



PHYSIO first

Warming up for the Fete - Tips from St Judes Clinic

Firstly, we are going to be there for the 10th year – oh my goodness!! So if you do get any ailments of a physical nature on the day, we will be there to consult with, for the cost of a small charity donation only!

As usual, we will also have our **BIG** raffle prize, and will be selling tickets in the Clinic and on the day. Monies raised will again be going to the Fete Charities.

<u>However</u>, getting to the point of the article, we want to give all you Feters out there some free advice **now**, so you can protect yourself from injury on the day.

<u>Loading/unloading cars</u> – If you've got a boot full of stuff for the day, take care to distribute the load in lots of small boxes/bags. Try to even up the loads, but if you have heavier items, make sure that they are put in last, so that you don't have to reach into the boot to pull them out. Repetitive and heavy loading place the spine at risk. Minimise this by keeping the loads light and getting plenty of help.

On lifting from the car - bending from the hip rather than the back, keeping your tummy in and not twisting round with a load but walking round with your feet are best ideas.

Lifting from the floor – bend your knees, keep your tummy in and lift close to you. If possible do lift in 2 stages, with something to place the load on ½ way. Again don't twist from the waist, walk round.

<u>Footwear</u> – we may well all be dressed as film stars on the day, but do consider those poor feet; sensible footwear should be the order of the day, preferably with some arch support – difficult if you are Jessica Rabbit! However, this will also protect your back. Let's hope it's not welly weather because these are not very good for helping one retain a good posture.

<u>Standing</u> – It's a long day and many of us will be up on our pins for many more hours than we are used to, and this can lead to aches and pains, backs being especially vulnerable.

This is because, as we stand still, our postural muscles are working hard to retain our correct alignment. If most of your day is spent sitting, this is going to be quite an athletic event and the postural muscles will tire rapidly, leading to a sagging posture, creating tension spots in the low back and neck. Most commonly, backache, legache, neckache and headaches can easily ensue.

To help, *think tall*, pull in those lower tummies, wear decent footwear (see above), have breaks from standing, sit down (in a good position), a change is as good as a rest. Also get lots of help on your stand, so that you can have a stroll round and enjoy the day too.

I hope these tips are useful and help to keep all Feters in excellent nick, so that we can all raise lots of money on the day for all the very good causes out there.

See you there – our Podiatrist and new Paediatric Physio will also be with us.







One of the great privileges of being a parish church is that of being available to the whole community -for baptisms, weddings and funerals, as the focus of local commemorations and celebrations, and simply to be open day by day for those who want space to be quiet, to think or to pray. Your parish church stands firmly in that tradition - it is the church for everyone in the community.

What people often forget is that the parish church continues to be there only because of the generosity of those who support it. Have you ever wondered what it costs to keep the church open with a full-time resident Vicar? Last year the cost was £75,000, all of which was raised from the gifts of regular and occasional worshippers. There are no government grants, and no money from central church funds to keep our church going, and only a very small proportion of these costs come from fees charged for weddings and funerals, and from ancient land rents. The church is here today because of the generosity of its regular congregation and well-wishers in the local community. Archbishop William Temple once said that "the Church is the only organization which exists principally for the benefit of non-members", and the financial support of the parish church is an excellent demonstration of this. Many people who are glad to use the church forget what they owe to those who have ensured its preservation down the years.

You will have noticed the scaffolding around the church roof - this is the outward sign of serious decay in the roof timbers and the need to replace all the lead, which will require us to find more than £70,000 more in the coming months. Over the past five years over £185,000 has been spent on church repairs and improvements, all of which has been raised locally. Each year the Fabric Fund benefits from half the profits from St Mary's Village Carnival, but this year we need to raise much more than that. There will be events throughout the summer to raise money for the church – and we hope that the whole community will support the regular congregation in this work to ensure the future of our church for the whole community.

Our thanks are due to all those whose regular generosity keeps the church running week by week, and to the wider fellowship of supporters who give to preserve the fabric of St Mary's. We appreciate all the support we receive.

Edlesborough Parish Council - Chairman's Report to the Annual parish Meeting held on 20th April 2006

My report covers the period May 2005 - April 2006

First and foremost 1 would like to introduce your Parish Council and explain how they contribute to the running of your Parish. Northall Ward. Cllr Kevin Cubbage, Kevin is the Vice Chairman of the PC and the whiz kid behind our website www.edleborough.gov.uk.now in its very successful 3rd year, Kevin assists our Clerk if needs be with the accounts and is on the GPC. Cllr Phil Conacher. Phil is responsible for planning in Northall and represents the Council in community events. Edlesborough Ward. Curs John Wilkinson, David Brown, Marilyn Pryce-Jones, Julie Ratheram and Steve Munday. John is responsible for planning in Edlesborough he also represents the council on several committees, including the GPC and deals with Luton Airport Issues. David is Chair of the GPC and Marilyn is his deputy they also help with community events along with Julie and Steve. Dagnall Ward. We sadly said goodbye to Cllr Geoff Spencer after many years service. His replacement is Cllr Karen Coppen, Karen is responsible for planning in Dagnall and is taking a leading role in the Parish Plan, I also represent Dagnall on the GPC. I would also like to mention our County Councilor April Davies and District Councilor Pauline Hannelly both these ladies work tirelessly on our behalf, and finally our Clerk Mrs Lin Sargeant who deals with all phone calls, correspondence, burials and the everyday running of the Council. I would like to take this opportunity to thank them all for their help, support and contribution to the smooth running of our Parish.

Committees

The General Purposes Committee chaired by Cllr David Brown continues to do sterling work, responsible for making decisions on the Churchyard/Cemetery, Memorial Hall, allotments, lighting and open spaces, thus reducing the time spent in full council when these decisions are ratified. Some of their decisions will be commented on later in my report.

Aylesbury Vale Local Committee. These meetings are run by Bucks C.C. and cover all issues that are dealt with by them and give Parish Councils an opportunity to have their say on local issues Cllr John Wilkinson attends these meetings on our behalf. John has already raised many issues of concern and tabled questions for discussion in Open Forum.

Parish Plan. This is a project we tried a few years ago but unfortunately had to shelve due to lack of funding. I am pleased to report that we have revisited this important project with Karen, assisted by Kevin, at the helm. Funding has been secured and all associations and groups in the parish have been invited to participate, we have had a very good response. A meeting will shortly be arranged to plan our next step forward.

Churchvard/Cemetery

The Remembrance Day Service was very successful. For the first time pedestrians were directed up onto the bank at the rear of the war memorial, this certainly was much safer for everyone involved, worries that people on the bank would not be able to hear the service were proved unfounded, this arrangement will certainly be used again. The work has now been completed on the Chancel roof just in time for the Easter Day evening service held there. Discussions are still taking place with the Church Conservation Trust. CCT will prepare Technical Architectural reports with a possibility of altering the approach to the Church via the zig zag path at the rear of the Church and most importantly the Cemetery access. Cremated ashes can now be buried within existing graves if the families so wish. Burial and internment fees have been increased in line with other cemetery's in the area, a list of the fees can be found on our website.

Allotments

Allotments throughout the Parish continue to be well used; there are still plots available in all three villages. Permission has been obtained for a footpath for the use of children and accompanying adults to walk through Dagnall allotments instead of along the A4146 to the school during term time, the work will be carried out and financed by Safer Routes to School. Water pipes have been

laid to Edlesborough Green Allotments by the tenants for whom we congratulate. Dagnall Gardeners Society continues to flourish, supplying everything any gardener needs, if it's not in stock they will be able to get it for you, a service used by our parishioners and many more.

Edlesborough Memorial Hall

The hall continues to be well used by a large range of local organizations. Plans for the new floor are progressing well under the watchful eye of the General Purpose Committee the cost is in the region of £20K so it needs to be right for all the users and the hall itself. All bookings for the hall can be arranged by contacting the hall bookings secretary and caretaker Mrs Sue Parker. We continued to support Dagnall and Northall halls with a donation of £1,000 each, to help with the everyday running and maintenance costs.

Edlesborough Green

The green is still the central feature of the village and continues to be used by every section of the community. The tennis club continues to flourish as does the cricket and football. I would like to take this opportunity to thank these organizations for all there good work especially with the youth of the parish. We continue to maintain all the facilities on the green to a high standard so it can be enjoyed not only by people interested in sport, but also for the dog walker, young families using the playground, or if you just wish to sit and watch the world go by, I'm sure a bench will be available. St Mary's carnival continues to use the green for their very successful annual event which raises large sums of money for local good causes and we are pleased to be able to offer this venue to the carnival committee. It was intended to erect two basketball nets, one in Dagnall, the other in Edlesborough, if you the parishioners wanted it, Dagnall's is currently being erected but unfortunately the response has been very poor in Edlesborough, so come on lads and lasses let us know by word of mouth, letter, or get your parents to write, in support, if you do not wish to lose this proposed facility.

Pavilion

The pavilion continues to be well used by the local clubs. New lockers have recently been installed and all new keys have been issued to registered users-and the key register has been set up, so if you require a key please make sure you know who the key holder is for your organization as keys will no longer be available from Mr. & Mrs Parker. The shower heads will be upgraded in the very near future continuing the on going maintenance plan.

Road Repairs

We continue to report any holes or problem areas in our parish, as do our conscientious parishioners. Highways on call have been very successful and a response is usually very swift, although Taskers Row proved to be a different matter, but I am pleased to report that thanks to Mrs Loma Cubbage's persistence supported by the Parish Council and our MP that this has now been attended to.

Traffic Calming

Yellow backing for all the 30 & 40mph signs, along with roundels painted on the road have been ordered for all accesses into our Parish. A request for costing and suitability for gates is also under consideration for the entrance to Edlesborough on the A4146 southbound from Northall. The hard standing for the school bus pick up and drop off point outside Knolls View Northall is now completed. We continue to investigate all forms of traffic calming for the High Street in Edlesborough but this is proving quite a difficult task due to all the regulations involved. We have requested the Speed Limit Revue Committee, to extend the speed limit through Northall, northerly, to Slapton turn. We have also requested that the 40mph limit in Northall be reduced to 30mph., but this decision has unfortunately been delayed by County until 2008. The criteria for Vehicle Activated Signs are being investigated for various sites within our parish and we continue to support our schools via the Safer Routes to Schools scheme.

Footpaths/PPP Scheme

Mr. & Mrs Webster are no longer our PPP representatives but we thank them for the many years they gave to walking and reporting any problems on our footpaths. The new PPP representatives

are Mr.& Mrs Thomas and a big thank you to them for taking on this important roll of keeping our footpaths open. Reported repairs necessary etc. continue to be carried out By Buck CC and The Chiltern Society. If we carry out any works we are reimbursed through the PPP scheme.

Rubbish Dumping

When reported, Aylesbury Vale D.C. continues to react quickly, removing large items of rubbish dumped in our hedgerows and gateways. The freighter service which allows you to remove difficult to dispose of rubbish twice a year, continues to be well used, larger items can be collected from your households by AVDC for a small charge. Unfortunately rubbish is still been emptied in our car parks and left around the green by uncaring people, we no longer have the three ladies who kindly gave their time to keeping our open spaces litter free, they unfortunately resigned at Christmas after many years of dedicated litter picks, although we notice someone is still clearing certain areas. Your efforts didn't go unnoticed ladies so thanks again to Gill Sue and Julie.

Dog Bins

We continue to support the dog bin emptying scheme at a cost of £4,000.00 per annum but we feel this is money well spent. To be able to enjoy our open spaces without having to check where we're walking is certainly a bonus, thankfully the majority of our dog owners are responsible and caring people who make good use of this very necessary facility.

Dagnall Recreation Ground Access Path (Gaddesden Walk)

Discussions are still taking place with safer routes to schools, BABTIE and the PC with regard to the best way forward for this project. Safety is the prime factor and it's proving quite difficult to find a suitable SAFE crossing, The path will not be opened until this is in place.

106 Agreement Dagnall.

All the legal papers have been signed for the monies to be spent on a multi purpose recreational track which will be installed on Dagnall's recreation ground. The monies become due to the council when building commences.

Police Matters

Our Community Police Officer PC Rob Barker joined us during the year and what a difference he has made to our Parish, he along with his colleagues has brought a visible Police presence to our villages especially in Edlesborough. Parking tickets have been issued and speed checks have taken place in the High Street, late night checks have also taken place. Speed checks have also taken place outside Dagnall School. PC Barker suggested to the Parish Council the possibility of a PCSO in our village might help put a stop to our increasing and very expensive low level crime problem. Although our crime wasn't problematic enough to warrant a funded PCSO we did qualify for a part funded officer, we duly took up this suggestion in conjunction with Pitstone and Ivinghoe and I can confirm recruitment has taken place and we will have our own officer in the summer.

Community Events

We continued to have stalls at the Dagnall Fete, St Mary's Carnival and we were present at the

Christmas Fayre where we received various comments on what you think we should or should not be doing as a PC on your behalf, all these suggestions are taken onboard. In the coming year we will again be in attendance at the village functions with lots of new ideas so we look forward to seeing you there. This concludes my report. Anne Thompson



Public Open Forum:

3 residents of the parish were present.

Mr Willis a resident of Medley Close asked about the possibility of a stair lift at the Coffee Tavern, he was advised that this is being looked into with regard to fire safety, and costs involved, and that a decision would be made soon.

Neville Johnson the Community Police liaison officer then addressed the meeting:

The Chairman thanked Neville for his continued excellent support.

Mrs Griffiths asked the PC why it seemed that only negative comments were published in Focus Magazine.

The Councillors felt that usually residents only attended the meetings with complaints so these had to be reported, and they would be happy for any interested residents to attend and provide a summary for Focus.

They then replied that these comments would be further discussed.

Traffic Calming:

The cost of speed indicators is being further investigated by Cllrs Beal & Marriage who have spent a great deal of time on this.

Policing Levels:

The level of Policing in the Village is excellent with all problems reported investigated speedily. Residents are advised that they should report all problems however small and ask for an incident number to ensure that these levels do not fall.

Rye Sports Pitch Verti- Draining:

Cllr Marriage will liaise with the Sports and Social Club and ascertain when this will need to be undertaken.

The Rve/ Totternhoe Road Junction:

An application for funding to improve this area was made to Rotary Environmental Awards, unfortunately this was unsuccessful but alternative ways to fund this will be considered.

Property in Church Lane:

The building materials from this property stored on the Meads Allotments have now been removed.

Invoice for dog bin emptying:

No invoice has been received to date.

Projects completed and ongoing:

- 1 The Rye car park barrier is now in place.
- 2 Litter bins Wallace Drive and The High Street in place.
- 3 Public meets the PC has been encouraging these will continue 3 times a year.
- 4 Traffic Calming is ongoing the PC look at this monthly and are continuing to look at

measures to improve this.

5 21 Allotments are now occupied out of 26; the installation of a new water tank has helped.

ACCOUNTS:

Cllr Tribbick has put a lot of work into finalising these and the Councillors had been issued with copies for review.

Cllr Tribbick will complete the annual return form with the help of Cllrs Beal & Marriage.



Wills & Children

TRUSTS: You will recall from last month's FOCUS article 'Are You Missing A Trick' that excellent protection of children's interests is provided when a Discretionary Will Trust is a component of a couple's Wills, typically enabling a share of the house to held in trust for children after the first death. Not only can over £100,000 inheritance tax be avoided, but it ensures that the surviving partner does not dissipate an estate to the detriment of any existing children e.g. the possible outcome of the survivor entering a new relationship or of liberal spending. Other Trusts include a Property Trust and a Disabled Beneficiary Trust, the latter being for the long term disabled child (or adult).

The mentioned trusts are each accepted by the Inland Revenue. A specialist solicitor, such as is available with my practice, should always be consulted.

LEGACIES: Children are the most common beneficiaries in Wills. Gifts may be monetary amounts, fixed or as a percentage of an estate or they can be individual or a collection of specified items. The children may be the parent's own children, step children or grandchildren. They can be children of others or be indirect beneficiaries through a gift to a children's charity.

Many couples will want gifts to children or grandchildren to be effective when the last of them dies. Others will choose also to gift to children on the death of the first partner. The pros and cons need to be considered carefully. Choosing the age that a child (minor) is to receive monies also needs to be considered: 18, 21, 25. It can be a percentage at different ages. The executor(s) of the estate will supervise the funds until payout day.

Step children: Step children do not benefit at all under intestacy, so being specifically mentioned in a Will is essential for them to receive any legacy.

GUARDIANS: Guardianship is the responsibility for making arrangements that best suits the welfare of children (under 18 year olds), including financial, health, education and spiritual. The Will can allow the guardians to draw on monies for the children's benefit ahead of majority. Potential guardians should be consulted prior to their inclusion in a Will.

Without a Will children without parents (orphans) are a matter for the courts. Distasteful disputes can occur over the custody of children.

COMMON LAW RELATIONSHIPS: Children left after the mother has died are, for example, not automatically the responsibility of the surviving partner. It is not uncommon for the mother's parents to claim custody. Having Wills in place stating the wishes of each parent will normally ensure the continued parenting by the surviving partner, if that is what is desired.

KEY POINT – Do not expose your children's welfare to the whims of the courts. Have your wishes recorded in your Will. A Trust, operative on the first death, is an excellent way to provide for and protect the interests of children, <u>and</u> avoid tax.





Becca's letter from Uganda

Hopefully you are getting used to my letters by now. My name is Rebecca Baldock and I am working as a physiotherapist on a missionary placement in Kagando Hospital, in SW Uganda, the Hospital being the Parish Project for 2006 for St Mary's Church in Eaton Bray. I know that you have an Open Gardens event on 11 June to raise money for Kagando, but more of that below.

I saw a strange sight the other day. A lady was walking through the centre of Kasese wearing just a string thong over her bottom and everyone was staring at her in disbelief. She looked really out of place - this was probably what people used to wear before Western culture interfered yet now it seems completely inappropriate. The photo is of traditional Ugandan dress (it's of one of the ladies I do play therapy with). The costume was introduced by the Victorians - they were shocked at the indecency of the locals' dress. Nowadays, it is the Ugandans who feel that Western visitors dress inappropriately – its strange how things have turned round.



I always used to wonder what I'd be doing if I was born in another culture, what my life would be like etc. Sometimes I find it hard to deal with my house help. She's the same age as me and we've become good friends, but I keep thinking that the only reason she is working for me is because of where we were born. She wanted to be a nurse, but didn't have the money to train. Instead, she trained as a nature guide, but there are no jobs unless you know someone who works there. She now wants to set up a shop, at least she will be able to achieve this by the time I've gone, if not before.

The other thing that I really find difficult is the issue of AIDS. So, so many people are affected by it here in many ways. It's strange to think of how many of my friends could be affected had we been brought up here. AIDS is such a hard thing – it could be completely wiped out here if people abstained, then remained faithful (condoms help, but they're only about 70% effective), but instead more and more people are being infected and dying. Part of this is cultural; although things are changing, women and children are often thought of as property. Until recently in this region, the more wives a man had the more respect he had; as a result there's still a lot of polygamy in the villages. This leads to a hundred and one problems, too many children to provide for, wives not equally loved and AIDS.

Another friend has a sister who is weak with AIDS. She is the same age as me and not married, yet at some point she will become the mother of four children. She will have to bring up and support these children, whilst obviously holding down a job to provide for them. The really heart wrenching things is that so many of these women have AIDS due to their husbands unfaithfulness.

People here fear AIDS victims of the disease are often isolated in their community - even by their family at times. Despite all the education about how to stop AIDS spreading there is still a fear of catching AIDS just by being in the presence of someone with the disease yet, because people won't listen to how to stop AIDS, it continues to spread rapidly.



On a lighter note I understand you have an Open Gardens event taking place on 11th June to raise money for the hospital here. The money you donate will be used to help equip intensive care beds to enable us to monitor very sick patients closely and therefore give them better treatment. We have some beautiful flowers here but not always grown in the most sophisticated pots.

Thank you for all your prayers in recent months. I will be praying for the success of your event – it will be so important for us here.

Today, the Post Office is very convenient for people who cannot get into town but, unfortunately, many offices have closed recently. Often it is not recognised quite how many services are carried out by the Post Office. Leaflets setting these out are available, and give such information as: banking on behalf of the big banks, paying bills, insurance, personal loans, saving stamps, holiday currency, gift vouchers and flowers by post.

Before she came to Edlesborough four years ago, Kathy & Nev (her husband) had worked in different fields of employment. Kathy had originally trained as a nurse, and she and Nev ran a care home for a time. Next they took on a glass decorating company, when their daughter, Claire worked with them for a while. Following this, they opened a shop in Ipswich, but decided they would like to take over a post office and shop with Claire and her husband Alan. When Edlesborough Stores came on the market they felt this was just the business they wanted. They moved in four years ago, together with William, Claire and Alan's son, and have run the shop ever since.

In thanking Kathy, Brenda said that Edlesborough Stores was a great asset to the village, to which everyone agreed. Kathy, her family and their staff run a very efficient shop, and are extremely popular with the villagers.

Equality Liability Abroad Too

On 22 March, the Court of Appeal ruled that credit card companies are equally liable for goods and services purchased overseas. This overrules the High Court judgment in 2004 which said that companies were not liable.

The decision makes credit card companies responsible for reimbursing customers who have bought faulty goods overseas or when the seller has encouraged the buyer by making false claims.

Additionally, the High Court held that the credit card company will be equally liable where four party transactions are involved. This is where a different bank or financial institution recruits the seller and there is no direct relationship between the seller and the buyer's credit card company.
