# Eaton Bray with Edlesborough Parish News

At the time of writing, it is just two days since Carnival so you must forgive me if this article has a Carnival focus.

An event that was a church fete until the 1980s has grown to become today, not just one of the biggest events of its kind locally, but one of the biggest one day events of its kind anywhere in the country. Thousands of people came out on 4 July to share in a very special event; one where there was no aggravation, no trouble, no violence or greed. Instead, this community, the place where you and I live, put on a show which, as an elderly visitor from Hartlepool said to me, was the best he had ever seen in his life, anywhere.

Now it does need a very strong organising committee to lay the foundations of such an event and huge thanks must go to all of them, but the important thing is that the rest of the community of our villages has picked up and run with the framework that has been created. It is simply fantastic that so many families go to the trouble of putting out the bunting and balloons and that so many organisations make the effort to dress a float or run a stall - visitors to the event are amazed.

I hesitate to estimate the number of people it takes to run the event – simply to organise it and run the church stalls needs several hundred people, of all ages; and then there are our advertisers, sponsors, those who have donated goods, prizes and time. To everyone of you my heartfelt thanks. Perhaps more important are, the thanks of all the children growing up here – even some of the grumpy teenage boys could recognise how lucky they are to be growing up in a community like ours.

But I'm supposed to include a religious element in this article – so some of you may wish to stop reading now. What lessons have I learnt preparing for and helping to run this year's Carnival? Well, the first lesson is to trust – not just other people, though this is essential because the event has become too big for any one person to know everything that is going on, so people have to be trusted to do what they say they will do; but also to trust in God. If you have never experienced the power of prayer then whatever I say will not convince you, but in the week leading up to the Carnival all my prayers were answered – not that I sat back and waited for God to do all the work – he has no hands but ours and works through us and those around us.

Second, I learnt the lesson of the importance of a kind word. On the evening of Carnival, Christine and I arrived home to a message on the answer phone. We were both physically exhausted - it was almost too difficult for either of us to walk upstairs to hear the message, which was a short and simple "Thank you". It meant so much and gave both of us an immediate lift - it will be a treasured memory of this year's event.

Finally, don't forget to count your blessings – realise how fortunate you are to live in a community such as this – and thank God for it.

As a postscript I must say thank you to the warm welcome and generosity I received from my neighbours in Northall when I was out collecting in advance of the Carnival. I hold each of you in my prayers.



# Highlights of the Minutes of the Eaton Bray Parish Council Meeting held in The Coffee Tavern on Mon 6th July 2009 at 7:30pm Police Representative

Inspector Steve Barrett, from Leighton Buzzard Police, attended the meeting and wished to respond to residents' concerns to lack of police presence in the parish; he believes that there are more police on the 'ground' than as previously and that they are in the process of improving Eaton Bray Parish Council Meetings 1st Monday of each month 7:30pm The Coffee Tavern Next Meeting: Mon 7th Sep 09

this. Residents attending the meeting expressed their lack of confidence in the police and believe there is apathy by the police to the village; especially in situations where residents have contacted the police with an issue to have no response back at all. Many residents do not feel safe in the village, as they do not believe there to be enough police presence within the parish. Although it was noted that since the addition of PCSO Jo Glenn there have been more police presence than before, however it was felt not enough. Inspector Barrett wished to reassure residents that the village is important to them. He informed residents that Eaton Bray village has on average 10 (ten) incidents per month, calls are made to the police and are then graded as to importance. Each call to the police is taken on board and is dealt with accordingly.

The Parish Council expressed disappointment that, despite several calls/emails to contacts within the police, they have not heard from anyone with regards to the option of incorporating specials within the parish. Inspector Barrett said he would look into this further.

### **Neighbourhood Watch**

Mr Brendan Murray, the neighbourhood watch officer for this area, attended the meeting and wanted to remind residents that this initiative is not run by the police but by the community; coming together to look at problems occurring within the area and try to resolve issues. ALL residents can join the Ringmaster service, a site which updates members on crimes within their area, as it is believed that by keeping everyone aware of what is happening within their area it helps people become more aware of issues and to keep an eye on where they live. This in turn supports the police as residents are more likely to contact the police if they then see anything suspicious.

It was recommended that a meeting be put together with neighbourhood watch and the police, to look at issues within the area and what residents would like to see. Inspector Barrett confirmed that the police are putting together a 'Community Safety Forum' for parishes to which the issues of neighbourhood watch/policing could be discussed in more detail. A date for this forum will be announced in due course.



# EDaN Group Cycleways Project Team

The EDaN Report indicated a high level of interest for providing safe cycling facilities in and between Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall. A small, but enthusiastic group of residents from these three villages have now met on several occasions to pursue this project. After much discussion the following Objectives have been agreed:

- To publish a map of cycleways in the EDaN area, and how they connect with surrounding cycleways, Sustrans' routes etc;
- To plan and establish a cycleway connecting Edlesborough, Dagnall, Eaton Bray, Northall and Ringshall;
- To make the surface of the recently, much improved bridleway from Edlesborough to Ivinghoe Aston, more suitable for cycling;
- > To improve and promote cycling within the EDaN area;
- ➢ To plan and install cycle racks where needed in Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall.

The provision of cycleways is clearly a major undertaking. As the Project Team is aiming to provide these away from the A4146 where ever possible, much thought is being given to possible routes. In some cases this might involve making existing footpaths into multi-use, all weather surfaces suitable for cycling. Such aims will clearly require a great deal of consultation and agreement with land owners, Bucks County Council, other authorities and residents – as well as considerable expenditure. So, this project will probably take several years and will therefore demand unstinting support from residents.

In the meantime, the Project Team is endeavouring to achieve some quicker "wins". Two potential sites for cycle racks have been identified and appropriate discussions are being held with the adjacent property owners. Available cycle rack designs are being researched, together with possible funding for their purchase and installation.

#### **Edlesborough Book Group Review** A Quiet Belief in Angels by R J Ellory



This month we read A Quiet Belief in Angels by R J Ellory. The book's setting is rural Georgia from the time just before the Second World War. It is narrated by Joseph Vaughan, a sensitive young boy whose life changes dramatically after the sudden death of his father. On that day, he notices a white feather which, to his impressionable young eyes. is from an angel's wing. At first, his belief in angels leads him to see them as guardians, but as the community is rocked by a series of brutal killings of young schoolgirls, Joseph begins to view them as harbingers of death. As he grows into an observant and intelligent young man, he is encouraged to write by his mother and schoolteacher and we hope for great things for Joseph. Alas, his life is dogged by tragedy , and the killings continue relentlessly without the killer being brought to justice. Joseph, because he knows and is familiar with most of the victims, feels personally involved and believes that he should somehow prevent the horrors from happening. This is impossible, of course, just as he is unable to prevent his own personal tragedies.

The murders continue for a full ten years. Then, the mystery appears to have been solved, when a neighbour is found hanging in his barn with incriminating evidence on his body. Joseph then attempts to forge a fresh life in New York as an author, but the past follows him and new horrors await.

This novel is extremely well written. The language is superb and quite lyrical in places. Although R.J.Ellory is English, his descriptions of the small towns and the rural Southern states are accurate and beautifully written. Sometimes we felt that the passages were a trifle overwritten and a little repetitive. There were, however lots of discussion points raised by the story; so a good choice for book groups.





#### Table Corner - A scent of roses

One of the aspects of the catering world Mr Searle likes best is tasting new food and testing new recipes. Some recipes never go out of fashion, for example our famous lamb with tapenade (hailing from France's Provence

Region, tapenade is a thick paste made from capers, anchovies, ripe olives and olive oil) is always much in demand, as well as the more traditional whole salmon served with green herb sauce. However, some clients rightly expect variety in menus and ask us for specific dishes. So we, as a family, spend many an evening meal trying new recipes. Mr Searle is merciless in his position of goûteur (taster): less salt, not enough sugar, change the presentation. Apparently this, good sources inform me, is all pretence and a cunning way of just getting me to cook again the dishes he actually really liked. The favourite one at the moment is the red berry and white chocolate tart, which seems to be disappearing at a bewildering speed. And who said that children are difficult eaters? Ours aged, 2 and 4, eat the tart in the following manner: first jump on all the red fruits, put huge mouthfuls of the white chocolate and mascarpone filling in your mouth, then finish by licking the pastry.

One of the most exciting dishes we have created recently is a fruit salad. But not any fruit salad. One served with rose cream. Yes, literally - rose cream. This recipe goes back to the time when flowers were used extensively in cooking. If you want to try this dessert, I would suggest you use delicate, exotic fruits such as mangoes, passion fruit etc. as the cream has a really delicate flavour and is best suited to exotic and equally delicate fruits. This means, due to the cost of those fruits, you might not want to prepare it for a large party of guests but instead just for a few special friends. This recipe will serve 6, so please buy the fruits accordingly. For the cream:

1 red rose - fresh, and not treated with pesticides

150 ml Single Cream 1 tbsp Caster Sugar

1 tbsp Lemon Juice

150 ml Double Cream

Remove the petals from the rose, and discard the rest. Wash the petals thoroughly, dry them and set a couple of them aside for decoration later. Place the petal leaves in a blender with the sugar and the single cream, and blend until smooth. Add the lemon juice. Now whip the double cream until it forms soft peaks. Incorporate the rose cream

into the whipped cream. Et voilà! Keep the cream in the fridge for a couple of hours as it tastes better when chilled.

When ready to serve, don't be tempted to mix the cream with the fruits. The exotic fruits are very much part of the visual attraction of this dish and deserve to be seen – so gently pour the cream over the fruits and decorate with the remaining petal leaves! Bon appétit!

We are pleased to welcome Caroline Colleran, our newest member, and two visitors to our last meeting.

Elizabeth Braiden had recently represented our Institute at the W.I. Annual General Meeting held at the Albert Hall, and she reported back to us at our meeting. She said how interesting the speakers had been, particularly 'Mr Yorkshire Tea'. His speech, Trees for Life, outlined the work Yorkshire Tea was carrying out, together with Oxfam, in the planting of trees to replace those lost in the destruction of rain forests. Other speakers included Eve Pollard (journalist), Maureen Lipton (actress) and one who considered bumble bees to be more important than honey bees in plant pollination. Elizabeth, like those who had attended the A.G.M. on previous occasions, said how impressive "Jerusalem" sounds when sung by so many W.I. ladies in the Albert Hall.

David Lee was the speaker at our meeting that evening. David is a Met. Office weather forecaster who has worked on 3 occasions in the southern part of Antarctica. He joins scientists, electricians, plumbers, etc. all working on difficult projects, but staying at the same base. The accommodation is modern and quite comfortable, with 2 people sharing a bedroom with bunk beds and an en-suite. All workers eat in a large canteen, and primus stoves are still used for much of the cooking. Work equipment naturally varies according to the research undertaken. Quite a number of women are employed alongside the male scientists. Weather forecasting plays a large part, as many planes go back and forwards, because ships do not go so far south due to the ice. Weather balloons are sent up three times a week to assist this work.

The area David stayed in was not nearly as cold as some. The further south you travel, the less snow there is. There is a small amount of wildlife in the area, including seals, penguins and skuas. The scenery is fantastic, as seen in the beautiful slides David used to illustrate his talks, particularly those of aerial views of the massive glaciers. David's visits to Antartica certainly make his work far from humdrum. Val Harris





#### Wheels2Work Officially Arrives in Bedfordshire!

The Bedfordshire Wheels2Work Scheme was officially launched on Friday 20th March 2009 at Tilsworth Golf Centre, Dunstable Road, Tilsworth, Bedfordshire. Andrew Johnston, Member of the National Development Team and Co-ordinator of the Hambleton & Richmondshire Scheme gave the keynote address.

Wheels2Work provides an innovative way of overcoming transport barriers to key services offering individuals their own transport solutions for up to a nine-month period until a longer-term solution can be found. The scheme is delivered through a 50cc Yamaha scooter loan, which is provided complete with fully comprehensive motor vehicle insurance, road tax and provision of service costs. Clients meeting the criteria are required to undertake a Compulsory Basic Training (CBT) course and Rural Ride training, both of which are free. A monthly fee is payable for the scooter loan.

The scheme is eligible to those who meet the following criteria:

- Being of working age (16 64) with priority given to those aged 16 24
- Living in South Bedfordshire area (excluding Luton)
- Having limited or no access to transport to employment, education or training opportunities.

The scheme is led by Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity. Funding has been sourced principally from the former Bedfordshire County Council, with additional grants from the Learning and Skills Council and South Bedfordshire District Council. Other partners include Jobcentre Plus, Connexions, Dunstable College, Leighton-Linslade Town Council and Bedfordshire Youth Service

The scheme is the latest edition to the growing network of over 50 across England. Each provides a tailor-made service to meet the needs of their clients and geographical area.
