

St Mary's Parochial Church Council meeting, 11th Dec 2008

The PCC discussed the following matters at the December meeting.

Carol Service at St. Mary's Church, Edlesborough.

The Churches Conservation Trust has defined new fire safety regulations specifically referring to the use of candles and prohibiting their use on ancient materials. As it was too late to make contingency arrangements for the Carol Service electric light would have to be used. Plans for future services would be considered.

Resignation of David Radwell - Organist

David Radwell who has been with St Mary's for nearly thirteen years had given his resignation effective from January 4th 2009. This news was received with great regret but understanding as he and his wife are moving out of the area. David has been such an asset to the Church and his leadership, dedication, tuition and development of the choir and individuals will be sorely missed. The advertisement for his replacement was discussed. The post will be termed "Organist and Director of Music". In the meantime we will need the help of volunteer organists.

Flowerbeds in the churchyard.

The Parish Council have agreed to take over the maintenance of the gardens in the church yard.

Parish Charity Project 2009

Each year the congregation are invited to put forward names of charities to be considered for the fund raising project for the year. 2008's project was Cancer Macmillan and the final amount raised will be announced shortly. The charity chosen for 2009 is Merlin Medical Relief. Merlin is the agency which responds worldwide with vital health care and medical relief for vulnerable people caught up in natural disaster, conflict, disease and health system collapse.

Carnival 2008

The final total raised was £12,258.93. This was an excellent result considering the financial climate and Peter Bennett was congratulated and thanked once more for all the work he and his Committee put into making the Carnival a success yet again.

Dagnall Management Committee

The Christmas Craft sessions were a success. A Coffee Afternoon meeting is being arranged for 'young mums'. The Congo Crisis appeal raised £133.

Church Flowers

We were pleased that Carole Johnson has agreed to take on the church flowers organisation and it is hoped that she will receive support from everyone within the parish.

The Vicar's retirement.

Malcolm Grant had advised the PCC in November of his decision to retire from full-time ministry and his last service will be Sunday 8th March. He was, therefore, invited to adjourn from the meeting, as protocol requires, whilst administration matters were discussed concerning his replacement and the manning of services during the interregnum. The prime concern is that there should be as little disruption to services as possible. Members also voiced their particular sadness and regrets that he will be leaving the parish.

This year's collection amounted to a magnificent £1973.14.





The global "credit crunch" will affect us all. Some are already experiencing its chill winds through loss of investment income, reduced pensions and the drop in property prices and the stagnancy of the market. Others have to face unemployment or the threat of redundancy; for some in our own community the blow has already fallen. We see familiar names disappearing from the High Street, and our plans for the future have to be rethought. Non-one is immune from this, and our concern for all such people is expressed in the prayers we offer daily in your parish church.

Events like this challenge the Church to exercise its prophetic ministry – not in offering slick answers to complex problems, but in discerning the underlying meaning of what is happening and listening to whether God is speaking to us through current events. That was the role of the ancient prophets, and many of them made themselves extremely unpopular by saying "This is what God says".

Various religious leaders today have offered a word of prophecy in the current crisis. The basic truth is that we have placed too much reliance on money, and in seeking to obtain more and more of it, we have undermined its value. The great materialist boom has lured us further and further into the realms of debt, often unsecured. We have become greedy, avaricious, and our appetite for material goods and possessions has increased. What we thought was the road to happiness has led instead to frustration, dissatisfaction and disappointment. And, like any addict, we have gone for more and more of what has failed to satisfy. Just think of the increasing incidence of mental illness, of family breakdown, of depression and stress: this is where our obsession with material prosperity has led us.

It hasn't been all wrong. But we have neglected other aspects of our human nature in our pursuit of material things. As someone said the other day, "the flat-screen television has become more important than playing with our children". What has happened to our relationships? Are they not far more important then almost everything else? How many people in the rat-race can no longer find time for relaxation, for simply being with families and friends? We used to be content with so much less: what has happened to change this? Where was that subtle twist which made what we do seem so much more important that who we are?

These are the issues we are being challenged to face today. A recent writer offered an interesting diagnosis of our condition. We are suffering from a new disease, "affluenza", which causes us to put affluence and physical comfort above everything else. We need effective treatment to rid our bodies of this virus, and to set us free to concentrate on the spiritual things of life. I don't necessarily mean "religious" things, although I personally believe that our neglect of these is part of the problem – religion is one way of establishing a proper balance in our lives. But I do mean those things which nurture our inner being, the real person we are behind all the frenetic activity.

We need to appreciate the beauty all around us, the care and love of those closest to us, the simple pleasures (many of which are free) of daily living, and let go the need for the newest and the latest and the biggest things around.

One of our human failings is that it often takes a really significant jerk to bring us to our senses – the prophet might well say that this is exactly what we have had. Will have the required effect? Is God showing us the folly of our ways in the only terms we will hear? That, I believe, is how divine judgement expresses itself in daily living. So my hope and prayer at the start of 2009 is that we may may all heed what is being said, and have the courage and strength of will to take the right steps to put right the deadly imbalance in our contemporary way of life.

May God bless you all, particularly those who are seriously affected by the financial crisis

Cemetery Access

The Parish Council have discussed the proposed route at length and have made the decision to utilise the piece of land originally purchased by the Council along the rear of the Churchyard access being gained from the Bridleway. The cost will be much less than original estimates for going through the Churchyard. A specification is being prepared for submission to contractors to enable quotations to be received.

The Council has expressed its concern to Bucks CC that the full length of the Bridleway, recently resurfaced, was not completed up to the A4146. When further funds are available Bucks CC will review this matter.

Traffic Calming

Now that the M1 roadworks are virtually completed the Waste Disposal Companies have been instructed by the Bletchley Landfill Depot to use the M1/A5 route. The Council have observed a significant drop in the number of large waste disposal lorries travelling through the villages although one or two companies are not adhering to the instructions and large lorries carrying soil and other materials are still using the village roads. The situation will continue to be monitored.

Training lorry companies have been requested not to use Edlesborough High Street during 'drop off' and 'pick up' times at Edlesborough School.

Litter Picking

Volunteers have come forward to help with collection of the litter constantly being left on The Green, in particular around the Pavilion, and the Memorial Hall. The Parish Council are extremely grateful to these volunteers.

Ditch clearance

The ditch adjacent to the Northall allotments has been cleared to prevent properties along the A4146 being flooded, other drains have been cleared by Bucks CC.

Open Forum

In future the Agenda for Edlesborough Parish Council monthly meetings will include an 'Open Forum' item thus allowing parishioners the opportunity of attending the meeting to raise any questions they wish to put to the Council.

THE PARISH NURSE CHARITY - Registration No. = 204752

The Charity was set up by a philanthropic local family, many, many years ago, to help residents living in Edlesborough, Northall and Dagnall with medical needs which they otherwise could not afford. Remember, it was started in the days when the whole area was a poor, farming community, with many of the residents unemployed, or with only seasonal work, and before state pensions and the NHS, and when everyone had to pay for all of their own medical services, including doctors, medicines and even quite ordinary things like blankets, coal, bandages etc, etc.

Since this time the remit of the Charity has been sensibly and legally updated from assistance for the "necessitous poor of the parish" to helping the disabled, elderly, sick and frail of the parish.

Although, not a large amount, the Charity still receives an annual income from the same source, whereby the Trustees are able to make grants to individuals providing the applications come within the current tenet of the Charity.

The Trustees are all local people and are therefore aware of the needs of those living within the community. Every request we receive is considered on its own merits and in the strictest confidence.

Grants can only be awarded to individual residents (not groups) of the villages of Edlesborough, Northall and Dagnall, for a specific medical and, or practical purpose, who are disabled or elderly or frail in some way. The Charity can sometimes assist with medical equipment which cannot be provided from any other source e.g. the NHS.





The 'Assessment for Public Sewage' application was acknowledged by Anglian Water Ltd on 6th November 2008. A Site Visit took place on the morning of Monday 8th December, which included a representative from Anglian Water, Mr. Drumm and myself. The whole of the area covering the 38 households was viewed.

The problems being experienced at my premises, at Amble in Pine Road, and at Mr. Drumm's house were highlighted. Photographs and notes were taken in Pine Road, Leighton Road, Tring Road and the service road behind Tring Road. It was stated that this visit should not be taken as a commitment to provide mains drainage, but as part of the assessment procedure.

Also adjacent groups of properties on Dagnall Road and Ivinghoe Way were drawn to the attention of the Anglian Water representative.

The Nude Ewe Project

A group of Edlesborough ladies have donated their locks to help preserve local meadows. A small flock of Wensleydale sheep has provided fleeces for a new nature conservation project. 'The Nude Ewe' is a partnership between the Wildlife Trust and BedsLife, a Bedfordshire-based environmental coalition.

Sheep and other livestock are responsible for the beauty of the English countryside. Our lovely green hills, valleys and fields were traditionally maintained by stock. Sheep are nature's lawnmowers. They eat bramble, shrubs and other rough vegetation. Without regular grazing, fields turn into scrub and eventually forest. Grazing gets rid of the scrub and in doing so maintains incredibly diverse grassland and heathland habitats. These habitats are now quite rare and some are globally important.

In recent decades agriculture has modernised, and so have livestock. Sheep and cattle have been selectively bred for maximum production, be it for meat, milk or fleece.

Modern sheep breeds are not nearly as hardy as the old breeds, which had to thrive in difficult conditions. Modern sheep will often eat only tender grass, which must be grown using fertilisers to improve its nutritional value. Fertilisers destroy our rare grassland and heathland habitats, which need low-nutrient soil. As old species-rich fields are fertilised they become monocultures of nutrient-rich lawn.

Another side effect of these agricultural advances has been the decline of many of our 'heritage' livestock breeds. Heritage breeds tend to be smaller, slow growing and not as commercially productive as modern breeds. As a result many are threatened and some are critically endangered. But because of their hardiness heritage breed sheep are often used in nature conservation projects. Groups like the Wildlife Trust and National Trust, and private individuals, keep small flocks to graze and maintain nature reserves and other areas of important habitat.

Sheep must be shorn every year, which costs about a pound per animal. But the fleeces are almost worthless and often just go to waste. The fleeces of most breeds must be sent to the British Wool Marketing Board, which acts on behalf of farmers to get the best prices for wool. This works well for farmers with large commercial flocks. But small graziers don't benefit from such economies of scale. Many of the fleeces simply end up as garden mulch.

Now the fleeces from Edlesborough's 'nude ewes' have been spun into beautiful white yarn. Wensleydales are considered 'at risk' by the Rare Breeds Survival Trust. They are large sheep which originated in Yorkshire during the 1840s. Like the Edlesborough flock most are white although a few black flocks exist. Wensleydales are also Britain's softest breed. Their lustrous fleece falls in long fine ringlets highly prized by hand spinners and dyers.

The new yarn is called Nude Ewe 'Wes'. Like all Nude Ewe wools it is undyed, unbleached and spun in the UK. It is available in 100g hanks at a price of £7.00 per hank. Proceeds from the sales of 'Wes' are going to the Greensand Trust to help maintain local grassland and heathland habitats.

The Nude Ewe project started a year ago with a single flock of Hebridean sheep. Since then we've grown a bit so we can offer a variety of yarns. The original dark brown 'Heb' wool is still available. And thanks to a grant from the Chilterns Conservation

Board we're spinning up more Heb to meet the demand. Wes is our second yarn, and will soon be followed by 'Speck', from a flock of Beulah Speckled Face sheep at Aston Rowant National Nature Reserve.

Edlesborough Parish Residents

I am continuing to sell the Green AVDC Refuse Sacks for the disposal of garden waste until, hopefully, the residents of Edlesborough, Northall and Dagnall are provided with a special wheelie bin by AVDC - and for as long as the Parish Council allow me to do so. I think that we are unlikely to receive these extra wheelies before the Autumn.

For those residents that haven't yet discovered the green sacks, they are currently £4.50 for a roll of 20. They are all marked AVDC, and are for garden waste only (not bricks, stones, flower pots etc). When full you just stand them (as many as you like) beside your ordinary wheelie on your usual refuse collection morning, and the dustmen (perhaps I should refer to them as Refuse Removal and Disposal Operatives or similar) will take them away.

This scheme has been going for approximately 12 to 15 years and I currently sell somewhere between 2500 and 3000 green sacks each year. The PC sell the sacks to residents at the price they pay for them, and nobody makes any money from the sales, except whoever makes the sacks in the first place I suppose. Originally it was started to try to alleviate the dumping of green waste along our highways and byways and especially in Cock Close (between Pebblemoor/Ford Lane junction and A4146) which had become really bad. Its hard to believe that I have been doing this all these years, but I look forward to seeing you all again come gardening time.

Age discrimination in redundancy selection



Long service can be used as a criterion in redundancy selection according to the High Court. In this case, unusually, the employer sought to argue that the length of service criterion in its collective agreement with the

recognised trade union was unlawful as it was age discriminatory. The union argued that it was lawful. The court agreed with the union in a decision which the union hailed as one giving extra protection to older workers.

The collective agreement provided for a redundancy selection scheme in which employees were scored against five criteria. A point was awarded for each year of service. The aim of the selection procedure was to produce a scheme that was fair and could be 'peaceably' implemented. The court held that the 'advancement of an employment policy which achieves a peaceable process of selection agreed with the recognised union' was a legitimate aim. It went on to say that 'the criterion of length of service respects the loyalty and experience of the older workforce and protects the older employees from being put on to the labour market at a time when they are particularly likely to find alternative employment hard to find.' However, it also said that it might have decided otherwise if the only selection criterion had been 'last in, first out'.

It was unusual for this case to be heard in the High Court rather than by an employment tribunal, and the High Court judge only agreed to hear it with considerable misgivings. The employer has been given leave to appeal as this is 'an important point for both parties'. We shall keep you informed of developments.

Birth or death: 'Tell us once' pilot

The 'Tell us once' pilot is a new service to make it possible for people to let the authorities know about a change in circumstances with just one visit or telephone call.

The cross-government service is a collaboration between the Department for Work and Pensions, HM Revenue and Customs, local authorities, the Driving and Vehicle Licensing Agency, and the Identity and Passport Service.

To start with, the service is only when registering a birth or death. There are plans to extend it to cover change of address.

The pilot starts in Tameside, Southwark, Rotherham and Wolverhampton and will extend into Kent and Lancashire over the next few weeks.

Prescription charges and cancer patients

In England, from 1 April 2009, the government has announced that cancer patients will be exempt from prescription charges. There will also be a move towards exempting patients with long-term conditions over the next few years.

We have no more details at present but will keep you informed.

Savings guarantee increased

Time off work for dependants

Employees who are caring for dependants are entitled to take any necessary unpaid time off work to deal with unexpected problems.

In an Employment Appeal Tribunal (EAT) case, the employee's child minder told her she could not cover a particular day. The employee told her employers of this two weeks in advance of that day and asked for that day off. Her employers refused and disciplined the employee when she took the day off.

An employment tribunal decided the employee was entitled to the day off and had therefore suffered a detriment for exercising that right. The employers argued that the right to time off only applies in a sudden and unexpected emergency.

The EAT ruled that to say the right only arose where the employee had no warning was too narrow an interpretation of the law and that a tribunal would take into account the amount of time between the employee becoming aware of the risk of disruption and it happening, and what alternative arrangements had been explored, when deciding whether the time off was necessary and should therefore be given.

Highlights of the Minutes of the Eaton Bray Parish Council Meeting Held in The Coffee Tavern on Monday 1st December 2008 at 7:30pm PUBLIC OPEN FORUM

Concerns were raised with regards to the parishes Neighbourhood Watch in that there is a need for more residents to join the scheme; currently only 11 roads in Eaton Bray are registered with the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme. The Parish Council agreed to support the Neighbourhood Watch believing it to be a vital support for the police and for residents to become more involved. The Parish Council agreed to look into this further.

POLICING WITHIN THE PARISH

PCSO Joanne Glen attended the meeting and confirmed that she and PC Viv Dady had been visiting Parishes last weekend. It was reported that there has been an increase in distraction burglaries recently and that the police are looking into this.

DONATION TO THE PARISH COUNCIL FROM ST MARY'S VILLAGE CARNIVAL

It was agreed to the purchase of daffodil bulbs from the money kindly donated to the Parish Council from the St Mary's Village Carnival; which will be planted in/around the parish.

BOWER LANE CEMETERY

Due to a recent enquiry to the Parish Council on the scattering of ashes; the Parish Council confirmed that the general scattering of ashes is prohibitive at the Cemetery. The Parish Council have agreed to the following: (i) if the wishes of the family are to scatter on a family grave, the turf/stones needs to be pulled back/lifted to allow the ashes to be scattered and then reset in original place (ii) the ashes can be buried in an old family grave, if the previous burial was a full burial; however approval would have to be obtained by the Parish Council (iii)the ashes are interred within the new section of the cemetery. In all cases Cemetery costs will apply.

VILLAGE GATEWAYS

The Clerk updated the Parish Council on the damaged Bower Lane Gateway. The insurance company have confirmed that the paperwork is currently being processed.





Highlights of the Minutes of the Eaton Bray Parish Council Meeting Held in The Coffee Tavern on Monday 5th January 2008 at 7:30pm

Public Open Forum

Representatives from the newly formed Eaton Bray Under Fives Play Time Group, Cheeky Monkeys (Wednesday afternoons, 1:00pm to 2:45pm at Eaton Bray Village Hall) applied to the Parish Council for a grant/donation for their group. The group wished to purchase new toys and to cover the initial rental/insurance set-up costs. The Parish Council confirmed that they do consider grants/donations to local voluntary or charitable groups if the work of the group should benefit some or all of the residents of the Parish of Eaton Bray. The Parish Council agreed to a donation.

Policing Within the Parish

PC Viv Dady and Sergeant Glennister (5289) attended the meeting. PC Dady wished to correct an error in a letter written by a resident, printed in Focus, presenting crime figures for the parish as provided under the Freedom of Information Act. The crime figures reported included 35 domestic incidents (not classed as crime), many relating to low level arguments. Therefore the detection rate should have been 16% not 5% as indicated – Eaton Bray being an area low in crime. The police are currently on target to reduce crime levels from last year. The Parish Council informed PC Dady that they were very pleased to see PCSO Glen walking around the village recently, a number of parishioners have approached Councillors pleased to see a police presence within the parish.

The Parish Council was also informed of a new link on the Leighton Buzzard Police Rural website where people can look at a crime map and obtain crime figures for an area

PC Dady wanted the Parish Council to make parishioners aware of a scam, using the digital TV changeover as a means for distraction burglaries. More details of this can be viewed on the Parish Council Website, under Neighbourhood Policing (Community Safety Update, January 2009).

Edlesborough Book Group Review MARY BARTON by Elizabeth Gaskell



We may see ourselves as casualties of the 'credit crunch' but thankfully we are not living in the 1840s. It was during this decade when Mrs Gaskell, the wife of a Unitarian minister in Manchester, witnessed the horrific social and economic deprivation of the urban poor; that monstrous gulf that divided the higher and lower classes. Her realist novel vividly contrasts the privileged lifestyle of the mill owner with his 'clemmed' (starving) employees. Men, women and children existed in cellar dwellings into which all the muck of the street drained. Unable to afford basic food, without fuel or medicine, many families were stricken by illness and death. Mrs Gaskell 'writes from the heart': her style is expansive and detailed in its description of everyday scenes and character. She utilises local dialect to convey a sense of immediacy and underpins her moral message by drawing on real events, such as the 1839 Chartist march to London.

At the novel's opening, Mary Barton lives with her working class parents in a poor but clean terraced house. However, her mother dies in childbirth and her father, a radical trades unionist, becomes increasingly angered and embittered at what he perceives as the 'lack of cordial sympathy' between rich and poor. Meanwhile, Mary is flattered by the attention paid to her by Henry Carson, the mill owner's son, and rebuffs her working class suitor, Jem. The plot turns on the murder of Henry Carson.

The novel's publication in 1848 caused an absolute furore. The cotton masters in William Gaskell's congregation were particularly outraged and a close family friend accused her of "culpable misrepresentation concerning the masters' attitudes to the workers' suffering". She was accused of stirring up class hatred with this 'condition of England' novel but in reply she pleaded for more understanding of the mill workers' feelings of injustice and isolation. Readers must make up their own minds. Unfortunately, some members found it such a harrowing read that they were unable to finish the book.

Salvation Sound...February 2009

Candlemas; the feast of the purification of the Virgin Mary, is held on February 2nd. In the cold of the winter days Psalm 24 is sung, "Lift up your heads, O ye gates, be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors, and the King of glory shall come in."

Who is the King of Glory? Why Mary's child, Jesus! He was presented, as was every month old child, to the priest, when his mother went to church to be declared "clean" after giving birth.

For centuries in this country it was called the Purification; to give thanks to God for having given birth safely at a time when to have a child could be a near death experience for many women.

The New Year, like Jesus, is already a month old - we are growing older, we carry within us all kinds of experiences, so ideally, we should be mature. Our characters have been formed by what we have thought and done in the past.

The year 2009 will grow up and grow old in just twelve months, Spring flowers will bloom, harvests will be gathered before another winter comes, and the year dies. Probably nothing very outstanding will happen to us, the horrors of the world's problems will be restricted to our television screens; as each day dawns our turbulence will be as confined as our activity allows.

Growing older can mean growing in grace and fruitfulness, becoming more mellow, less critical of others, less impatient; and as our physical strength abates, and health deteriorates, and our memory is not as sharp as it once was, we must not despair but make sure that every day can be a new beginning.

Advice from Patience Strong "Have something to show for the winter.
Don't sit between supper and bedcontented with mere entertainment.
Do something constructive instead.
Create something useful or lovely,
employing your hands and your brain or study and set yourself lessons,
new regions of knowledge to gain Those hours of long winter evenings
much pleasure and profit can bring.
Do something to prove you've not wasted
the months between Christmas and spring.

What will this year bring? Hardship, trials and tribulation? yes for some no doubt. Adversity is a way that God uses to produce good results. Trouble, if it turns us to the Lord, could be good for us. We have become complacent, and too, used to the good life.

Romans 5: 3-4.

Tribulation produces perseverance; and perseverance, character; and character hope. Jesus' life on earth was short but He lived it to the maximum. Do you likewise. Walk by faith, then each day will be a challenge, live your life fully, our time is fleeting too. Who knows, no-one but God, what 2009 will bring.

Forgive us Lord, for failures past, Then help us start anew With strength and courage to obey And closely follow You.
