





So many of the pains and sorrows of our modern world are reflected in the Christmas story. Because we want Christmas to be a joyful time of family celebration, we sometimes try to push the darker side of the story away, and so miss its resonances with the sufferings of the world today.

It starts with a young unmarried girl being found to be pregnant in a society which ostracized such people. It tells of an expectant mother forced by anonymous bureaucracy to make a long and hazardous journey to complete census- and tax-returns, of a homeless couple seeking shelter, of a mother giving birth in a stable with only a cattle-trough in which to lay her new-born child, and of the murderous jealousy of a psychotic ruler, and the rampage of his troops through peaceful villages, slaughtering little children and all who sought to protect them. It tells of a refugee family seeking asylum in a foreign land.

But these are not anonymous statistics on some register of human rights violations, and case-notes in a dossier of crimes against humanity. These are stories about named people. The young mother is called Mary, and her baby was called Jesus. They travelled the long road from Nazareth to Bethlehem to register for the imperial census, and the only place available for Jesus's birth was a stable. And they fled to Egypt to escape Herod's sword. These are real people – just like the ones in today's stories.

We celebrate this story because it speaks of God's involvement in all these human tragedies, and of God's answer to them. For most of us, Christmas is a time of joy and family celebration, with parties, presents, pantomimes and plenty of fun. But we need to recover the real message of peace and salvation to recognize how Christmas can bring light and hope and peace to people who still suffer these terrible injustices. We need to be reminded when we hear of refugees that the Son of God was once a refugee, that his family had to flee by night from the rampaging militia, that God's own Son was squeezed out of busy, self-interested human society into a stable. There is solace for the victims in knowing that God Himself is with them in their sufferings and Christ still bears their pains in heaven.

That God identifies Himself with today's human victims gives them a new significance - God's concern becomes our concern. That is part of the message of "God with us" at Christmas, and through the pictures we see night after night on our televisions God is challenging us to do what we can to alleviate their sufferings. Christmas stirs our consciences and challenges our charity. We spend a great deal of money on people who already have plenty – can we not do something for those who have little or nothing? Oxfam and Christian Aid have schemes whereby we can send a present to a developing nation of livestock or medical equipment or educational materials; Shelter and other charities provide help for the marginalized in our own society. Would that not be an appropriate response to the darker side of the Christmas story, as we celebrate the bright and joyful side?

May Christmas bring joy and hope for you and all whom you love, and may our generosity bring joy and hope too to those who most need it in today's world. A peaceful and blessed Christmas to you all.

He has received no explanation from District Council why a cartographical error omitting the land from the green belt has not been corrected. The clerk to write to the District Council in support of Mr. Willis and his neighbours.

PC Josh Tonkin advised the council that PC Viv Dade (5602) has been appointed as Beat Manager.

There were 16 offences reported in October; 6 criminal damage; 1 theft of a motor vehicle; 2 thefts from motor vehicles; 1 violence against the person; 1 other burglary; 3 thefts; and 2 cases of fraud.

CHAIRMAN'S CORRESPONDENCE & COMMENTS.

£75 will be donated to The Royal British Legion in respect of Wreaths for Remembrance Sunday.

The Chairman gave a report on the Parish Council meets the School Council meeting, held on 19th October 2006. The meeting was well attended with 12 children present. The Chairman thanked Cllrs. Heyland, Conner, and Brand for their support, and the children for their interest.

One of the issues raised concerned the rubbish in the School Lane Rec., and the G.P. committee was asked to explore the suggestion of an additional litter bin for this location.

Ballot papers were distributed and councillors cast their vote. It was subsequently reported that it was a unanimous decision.

Traffic Management

Cllr Beal reported that an evaluation survey had been carried out by SBDC, this found there was no requirement for a school crossing patrol. This is to be investigated further.

Traffic speed monitoring has been completed at two locations, a third will follow.

A report of the activities of the committee regarding traffic management will be displayed around the village and published in Focus magazine.

Funding: One possible source is the County Partnership, and it was proposed by Cllr Beal, agreed unanimously, that an application for funding should be submitted without delay,

ALLOTMENTS:

The proposed changes to the allotment regulations were explained and agreed unanimously. The

allotment holders are to be notified of the new regulations.

It was recognised that the plots are not currently marked out. An effective way of doing this is to be found and implemented as soon as possible.

CEMETERY:

Cllr Conner reported that 20 kg. of bulbs have now been planted, and that the site is looking better.

The Clerk is to attend a burial ground management course, and will work with Cllr Conner to gather existing documentation with the intention of reviewing policy and regulations relating to the cemetery.

CONDITION OF ROADS:

Councillors were reminded that they have a responsibility to monitor the village, including the condition of the roads. Any concerns should be reported through the Clerk to the relevant authority.

OTHER MATTERS ARISING FROM OCTOBER MEETING:

Repairs to Coffee Tavern chimney and flashing: The Clerk reported that Alan Barnard has now carried out his inspection and given a verbal report. It is necessary to repoint the chimney above the roofline and re-seat the chimney pots and seal them.

Fires

This currently reads

19(1) No person shall in the ground intentionally light a fire, or place, throw or let fall a lighted match or any other thing so as to be likely to cause a fire.

19(2) This byelaw shall not prevent the lighting of a properly constructed camping stove or cooker in any area set aside for the purpose, in such a manner as not to cause danger or damage by fire.

The changes are to delete the original para 19.2 and add words from the model byelaws 12(2)(a) and is now to read:

"Byelaws shall not apply to the lighting of a fire at any event for which the Council has given permission that fires may be lit."

Golf

<u>This is a new rule</u> reading from the model byelaws para 35 and reads "Golf prohibited. No person shall drive, chip or pitch a hard golf ball."

Skateboards

This is a new rule from the model byelaws para 26 and reads "Skateboarding permitted but must not cause danger or annoyance. No person shall skate, slide or ride on rollers, skateboards or other self-propelled vehicles in such a manner as to cause danger or give reasonable grounds for annoyance to other persons."

Horses

This is new rule recommended by the GP committee to be inserted after the vehicles section (para 2) the following words to read "There is no bridleway on this land and the riding of horses or ponies is prohibited"

Wildlife

This is a new rule from the model by e laws Para 9 "No person shall without the consent of the Council, turn out or permit any animal for which he is responsible to graze on the ground" followed by the words recommended by the GP committee "unless by licence of the Council"

School Crossing Patrol at School Lane

This has been evaluated by the Road Safety Education & Training dept at Beds C. C. and found to be not enough pupils crossing the road at this point to put a crossing patrol into place.

School Signs

Requested roadside School Signs to indicate to traffic that children are present in the area of School Lane.

Funding

Research into possible funding for traffic calming measures that may be judged to be required.

Your Will & a Change in Circumstances

Last month I concluded my comments on Deeds of Variation – the important opportunity to change (vary) the Will or intestacy of a person who has died within the past two years, usually to avoid inheritance tax but also useful for other purposes.

CHANGE: When it was drafted your Will was prepared with your wishes and circumstances in mind. However, your circumstances and wishes and the circumstances of those mentioned in your Will can change making your Will inaccurate or at least no longer a reflection of your current wishes

To manage change it is recommended that you review your Will regularly and up date it whenever a significant change has occurred.

Common changes include

- alteration in the distribution of benefits, e.g. a change in a money legacy
- addition or deletion of beneficiaries, including arising from the birth of a child
- replacement or addition of an executor, trustee or guardian. The current entry may have died. They may no longer be suitable, willing or be your choice.
- getting married, remarried or registering a civil partnership.
- getting divorced, dissolving a civil partnership or separating
- the inclusion of a trust

A change in personal status does not necessarily cancel a Will. For example, in the case of divorce, whilst any gift to a divorced spouse would lapse, unless a contrary intention is stated in the Will, other elements of the Will remain valid. Getting married or remarried cancels a previous Will unless the Will expressly states otherwise.

CODICILS: <u>Under no circumstances</u> must you alter your Will with pencil or ink amendments or attach anything to the Will – this will almost certainly invalidate any change you wish to make and probably the Will itself. Instead, most changes can be addressed by the use of a codicil. A codicil is a supplement to a will which makes some alterations but leaves the rest of it intact. A codicil can be prepared by the Will writer who drafted the Will but it need not be so. Each codicil must be signed by the person who made the Will and be witnessed in the same way as a Will. However, the witnesses do not have to be the same as for the original Will.

A NEW WILL: More significant changes such as the inclusion of a trust in your Will to minimise your inheritance tax liability or to make the best provision for any children, will normally require a new Will to be prepared. The new Will should commence with a clause stating that it revokes all previous Wills and codicils.

KEY POINT: You should review your Will regularly to ensure that it is up to date and continues

to accurately express your wishes. <u>Home owners</u>, please check that your Wills have trusts in them to minimise any inheritance tax liability and/ or provide the best provision for children. DLA and AA - Special Rules

People who are considered to have no more than six months to live can make a claim for disability living allowance (DLA) or attendance allowance (AA) under the special rules. This means that they can get DLA or AA without having had the

condition for a particular length of time or having to fill in all the boxes about the care needs on the claim form.

From 25 September, an award made under the special rules will be for a fixed period of three years (instead of for an indefinite period as previously). If the claimant is still alive after the three year period, a renewal claim can be made in the normal way.

DLA claimants will have to fill in all the boxes on the claim form if they wish to apply for the mobility component. This may be awarded for the same three year period or for an indefinite period depending on their circumstances. If claimants are already receiving the mobility component, the length of the award of the care component made under the special rules may be adjusted to more or less than three years. This is because the two components cannot be awarded for different fixed periods.



Recently, British Gas and a company making a parcel delivery have had difficulty finding me because of this. I, of course, mean no disrespect to our good neighbours in Eaton Bray! But Edlesborough has a strong identity and community in its own right. Wouldn't it be good to have the name of our village on our letters? I understand postcodes and district addresses are set by Royal Mail. Only they can make the decision to change them and, rightly so, only with consensus from residents. Might we join together to try and put Edlesborough back on the postal map? I would be willing to co-ordinate the cause.

A Recipe for a Christmas Pastry. (presumed A.D. 1394.)

Cast therto poudre of pepyr, salte, spyce, eysell (vinegar) and funges (mushrooms) pickled and thanne (then), take ye boonys and let hem seethe ynne a pot to make a goode broth for it; with ye hede of oone of ye byrdes stucke at ye oone end of ye paste and a grete tayle at ye other and dyvers of hys longe fedyrs sette ynne cunnynglye alle aboute hym........

Well I think it would make a change from mince pies, wouldn't it.?

CHRISTMAS, December 25th. all of our thoughts turn to this time of great celebration; but before I write more let me put the record straight about that date.

The early church did not know the exact date of Jesus' birth, neither was there an annual celebration of it. What we do know is that it wasn't in December; for the shepherds and the sheep would have died from hypothermia in the freezing Palestine winter, out in the fields. No, we have to look to the year A.D.336 for the first evidence of a celebration which was found in a Roman document. The date was chosen as a take over of the Roman festival celebrating the unconquerable SUN. The apparently dying sun began to increase its sunlight on DEC. 25th. Edlesborough W.I.

To celebrate our birthday, Kathie Froud had cooked and decorated a lovely cake, and we were each served with a slice at our monthly meeting.

Our speaker that evening was Mr. Roger Evans from the Thatching Centre in Northampton. He spoke on an invitation he had received from Japan to go there and demonstrate English methods of thatching. He and his wife stayed in a small village surrounded by mountains and forests of cedar trees. Black bears, monkeys and wild boar are to be found in the region. Villagers live in small thatched houses and log cabins.

Mr. Evans showed slides of the work carried out jointly by himself and Japanese thatchers. The house they worked on was in a very bad state. Before they began, a crowd of villagers came to witness the blessing of the house. Once the thatching started, the whole process was filmed for Japanese T.V., and many V.I.P.'s visited the site. Mr Evans said it was an uncomfortable climate to work in - very humid. However, he enjoyed the company of the Japanese thatchers, and they all learned from each other's methods.

The scaffolding was made from cedar poles, and the ladders were very short so a few were tied together to make one long one! Mr. Evans showed them how to thatch with reeds, which had to be transported several hundred miles. The Japanese workers completed the work by laying cedar strips across the reeds. It really was a pleasure to see the slides of the finished work.

Two of the young thatchers had visited the Thatching Centre to study our methods but, unfortunately, there are very few young Japanese people taking up this career. Mr. Evans had really enjoyed his unique experience, and had been treated so hospitably when in Japan.

Later in the month a number of Edlesborough members attended the Beacon Group meeting at Aston Clinton, when they heard a talk by Lady Lucinda Lampton of T.V. fame.



Becca's letter from Uganda

Thank you again so much for your support. We've now purchased the pulse oximeter as you can see in the picture. Those of you who have been in hospital in the UK will recognise it as a standard piece of equipment that NHS staff and patients take for granted, but which has the potential to save many lives. It will mean so much to the hospital to have such a vital piece of equipment.

Our machine is a very nice one, it does continuous monitoring, which we need for very sick patients, and can be used on adults and



children. It has a battery back up so, importantly, will work when there's no power, and this plus the fact it is light, means it can be used to check the oxygen levels of many peoples' blood. It cost 2,179,250 Ugandan shillings, which is equivalent to about £677 with the exchange rate at the moment.

So it's just arrived. Over the coming weeks I will be teaching the nurses how to use the equipment and, with the surgeon, establish a protocol for how the nurses should react. Next month, once the machine is in use I hope to send you some of the nurses' comments and thanks, and a picture of it being used with a case study.

Thanks to the generosity of your villages, through St Mary's Church we have also been able to place an order for a blood pressure monitoring machine, which we expect to arrive in the next few weeks. Emma who is a nurse on the ward, said "Thanks so much, may you be blessed, this equipment is really going to help so many people".

Gordon Gray writes: This year's project has taught me an awful lot about our ability to send aid to the third world. When we read the news there seems to be so much need that it is impossible for us to think that we can do anything to help address the problem of poverty, poor heath and the inequality of the use of the world's resources. The simple fact is that as a result of the actions of the people of our villages there are people alive today who would otherwise be dead. Those people have mothers, fathers, brothers, sisters, children, husbands, wives who today are not in mourning for a dearly loved family member.

Individually it has cost the people of our villages hardly anything – most people's contribution was little more than the £3 entry fee for the Open Gardens event in June – yet we have done something remarkable and made a significant difference to a village community in Uganda. Thank you everyone for your support so far, throughout the year.


