Last year the Open Gardens Afternoon brought pleasure to many people and raised a remarkable sum of money for Kagando Hospital in Uganda. Building on this success we are pleased to offer another Open Gardens Afternoon on Sunday, 10 June, this time in aid of our Church Roof Fund and this year's Parish project, the Chilterns Multiple Sclerosis Centre. I want to express our thanks to the kind people who are allowing us to invade their privacy end enjoy their gardens, and invite *FOCUS* readers to come along for a wonderful afternoon and contribute to two very worthwhile charities.

Gardens are special places, oases of peace and pleasure, and for many an escape from the pressures of the world. For some they are truly a sanctuary – there is an old saying "you are nearer to God in a garden". There is truth in that, for the joy of the garden gives us a sense of wonder at the beauty God has created. But it causes me some concern because it can make God a comfort zone into which we retreat from the harsher realities of life, and the God Jesus reveals to us is a God who is deeply committed to our world and every aspect of its complex life.

In the Bible, the garden does indeed represent paradise, but the Garden of Eden story shows how even in idyllic surroundings pride and rebellion can assert themselves, and human beings are so easily led astray. There are two other garden stories in the Bible we should think about. It was in a garden (Gethsemane) that Jesus struggled with his human frailty to consecrate himself to the path of suffering to reveal the full wonder of God's saving love, when he died on the cross to break the stranglehold of sin and death over us. And it was in a garden, close by Calvary, that the risen Jesus first appeared to his followers to show them he had been raised from the dead to open up God's new future – eternal life – for the whole human race. Those gardens have definitely brought us nearer to God.

I am reminded also of a well-known carol, which sees us as King Jesus's garden. It lists the virtues that ought to characterize our lives – chastity, humility, patience, obedience, and, above all, charity – and pictures them as the flowers we cultivate. In so many busy lives these qualities can easily become neglected – unnourished, unwatered and choked with weeds – and wither away. So, as we enjoy other

people's gardens, or work away in our own, can we spare a bit of thought and effort for the cultivation of our own personalities to encourage the growth of positive virtues in our own lives, and so make our little corner of God's world a little more like the paradise it was always meant to be?

Because Romania has just joined the EU, people like Alex Bruda, Director of Biblia Pentru Toti, has had to spend a lot of money on, for example, having health and safety inspections, which has cost him over £300, money which he could not really afford.

So I feel led to help in a small way; to help Alex to do the job which he loves doing, which is telling

children and young people about the love that God has for them.

I look forward to seeing as many people as possible on 16th June.





#### Chairman's Report for Edlesborough Annual Parish Meeting 19th April 07 - My report covers the period May 06 - April 07

Your Parish Council is made up of 3 Wards Edlesborough Northall and Dagnall. 5 Councilors represent Edlesborough Ward; they are John Wilkinson, David Brown, Marilyn Pryce-Jones, Julie Ratheram and Steve Munday. Northall Ward has 2 representatives, Councilors Kevin Cubbage who is Vice chairman of the Parish Council & Phil Conacher. Dagnall Ward also has 2 representatives; Councilors Karen Coppen and me, Anne Thompson. Cllrs John Wilkinson, Phil Conacher & Karen Coppen are responsible for all planning issues in their respective wards. We are all supported by our industrious Clerk, Lin Sergeant, who deals with all telephone calls, correspondence, burials and the every day business activities of the Council. This past 12 months has been a positive and successful period for the Parish Council with many projects taking a huge step forward, or being completed. I will enlarge on some of these issues later in my report. To achieve these results every member of this council, including the clerk works tirelessly on your behalf and for that I personally thank them.

I would also like to mention and thank our County Councilor Avril Davies and District Councilor Pauline Hannelly. Both these ladies contribute a huge amount of time and effort to our Parish.

#### **Committees**

<u>General Purposes Committee:</u> chaired by Cllr David Brown comprises Councilors Marilyn Pryce-Jones Vice Chair; Steve Munday, Kevin Cubbage, John Wilkinson, myself and two co-opted non voting members, Sue & John Parker. Our Clerk Lin records the minutes. This committee continues to do sterling work, responsible for making decisions on the Churchyard/Cemetery, Memorial Hall, allotments, lighting and open spaces, thus reducing the time spent in full council when these decisions are ratified. Some of their decisions will be commented on later in my report.

**Aylesbury Vale Local Committee:** These meetings are run by Bucks C.C. and cover all the issues that are dealt with by them in the Vale of Aylesbury. Cllr John Wilkinson attends these meetings on our behalf. John continues to pursue the legality of the no repeater signs decision through the High Street in Edlesborough; he has also campaigned for white edge lines on the Bucks section of the A4146, Bucks being the only County on the A4146 not to provide this type of road marking. I am pleased to report that due to John's persistence this was finally agreed at the last meeting and will be implemented at the same time as the dragon teeth markings on the A4146 Northall/Edlesborough boundary. Without John's input at these meetings we, as a Parish, would simply be put at the back of the queue for 'getting things done' so we thank you John and look forward to your continuing presence on this committee.

Local Cluster meeting: This is a group run by County Cllr Avril Davies and is a

very useful smaller version of the local committee as it covers Avril's constituency of which we are part. Any local problems are raised and discussed at this meeting.

**Neighborhood Action Groan:** South Wing NAG meetings are a Thames Valley Police run group which deal with problems in our local community. Our representatives are The Clerk, Cllr Wilkinson and myself. The format of these meetings is about to change so these will be reported on at forthcoming Council meetings.

**Parish Plan:** I am pleased to report that this project, championed by Cllr Karen Coppen & initially Cllr Kevin Cubbage, is now up and running, A steering committee has been formed, comprising local residents and hopefully 1 Parish Councilor from each of the three villages The committee is chaired by Ms E Braider, a parishioner and has been called the EDaN project. This is YOU the parishioners plan supported by the Parish Council and we look forward to lots of interesting things happening in the very near future. PAIN is the very important group which looks after our interests with regards to any Luton Airport issues and for this we continue to support them. Cllr John Wilkinson is the council's representative. You can rest assured that any future development plans for the Airport will quickly be addressed by PAIN.

**www.edlesborough.gov.uk:** is in its very successful 4th year. The success of this website is due entirely to one man's efforts. He has maintained and kept the site updated since its inauguration, it has always been his 'baby' and that man is, of course, Cllr Kevin Cubbage.

We had many problems in the early part of last year caused by our Web provider but as I'm sure you've all noticed the site is back up and running thanks to Kevin's doggedness. Without Kevin's massive input this site would not be the triumph it is, so Kevin many sincere thanks.

**Churchyard/Cemetery:** Discussions are still taking place with the Church Conservation Trust about various issues. Plans have been agreed for upgrading the entrance and access to our Cemetery through the grounds of the old Churchyard in an aesthetic and sympathetic way. We have agreed to fund this initial work up to £15,000. To complete the project, the next stage will be to provide a turning circle so enabling the Hearse and mourners to access and exit the cemetery with dignity and ease. I would like to thank Canon Malcolm Grant, S. R. Dillamore Ltd Funeral Directors, the families of the three graves involved in this project and the advisor and architect from the CCT for their help, advice and contribution to make these very important plans come to fruition. It is envisaged works will start in the forthcoming summer months. We have recently commenced work in the cemetery to make it a fully functional lawn cemetery. The contractor has also removed ivy from the trees so they will be able to flourish and the hedge has been reset where necessary. I am pleased to report favorable comments have been received with reference to the contractor's ongoing work.

Burial and internment fees have been increased in line with other cemeteries in the area, a list of the fees can be found on our website.

<u>Allotments:</u> Allotments throughout the Parish continue to be well used; there are still plots available in all three villages. Funding has been agreed by Safer Routes for School for the footpath through Dagnall allotments for the accompanied village children to walk to school during term time, the work should be carried out this summer making it much safer than along the A4146. Once again I would like to thank Dagnall Gardeners Society for being such an asset to our community, supplying everything any gardener needs. If ever you want a chat about anything to do with gardening or anything else for that matter the Gardening hut on a Sunday morning is the place to be.

Edlesborough Memorial Hall: The hall continues to be well used by a large range of local organisations. The new floor is being laid at this present time and I would like to thank the under 5's and the other regular users for their patience and understanding during this period of unforeseen delays. But removing all the hazardous materials and having a much more user friendly surface can only be a huge plus for the Parish. Progressing well under the watchful eve of the Chairman of the General Purpose Committee Cllr David Brown and our Clerk Lin the works should be completed week commencing 7th May. The cost is in the region of £17,000. Thanks to Cllr Brown who on behalf of the PC has secured funding to the tune of £15.000 for this project, £5,000 from Aylesbury Vale D.C. and £10,000 from the Lottery Awards for All fund. The result of which has left us with reserves for future projects within the hall, thank you David. This year we also funded the fencing of an outside play area for the under 5's so providing them with a much needed facility. We continued to support Dagnall and Northall halls with a donation of  $\pounds 1,000$  each, to help with their everyday running and maintenance costs. Due to the amount of articles submitted for this month's Focus, the 2nd half of this report will be included in the July edition of Focus.

#### **Edlesborough W.I.**

Our recent Members' Night was held in Edlesborough School, as new flooring was being installed in our usual venue, the Memorial Hall. Vivienne Grundy was thanked for holding our recent coffee morning at her home, when £275 was raised for the Iain Rennie Hospice at Home. Sue Parker was thanked also for the report she gave at a recent Beacon Group Meeting.

The main part of the evening had been arranged by Brenda Shields. On Members' Night the Committee hand over to other members who plan the evening. Brenda and her helpers had done a grand job. To start off, we were presented with lovely spray orchids, in appreciation of our efforts during the year. Also included were June Morton and Jill Paton who set out the Memorial Hall before each meeting. Brenda's thanks went also to the ladies who were helping her that evening.

Joyce Corless was introduced by Brenda as our speaker. She gave us an insight into Milton Keynes Theatre - an extremely interesting talk. Joyce is a G.S.R. (Group Sales Rep.) working for the theatre. There are ten G.S.R's, all covering their own districts; Joyce covers Luton & Dunstable. They promote the theatre, and encourage people to go there. Part of their work involves watching shows elsewhere and inviting other groups to Milton Keynes Theatre.

The theatre belongs to the Ambassador Theatre Group which is the largest in the West End and second largest in the U.K. Regions. Milton Keynes Theatre opened on 4th October, 1999 after twenty-five years' planning. Originally it was the dream of Sean Hennessey, a Council member. Sadly, he died aged only fifty-three, and never saw the building. The Hennessey Rehearsal Room is named after him. Similarly, Margaret Powell Square remembers a lady & her family who gave many donations and carried out numerous acts of good work. Milton Keynes Gallery, Metro Restaurant and Milton Keynes Orchestra all run separately from the theatre.

There are a number of facilities which help disabled visitors to the theatre: extra wide doors, ramps, wheelchair spaces, help for the deaf and visually impaired. Joyce described the decor: blue ceilings, green carpets, rough brick foyer, use of glass to give a view into and out of the building. The ceiling can be raised or lowered according to the sound needed. In fact, it can cover the circle area. The size of the stage can be changed, and there are fourteen trapdoors. Scenery and drapes are connected by ropes to a fly tower. These are all numbered, so can be pulled individually. The saying 'dropping like flies' originated with reference to these, not insects. Another phrase - 'in the limelight' - goes back to the time when lime was placed along the front of the stage and burned to give light.

A busy activity backstage is the cleaning and drying of costumes and wigs. When a new company arrives, wardrobe boxes containing dirty clothes are unloaded directly from lorries into the back of the theatre. Special effects also come with each group. There are fourteen dressing rooms, and dressers are employed to help with change of clothes during performances. This is particularly fast for dames in panto, who have at least twelve costume changes in one performance.

It was really interesting to learn how much backstage work occurs in order to run each performance in the theatre. Following this, tea and delicious cakes were served and Phrena, our President, thanked all concerned for the very enjoyable evening. Val Harris



#### Edlesborough Book Group Cold Comfort Farm by Stella Gibbons



Stella Gibbons, a journalist, wrote this, her first novel, after only publishing a book of poetry. She viewed the rural novels of the time with disdain and wrote this as a parody of the, as she saw it, florid prose and romanticised characterisation of the countryside that they portrayed in that genre.

The heroine of the story is Flora Poste, a well educated and well connected young lady, living in London with a very merry widow as her chaperone. When Flora's parents die, leaving her with a small allowance on which to live, she decides that she must approach various relatives with a view to becoming a semi permanent guest. She decides to live with her cousins at Cold Comfort Farm. On arrival, she discovers that the farm and its occupants live up to its name and the thrust of the novel lies in the contrast between the cool headedness of Flora and her mission to organise and restore order from chaos; and the shambolic Starkadder family, who are ruled over by the fearsome matriarch Ada Doom, who manages to control the whole family from her bedroom and is held in awe by all. Everyone appears to accept her ruling that no one can ever leave, "because, there have always been Starkadders at Cold Comfort Farm". Judith Starkadder and her husband Amos run the farm with their sons Seth and Reuben and a supporting cast of typical rural characters. Flora succeeds in disentangling the web of psychological complexes and dysfunctional behaviour and solves each cousin's individual problem, bringing about happy endings for everyone including herself.

The group was divided in its approach to the book inasmuch as some had read it a long time ago and remembered it with great affection and the rest, who were all familiar with the story but had never read the book. So, for all of us, its reputation had gone before it and we had been told ,"it is a brilliantly funny book,"which is hard for the novel to live up to. At the meeting we were even more divided in our opinions. There were those who had reread it and still thought it was a brilliantly funny book. Those, who on second reading, found it dated and did not enjoy it. There were new readers that had appreciated the sly and socio-political humour and those who did not find it all funny.

We all found the characters well drawn and enjoyed the way that the purple prose was signposted with an asterisk. There were some wonderful set pieces, a ball at the local manor house and a country wedding and the fictional dialect was wonderfully realised. But, a very divided group at the end of the evening with no overall winning opinion. It would appear to be a book that has to be read by the individual and only he or she can decide whether or not it is "brilliantly funny.

#### WILLS -Top Ten Tips

**1.** Choose who draws up your Will wisely: You can make your own Will using a DIY kit but the process is full of pitfalls and errors are easy to make. Lawyers make more money sorting out badly drafted Wills and dealing with claims against those Wills, than they make for drawing up wills. Your Will is a key component in your financial planning and an essential record of your wishes. DIY is OK for home improvements, but it's not for Wills. Use a specialist solicitor.

**2. Choose your executors well:** Executors are responsible for exercising your estate in accordance with your instructions. It is a responsible and demanding role, and can involve large sums of money. Also make sure the people you choose are happy with the role.

**3. Appoint a default or substitute executor:** If you are married you will probably want your spouse to be your executor, but don't appoint them as your sole executor. If you both died together e.g. in a car accident, neither of you would have an executor living. Always appoint a default or substitute executor in case your spouse is unwilling or unable to act.

**4. Appoint guardians:** If you are the last living parent and you die leaving children under age 18, a guardian will be appointed by the court if you have not specified who this should be in your will. If you are unmarried but you and your partner have children, you might not even get guardianship of your children. If an unmarried man dies, his female partner automatically gets guardianship of their children, but if an unmarried woman dies, her male partner does not. Appoint each other as guardians in your wills to overcome this problem.

**5. Appoint trustworthy trustees:** This might sound obvious, but if you are setting up a trust in your will or if your beneficiaries could be aged under 18 when you die, you will need to appoint trustees. Trustees will be responsible for managing and investing money, or looking after property until it passes to the beneficiaries, so make sure they are people with a good grasp of financial matters.

**6. Make specific legacies:** If you want to preserve family heirlooms or items of special sentimental value, (for example, a grandfather clock, or a wedding or engagement ring), you should leave these items as a specific legacy to a named beneficiary.

**7. Leave a residual legacy:** The 'residue' is what is left over in your estate after you have made any specific legacies. You must specify who this goes to, as if you fail to do so, you will create a partial intestacy in your will. In other words, the small gifts and legacies would pass according to the Will, but the residue is subject to the intestacy laws.

**8. Beat the Tax Man:** 40% Inheritance tax is an increasing burden for many families, e.g. where the value of a property pushes the value of a couple's joint estate above £300,000. If you are married, recently widowed or civil partners you can include a discretionary trust in your Wills, which could save the family up to

 $\pounds$ 120,000 in inheritance tax at current rates AND give children and the home the best protection.

**9. Sign your will:** It's all very well having your Will drafted, but if you don't sign it in front of two independent witnesses, it will not be valid. A witness cannot be anyone mentioned in the will or anyone married to anyone mentioned in the Will.

**10. Have it stored safely:** Once your Will has been correctly signed and witnessed, have it stored in a proper safe storage facility. This will protect it from fire, flood, damage, or loss. Your executors will be provided with a certificate showing them where your Will is stored and how to get hold of it if you die. The Probate Registry will want sight of the original Will, not a copy. Whatever you do – don't hide your Will. Your will is no good to anyone if it cannot be found after your death.

#### 22<sup>ND</sup> Marathon Des Sable - My Story by Sally Thorne

My adventure started at Gatwick Airport on Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> March, when I joined 232 mad Brits all with Raidlight rucksacks, full of mixed emotions, sad at leaving my husband and children but exhilarated at the thought of finally after 20 months preparation, fulfilling my dream of competing in the toughest foot race on earth.

We arrived in Morocco and the first night was spent in a 5 star hotel, this was my last taste of luxury for the next 8 days.

Day 1: Next morning at 9.15am six coaches arrived to take the British competitors on a six hour trip to the bivouac at Jebel Irhs. Bearing in mind we are all drinking as much water as possible, the French organisers in their wisdom refused to stop the coaches for a comfort break until lunch time, 3+ hours into the journey, this was our first experience of having no toilet facilities, no trees, no boulders, no anything, just sand and 232 cross-legged Brits. After another 3 hours on the coach excitement erupted as we caught sight of our camp in the distance. The coaches stopped and we all disembarked to be herded like cattle onto Moroccan army trucks with our suitcases, rucksacks and litres upon litres of bottled water, to be transported to checkpoint 1 for registration. We were the first to arrive and were directed to our so-called tents! My tent was number 76 and my companions for the duration of the marathon were 4 men and 3 other girls, little did we know then of the strong bond that would be formed by complete strangers over the next 8 days and how important this friendship would become. After polite introductions we sorted out our gear and had our first lesson in queuing, in fact we queued for everything from water, to seeing doctors, dentists, to send our one allowed email, in fact the only thing we didn't queue for was toilets as there was ample sand for everyone.

Our first magic night under the stars in the desert was soon turned into turmoil as

the first of many sandstorms hit, a quick lesson was learnt that night to always sleep with your sand goggles on and always put your kit away safely. After 6 hours trying to hold onto the tent and 3 hours sleep day 3 was upon us. At this point I must thank Moira D'Arcy and St Judes for providing me with the best sleeping bag ever. I was the only one in our tent that was not shivering in the freezing night time conditions. Day 2: The whole day was spent going through rigorous medical and kit checks. One by one all 760 competitors, made up from 33 nationalities, had their rucksacks weighed. The minimum weight is set at 6.5Kg, I wish! Mine was a staggering 13Kg, only 2Kg below the maximum allowed. That night we had our last real meal before moving over to the delights of dehydrated food.

Day 3: Self-sufficiency began the next day with the first stage of the race a gentle 30km. After another cold night and sand storm 757 competitors set off in high spirits. All went well, a super day and after 6 hours in temperatures of 43° and humidity at 14% I was 4<sup>th</sup> back to tent 76 and with tomorrow's stage being an extra 7km up a 25% difficult climb. I knew I had to reduce the weight of my rucksack as my back was breaking. My tent mate Paul decided to do a cull which included my mess tin (as I could borrow his), this I would live to regret. Some clothing, medical supplies and my sleeping bag liner, which I noted he used!

Day 4 Stage 2: I started off at a good jogging pace and got to checkpoint 1 in good time, but made my first mistake by not taking enough time out to rest and didn't take enough salt tablets. After 18km I started the 1<sup>st</sup> of 2 steep climbs I soon became nauseous and faint so had to stop and many competitors passed me including my tent mates Paul & Lee. This was my 1<sup>st</sup> of many lows and I shed a few tears. But then Jo appeared, another girl from our tent, and literally dragged me to checkpoint 2. I took on some more water and salt tablets; met up with the boys and we all set off together. After 15 minutes I hit a real high but stayed with Jo and the boys as they were now struggling. We completed the big climb pulling ourselves up on ropes. By the time we reached the top we were losing light fast and only had 90 minutes to complete this stage, the adrenalin rush was immense we just ran and ran, up and over the sand dunes to reach base 3. It was now dark but the camp had seen four lights appearing over the dunes and news travelled fast and the whole camp clapped us in, it was the greatest feeling I was to experience; and unfortunately it was downhill from now on.



#### Mothers' Union, Eaton Bray With Edlesborough

On Wednesday, 11<sup>th</sup> April Lillian Appleby from Dunstable showed the Mothers' Union a small part of her collection of over seven hundred and fifty thimbles.

The Romans made the earliest thimbles and one found at Verulamium is on show at the museum in St. Albans. Thimbles are most usually made from metal, leather, rubber, wood, glass or china. Originally thimbles were used to push needles through fabric or leather, and particularly by sailors when making sails, but now thimbles are made for commemorative, advertising and decorative purposes.

In the 19<sup>th</sup> century many thimbles were made from silver and 'Dorcas' thimbles, made by Charles Horner, who had strengthened the soft metal by using a steel core covered inside and out with silver, are very popular with collectors. The Thimble Guild produces a monthly book for collectors with information on new and old thimbles.

As an example of the different types of thimble which have been produced, the first one Mrs. Appleby showed was one made of chalk, with a picture of the white cliffs of Dover on it, followed by one made of coal – showing a picture of a coal mine! The ingenuity of thimble makers became evident when she produced thimbles made of cane, crocheted yarn, wood (one particularly special one from Jerusalem made of olive wood) Indian wood with brass inlay, minute beads, enamel with wire, hand blown glass, varnished papier-mâché – the list seems endless. From the nineteenth century thimbles have been produced by the great porcelain makers – Wedgwood, Sevres, Limoge, Meissen.

It seems almost anything can be commemorated with a thimble – and Mrs. Appleby's collection proved it – royal occasions: the Queen's 80<sup>th</sup> birthday, Jubilee, the Princess of Wales Memorial

Foundation: Counties; stamps and bank notes – a Penny Black 1840; a five pound note; important dates; Olympic Games 1948; V.E. Day, St. George's Day; the life of Richard Whiteley 1943-2005, and many many more. All beautifully decorated, and interesting to see how many different categories and events in our lives are recalled and remembered in this miniature way.

Collecting something small and interesting which can easily be displayed is an obvious advantage, but Mrs. Appleby did admit that the most difficult thing about her collection is the dusting! 61



#### **Bee-keeping Look Out For Swarms....**

Spring started early this year with rape, flowers and blossom in full bloom by the beginning of April. I extracted honey by the middle of the month, four weeks earlier than last year - global warming?

The weather until now has been good for bees with warm sunny days although as I am writing it is about to change, mind you we could do with some rain.

I have the clearing boards in the hives and hopefully I will be extracting some rape honey by Saturday the 5th of May.

Rape and ivy honey sets very quickly, so to avoid the honey setting in the comb it has to be extracted before the honey is fully capped (sealed), the norm is that honey should extracted when the frame is no less than 3/4 sealed but with rape and ivy it has to be done earlier.

I collected my first swarm of the year from Caddington of all places. It was massive and on top of a tree, a bit of a difficult job as I had to cut several branches to get to it and all of this on top of a ladder (the things we do for love). I placed my skep (straw basket that Victorians used as beehives) on top of the swarm, I smoked them a bit and the whole swarm crawled inside the skep, mind you it took two hours. They are now happily settle in one of my empty hives.

Skeps are ideal for swarm collection as the bees can breath through the gaps and crawl about the place avoiding overheating that can easily kill them, especially on hot days.

Bees will swarm from a hive to somewhere near, most times it will be a tree branch where they will hang in a kind of ball for several hours to several days. Bee scouts will look around the country side for a permanent home favouring dark and reasonably large places with small entrances. It is the first stage of swarming that bees can be 'easily' collected, once they are settled inside a tree trunk or a chimney things get difficult.

We are entering the swarm season so I have in place several 'bite hives", that is

empty hives with narrow entrances and inside a couple of old combs hoping to catch wandering swarms.

Roll on summer!
