

40 Scouts and adults camped at Boyd Field, Henlow for the weekend enjoying activities such as pioneering, raft building, canoeing and hiking.


The small camp location meant a great opportunity for a bit of freedom for climbing trees, constructing mega catapults, archery, building fires and, of course, cooking over the flames



At the start of our last meeting cards from Linda Green and Margaret Lauing were read out, both thanking members for all the good wishes sent to them during their recent times of illness.

Wendy Clark was welcomed as our newest member, and Chris Yates & helpers were thanked for arranging such an enjoyable Members' Night the month before. Suggestions for future outings were put forward, to be considered further. Maureen Shipway gave a report on the B.F.W.I. Spring Council Meeting she had recently attended. A newspaper article on the W.I. "Calendar Girls" was read to us, and we learned that another calendar for 2010 had already been printed. Congratulations to them, as they raise a large amount of money for charity.

As it was our annual Resolutions Meeting, the one for this year was given:

"Honey Bees play a vital role in the pollination of food crops and in our environment. In view of concerns about the accelerating decline in the U.K. honey bee population, this meeting urges H.M. Government to increase funding for research into Bee Health."

However, this resolution had been withdrawn from this year's A.G.M. of National W.I., as the Government had already put a considerable amount of money into such research.

Nonetheless, a vote had to be taken, and it was passed unanimously. Sue Parker had studied this subject on our behalf, and reported that the honey bee population had been decreasing since 2003, and that other pollinators are also affected. Honey bees need food from January to October, and the R.H.S. has a list of plants they like. Individual beekeepers are helping to prevent these diseases, and gardeners can do so by putting up bee boxes and growing suitable plants. Beekeepers can always be contacted to give help.

To end the evening we were served a tasty cheese and wine supper, organised by Ann Brinklow

Later in the month the Committee went on their annual lunch outing, this time to Chez Jerome in Dunstable – very enjoyable. We always seem to be eating, but we do occupy ourselves in many other ways!

Unique Feet – A Podiatrist's Thoughts

Visiting a friend in hospital one evening he said "Shhh, listen to those footsteps" as the heels clunked down the corridor. "I bet that's Nurse Lynn", he said, and he was right. He'd been there long enough to recognise the sound of a person's footsteps! Is he unique? Well, surprisingly, no. Even Shakespeare knew about such things:

"High'st Queen of state, Great Juno comes; I know her by her gait (The Tempest Act 4 scene 1, Ceres observes)

Gait is the manner of how we walk. How we walk is unique to each of us just as each of our individual feet are unique.

If you take two people, whose feet appear equally flat, one can have hard skin, the other person does not. The person with hard skin might be pain-free but the one with baby smooth feet can be in pain in the foot and leg muscles.

Hard skin generally results from things such as friction and sheer stress to the skin of the feet and tissues beneath it. Maybe our shoes pinch the skin, or they cause us to put more pressure on one area, like the ball of the foot. Callous may form or we might get a deep painful ache in there instead.

Painful feet and legs often come from the muscles having to work too hard, perhaps from prolonged standing or even from a simple walk - but our foot and leg muscles seem unable to take the strain. One sign that our feet are working harder can even be that walking seems such hard work. Some people are put off sport simply because running or walking is so tiring and hard, partly because their feet are not working efficiently for them!

It might surprise people to hear that a research study in January this year suggested that "Approximately one quarter" of a population are "affected by foot pain at any given time." These kinds of situations can often be helped.

The role of the Podiatrist includes working out how to make the right changes and choices to make your feet happy again. They can advise on:

- 1. Footwear and any requirements for special inserts that go inside the shoe. These inserts or orthotics help to alter the way the foot bears load in standing and walking, taking the load off of tired strained feet.
- 2. The need for Chiropody -i.e. the removal of corns and callouses.
- 3. The need for liaison and treatment by our Physiotherapists. The Physiotherapist can often treat any painful areas locally and advise on exercises, joint mobilisation and soft tissue work.







Chairman & Treasurers Report - May 2009

This past year has seen our income grow again by about 9% to £9,876 whilst our costs have increased by 16% to £7,136. This increase in costs is as a result of the committee's commitment to maintain cleanliness and

Despite the increase in costs our current bank balance has also increased and now stands at £11,608 excluding the recreation ground track funds. Use of the hall for the Dagnall Under 5's and all of our numerous local groups has continued to grow this year.

Police Representative

The police went through the crime figures for the month. The police wish residents to be aware that now the summer months are here, longer daylight hours and better weather, there have been issues with groups of people congregating in areas within the parish; however they are monitoring the situation. With regards to nuisance motorcycles, this is an ongoing problem and they have been in contact with one offender and will keep monitoring this. The police confirmed they will be in attendance at the Parish Council meeting in July; in addition the Police Inspector from Leighton Buzzard Rural and the Neighbourhood Watch Officer for the area will also be in attendance.

Cold Calling

There have been a number of issues with cold callers within the parish recently. It is important to know what to do when this happens.

- (1) Put the chain on the door when answering as you do not know who is calling.
- (2) Ask for the person's name and the utility companies name/telephone number for whom they are representing. The person knocking on the door should provide this without a problem, if genuine.
- (3) Inform the caller that you are just going to telephone the company to ensure that they are supposed to be in the area and doing what they say they are doing.
- (4) Shut the door and make the phone call, if they are genuine they should still be at the door when you return.

If you are still unsure then contact the police and state what is happening, description of person and company they say they are working for.

This year EB Lions have exceeded their ambitions by scooping not only the FA County Award for Best Charter Standard Developing Club, but also the

Zero Edlesborough Book Group ReviewThe Remains Of The Day by Kashuo Ishiguro



This month's choice, The Remains of the Day, won its author Kasho Ishiguro the Booker Prize for 1989. The story is told in the first person, by Stevens, the now aging butler to a once great household in the years leading up to, and during, the Second World War. The novel begins after the war, in 1956. Stevens is still the butler at Darlington Hall, but his circumstances are much reduced The house has been sold to a wealthy American, Mr Farraday and is now being run much more informally with a minimal amount of staff. Stevens is worried that he will unable to keep his impeccable standards and a letter from a previous housekeeper prompts him to make an appointment to meet her, thinking that he might be able to persuade her to rejoin his staff..

As he journeys to the West country in a car borrowed from Mr Farraday, he reminisces on days gone by and gradually, through his eyes, we are privy to a life of service, self delusion and misguided loyalty. Kashuo Ishiguro brilliantly captures the pompous language used by the butler as he muses on his life and persuades himself that he performed his duties to the highest possible standard, maintaining his dignity and professionalism at all times. This came at great cost to himself and precluded any intimacy or personal relationships in his efforts to be a "great butler". His loyalty to Lord Darlington blinded him to the fact that his lordship had pro Hitler tendencies and entertained guests such as Ribbentrop and Oswald Mosley. If his lordship did it, then it had to be right.

As he ponders over his life, he realises, at last, that he has nothing to show for all his efforts, in fact that he has no real identity. He wonders what he will do in the remains of his day.

This is a wonderfully engrossing book, it draws one into the mind of this very repressed, introverted man and reveals the utter sadness of an unfulfilled life. Our group all enjoyed this book and would recommend it unreservedly. As one of our members remarked "It is deceptively simple".

We had 2 prizes, a book token, won by Ms S Trinder from Welwyn Garden City and some M&S vouchers, won by Richard Fraser from Watford.


Samaritans received over 5 million contacts in 2008, and the only method that you can't use to contact us is smoke signals.



Dear F.ditor

I read with interest, tinged with sadness, the letter from Jess Hawkes in support of the proposed skateboard park on Eaton Bray recreational ground and I am sure she is a very sincere and good person who tries to see the goodness in others, which without doubt is mostly justified. I remain neutral in regard to the park which would not be close to my residence, but now feel inclined to air my views after many years of life and its experiences.

Moving here from Hemel Hempstead 15 years ago, I looked forward to a peaceful and friendly life amongst kind and considerate neighbours, and thankfully this has proved to be true. However, as an active cyclist using roads around the villages, my experience is in complete contrast, with many instances of harassment from youths in passing cars. I wish to tell you of the most recent ones

occurring this year.

March 22nd, remembered as it was our anniversary, I was cycling past St. Mary's Church to Totternhoe when a pony and trap rounded the corner ahead, spotted me and crossed the road heading straight at me, a frightening experience looking a terrified pony straight in the eyes, the consequences could have been disastrous but the driver veered off with inches to spare, much laughter and verbal abuse. More recently, cycling along the High Street passing the Nurseries on the right, a noisy motorcycle turned right out of that road, and when passing me the helmetless rider swiped me around the head trying to dislodge my hat. He looked back to see if he was successful whilst approaching the blind bend by the church.

I am writing these experiences to illustrate that if youths of this nature become involved with the proposed facility, they will drive away the decent children who wish to use it and gather around them the more weak and simple minded, i.e. a gang, thereby I am sure, justifying the fears of everyone living in the vicinity.

I mention sadness at the beginning of this letter because my wife and I are frequent visitors to Switzerland where the skateboard parks are well used and very popular without apparently any problems. I don't think it will happen here. Although some may describe me as a cynic, it is because experience has made me so.





Salvation Sound...July 2009

Letters today are an accepted part of everyday life. However it wasn't always like that. In early Victorian times letters were an expensive luxury, far beyond the reach of the poor; postal charges were levied according to distance and anyone receiving the letter had to pay for it.

A man named Rowland Hill noticed a poor woman refusing a letter from the postman because the charge was one shilling. Concerned for her plight, he paid the fee and gave the letter to her. The woman told him that the missive was from her son, there was no writing on the paper, but when he was working away from home he would send a blank sheet at regular intervals, thus its arrival told her he was alive and well. Being poor she would not accept it but she would know the meaning of it. Rowland Hill used this knowledge as one of his weapons to obtain postal reform; so it was that in the year 1840, the pre-paid Penny Post, along with the Penny Black Stamp was introduced.

Communication today is so much easier for we have the telephone, e-mail, cell-phones, and fax machines, and of course texting. It is surprising how much can be said in just a few words, which is why I like to read the mini-sermons that are on the notice boards outside some of our churches

"Don't pray that your load may be lightened, but that your back may be strengthened to bear it."

"Where the faithless may see only a hopeless end, the faithful rejoice in endless hope."

"What is missing from this: CH CH? UR!!

Paul wrote many letters and we are fortunate to be able to read copies of them in our bibles today. Each of them gave good advice, instructions on how to live, sometimes he scolded. He told us (yes, it is relevent today) to live in union with Christ Jesus, to keep our roots deep in him, build our lives on him and become ever stronger in our faith, and be filled with thanksgiving. He ended each letter with a blessing. His friends must have felt that these letters were not only helpful but comforting as well.

The art of writing was known in the time of the early Pharaohs. Moses was commanded "to write for a memorial in a book." Ex.17:14. The books of Moses are the most ancient that are still in existance. Rameses II built a library in Thebes which was reputed to

have held 20,000 books. The first mention of letter writing in the bible is in the time of David.2 Sam. 11. 14:15.

It is a great joy to hear the post-person push letters through the letter-box; but so often all we receive are those things called 'junk-mail'. How good it feels if someone has sent a card from a holiday destination, or better still an unexpected letter from a loved one, friend or relative.

Why don't you write to someone today? and end your letter with something like this instead of just 'all good wishes'...

"We shared our laughter and our tears, We shared our joys and sometimes fears. We shared our company and in the end, We each of us had made a friend." God bless you.
