



As the result of an incredibly generous gift, we have been able to replace all the old wooden chairs with new, upholstered ones, which makes sitting in church much more comfortable. Why don't you come along to a service and try them for yourselves? The new chairs link together easily and can easily be separated, and this allows us to use the space inside the church much more flexibly. We want to be able to use the church for a wider range of events, and this is now possible. So we offer our heartfelt thanks to the kind benefactors who have made this possible.

We have just received permission to proceed with our plans for a new pulpit in the church, and we hope to have this completed some time in the new year. Since the old pulpit became unsafe, we have been using a temporary construction, which was built as a prototype for the new one, and from the use of which we have been able to make significant improvements in the design. The new design does not have any effect on the quality of what is spoken from it! But this will mark another significant step forward in our plans to make our wonderful 13th century church more user-friendly in the twenty-first.

It is important that we care for the fabric of our church. It is an integral part of the heritage of our community, and we want to be able to hand it on to future generations in good condition and well furnished to meet the needs of a new age. We recently launched the Friends of St Mary's to draw together people who want to help preserve the fabric of our church as part of our local and national heritage. The quality of its architecture (especially the wonderful arcades) makes St Mary's a building of national significance, and we know that many people in our village community and former residents and friends will want to help conserve it for the future – and this is precisely the purpose of the Friends. If you want to know more, or would like to offer your help, please contact Sally Taylor (01525 221576). The funds raised by the Friends will be separate from normal church running expenses, and will be used only for the repair, renewal and enhancement of the fabric and furnishings of the church.

I know that because of the world financial situation this autumn will be a hard time for many of our readers, and our thoughts and prayers are with those who are facing real difficulties. May God bless and uphold you and your family in all you do.







What Would You Do?

I am frequently reminded of how dying without an up to date Will can leave families with unnecessary stress, in conflict and financially much worse off.

Angie and Bob had been together for over 20 years when Angie, in her mid 50's, suddenly died. Bob had meet Angie shortly after she had tragically been widowed at a young age. Angie inherited her house from her late husband and raised her two children with Bob as her common law partner. The children, Graeme and Emily, have both left home and are happily married with their own children.

As Angie and Bob never married all of Angie's estate including her £350,000 house is inherited by her children. Bob is left with nothing. Bob at 66 is potentially homeless. Graeme and Emily are aware their Mother wanted Bob to continue to live in the house. However, both children have significant mortgages, Graeme has his own business that is struggling with mounting debts and Emily's eldest daughter Jo is due to go to University in October. Bob has a state pension and few savings. What should they

It does not take much to imagine the type of discussions Graeme and Emily will need to have between themselves and with their spouses. Bob's future is in their hands. If only Angie had recorded her wishes then Bob would have no uncertainty and Graeme and Angie would be free of the dilemma that faces them now. How can they achieve what is best for each family and the best for Bob? A decision has to be made.

There is a further complication: Angie's estate is £360,000 and unless documentary evidence is available to confirm that all or part of Angie's late husband's 'nil rate band' tax free entitlement was not used up at the time of his death, £19,200 inheritance tax has

to be paid. (40% of £360,000 – £312,000). This could mean the house has to be sold or money has to be raised in other ways as the £10,000 cash in Angie's estate is not enough to cover the tax due let alone the funeral and other expenses that also have to be met

Graeme, Emily and Bob would not be facing this torment if Angie had left a Will, whilst had Bob and Angie married and their Wills included an appropriate trust no inheritance tax would need to be paid.

If you are a couple, married or not, without Wills that include a trust then you are likely to leave your loved ones with uncertainty and your home exposed to a possible enforced sale to meet future long term care fees. If you are married and have an estate over £624,000 trusts can enable all inheritance tax to be avoided.







Concerns were again raised regarding the planning application for Dyers Road, Eaton Bray. The Parish Council was informed that on the NATS Website (www.consultation. nats.co.uk) there is to be an update relating to the proposed flight paths, available from 22nd July 2008.

ST MARYS VILLAGE CARNIVAL STAND

The Parish Councillors would like to thank all those that came to have a chat at the Parish Council stand and that all points raised would be looked into.

BT PROPOSAL TO REMOVE KNIGHTS CLOSE PUBLIC PAYPHONE

The Clerk informed the Parish Council of the proposal to close the public payphone situated at Knights Close. The Parish Council have put forward their argument for the public phone to stay: an essential facility for the elderly in that area, many of the dwellings in close vicinity to this phone box, poor mobile phone coverage in the parish.

ALLOTMENTS

Mothers Union Report Eaton Bray with Edlesborough

On a beautiful English summer's day in July (one of the few we have had this summer), members of the M.U. went to an equally beautiful area of England – the Cotswolds. Pretty villages, good food, pleasant company – everyone enjoyed themselves! That was the summer outing.

With the beginning of Autumn, the September meeting was held in St. Mary's Church, which will be the venue for meetings of the Mothers' Union in future. Members were welcomed by the Vicar who hoped they would enjoy their new environment.

Nigel Watson made a welcome return as the speaker – this time on his 'Holiday in Lapland'. Lapland stretches over Sweden, Norway and Finland, but it was to the Swedish town of Jukkasjarvi that Nigel and his wife Georgina went to spend three nights at the Ice Hotel. In this small village on the banks of the Tornetrask river, a hotel, which is the size of two football pitches, is built every winter, and melts again with the warmth of spring. The front of the hotel proudly boasts the number 18 – because this was the eighteenth hotel to be built in as many years.

The 'building' is erected in about seven weeks each Autumn/beginning of Winter – as soon as the temperature drops to around -10C, and if there is a 'warm' spell finishing the work in time for visitors to arrive can be somewhat difficult! As well as his own photographs, Nigel showed a video showing how the hotel is constructed.

The hotel is decorated with the most amazing carving and sculptures (all made from ice of course) and sculptors and artists go to Sweden from all over the world to carry out this work.

On arrival at the hotel, 'booking in' was done at 'Reception' but this was the first reception desk in an ordinary part of the hotel, and having then been given even more warm clothing e.g. thermal boots; large jacket with hood, etc. it was time to enter the Ice Hotel and again be welcomed at 'Reception.' All the rooms and suites are decorated individually, and guests are shown all the rooms each with a different theme. Their room was called 'Meander' and the carving related to a river, even including a bridge to be crossed to reach the bed. The bed was made of ice too, but there was a wooden base, which in turn was covered with reindeer skins. Temperature inside the room: -5C – outside: minus 25-30C.

Time to find the bar – made of ice, and so were the glasses, so the many varieties of vodka needed no ice added. Hot drinks were also available, but glasses could not be placed on the bar – melting was not required just yet. When bedtime came, the hotel issued artic sleeping bags and nightcaps, but in fact both Nigel and Georgina did sleep. Morning was greeted with a maid bearing a flask with hot lingenberry juice.

There were no doors to the rooms, just curtains, and all sound was deadened, but with so much ice around, the whole room seemed to glow in the moonlight, and if there was a camera flash anywhere, it showed right through the hotel. Bathroom and changing facilities were in the 'warm' part of the hotel, and most people spend only one night

in the Ice Hotel

The village was quite small, but with an interesting church, and, surprise, surprise, the Ice Hotel has a church as well, and two weddings were conducted there during their three day stay.

Salvation Sound...October 2008

"GONE FISHIN' - INSTEAD OF ILIST A-MISSIN' "

Do you remember those halcyon days when armed with a jam jar and fishing net, you took off to the nearest pond or stream to fish for minnows or sticklebacks, or newts; or maybe to collect frogspawn to make a pond of your own in an old washing-up bowl.? I was so reminded of those days as I walked along the canal bank at Leighton Buzzard and saw today's fishermen. They had large umbrellas, to ward off rain or sun - little seats to sit upon - keep nets for their catch - boxes and cans full of bait - not for them a worm or two from the garden - and the rods - of differing size and weight, with elaborate hand made flies

How different from mine; a bean stick, with a bag on the end, made from an old net curtain. Yet the excitement of the catch was equal in both cases.

Some while ago I visited Israel, and went on board a fishing boat on the Sea of Galilee and watched the fishermen throw the huge nets into the water;- they still used the same technique as did the fishers of Jesus' time. The methods used were either the casting net or the drag net - though some were caught by the fishing hook. (Matt. 17: 27)

Fish, called dag, in Hebrew, abounded,in the lakes in the valley of the Jordan. So no doubt the Hebrews were familiar with many species, although no fish are mentioned in either the old or the new testament by name.

It was from the fishing industry that Jesus called his first disciples; Simon, (called Peter), Andrew, James and John, - it was in a fishing boat that He rebuked the wind and waves. He fed the multitudes, twice, with fish and bread. Tribute money was found in the mouth of a fish; and He ate broiled fish with the disciples after his resurrection. He told the disciples to cast their net on the right side of the boat after a fruitless night of fishing - they did, and caught so many fish that they couldn't pull it in!

When he called to Simon and Andrew as he walked on the shore of Galilee, he saw

that they were fishers and said "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men". We are still called to serve Jesus, even today; if we accept him as our Lord and Saviour we have hope for our future.

"Those first disciples heard and trusted God's word - If we believed as they believed, great grace would hallow every deed."

Now where's my purse - for I think 'twill be cod and chips for tea!!



At the beginning of our recent meeting we all wished Mavis Purcell a very happy 'special' birthday. We all hope you had a lovely day. Mavis.

Our speaker was Keith Jansz, a member of the Association of Mouth & Foot Painting Artists. Most of us have bought cards and calendars illustrated by these artists, so it was a wonderful experience to meet one of them. Keith was born in London in 1961. He was a keen sportsman, particularly with football and athletics, and he ran in the London Marathon for Barnardos. In 1995 he was left paralysed from the chest down when he broke his back in a car accident. This involved a seven months' stay in Stoke Mandeville Hospital and being confined to life in a wheel chair.

A present from his mother-in-law, of the M.F.P.A. book "Painters First", gave him hope, and he was encouraged by Trevor Wells - a mouth artist - to take up this form of painting.

Keith paints with a brush nailed to the end of a long, bent arrow-type holder, which he controls with his mouth. As a result of this type of movement, he says his neck has become the strongest part of his body. Powered easels help with large paintings by moving them to different positions. Keith told us he makes a drawing of his subject first of all, and then works his painting from it. He likes to paint places he visits, statues, still life & some portraits. He feels lucky to be able to paint as he does. He exhibits his work here and abroad, and says his new career has given him a focus and different direction in life. Cindy, his artist wife, accompanied Keith, and assisted by displaying a number of his paintings. Considering he paints by mouth, it is fantastic to see the quality of his work.

Since 2000 Keith has been a full member of the M.F.P.A. which started in 1956. It is run by the artists themselves to earn a living, as they do not rely on the state. They have over thirty workshops in Britain, and many artists worldwide. They run their own trust fund for training handicapped children in the arts, and offer financial assistance to all concerned with such training. In 1992 they opened the first gallery in the U.K. dedicated solely to work of disabled artists. One such artist, Tom Yendell, has a studio in the gallery which is situated in Selbourne, Hampshire. Many original paintings displayed are for sale, as are other goods from the wide range of all the artists' work.

Once a year all the artists come together. It was a pleasure to meet Keith, and to hear how well he coped with life after his accident. He certainly earned our admiration.

Later in the month out Institute celebrated its 80th Birthday by holding a lunch in Ann Brinklow's lovely garden. It was a really happy occasion, and we thank Ann for her kindness, and for arranging the catering. Thanks go also to Elizabeth Braiden for organising another garden outing. Such trips are always very much enjoyed.

Edlesborough Book Group Review Rabbit Run by John Updike



'Rabbit Run' is the first in a series of books spanning the latter half of the twentieth century, which chronicle the life of Harry 'Rabbit' Angstrom. This story takes place between the months of March and June 1960. Harry is twenty six, married with a three year old son and his wife, Janice, is pregnant. He is disillusioned by his marriage, bored with his wife and underemployed at a local store as a kitchen gadget demonstrator. He was once a high school hero, a star basketball player receiving acclaim and adulation on a regular basis. He is still tall and athletic and mourns his glory days.

One day, he decides on impulse to leave his small town life behind and embarks on a marathon drive across America, to achieve what he believes is his true potential. After just one night, his nerve fails him and he returns to his home town. Unable to decide whether to go back to what he thinks is the stifling atmosphere of his wife and her controlling family, he seeks out his old basketball coach, in the hope that he will help to solve his dilemma. The old man proves to be a negative influence and encourages Rabbit away from his responsibilities, also introducing him to Ruth, a 'good time' girl with whom he quickly forms a relationship, moving in with her. This of course is scandalous behaviour in 1960's small town America.

This sets the tempo of the novel, as Harry, rabbit like, zig zags back and forth, never really being able to make a commitment. Harry is the hero of the story, but as it unfolds, he is shown as very selfish, thoughtless and insensitive to the feelings of others. He seems to be totally oblivious to the pain and emotional chaos he leaves in his wake. This introduction, to the character 'Rabbit Angstrom', did not endear him to our reading group. Only a minority expressed an interest in reading about his future life. Although most of the group disliked the story and characters, everyone agreed about the skill of John Updike's writing. His descriptive passages and evocation of life in middle America in the late 1950's is brilliant. The pace of the novel, which is written in the present tense keeps up a momentum in keeping with Rabbit's constant shifting and inability to settle for any length of time. Although, perhaps the present tense made it difficult to remember that the events were taking place nearly fifty years ago.
