



Highlights from the Minutes of the Eaton Bray Parish Council Meeting - Held on 4th. September 2006 at 7:30 p.m.

Chairman's correspondence:

A letter of resignation has been received from Cllr. L. Tribbick. The Council expressed sadness at the news and commended the hard work and support that Cllr. Tribbick has offered in the past.

Crime Statistics:

There were 22 reported offences in August; 12 vehicles damaged, 5 Thefts from motor vehicles, 1 Other theft. 4 Other burglaries.

There is currently a dispersal order in force on the village, in an attempt to control nuisance and antisocial behaviour

The forthcoming alcohol ban covering the High Street was also noted, signs are already in place.

Allotments:

Following comments about the state of the allotment sites, it is proposed to review policy concerning their upkeep and the rules and conditions governing their use.

N.B. Rents for 2006/07 are due on 1st.October.

School Governor:

A unanimous vote confirmed that Cllr. M.Heyland would continue as Community School Governor of Eaton Bray Lower School.

Chilterns AONB Grant - Village Signpost:

The Council has received confirmation of a grant towards this project from The Chilterns AONB, further support is to be sought locally.

Traffic Calming:

It was decided that the General Purposes Committee would organise the Council's response to this ongoing item to try and make some progress. A proposal to gather up to date statistics using automatic sensors was welcomed and the G.P. committee was asked to obtain details and quotes for this.

New Byelaws:

Changes to existing byelaws must be advertised for 12 weeks. It was decided to use "Focus" for this, and also to display notices around the village.

Coffee Tavern:

There was a unanimous decision to go ahead with the exterior redecoration and repairs to the chimney flashing. Interior work will now be postponed until next year due to costs.

After consulting with local letting agents, the Clerk is to prepare a detailed report and schedule for refurbishing the cottage adjacent to the Coffee Tavern with a view to re-letting it.

Cemetery:

It was reported that ground maintenance work was now up to date, and the new area has been cleared and fenced.

All cemetery management matters are to be reviewed for discussion at the October meeting to establish policy for the future.

Vacancy:

There are two vacancies for Parish Councillors in Eaton Bray. Anyone over the age of 21, who has lived or worked in the village for a year or more is welcomed to apply to be co-opted onto the Council. We hereby give notice of the following proposed changes to the byelaws in respect of pleasure grounds, public walks and open spaces of Eaton Bray, Bedfordshire.

These proposals to be advertised for a period of twelve weeks prior to submission to the Department for Environment and Rural Affairs.

Fires

This currently reads

- 19(1) No person shall in the ground intentionally light a fire, or place, throw or let fall a lighted match or any other thing so as to be likely to cause a fire.
- 19(2) This byelaw shall not prevent the lighting of a properly constructed camping stove or cooker in any area set aside for the purpose, in such a manner as not to cause danger or damage by fire

The changes are to delete the original para 19.2 and add words from the model byelaws 12(2)(a) and is now to read:

"Byelaws shall not apply to the lighting of a fire at any event for which the Council has given permission that fires may be lit."

Golf

This is a new rule reading from the model byelaws para 35 and reads "Golf prohibited. No person shall drive, chip or pitch a hard golf ball."

Skateboards

This is a new rule from the model by elaws para 26 and reads "Skateboarding permitted but must not cause danger or annoyance. No person shall skate, slide or ride on rollers, skateboards or other self-propelled vehicles in such a manner as to cause danger or give reasonable grounds for annoyance to other persons."

Horses

This is new rule recommended by the GP committee to be inserted after the vehicles section (para 2) the following words to read "There is no bridleway on this land and the riding of horses or ponies is prohibited"

Wildlife

This is a new rule from the model by e laws Para 9 "No person shall without the consent of the Council, turn out or permit any animal for which he is responsible to graze on the ground" followed by the words recommended by the GP committee "unless by licence of the Council"





In some places the Christian doctrine of creation is a matter of serious controversy. Some people maintain that the opening chapter of the Bible has to be treated as a literal (almost "eye-witness") account of how things began. But the ancient writers would not understood such questions. The evidence of their eyes showed them this marvellous world, and one (or perhaps several) of them wrote a great poem to celebrate God's wonderful work. Their concern was to establish that everything that exists came from God – the "how" of it was of no interest to them – and then to teach us our human responsibility to care in God's name for what He has entrusted to us. I find it curious that many of those who are adamant that we must accept the Bible-story as literal truth seem often to deny global warming and show little concern for the limited nature of earth's resources.

But that is a concern for all of us. We might argue about the exact nature of "global warming", but almost all scientists agree that there are observable changes in our climate which raise serious questions about the future of our planet and our way of life. Our use of fossil fuels and our greed for energy play a part in what is happening, and while the pundits argue, serious damage is being done to our environment – unless we take positive action to change our habits.

Energy use is an issue which involves us all. What can we do to limit the damage we are doing to our world? It is a huge problem, but solving most huge problems usually involves lots of individuals doing little things, and then pressurizing people in power to take what might seem unpopular decisions. How could we use less electricity or gas? New light bulbs, turning off lights we don't need, turning the heating down a couple of degrees, not leaving appliances on stand-by – there are many, many little ways in which we can become more sparing in our contribution to pollution. Then there is our oil/petrol use – smaller and more efficient cars, more economical driving, car-sharing, getting the bike out for short journeys, and thinking carefully about air travel ("was your journey really necessary?"). We can all start to make a difference. Then we can call on our politicians to face up to the real issues.

The same is true of recycling. Ours is the most wasteful society in Europe – just look at all the things we throw away, which could be recycled or composted, or which we simply never needed in the first place. All this waste uses up valuable resources, which should be there for our grandchildren to use. Do you make full use of the recycling service of the Council – and why don't we urge the Council to do more to recycle things that can be re-used? In the long run it does make economic sense.

There is an old story of old Joe leaning on his garden fence as the Vicar went by. "What a splendid garden you have, Joe", the Vicar said. "What a wonderful job you and the good Lord have done to make it so beautiful." "That's as may be, parson," said Joe, sucking on his pipe – "but you should have seen it when 'E 'ad it on 'Is own".

Christians believe that God has entrusted this wonderful world to us to care for it - we have a God-given responsibility to use our planet and its richness wisely. *That* is the most important reason why we should take these issues to heart, and change the way we abuse God's creation, before it is too late.

St Mary's Roof News

Our efforts to raise funds to help meet the cost of restoring the roof of St Mary's church have recently been assisted by the award of a grant by a little-known – but locally connected trust - the Francis Coales Charitable Foundation. As this may not be an immediately familiar name, or one with an obvious local connection, we thought that a word of explanation might be appropriate ...

Francis Coales farmed at Chicheley near Milton Keynes until 1885 when he retired and with his son purchased an established corn merchant's business – Hives & Sons – in Newport Pagnell. The name of the business was changed to Francis Coales & Son and over the years expanded through the purchase of similar businesses trading around this area, at Bedford, at Olney & at Tring.

In 1973, following a major fire at their main mill at Newport Pagnell, the decision was reluctantly taken not to rebuild the mill, but to close down the business, and from the winding-up was established the Francis Coales Charitable Foundation.

Although now based in Weston-super-Mare, the main object of the foundation is to offer assistance towards the cost of repairs and restoration in the area where the business once traded. Specifically: "to assist with the repair of old buildings open to the public ... preference is given to churches and their contents in Bucks, Beds, Northants & Herts".

Thankfully the work to restore the timbers in the roof of the nave of the church met the criteria set by the foundation and St Mary's is grateful for the £3000 donated by the trustees.



YOU HAVE UP TO 2 YEARS TO DO IT!

A person's WILL can be altered or replaced after they have died!

WIDOWS & WIDOWERS: This month I focus on your right to have the distribution of your late partner's estate rearranged to better match the wishes of the beneficiary(ies) – the primary beneficiary is probably you - whether that involves replacing all or part of your partner's Will or drawing up a first Will if they died without leaving one.

This rearrangement is called a **Deed of Variation.** There are 3 general provisos.

- All beneficiaries affected by a change must agree.
- It has to be completed within 2 years of the partner's death.
- It can only be done once, <u>including</u> after probate has been settled.

The motive that initiates the majority of **Deeds of Variation** is **avoidance of inheritance tax**, whether it is the tax liability on the deceased's estate or, more often, to <u>double</u> the surviving partner's own inheritance tax free entitlement, or both.

INHERITANCE TAX: Anyone widowed who owned their house jointly with their late partner will inherit the house, 100%. This would seem to be OK. However, the survivor's estate will be increased considerably by the assets inherited from the late partner and so will their future inheritance tax liability. Also the late partner's inheritance tax free entitlement will also have been lost.

You will be aware from previous FOCUS articles that Wills can **double the inheritance tax free entitlement** of couples who own their homes in joint names, i.e. £570,000 today. This means a potential saving of over £100,000 tax. A **Deed of Variation** allows those widowed and their deceased partner to still be considered as a legal partnership and so enjoy the same rights as a living married couple.

By having new Wills for the late partner (notional Will) and for the survivor, together with changing ownership to tenancy in common, the widow or widower's estate can benefit from both their own and their late partner's inheritance tax free entitlement. Importantly, the survivor retains life possession of the house.

DOWNSIZING: Any plans to 'downsize' need to be delayed until the **Deed of Variation** is completed. The interest of the deceased, as recorded by the Land Registry, must remain, i.e. the Land Registry <u>MUST NOT</u> have been advised to change ownership from joint to sole ownership nor must the house have been sold

NOTE: Ownership in **tenancy in common** <u>also</u> provides the best provision for children and minimises the risk of having to sell the house to meet care costs.

Arranging a **Deed of Variation** is complex, so it is essential Law Society regulated solicitors are used, as are available through my practice.

Pottering The North Sea Cycle Route, Denmark and Norway

Yes, we ventured forth to foreign parts! Margaret, a friend and fellow National Cycle Network Ranger from Devizes, and I met up at Liverpool Street Station with our bikes and took the train to Harwich, where we caught the DFDS ferry, the Dana Sirena, for Esbjerg. The Dana Sirena can carry over 600 passengers and 435 cars, and cruises at 22.5 knots. I always think it is exciting driving a car onto a ferry but cycling onto a ferry this size is quite a thrill I can tell you. After a very relaxed crossing, we awoke refreshed and after a hearty breakfast we were keen to get going. That was after we managed to disentangle helmets, loaded panniers and ourselves from a lift full of Polish lorry drivers who were going to the lorry deck!

The North Sea Cycle Route is an unbroken, signposted route that follows the entire coastline of the North Sea. That is the coast of England and Scotland, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Germany and the Netherlands – a total distance of 6,000km. It is especially for cyclists. You are free to choose where to start and finish your trip – whatever you do not manage to see one year, you can always see the next, because the North Sea Cycle Route is here to stay.

Each country issues a map and guide notes for its section of the route. On departing Esbjerg the notes said "passing a swimming pool on the left" and as it was on our right we very quickly realised we were going the wrong way! (Margaret had also taken care to bring along her compass!). Our accommodation was in the excellent DanHostels. After two days cycling we got the train to Frederikshavn to cycle around the most northerly tip of Denmark. I had booked the train, a journey where we changed once. Whilst cycle facilities on trains are very good in Denmark getting the bikes into the carriage proved somewhat problematic as there were two/three steps up into the carriage, however we managed. Later on in Norway we put our bikes onto a bus, not a problem once on the bus but again two/three steps. After an overnight ferry to Larvik we spent two nights with Margaret's brother near Tonsberg. During the following days we cycled through Sandefjord, Larvik, Kragero, Risor,Tvedestrand, Arendal, Grimstad, Lillesand and finally Kristiansand, a mixture of historic towns and pretty fishing villages with their white painted wooden houses in narrow streets. We cycled around fjords, caught the ferry across them, and a couple of times telephoned for a water taxi.

In both countries the food was good. Norway is expensive, everything is double the price that we pay at home. Fairly well signed throughout, the route is mostly tarmac paths alongside roads and tracks through woods and forests etc. Everyone we met was very friendly and all spoke English. We returned from Kristiansand on a glorious sunny afternoon on the ferry Princess of Scandinavia. Margaret and I were instructed to go to the front of Row 12. This we did and found over 20 motorcyclists there (and more on board). They look a bit scary but they are really big softies! Our return was marked by sitting on the sun deck drinking beer, eating in the posh restaurant, a drink in the bar and after a comfortable night in a cabin, a good breakfast. On arrival in Newcastle we followed route 72 (Hadrians Wall Route) receiving lots of toots and waves from the motorcyclists departing for various parts of the British Isles. Route 72 takes you to the main line station in Newcastle. I always enjoy getting a train home because I can cycle home from Tring station, therefore contributing to a sense of having had an adventure and been on a proper journey.

I would urge anyone to have a go at this splendid route which links seven countries together. One result of the work done internationally on the North Sea Cycle Route is that conditions for cyclists have been given higher priority by planners. You will find information boards at strategic points along the route and you should have no problem finding practical information.

Maps and information on accommodation, ferries, trains, route planning is available through the website . www.northsea-cycle.com

The route in the UK is: NCN Harwich/Fakenham, NCN Fakenham/Hull,NCN White Rose Route, NCN Three Rivers Route, NCN Coast and Castles Cycle Route, NCN Edinburgh/Aberdeen, NCN Aberdeen to JohnO'Groats, NCN Orkneys and Shetlands.

Edlesborough Parish Council (including Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall) News

Reports from the July 2006 General Purpose Committee Meeting and full Parish Council Meeting

Various issues had arisen from recent Health & Safety reports received by the Parish Council and Edlesborough Under 5's and a joint amicable meeting was held to discuss same. The Parish Council agreed to investigate the possibility of fencing off the grass area between the Memorial Hall and the Scout Hut to allow the Under 5's to use this space for outdoor activities.

Difficulty was arising in obtaining sufficient quotations for various works to be carried out and the Parish Council agreed to revert to the Standing Orders regarding the amount of quotations required.

In an attempt to improve Traffic Calming an agreement was reached by the Parish Council on the number of yellow backed signs and roundels to be installed throughout the villages and an order has been placed with Bucks. CC.

Regrettably a long established Horse Chestnut tree on The Green had become diseased resulting in it being a danger to the public and would be felled, the Parish Council intend to plant a replacement tree at an appropriate time.

The order has been placed for the installation of a Basketball Goal on Edlesborough Green and for a smaller second Junior Football pitch. The existing practice goal will be removed and a removeable, lockable replacement positioned on the smaller pitch in due course. A request for 'The Bell' Football team to play matches on The Green alternating with Edlesborough 94FC has been approved.

The Annual Return for the year ended 31st March 2006 has been agreed by the Internal Auditors and is currently awaiting agreement by the External Auditors.

A slight diversion of footpath No. 18 has been approved.

Councillors will be attending a meeting with Bucks CC to discuss outstanding issues within the Parish.

Amendments to two Section 106 agreements at Beacon View and Knolls View, Northall are being discussed with the relevant authorities and developers.

Edlesborough School in conjunction with Safer Routes to School are endeavouring to establish 'crocodile routes' to get children to and from School safely and the Parish Council will be investigating the road parking problems outside the school.

The new Edlesborough sign has been erected on the boundary between Eaton Bray and Edlesborough.

Archaeological tests are being carried out at Edlesborough Churchyard as the basis of a full report and costs involved to be made available for improving the access to the Cemetery.

A Parish Plan meeting will be held in September and those who wished to attend will be written to as soon as a definite date has been agreed with Bucks Community Action.

PCSO Jackie Dodson is now on duty throughout the Parish and parishioners are asked to report anything suspicious or are welcome to 'have a chat'. The Parish Council were sorry to be informed that PC Robert Barker will be retiring in September, his patrolling of the Parish over the past 12 months has been invaluable in reducing the problems that were occurring.

The Parish Nurse Charity/Burghope Trust

The purpose of these charities is to help the 'sick and infirm' of parishioners residing in the Parish of Edlesborough. Any parishioner seeking help from either of these charities can telephone the Clerk for further details.

Requests for allotments are becoming popular and all allotment holders in the Parish are asked to please inform the Clerk if you intend giving up your allotment, an allotment should not be passed over to someone else without prior permission of the Parish Council.

The Parish Council would apologise to all Parishioners who visit the Parish website. Unfortunately since February problems have occurred with the Server which hopefully has now been rectified and all up to date information is now available.



Rent Arrears Protocol

From 2 October, a new pre-action protocol sets out the steps a local authority or registered social landlord should take before applying for a possession order based on rent arrears. Landlords need to adopt its principles now in their pre-court rent arrears procedures.

The steps include: trying to agree affordable sums for the tenants to pay towards the arrears, providing rent statements on a quarterly basis, assisting the tenant in claiming housing benefit and advising the tenant to seek help from a bureau or a debt advice agency. The protocol will also mean that generally a landlord cannot start possession proceedings if there are outstanding housing benefit issues.

If the landlord fails to comply with the protocol, a tenant will be able to use this as an argument to have a possession claim made on discretionary grounds adjourned, struck out or dismissed. If a landlord makes a possession claim on mandatory grounds and has failed to comply with the protocol, the court will only be able to impose an order for costs.

Here to Stav

From 10 July 2006, fixed-term employees become permanent employees when they have been employed on a fixed-term contract (or renewals of it) for four years or more, unless the employer can objectively justify continuing to employ them on a fixed-term contract.

If an employee has been employed on a series of fixed-term contracts, the four years will only count as continuous employment if any breaks between the contracts were either for less than one week or for a specific reason, such as sick leave, maternity leave or a temporary cessation of work.

The employer should give the employee a statement of change to their terms and conditions within one month of the fourth anniversary. This should specify the notice period the employee is entitled to, rather than the date the fixed-term expires Failure to do this can result in an award of between two and four weeks pay.

Hypermobility Syndrome



What is hypermobility syndrome?

Hypermobility means "more movement", so basically the joints move more! This is due to connective tissue being more stretchy than normal, which allows your joints to move into funny positions.

Hypermobility is something that you are born with and many people with hypermobile joints have no problems – they may even use it to their advantage such as ballet dancers or violinists.

People with hypermobile joints who have pain are said to have "Hypermobility Syndrome".

The pain can be present for several reasons – it could be due to injury, as it is easier to injure joints that move more or muscle spasm or pain can develop as a result of the muscles working harder to keep the joints in the right position due to the stretchy ligaments.

What can I do?

If you have pain from an injury following the R.I.C.E. principle (Rest, Ice, Compression and Elevation). If the pain is generalised not due to injury or chronic, try using heat or painkillers.

Physiotherapy can help by treating any problematic joints and also teaching exercise programmes to help manage the problem.

Other points to try to help avoid problems include:-

- Regular exercise programme because building up the muscles helps to keep the joints in the right place, so you are less likely to hurt or injure yourself.
- Pilates and swimming are good and avoiding sudden twisting movements in sport.
- Maintaining good posture.
- Keeping a healthy weight.
- Wearing supportive shoes and avoiding heels.
- Avoiding static positions for any length of time.

'East of Nowhere' by Robert Chalmers

Edward Miller is a tabloid newspaper editor, who in a moment of madness (that favourite tabloid phrase) contrives to lose his job, his wife and his house. Pursued by exposure and disgrace, he is forced to flee, first to an old friend in the North, then to a strange English-teaching school in Spain, then to altogether wilder shores.

But as the world round this proudly racist and homophobic bigot becomes steadily more bizarre – and, increasingly threatening – so he himself

and, increasingly threatening – so he himself starts to grow in self-knowledge and moral stature.

This is an engaging, sly, black comedy with lots of tension and occasional flinch-inducing shocks. Some of the group gave up reading at one gruesome stage, but it was worth persevering for the rest of the story. Chalmers writes with startling deftness, wit and real sympathy. I found it completely gripping throughout.







Book review - Walking with Wheels in Bedfordshire and Milton Keynes Lynda Kynnersley (Price £7.99, available through all good bookshops)

The walks in this new publication have all been chosen for their ease of access with as much information as possible about the physical features of the route, to enable people with limited mobility to decide for themselves whether a particular walk is within their ability. Some walks are on trails that have been specially adapted to make them more accessible but others are on country paths, which have reasonably flat, smooth and hard surfaces.

The walks vary in length from a mile and a half up to seven miles, with the possibility of extending them to up to fourteen miles. The majority of the walks are designed to be circular with different outward and return routes, but in a few cases there are no suitable return routes and the directions will say to retrace your steps to the start point. A few walks are described as linear and on these routes, you can either do the whole walk, arranging transport at each end, or start the walk at any suitable point, go as far as you choose and retrace your route..

Details of how to get to the start point, where to park and where to find refreshments are all included, as well as general information of interest about the area and what wildlife you may see - everything in fact for a good trip out.



Becca's letter from Uganda

Well I've been away from home for just over a year now and a lot has happened. It's been quite a challenging year in many ways and amazing too. I've learnt so much about God, and about myself.

People say that when you are out here things are either really great or really hard, and to a certain extent I'd have to agree with that. I've struggled with some things over the last few months but God has been really amazing in helping me through them and looking at things in a different way. God truly doesn't put you in a situation where he won't give you the strength and change of heart to cope with it even when personally you don't have it.

There are some really special things here, like the community that Kagando is – the care and love that's here, the family feel. When someone's ill, or going through a hard time everyone's there trying to bring help and comfort. Then there's the fun that we have all together celebrating a joyful event. It's really special and really feels like the way we are meant to be as Gods church caring for and supporting one another.

Over the last two months I've had two Physios come and stay which has been great. One was from Germany and about to start working for a year in another hospital where she will be the only phyiso; she wanted to get some ideas about how to treat conditions you find over here and how things run. The other was a medical student. It was good fun, I enjoyed learning from them as well as teaching, and was quite surprised by how much I'd learnt over this year.

It's taken me a year to try and make any comment on the church here, but here's an attempt at explaining what I've found. In January at my Mission's Conference an African pastor make a comment on the Christianity out here. I've found that this comment explains quite well the church in this country. He told me that one of the worst insults you can say to someone here is to call them a pagan. To avoid being given this title people want to be baptised and be given a "Christian name" – i.e. a name from the bible. Many people therefore get baptised not because they believe, but so that if anyone calls them a pagan they can deny it by reporting they are baptised and giving their name.

I found it very interesting going to one of the nursing students fellowship meetings. The first year students had just started and they were asked to stand up and introduce themselves. As they did so they would say their name, then came the distinction. Some of these people would report the name of the church they go to, others would declare that Jesus was their personal Lord and Saviour and talk about being saved. I've never liked the question "when were you saved" – as I feel that Christianity is a journey – for some the discovery of Jesus and the decision to become a Christian will happen very quickly – for others like myself it was a long journey, and it's still a continuing journey which makes it so exciting. But the question here is quite apt, as it helps you to understand where people are in their faith and what they know and believe. You therefore have the difficulty that many people will call themselves Christians but still go and consult the witch doctor and carry out all their strange practices. A lot of evangelism goes on here, and we can learn much from it. But unfortunately it is not always followed up. You therefore have many people who've made a commitment, but never had anyone to help them afterwards discover the bible, and help them develop in their faith. To use a metaphor, the river is wide, but not very deep.

Many people at Kagando come to church and have heard the gospel many times. There are also some really strong Christians here who are great witnesses. From discussing with a friend whose been here much longer than me, the two major prayer needs are for good discipleship, and for God to be working in peoples hearts who've heard, but don't know him yet.

Kagando is not just a hospital, it has many other community projects and things it's involved with. I've asked if I can start seeing these, so will write about these in the future. But please if there's anything in particular that you'd like to know about, I'm sure you're not the only one so please ask via Gordon Gray on 220136, and I'll try and write about it.

- Please also thank God so much for this year and his protection and provision towards me.
