly. The worst of human traits can surface. Of course, it is not always so.

The Rules of Intestacy only deal with the monetary value of a Deceased's estate, whereas a Will typically records who is to get what, any nominated guardians and who is to administer the estate. It can also include bequests of specific items (e.g. family heirlooms) or monies to individuals, charities etc; funeral arrangements; donation of organs; in fact, anything you fancy. Your Will may not please everybody, but it is likely to avoid the trauma too often associated with intestacy.

Your Will should also be structured to minimise any inheritance tax and long term care costs. Dying without a Will (intestate) gives such monies to the Exchequer – that is not where I want my hard earned money to go!

Except for the simplest of Wills, you need professional guidance, typically a solicitor and ideally one providing an in - home service, such as my practice.

**KEY POINT:** Intestacy is not good for anybody. Instead, a Will is a must have.

Death can strike at any time. You need a valid Will to be in place today.

## Dunstable Church of England Schools (Ashton Middle School & Manshead Upper School)

Parents are reminded that if they intend to apply in the autumn for children to be admitted to either of these Schools in September 2007 on the basis that they are practising members of the Church of England, the Governors require to be assured that they have attended public worship on at least one Sunday each month during the six months preceding the application. The clergy of the North Chilterns Group have agreed that they will sign applications only when they have written evidence that the Governors' attendance criteria have been satisfied. Anyone who will be making such an application should ask for an attendance card at the church, and ensure that they have it signed by the Vicar or a Churchwarden each time they attend. Without such evidence of regular attendance the Vicar will not be able to sign the application.

## St. Mary The Virgin Edlesborough

The Easter Sunday Service at St. Mary The Virgin on April 16<sup>th</sup> will mark the reopening of the church after another major conservation contract. Highly skilled craftsmen have carried out major repairs to the chancel roof which had to be completely taken off and put back again. Although it is hard to see from the ground the roof is now covered by slates rather than concrete tiles. The buttresses have lost their concrete casing which has been replaced by beautiful, local stone again. Rain and high winds permitting the scaffolding will be taken down shortly.

Inevitably after such a major building project the ground is muddy so stout footwear is recommended.

The Churches Conservation Trust which is responsible for St. Mary The Virgin is working closely with the Parish Council to improve the access to the church and particularly to the churchyard.



## **Edlesborough Cricket Club**

After successive seasons of just missing out on promotion followed by just missing out on relegation, Edlesborough's Saturday league side never threatened to go anywhere in 2005. The club finished their campaign in Division 2 of the Morrant



Four Counties Cricket League with a record of 6 wins, 6 losses and the rest of their games either drawn or abandoned due to bad weather. Absence from some games by key players, accompanied by loss of form by others, again revealed the lack of depth in the side, which was only partially offset by a couple of promising youngsters coming through from the Colts. The Sunday friendly side also had an evenly balanced record of wins and losses, which included particularly close, high-scoring games against Studham and Dunstable Town III, the former just won and the latter just lost.

Over the whole season, the league batting averages of Matthew Merrick (46.8) and Graham Hacking (43.2) stood out from the crowd, with Graham's score of exactly 100 not out to win the home game against Eggington Foresters being one of the club's only two centuries. The top score of 105 was made by Marcus Bates in the home game against Newport Pagnall, who nevertheless topped Edlesborough's total of 241 for 4 in a close fought game. In the friendlies, half a dozen people scored half centuries during the season, with a top score of 74 by Neil Morgan in the home win over Gaddesden Row.

In the club bowling statistics for league games, Mark Brown, Jaco Jacobs and Matthew Merrick all averaged just over 20 runs per wicket, with Mark's record of 21.1 just topping the list and including two 5 wicket hauls in the home wins against Eggington Foresters and Stewkley. Including friendly games as well, Mark emerged as quite easily the club's best bowler over the whole season, with an average of 16.8. However, the best performances in individual games were Jaco Jacobs's 5 for 21 in the home league win over Willen and Barry Jenkins's 5 for 16 in the last game of the season, a losing friendly against Dunstable Town III. Despite being officially retired, Barry emerged from hibernation in mid July when the club was short of players for a friendly and subsequently turned out regularly, if not usually with quite the same brand of wizardry as in days of yore.

The Colts team has more fixtures than in previous years, playing twice against each of Tring, Milton Bryan, Northchurch, Dunstable and Ivinghoe & Pitstone. As for the adult sides, they had a season of balanced fortunes, but beat all their opponents except Northchurch at least once. Andrew Kight (43 ret.), Declan Hall (42 not out) and Chris Mortimer (41 not out) made the season's highest scores in the wins over Tring, Milton Bryan and Ivinghoe & Pitstone respectively, with Chris Kimpton, Adam Lee. Owain Prys-Jones and Jadeep Shah all playing innings in excess of 20 at different times. Notable bowling performances included Andrew Kight's 5 for 19 and Chris Kimpton's 3 for 2 in the win over Tring and Charlie Dear's 3 for 14 against Milton Bryan. Many of the players were relatively young and should still be available for the 2006 side, when the Colts will be playing in a local league.





## The following issues were discussed at the February General Purposes Committee and Parish Council Meetings.

#### **Community Policing**

The sum of £7,000.00 is to be expended on the employment of a Police Community Service Officer (PCSO)

#### **Traffic Calming**

A quotation is awaited for the purchase of yellow backed signs and roundels.

Buckinghamshire County Council are re-assessing the Dagnall 'Build Out'

#### Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall Villages

A further meeting has been held to discuss the Edlesborough Memorial Hall floor replacement and quotations requested. It is possible that funding may be available towards this project.

With the assistance of John Bercow MP and pressurising by the Parish Council a new pavement in Taskers Row is being constructed and work to the remaining pavement will be carried out in the new financial year.

The 'Hand Car Wash' sign has been removed from Pine Trees Garage and an Enforcement Notice will be served on the operators.

Numerous road repairs have been reported most of which will be carried out shortly, other repairs will be monitored and work carried out when considered appropriate by the County Council.

The Parish Council will be holding a Quiz for the adults and a drawing competition for the children on it's stalls at both Dagnall Village Fete on 20th May and Edlesborough Carnival on 1st July. More details to follow.



### Becca's letter from Uganda

Hopefully you are getting used to my letters by now. I am working as a physiotherapist on a missionary placement in Kagando Hospital, in SW Uganda, the Hospital being the Parish Project for 2006 for St Mary's Church in Eaton Bray. I am sure many of you will remember my family, the Baldock's, who originated in Dunstable; in particular Eric Baldock, my grandfather, who used to run Herrington's chemist at the top of George Street in Dunstable.

I have indicated that if you want to find out more about Kagando you can do so at <a href="https://www.kagando.org">www.kagando.org</a> but since not everyone has access to the internet, and for some it may be too much trouble, I thought I would tell you something about, Uganda, the hospital and its work.

Uganda lies on the elevated basin that rises between the eastern and western branches of the Great Rift Valley. Most of the country is over 1,000m in altitude, and the topography is generally quite flat. Most of Uganda is well watered and fertile. Almost 25% of the country's surface is covered by water and yet only 38% of the population have access to clean water.

The country has a population of almost 20 million and an annual increase of 2.5% per annum. This rate is low by African standards, partly due to the high incidence of AIDS, a disease that originated close to Kagando, over the border in the Congo. Life



expectancy in Uganda is around 40 years. Christianity is widespread and, here at Kagando, I am supported by a lively Church community.

Kagando was originally a Leprosy Settlement located over the hills in Congo but in 1963 it was moved into Uganda and became a more generalised hospital, supported by the Ugandan government who invited an Africa Inland Mission (AIM) missionary doctor to start a hospital in the area. The strong Christian foundation to the work of Kagando has remained throughout – the emphasis in the hospital being placed on Christ-like caring for patients and all those suffering.

TEAR fund became involved in the work from early 1979. With their help a new hospital was built supported by a hydroelectric scheme, based on a small river flowing out of the mountain near Kagando. In response to a severe cholera epidemic, which killed thousands of AIM volunteers, capped springs on the mountainside bring clean water to the hospital and local communities. As a result there have been dramatic reductions in water borne disease and with new pipelines and outlets more communities now have access to clean water.

Over the intervening years the work of the hospital has gradually expanded and, today, a busy District General Hospital is at the heart of Kagando providing a full range of services for patients.

Kagando has established a seed bank to help local farmers and a tree nursery, which encourages tree planting in order to reduce the effects of erosion. In addition, with Fairtrade, the development has established a honey collection unit to produce local honey. A grinding mill has been set up, which encourages and supports local farmers and there are workshops where local people can learn and develop skills in woodwork, mechanical, panel beating etc.

A nursery school, originally established for the staff's children grew into a full Primary School, which now provides a high standard of education for more than 800 children in the surrounding area.

Despite the wonderful work carried out in Kagondo over the past 40 years, the needs and challenges facing the project today remain great.

More doctors are needed to work medium or long-term contracts. Doctors are a mobile workforce
and Uganda faces competition to retain its trained doctors, not least from the UK, which is
continually striving to recruit more overseas doctors to meet the demands of the NHS.

- Financial shortfall the costs of running the project escalate constantly, and although every effort is made to contain costs, and maximise income, there is a constant need for subsidy.
- Threats to water and electricity supplies. The hydroelectric power turbines and generators are now old and require upgrading and frequent repair. The water and electricity supply run alongside a road that is to be upgraded. Kagando are being asked to meet the costs of moving the pipe and cable, even though the community benefit from the supplies without cost.
- Growing work load the needs are overwhelming
- Changing technology With increased sophistication of treatments available, and increasing
  demands by the Ugandan Ministry of Health to follow accepted good practice in all areas of the
  hospital and project mean that costs escalate.

I know the hospital and the trustees are very grateful for the support from the St Mary's Parish Project and I hope that people who read my letters will be inspired to turn out and help, or at least take part in the events that are planned. In particular, I understand that a number of villagers are opening their gardens on 11 June. That sounds great and I wish you every success. I can assure you that all the money you raise is both desperately needed and will be used to good purposes to provide hospital services that we in the UK take for granted when we go into hospital.
