"Kneel here, hamshira. And look down. One last time Mariam did as she was told.." As I write this "A Thousand Splendid Suns" is on top of the best seller charts and I am sure many of you remember this quotation, I know I will.

Mariam is an harami, an illegitimate child who only sees her adored father once a week. On those precious days they go fishing, he reads to her and gives her beautiful presents but she can never live with him. Her mother hangs herself, she, Mariam, has an arranged marriage and disappoints her husband, Rasheed by bearing a daughter. Rasheed takes another wife. Out of this unhappy household the two women form a strong bond which will endure beyond death.

Reading this novel we all felt how fortunate we were not to have been born in Afghanistan and endure life under Taliban rule. The book moved a few of us to tears and overall we concluded it was a wonderful novel, however one of us thought Afghanistan was not brought to life as they had hoped. There is much affection for the country among the characters, but you could feel a little cut off from the sights and smells and atmosphere.

This book is an unforgettable portrait of a country in conflict and a deeply moving story of family and friendship.

St Mary's Parochial Church Council Meeting

The PCC met in February at All Saints' Church, Dagnall, following a celebration of the Eucharist.

The contract to clean the Church has been let and cleaning is now taking place on a fortnightly basis. After investigating several venues for their meetings, the Mothers' Union has decided to meet in St Mary's Church, starting in September. A lengthy discussion was held about the new flag and on which days it should be flown. It was decided that when the current flag, St George's, needs replacing it will be with one incorporating the Diocesan crest, as had been originally agreed. A Flag Day timetable was distributed and it was decided to seek a volunteer who would raise and lower the flag for the appropriate days during the year. The concensus of the Council was that the new chairs for St Mary's should be upholstered in green. The windows in the Vicarage are being replaced with double-glazed units.

An anonymous benefactor has provided sufficient funds to enable all the repairs to the Church roof to be carried out as one project, thus making the overall cost less than originally thought as ancillary costs for scaffolding, cleaning etc will be incurred only once.

The possibility of reviving the Churches Together Open Air Service was discussed and it was agreed that it would be a welcome return, with the service taking place on Edlesborough Green in September. A meeting to investigate changes to the Worship for Everyone service, normally held on the second Sunday of the month, had been held a few days earlier. A report on that meeting was given, and the first changes will be introduced for the Mothering Day service on 2nd March.

Elections for members for the next PCC will take place at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, to be held on Thursday, 24th April.

Following a short service of Holy Communion, St Mary's Church PCC met at the All Saints' Dagnall church hall on 13th March 2008.

The PCC was advised that agreement had been reached with the donors of the flag pole, that the flag of St George would henceforth be flown on specific dates, rather than continuously.


A report on the requirement for a Parish Administrator, commissioned by the PCC and written by Brian Wyke, was then discussed at length. There was clearly a heavy administrative burden, which fell disproportionately on the vicar and a small number of the congregation and, although there was a feeling that more members of the congregation would be prepared to carry out small, clearly defined administrative tasks, a considerable proportion of this workload could be transferred to a parttime administrator. Unfortunately, the PCC was unable to identify any facility where administration, such as photo copying, typing, telephoning and filing, could be carried out - regardless of whether this was by volunteers or by an administrator employed by the parish. It was agreed therefore that the Standing Committee would conduct further investigations in consultation with Brian Wyke. Discussion then turned to the next tranche of repairs to the church roof, which involved renovation of those to the Chancel and North Aisle. As a result of a huge increase in the cost of lead, the builders had increased their estimate for this work by 30%. Furthermore, the insurance company will no longer insure the lead on a church roof when scaffolding is erected round the building. It would therefore be necessary to provide a security presence during the repairs, whenever workmen were not physically on site. The total cost of the repairs had therefore increased from £87,000 to £157,000, and this was beyond our means. The PCC was therefore forced to agree that work on the Chancel roof would continue as planned, but that to the North Aisle would be deferred until additional funds had been raised. Work was scheduled to start after Easter, and be completed by 31 May 2008.

Fund raising projects included the open gardens event on 8th June, when the proceeds will be split between the church roof and Macmillan Cancer Support (St Mary's charity for 2008), an old time music hall on 28th March, a review on 10th May, the carnival on 5th July and the flower festival from 19th to 21st September. The meeting was delighted to hear that eight young people from the North

Chilterns Group were attending classes prior to confirmation on 22nd June, that All Saints' Dagnall had presented a cheque for over £2,500 to the Iain Rennie Hospice and that plans were underway to hold a parish picnic on Edlesborough Green on 10th August.

Lastly, as this was the final meeting before the Annual Parochial Church Meeting on 24th April, when a new PCC would be elected, retiring members were thanked for their contributions.

The Easter-story in the Gospels reveals a lot about the corruption of human motives. It is easy to focus on how Jesus's friends let Him down in His hour of need, when they all ran away. There is nothing complicated about their reaction to the crisis of Jesus's arrest and condemnation – they just ran away for fear of their own lives. They were on Jesus's side until cowardice destroyed their loyalty.

But what about Judas who betrayed Jesus? Did he do it just for the money? Was he trying to use his powerful contacts to force Jesus into decisive action? Had he become disillusioned with Jesus and was 'out to get Him'? We simply don't know. But whatever he was trying to do it all went terribly wrong, and he "went out and hanged himself". Judas was on his own side, pursuing his own agenda.

Look at Caiaphas the Jewish High-priest. His priority was the preservation of the uneasy compromise between the Jewish establishment and the occupying Roman forces, on which his own status and power and wealth depended. Any religious unrest would put all this in jeopardy. Jesus threatened it, and therefore Jesus had to be got rid off . "It is expedient that one man should die for the nation", Caiaphas said quite openly. It would be easy enough to have Him killed in some dark alley, but it would be better if He were disgraced – hence the collusion with the Romans to have Jesus crucified – so that no-one would ever take His teaching seriously, and it would soon be forgotten. Caiaphas wanted people to think that his concern was for the 'big picture', but it was really only a cloak to preserve his own influence and prestige. Caiaphas was on the side of power.

Or look at Pontius Pilate, the Roman Governor, the embodiment of Roman justice. He recognized that Jesus was an innocent man who was being framed by influential people. But he also recognized that if he tried to do what justice demanded he would probably have an uprising on his hands, and that would mark the end of his political career. What was one peasant religious teacher, after all? And all down the ages, the "little people" have been sacrificed because their rights prove too costly or inconvenient for the people in power. Pilate was on the side of taking the easy way out.

And the fickle crowd. One day they greeted Jesus as a hero; a few days later they were baying for His blood, whipped up by a few agitators in the pay of the religious authorities. Whose side were they on?

That's the question the story of Jesus's sufferings and death force us to face: whose side are we on? Do we have sound moral principles which we struggle to uphold even if it costs us dearly? Or are we concerned only for an easy life? Or are up for the highest bidder? The Easter story brings all our secrets out into the open. But

it doesn't stop there. After Easter the risen Jesus appeared again, alive, not to the people of power but to His own friends, and transformed their lives. The ones who ran away became the ones who travelled to distant lands to tell others about what Jesus had done for them, and almost to a man suffered cruel deaths rather than deny Him again. That is the wonder of Easter, the wonder of the new life which the resurrection of Jesus has released into our world.

But the question remains, "Whose side are you on?" MALCOLM

How to deal with dog fouling

1. Is dog fouling an offence?

There are approximately 7.4 million dogs in the UK. They produce 1,000 tonnes of excrement per day. This has to be cleaned up.

In England and Wales, the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 says that local authorities can designate most public land as 'poop scoop' area, so if dog-owners use these public areas they must clear up after their dogs.

2. Who is responsible for clearing dog fouling?

Your local authority has a legal duty to keep highways clear of dog faeces in England, Wales and Scotland under the Environmental Protection Act 1990. This includes public walkways, recreational ground and any part of the sea shore frequently used by large numbers of people.

3. What can I do about a dog fouling offence?

Take details

If you wish to take action against a dog owner who has not cleaned up after their dog, you should immediately note details of:

- Date, time and place of offence
- The name and address of the person in charge of the dog if possible
- A description of the dog

Contact the local authority

Find out which department is responsible for dog fouling offences and clearly describe the place being fouled to find what regulations are in place for that area. Make sure you find out how the authority enforces the law on dog fouling.

Most of the time the offender will be given a warning before legal action is taken. This warning may be sufficient to deter further offences.

Dog wardens

If fouling occurs at regular times, it may be possible for a dog warden or officer to witness the fouling and take action.

Local authorities can use contractors such as dog wardens to enforce the fixed penalty scheme for dog fouling. They are regarded as an effective way of tackling dog fouling problems. Their job includes:

• Enforcing the law on dogs and dog fouling and local by-laws

- Promoting responsible attitudes to dog ownership
- Handling and securing stray dogs
- Dealing with problems relating to nuisance dogs

4. Penalties for dog owners who fail to clear up England and Wales

The penalty for not clearing up dog fouling is up to $\pm 1,000$. There is also provision for a fixed penalty scheme with a fine of ± 50 .

5. Health risks of dog fouling

A recent survey by Encams said up to 16,000 people are affected by toxocariasis every year. This is a disease contracted by contact with fouling or contaminated soil and which causes 50 cases of serious eye infection and even blindness every year.

Toxocara is a roundworm which lives in the faeces of dogs, foxes and cats. Their eggs are resistant to freezing and disinfectants and can survive for two years or more.

Solutions to the problem

Encams says every owner should treat their dog with a worming preparation. Their advice is to do it regularly. They also say dog owners should clean up after their dog, using a doggy bag, and leaving it in a designated dog bin. And if there isn't one around, they should put it in a normal litter bin.

We had great pleasure in welcoming our guest speaker Mr Runnalls Davis who gave us a very interesting talk and slide show on the work carried out by women operating the narrow boats during the Second World War. Little is known of this branch of the 'war effort' in carrying out vital work, transporting essential supplies along the canal systems from 1939 until 1945.

On learning that many narrow boats had been 'tied up' because of the lack of men to operate them. A group of young ladies most of them from very affluent families, decided to man the boats. Volunteers were recruited mostly from their friends, and despite the lack of knowledge on how to do the work, received permission from 'the ministry' to operate the boats. The traditional canal boat families watched the volunteers many mistakes with much glee!

However by the end of the war the women had earned the respect of the boating families. There has never been any formal recognition of this work; all the women were ever issued with was a badge stating they were on National Service IW (inland waterways). But some wag had given them the name Idle Women, thus the title of the talk!

JGS Metalwork – A Quarter of a Century at Broomstick

May 2008 marks the 25th Anniversary of the founding of J.G.S. Metalwork. In 1983 John Sayer was asked by a neighbour if he could manufacture a car component and was given a small order. So began a search for workshops and machinery which ended at Broomstick Yard off High Street, Edlesborough, and with the generous loan of some machinery from Mike Moore, the landlord, John took a huge gamble and left his fulltime employment to become self-employed.

John has run JGS since 1983, with his son joining him several years ago. In 2007 they formed a Partnership - JGS.Metalwork & Son, with John senior concentrating on quotations and artistic ironwork and John junior on the automation systems. The office is run by Carolyn, his wife, so this is a true "family business".

Over the years, working many hours a week and weekends, John has expanded his business into more units, and added offices. Some may remember the huge crane that closed Summerleys for a while which lifted the portakabin over the roof of the Post Office, as the delivery lorry could not get through the narrow opening into the yard, then a smaller crane lifted the office into its permanent position.

Starting from the car component trade, John also made decorative ironwork, gates, railings, balconies, etc., and one day was asked to make a weathervane. This started JGS.Weathervanes which grew to over 300 designs. Weathervanes have been made for Battersea Park Children's Zoo, the Metropolitan Police, Aylesbury Vale District Council, Pensthorpe Waterfowl Park, to name a few, but many hundreds have been sold at home and abroad. JGS have given short talks on local radio and had a trip to Japan to meet clients and attended most major County Shows, from Derbyshire to Somerset, the favourite being Hampton Court Palace Flower Show, however, the concentration is now on producing gates and installing gate automation.

JGS work mostly in the local area plus North London, and over the years have made useful contacts with the building trade and word-of-mouth recommendations. The



PC Dady gave a copy of Police contacts for the area to be displayed on Parish Council noticeboards. PC Dady informed the Parish Council that the Police are dealing with issues regarding problem motorbikes asking the public to keep reporting these events and giving police as much detail/description of offenders (two bikes having already been confiscated).





Dagnall Weather Station (AONB)

After a wet January, February was on the dry side with rain mainly at the beginning and the end of the month with a total of 25 mm =1in. Although we had the coldest temperature this winter on the 17th of -6.8°c when the temperature was below 0°c for 14.5 hours, for most of the month the barometer has been high and we have had good long sunny days. On these days the temperature rose dramatically by as much as 14.0c degrees in 7 hours to maximum 15°c (See plot below). There was a total of 95.5 hours during the month when the temperature was below zero

On a different subject I am sure you saw on the TV the earthquake magnitude 5.2 in Market Racen but we did have one much closer on the 5th February in Thame in Oxfordshire of 2.0 magnitude.




Mothers' Union - Eaton Bray with Edlesborough

'On the Buses' was not exactly the title the members might have expected for a talk by the Rev. John Heffer at their February meeting, but in the seventies John decided to take a 'working sabbatical' from the priesthood.

Having been brought up on a farm and driven tractors and lorries, he worked for Boss Trucks in Leighton Buzzard and became a fork lift truck driver. Having mastered that well enough to have been presented with a proficiency certificate, he then moved to something larger – a bus!

When he first started with the bus company, he drove the bus and the conductor took care of the passengers, but when the Company introduced 'one-man' buses, he became the front man and indeed the only man, subject to the whims and vagaries of the general public, which changed his working life considerably. Not only was he now 'in charge' he had to do everything himself – sell tickets: deal with the public: change the direction boards: remember the route: drive the bus and keep to the timetable! This was quite difficult for John, as being a punctual person, he was invariably early at each stop.

His work colleagues were fully aware of his background, but still made him 'one of them' although if a certain Inspector ever had cause to comment on something to John he always started with - "as a Christian, John....." even for the smallest misdemeanour. However his popularity was proven when John gave up the buses and became the Vicar of All Saints, Leighton Buzzard and a large number of the Bus Company staff, all in their uniforms, attended his Induction Service.

Salvation Sound...April 2008

Tuesday is market day - I love to see the stalls all laid up with fruit and vegetables - but the traders of today don't like to see you touch their wares. Years ago barrowboys used to shout, "If you don't want the goods, don't muck. 'em about." This was often addressed to a really thrifty shopper who would pick up and examine everything really carefully before deciding on making a purchase. No bruised or blemished fruit for her, nothing from the back of the stall, and it had to be weighed before being placed in the bag. She took no notice of the signs saying "Don't touch me til I'm yours."

There are times when touching is appropriate, and times when it isn't. A hand on the shoulder may seem a very little thing but it can mean so much, or to hold the hand of someone who is really ill. It is a comfort to that person to know that someone is physically present and that they are not alone in whatever it is that they are facing. They may not be able to speak but just a squeeze of the hand can say far more than words. Words are sometimes very limiting. The gentle touch speaks volumes.

However there are people who cannot bear being touched, and we must respect their feelings. Is it I wonder because for some reason we British are too reserved? Perhaps that reserve is beginning to break down, for many people now greet one another with a hug or a kiss, instead of the rather nervous handshake of years ago; so maybe we are becoming less restrained.

Mary Magdalene was one of the 'touchers'. She was the first one to see Jesus after He had risen from the dead on Easter morning - she thought He was a gardener until He called her by name. Straight away she reached out for Him, but He said, "No". Instead He told her to go and tell the disciples that she had seen the risen Lord. Now hard that must have been for Mary not to have touched Jesus, and how hard it must have been for Him to forbid her. Then there was Thomas, he couldn't believe what the disciples said to him.. That is until a week later when Jesus appeared and said, "Put your finger here, and look at my hands; stretch out your hand and touch my side." (John 20:27).

Jesus knew the great value of touch and through this power helped and cured many people. If you are someone who puts God on the margins of your life try letting Him touch you, it won't be easy, but it will be so rewarding...

During his time with them he spent three weeks in the tragic village at the time of the Aberfan disaster.

Since then Peter has worked as a reporter in a number of towns, and has helped to train young people starting in this type of career. Before retirement he started a 'Cabbages and Kings' column in a local paper, and still continues with it today. These articles are all about people, and he much prefers to write about their good points rather than the bad. He considers people to be wonderful and the finest spectator sport.

Considering he had no idea what career to embark on originally, Peter had a great time carrying out his work as a local reporter. He would not enjoy it as much today, as he considers it to be mainly an office job.

Our coffee morning proved very successful, as well as enjoyable, and we raised over £183 towards the new cemetery improved access. Thanks to Maureen Shipway for housing the event. Thanks also to Linda Green for arranging a visit to Milton Keynes Theatre to see 'South Pacific', a show very much enjoyed by all concerned
