The World Cup is over for another four years, and even casual watchers are likely to remember the red cards shown to Wayne Rooney and Zinédine Zidane for acts of violence on the pitch. It now appears that each action was a response to vicious personal insults, intended to rile them as key players in their teams. No-one can condone outbursts of violence on the football pitch - or anywhere else for that matter - but we must also condemn the decline of sportsmanship which tolerates the trading of insults on the field in an attempt to undermine the opposing team. So much for sporting ideals!

Sports personalities become national idols, and however much we may regret it, these stars become role-models for many of our young people. This is why their behaviour is more than just a matter of good sportsmanship. For one of them to lash out in the heat of the moment seems to give permission for folk in the street and in pubs and clubs to respond similarly when verbally provoked.

Modern society has a problem with respect and with self-control. The general rise of anti-social behaviour, binge-drinking, street crime, road-rage and dishonesty are the result of not nurturing habits of restraint and respect from our earliest days. We have to learn how to control our violent instincts, and to give proper consideration to the rights and needs of others. It is alarming to hear how many young people in towns and cities carry knives "for self-protection", and recent news stories how tragic the outcome can be. It is no use muttering, "the government should do something about it", because it actually needs a change of attitude among the general populace for any government policy to be effective. It is up to all of us to do something positive.

But it goes deeper than that. It is not true to say "sticks and stones may break your bones, but names can never hurt you", because we all know that carefully targeted insults can be deeply wounding. But to lash out is not an appropriate response: that is the lesson we all need to learn, and the earlier in life the better. It has been truly said that civilization is the difference between what goes on in people's heads and what they actually do. We all have violent thoughts and fantasies, and we are all tempted to a violent response, but these have to be restrained in a civilized society. And those who live in the public eye and grow rich on publicity have a responsibility to set the example for others to follow. If we pay footballers such grossly inflated salaries, then, surely, we have a right to expect something in return from them. But everything depends on our learning how to control our reactions to minor provocations first – only after that can we hope to develop the self-control we need to behave properly in the face of real aggression, physical or verbal.

Self-control is a much under-valued quality these days. Perhaps the World Cup 2006 has reminded us of its true importance; if so, that is something for which we should all be grateful. But we also need to take the lesson to heart.

The Duke of Devonshire invited Paxman to manage and develop the gardens at Chatsworth House in Derbyshire, which included designing a model village for the estate workers.

It is said that a green house was the inspiration for the Crystal Palace building with the original drawing doodled on a piece of blotting paper! All that remains in Hyde Park of Crystal Palace are the entrance gates. A fire destroyed the building in 1936.





### Your Business & Your Will

Last month I highlighted the importance of your Will needing to be both available for immediate reference on your death and that it must be acceptable (valid) to the Probate Registry. A Will is of little worth if either of these conditions is not met.

Here is an important question for many readers.

'What would happen to my business if I were to die tomorrow?'

#### **Business Operated as a Sole Trader:**

As sole trader you have skills and experience not easily replaced. Is there someone you have groomed to succeed you - is there an option to purchase? Can the business be sold as a going concern or must it be wound up, and the monies realised added to your estate? Your Will should record your wishes.

#### A Firm Operated in Partnership:

A Partnership Agreement needs to be in place that includes what is to happen when a partner dies etc. The surviving partner(s) may wish to continue trading but will have to raise monies to pay into your estate. You have no rights to bequeath your position as a partner but you can bequeath the financial interest you have in the partnership.

A combination of a Will and Partnership Agreement will ensure that your beneficiaries and surviving partners enjoy an orderly and planned settlement of your business affairs. The Agreement has priority over the Will, so executors and trustees cannot take an active part in the firm, except as required to secure the financial interest of the deceased.

#### A Major Shareholder in a Limited Liability Company:

Many former sole traders and partnerships have changed to a limited company or partnership status in recent years. This totally changes the situation when death occurs. E.g. the Articles of Association determine what rights the shareholder has in the disposal of shares. They can include an option to bequeath shares to certain family members usually restricted to a spouse and children. The Articles take precedent over any conflicting clause in a Will and the Executors and Trustees cannot interfere in any way with the operation of the Company.

KEY POINT: The legal status of your business, or interest in a business, determines the options

available to you to influence what happens to your business interest on your death. This is a complex topic demanding professional guidance from an accountant, and, on your Will, from a practice such as mine, which provides guidance in the privacy of your home during a day or evening that best suits you.

### **Edlesborough W.I.**

Photos of the seat we recently donated to Edlesborough Churchyard were shown at our last meeting. The seat is provided, on behalf of W.I. Members both past and present, in order that visitors to the graveyard are able to sit quietly and rest.

'Memoirs of a Grocer' was the title of a talk given by our speaker, Mr. P. Nicholls, whose account of his family business was both interesting and amusing. He was born in 1922, when his father was the manager of a high class grocery shop in Wandsworth. Mr. Nicholls senior had always wanted to be his own boss, and in 1933 took over a shop in Studham. During the next few years Mr. Nicholls' family, including his brother and sister, ran a number of grocery shops in this area. Mr. Nicholls served in the army for five years, and upon demob. went to work in their Wendover shop. He bought a house there three years later, and remained in the business until it was sold in 1994.

It was a high class grocers. Many wealthy people opened accounts with them and remained lifelong customers. A number of them were from the world of stage and screen, and Mr. Nicholls related some amusing memories of these customers and how he enjoyed friendly banter with them. Chefs at Halton Camp bought produce from Nicholls. On one occasion this was for a lunch cooked for the Queen, who actually drove past the shop on the way to the camp!

Another big account was with "Chequers", and Mr. Nicholls saw many Prime Ministers come and go. Well known people were entertained there, and General Eisenhower was a guest at one time. Ted Heath lived at "Chequers" most of the time when he was in office, during which time Nicholls

received large orders for his yacht. Margaret Thatcher actually visited the shop one Christmas to thank them for their help, when she said: "It is just like my father's shop in Grantham".

In time, Mr. Nicholls and his nephew were the only remaining family members running the business. Supermarkets were coming along and business rates were increasing. In 1994 the grocery shop closed, when it was sold to Threshers for a 'very good price'. So the popular high class grocers came to an end, but what a fascinating life it had been for the Nicholls family. Shops like that are sadly disappearing and becoming just a lovely memory.

A few days later we enjoyed our coffee morning at Chris Yates' lovely home & garden, when £191 was raised towards W.I. Funds. Thank you, Chris.

### Becca's letter from Uganda

#### The importance of play

In recent months various people from the UK have kindly donated toys to the hospital. I would like to thank you for these and for your prayers. I thought it'd be nice to give you a broader view of how toys are being used here and how play therapy is developing.

We continue to try and spend an hour each day playing with the children on the Paediatric ward who are no longer acutely ill, but are still recovering. News of play therapy has spread though and we often get kids coming from other parts of the hospital including quite a few children from about 5-14 who are in hospital to attend to their relatives. This means that instead of going to school and playing like we'd expect them to do at their age, they are cooking, cleaning clothes, emptying out catheters, looking after babies etc – so I think it's only fair that they get some fun too.

In many ways play therapy is aimed at the malnourished children. Play is a main component in the treatment of these children. This was not being done before but, having seen the success of daily play sessions, initially 3, and now all 5 of the nurses working with the malnourished children want to be part of it.

The malnourished children are often in hospital for long, long periods of time and receive very little stimulation. They can often develop developmental delays. On top of this children with disabilities are often more prone to becoming malnourished. It's amazing to work with these children. At first they generally just watch and don't participate much, or are too tired to be able to participate, but after a session or two with a lot of attention given, they start joining in little by little and smiling, and then you can't stop them, they're the first ones there and they love it. Each session is different depending on which children are there – but we've got a great bunch of kids at the moment, their eyes light up when we come onto the ward.

It's great to see the children's excitement as we arrive and now the kids have got used to us they often run to get the toys they like. Of course, we do get the kids crying when we leave and take the toys away, but this usually stops when they realise that we'll be back again tomorrow. We provide the kids a time of fun with toys that they just don't have - most kids don't even have a teddy. Sometimes the toys go missing, about half the time we find them again; this is hard as we do try to trust people, but it's little different from the UK where toys are taken from doctors' waiting rooms too.

We don't use any soft toys in the play therapy and to prevent the spread of infection we wash the toys daily between each session. However we do use soft toys to give to children to keep. This is really helpful as, if we are doing physio with a specific child, we can give them a toy that they can continue to use to help the parents carry out the physio when we are not there. We also use them to give to children who have gone through really difficult things for example:

- Helen is a 9 year old girl with sickle cell anaemia. When I first saw this girl the doctors were all surprised that she had survived. She presented as someone who had suffered from a stroke and was unable to sit without support. By the time she left hospital she'd made incredible progress and left us being able to walk. Unfortunately due to her disease, she will die young and quite possibly could suffer from a stroke again.
- Janet was a really sweet 12 year old girl. She had typhoid and had to undergo 2 major operations. Unfortunately she was severely anaemic and the disease continued to affect her gut. She sadly did not survive. However after her first operation we were able to give her a cuddly rabbit, much to her delight, and she often would play with if or cuddle it.

#### **Prayer requests**

• Please continue to pray for the involvement and training of the nurses – we're really seeing them getting excited and joining in, which is great. Please pray that this continues

- Please pray particularly for the malnourished children at the moment. The hospital has a dairy, which provides milk for the children a really important part of their treatment. Unfortunately the cows have got a virus at the moment so no milk is being provided but, praise God, they've found another source of milk and someone to pay for it for the next week or two. But please also pray that our herd will recover quickly.
- Our paediatric consultant has not been around very much lately as his mother is very ill. This is a great loss for the hospital as he is such a great doctor, gentle, kind, caring and has an incredible amount of knowledge. Please pray especially for him and his mother and also for the hospital and children as they continue without him.

### **Check Your Tyres, It Could Save Your Life!**

When was the last time you checked the tyres on your car? It is recommended that we all check our tyres for pressure and tread wear every two weeks but how many of us actually do? Not many. Your tyres are your only contact between your car and the road so making sure that

Not many. Your tyres are your only contact between your car and the road so making sure that they are not flat, damaged or worn can make the difference between crashing and not crashing in an emergency stop situation. 'So many people forget to check their tyres and the first they know about it is when they have a blow out on the motorway' says Oliver Hall from etyres.co.uk. 'If you continue to drive on a flat tyre or one with a slow leak, then heat builds up in the sidewall of the tyre where it is being squashed under the weight of the car. Sometimes you only need to drive a mile or so before the tyre falls apart. That is why you see so many bits of blown tyres on the motorway because the higher speeds cause the underinflated tyres to overheat more quickly and disintegrate. This is clearly extremely dangerous. You wouldn't believe the number of people who are driving around on damaged or excessively worn tyres without realising it.

If you get a nail in a tyre often it can be repaired for about £20 if it is dealt with early but by driving round with it in the tyre for a few weeks can make the tyre irrepairable making for a more expensive replacement.

To check your tyres you need to crouch down to a level where you can see right under the car and see the inside of the tyre as well as the outside. Most tyres have tread wear indicators, usually six or more small ribs across the bottom of the main tread grooves. When the tread surface is level with these ribs, the tyre needs to be replaced. Also check for bulges in the sidewall of the tyre as this is a sign of a damaged tyre and needs to be replaced.

Etyres.co.uk has recently opened up a branch in Dunstable. Etyres offers a totally mobile tyre fitting service so that customers can have tyres fitted on their driveway at home or in their work car park to save them waiting around at tyre fitting depots. By cutting out the costs of large fitting depots they are able to offer some of the cheapest prices on car and van tyres, sometimes offering savings of as much as 40% on prices usually paid. So they save you time *and* money!

Etyres.co.uk offers a national service with a network of over 200 vans around the country. The vans are fully equipped with the latest tyre fitting and electronic wheel balancing equipment and the fitters also use special alloy wheel protection tools to ensure your alloy wheels are kept in pristine condition. They also have the tools to fit the new style Run-flat tyres which are becoming common on new Mini and BMW models. Etyres also come and supply and fit new car batteries. Another

service offered is a puncture repair service which means that if you get a puncture in one of your tyres often it is repairable, and they can fix it, saving you the cost of a new tyre.

Anyone wishing to get a quote or try the service should call 08456 445924 which gets straight through to the Dunstable branch, or you can log onto the website at etyres.co.uk where you can obtain quotes, get information on your tyres and view price comparisons.
