May brings round the annual Christian Aid Week Appeal, with its public events and house-to-house collections. I have no hesitation in asking all FOCUS readers to be generous in their response. We hope that our collectors will call on every house in our villages during the week 14-19 May, and you will find an envelope for this collection with this magazine. And remember, if you are a UK tax payer, you can make your gift worth 28% more by completing the Gift Aid declaration on the envelope, thus enabling Christian Aid to reclaim the income tax you paid on that gift.

Christian Aid is the arm of the churches of our land, reaching out to help victims of natural disaster, war and poverty across the world. The churches themselves provide a world-wide network of contacts through which Christian Aid is able to work directly with local people in each situation, and so avoid almost all of the political corruption which blights so many good intentions for relief among the world's suffering people. Money given to Christian Aid gets to the people who actually need it.

Christian Aid works with the other relief agencies to bring help to disaster victims, and your gifts can help to ensure that assistance is ready when there is an earthquake, hurricane or devastating flooding in a country whose economy and infra-structure cannot cope with such large scale need. It also works in many Third World countries, mainly in small localized projects, to improve agriculture, create sustainable local industries, and to undertake development projects such as the provision of clean water and hygiene facilities. Such simple provisions can transform people's lives and open up totally new possibilities for those for whom survival is a constant struggle.

There is an old saying among the native peoples of America – "give a man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for life". That is a fundamental principle for the work of Christian Aid: it sets out to give people the knowledge, the skills and the basic equipment they need to take charge of their own future survival, and to give them that basic human dignity of being able to care for themselves and for their families. Some years ago, Christian Aid coined a slogan which has stuck ever since – "We believe in life before death". That's what your response this year can give to some of the world's poorest people.

Jesus told a story (Matthew 25, vv.31-46) about the final judgement, when people were separated, some to his right hand and some to his left. Those to the right were commended for the kindness they had shown to Jesus, feeding him when hungry, clothing him when naked, visiting him when sick. When they asked

"Lord, when did we do this for you?" he replied, "whenever you did it for one of these, my brothers and sisters, however poor, you did it for me". I hope that reminder will encourage us all to give all the help we can afford to those who have so little.

May our generous and loving God bless our generous acts to bring joy and hope to others.

Edlesborough W.I.

A letter from the Parish Council was read out at our last meeting, thanking us for the gift of an electric cooker for use in the Memorial Hall.

Tony Maisey, our speaker, was making a return visit. 'Talking to Children' was the title of his talk this time. Tony is a retired G.P., and it was obvious he must have been very understanding when dealing with children in his surgery. In his opinion children should be treated with as much respect as adult patients. They should not be ignored in favour of speaking to parents, and eye contact should be made when talking to them. He felt doctors should be honest about treatment which the child needed and explain why, on some occasions, it was best to wait and see if anything should be done.

It was pointed out by Tony how often children misunderstand phrases used by adults. For instance, if an operation is needed the anaesthetic should not be described as being 'put to sleep'. Young minds can interpret this as being put down like a pet animal, which naturally would be very frightening. A child will often be scared of a stethoscope, so Tony would let a young person hold it on his own chest in the first place, making him feel safe. He never told a child a certain treatment would not hurt, but that it would hurt a little. A doctor gains the trust of his young

patient in this way. Another sure way of putting a child at ease in the surgery is to acknowledge his age. The quarter, half and three quarters are extremely important at that stage in life!!

What an understanding person Tony must have been when dealing with his young patients.

The Office of Fair Trading (OFT) is sending out a mass mailing of mock scam letters telling people that they have won a huge sum of money. A total of 20,000 letters are being posted to members of the public in the Midlands, South East England, North East England and Wales.

The mock letter is designed to look like the type of scam that the OFT seeks to tackle. On the back of the letter there is a statement telling people that the letter is an OFT warning and that there is no real prize.

The mailing is designed to alert people to the sort of language and tactics used in scams and is part of the OFT scams Awareness Month, launched on 2 February. The OFT issued a press release about scams on Monday 19 February.

The Budget & Inheritance Tax

The Budget increased the Inheritance Tax 'nil rate band' to £300,000.

Whilst each of us can now have an estate of up to £300,000 free of 40% inheritance tax, couples who are married, in a civil partnership or are intending to be either, and own their home in joint ownership, will loose the tax free entitlement of the first partner to die at the time of their death i.e. reducing the couple' joint entitlement from £600,000 to £300,000.

However, with the RIGHT Wills a Couple can overcome this situation and save their family £120,000. (£120,000 is 40% of £300,000). N.B. This can apply to those widowed in the past 2 years.

WILLS & HOME OWNERSHIP:

For many couples most of their estate is held in the value of their house. To avoid inheritance tax couples who own their homes in joint names usually need to change the house ownership from joint names to ownership in Tenancy in Common, <u>and</u> have a discretionary will trust facility structured into their Wills. The trust provides the option to preserve the first to die's 'nil rate band' entitlement so that on the survivor's death both the survivor's and that of the first to die's 'nil rate band' applies, i.e. £600,000 today. A figure that can be expected to increase each year.

Married and civil partners who already own their home in tenancy in common and have an estate of over £300,000 still need to have Wills that include a discretionary will trust to avoid inheritance tax.

Owning your House in Tenancy in Common will also:

Make the Best Provision for Any Children. Ownership in Tenancy in Common not only avoids or saves over £100,000 in inheritance tax, but it also gives the best protection for any children. After the first death, the house's shared ownership is between the survivor and trustees nominated by the survivor, which can include themselves and their children. The trust is typically for the benefit of the children and is arranged so that the surviving partner has life possession of the house, etc. This arrangement guarantee's the children a minimum of half the house's value no matter what future action or new relationship the survivor makes, yet protects the survivor's own interest in the need to live in or dispose of the house. The children receive their inheritance of half the value of the house on the death of the survivor or earlier if agreed between the parties.

Avoid the Sale of the Home to Cover Long Term Care Fees. When a house is in shared ownership – survivor and trust - it is very difficult for any local authority to enforce a sale of the house to pay for long term care fees.

News for Northall Residents from Edlesborough Parish Council CLOSURE of A4146

The Clerk has been informed by Buckinghamshire County Council that an Order has been made which will temporarily prohibit any vehicle from proceeding, except for access, in that length of the A4146 Leighton Road, Northall in the Parish of Edlesborough, which commences at its junction with Slapton Lane and continues to its junction with Eaton Bray Road.

The alternative route for vehicles affected by the closure will be via A505, B488 to Ivinghoe, B489 to Edlesborough and A4146 and vice versa. The alternative route for Heavy Goods Vehicles will be via A515, A5 and B489.

The closure is required whilst carriageway resurfacing works take place and it is anticipated that the works will take place between 1900 hours on 30 May 2007 and 0600 hours on 1 June 2007.

The Order will come into operation on 30 May 2007 when the appropriate signs are lawfully displayed and will continue in force for a period of 18 months or until the works have been completed, whichever is the earlier.

Penalties for not observing these restrictions will be as prescribed by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.



"All day the colours had been those of dusk, mist moving like a water creature across the great flanks of mountains possessed of ocean shadows and depths. Briefly visible above the vapour, Kanchenjuna was a far peak whittled out of ice, gathering the last of the light, a plume of snow blown high by the storms at its summit". On reading this first paragraph of the book, we all agreed that there was some wonderful descriptive language used in this Booker Prize winning novel, the second novel by the author.

After reading more of Inheritance some of us felt it could have been shorter, with so many vivid characters it leaps around in time and space and occasionally gets unfocussed. Kiran Desai set the novel in Kalimpong because she spent part of her childhood there staying with an aunt, Desai explains "I wanted to capture what it means to grow up in such a fascinating place, with such wonderfully disparate people, and to depict how we never really try to understand what life is like for other people. "High in the Himalayas, the story centres on three people and one dog living together in an ancient house. There's the embittered, reptilian judge, lost in his memories: of a youth spent at Cambridge; of humiliation in a foreign land. Staving with him are his beloved dog Mutt and his 17 year old granddaughter Sai, who was orphaned as a child. The judge's cook, who manages the household, and a few neighbours, round off the cast. As the story unfolds, insurgency is growing in the region: the Indian Napalese want their own country or state, where they will not be treated as servants; young boys, trying to be men, roam the mountainside looting houses, collecting ammunition. Their predicament is contrasted against the Indians settled abroad, stumbling from one job to another in a humorous parallel narrative.

The author tried to show what life is like for other people in cultures very different from ours, some leaving seeking a better life and how those returning find it difficult to be accepted again. It is a novel about contemporary immigrant life and the on going parallel world left behind. It has depth and emotion, humour and imagination, moments holding out the possibility of hope or betrayal.

A couple of us thoroughly enjoyed this book but generally the group found it difficult to get into and generally a little disappointing. They also thought the characters and scenes in the book were "snapshots" and lacked depth.

As a group we would not read anything else by this author, although the writer of this review would!

Highlights from the Minutes of the Eaton Bray Parish Council Meeting - Held on 2nd April 2007 at 7.30pm

At a recent meeting with Mrs. Hounslow, Head Teacher of Eaton Bray Lower School, it transpired that to move further ahead with the nursery project, the school needs confirmation of the Parish Council's consent, in principle only at this stage, to the installation of a new gateway into the school premises from School Lane Rec.

The Council agreed unanimously to give consent in principle, with the provision that the installation of the gate must not cause any restrictions to the future use of the park.

An email has been received from the Tennis Club, reporting that work on the courts is due to be finished in June and inviting the Parish Council to the official opening which is to be celebrated with a "Play Day" for all villagers to come and "have a go". Also requesting the PC to allow access to the park for a few vehicles on the day, and assuming responsibility for any damage to the grounds.

PC Dady addressed the meeting and reported seven minor crimes for March:

- 1 x attempted theft of motor vehicle
- 2 x criminal damage
- 4 x thefts from motor vehicles

The Council told PC Dady that the main areas of concern in the village are:

- 1. Strangers wandering around the village and onto private property.
- 2. Speeding traffic.
- 3. A youth has been seen hanging around the school, and damaging local trees.
- 4. The apparent easy availability of drugs.

PC Dady gave contact details for the Safer Neighbourhood Team, it was suggested that an insert for Focus magazine could be produced to distribute this information so that residents know who to report anything suspicious to.

Bower Lane field:

The GP committee have considered the application to rent this land, and advise the Council to reject the request.

Traffic calming:

All the advice received has been to pursue the installation of Vehicle Activated

Signs as the most suitable traffic calming measure, with the preferred sites being in the vicinity of the Methodist Chapel and at the bottom end of Bower Lane.

The next step is a meeting to consider different designs of VAS.

Bee-keeping- the season started well...

The hives were active in middle of March with bees bringing pollen and nectar from mainly willow trees.

At the end of the month the weather changed and for a long week it became cold and miserable, bees do not like this kind of weather, (neither do I) they need something above 12C plus to get out, so they stayed home!

These 'weather changes' at this time of the year can be dangerous for the hive. Encouraged by earlier warm weather, the queen bee gets very active laying eggs so space and food is needed to support the rapid expansion in the hive, some times the bees have to be fed with foundation (candy) to avoid starvation.

There is not much forage at the moment just enough to keep the bees going. I have nevertheless removed the winter mouse guards from the hive entrances and added two suppers per hive so everything is ready for the first big honey flow of the season, the flowering rape (weather permitting of course).

We are entering the allergy season that brings so much misery to so many of people. It is a well known fact that taking local honey alleviates allergy symptoms. Bees collect pollen, nectar, propolis and other substances from the local flora and the theory is that by taking local honey, you are introducing these substances that you are allergic to. It is a slow process as it is done in small doses but your body should build up an immunity to the allergy. It is a kind of vaccination and I guess that make sense.

Nonetheless, the dance floor remained practically full for most of the evening so hats off to Jim and his band, they do know how to play a good gig! A raffle followed a brief break in the drumming, during which the Chairman's wife won first prize (always happens; I think next time we'll just deliver the top prize to their house beforehand to save the hassle of bringing it down to the hall), before it was back to Jim's big band to close off the evening with some nice romantic slow numbers, with lots of drumming.

For those interested in trivia, the longest singles match in recorded tennis history took place at the 2004 French Open when Fabrice Santoro defeated Arnaud Clement 6-4; 6-3; 6-7; 3-6; 16-14. The match lasted for 6 hours and 35 minutes of actual play, and was spread over 2 days due to it getting dark at the end of the first day!



Rogation Days are the three days preceding Ascension Day. Ascension Day commemorates the visible rising of Jesus Christ to heaven; and they all occur in this month; 17th - 18th - 19th and Sunday 20th of May.

On rogation days the Roman Catholic Church sung or recited special litanies, to invoke a blessing on the years growing crops; some church's congregations would undertake a farm walk, with the Clergy blessing the fields and animals as they went.

Rogation: The farmer and his workers did "farm walking" every day, summer and winter. A popular image in the past was of the farmer leaning on a gate staring at his fields, with a faithful dog sitting beside him. The atmosphere sedate and noticeably quiet! But May is an 'outdoor workday' month for those on farms, (apart from milking and sheep shearing); it is said that unless weeds are killed off in May they will never be properly subdued all summer. Grass means that livestock can live outdoors night and day. Growth of everything is rapid at this season of the year, and lighter evenings make for longer working days.

It is good to walk, for then we can commune with all we see. As Christians we walk in the way of the Lord as best we can.

Jesus walked; He made the lame to walk; with Him we can walk along in timeless friendship, with the knowledge that He died, but rose again and ascended into heaven there to sit at God's right hand. Psalm 119 v.35; in The New Living Bible states,

"Make me walk along the path of your commands, for that is where my happiness is found."

"And did those feet in ancient time, walk upon England's mountains green? And was the Holy Lamb of God on England's pleasant pastures seen?"

More towns, more buildings, all impressive. Jaipur, also known as the Pink City, had magnificent buildings too, many based on astronomical themes, and the largest statues made of silver in the world – as confirmed by the Guinness Book of Records

Travelling was by both train and car; the train having three classes, - 1st with individual carriages; 2nd advertised as having 'chairs' and, surprise, surprise, 3rd – no chairs! Passengers alighted from both sides of the train, with or without a platform!! Also interesting, travelling by car, as most drivers seemed to drive on the shady side of the road, in which ever direction they were progressing.

Nigel's photography is excellent and this was very evident when they reached Ranthambore Tiger Sanctuary. Two trips a day produced wonderful pictures of birds, flowers, other animals and eventually an elusive tiger very well

camouflaged by the undergrowth but seen clearly through the long range lens.

Then to Goa, and a more relaxed life style, very different from the hustle and bustle of the cities. The whole village becomes involved in the catch by using a large circular net and pulling it on to the beach, where it is cooked in the many food shacks on the beach and eaten immediately. No-one goes hungry in that region.
