

#### **Blocked Sewerage Pipes**

A PLEA To all our neighbours and residents of Edlesborough whose sewerage and waste water flows through our property into the main sewer pipe before it heads off towards Summerleys into Eaton Bray, then making its way to the pumping station. As those of you who live close to us know we have not only the main sewerage drain of Edlesborough Village in the middle of our back garden but also the smaller pipes coming from local properties and I believe Cooks Meadow development that take the waste and sewerage from these properties into this main sewer.

Over the past 24 years of living here we personally have had to deal with the clearing of the smaller pipes on a regular basis as and when it becomes blocked. We have had Anglian Water out for blockages of the main drain on numerous occasions. They know immediately who we are when we call as the record file must be inches thick.

Ed usually has to unblock the smaller pipe on average once or twice every couple of months sometimes more and during the past 6 weeks of June and July has had to rod the drain on 4 occasions- usually after it has rained heavily for some reason. On Wednesday 22nd my immediate neighbour called out Anglian Water Authority as his drain had become blocked again so I also phoned them to come out as it is getting ridiculous and although we know it has to be done it is unfair that Ed gets this very unpleasant job and then has to hose down the equipment and garden because of the smell and germs. When Anglian Water arrived they told us that the main sewerage was clear and refused to unblock the smaller pipes stating that only the main sewerage was their responsibility. After a lot of persuasion we eventually got them to put their pressure washer into the pipe to clear it BUT they have told us they will not clear these pipes in the future. For years we had 2 nice older guys who came from Anglian Water who did all they could to help with this problem. They were able to see from the records that we had a major problem with blockages due to more houses being built in the village and more waste having to travel through these pipes without any upgraded work being carried out on the current sewerage system. I do not know what will happen if they have plans to build any further developments which will use the same pipes to get rid of the extra waste – they just cannot cope with what we have now.

I cannot understand that if we are talking about Sewerage and due to the amount of blockages that we actually get on our property and on our small Estate why we can be held responsible for keeping this small pipe clear surely it must be down to the people to whom we pay our Water Rates to keep the waste flowing to the pumping station. All our washing machines, dishwashers, sink water, bath water and sewerage flow through the same pipe and we feel it is too small to cope.

Lastly I would ask all of you to be careful what you actually put down your toilets & drains as apparently Anglian Water personnel state it is the responsibility of all of us to keep the smaller drains clear. Items such as DOUBLE THICK TOILET PAPER, SANITARY ITEMS AND EVEN NAPPIES although apparently bio-degradable this does not happen instantly so with FATS, COOKING OILS and even WASHING POWDER etc. cause the blockages. Please try to reduce these items or even put them in the dustbin and maybe the drain might not block as frequently and then my husband will not have to clear them so regularly once I might add on Christmas Day and also another time his Birthday.

A carvery lunch at The Cock in Wing is the venue and object of our September meeting, followed by a visit to a local garden centre.



#### Highlights of the Minutes of the Eaton Bray Parish Council Meeting held in The Coffee Tavern on Mon 7th Sep 2009 at 7:30pm Police Representative

PC Viv Dady and Police Sergeant Ian McBrearty attended the meeting. They confirmed they are in the process of installing a camera in the High Street. The police reassured residents that they are dealing with the issues arising from youths hanging around certain areas of the parish. The police reiterated the importance for residents to contact them when they see/hear anything improper.

#### Youth Club

The police confirmed that they have members of the parish who are interested in reforming the youth club and are in the process of going through checking procedures for these roles.

#### Planning

The Parish Council Meeting was attended by a large number of residents with concerns for a planning application and following a discussion of this application the Parish Council gave unanimous support in recommending the application be turned down. The Parish Council raised concerns with regards to the time limit put upon planning applications to be put before the Planning Committee. The Parish Council believe the timescales are too short and do not give Parish Councils time to look at and discuss planning applications in detail.

#### **Central Bedfordshire Representatives**

Central Bedfordshire Councillors, Cllr Ken Janes and Marion Mustoe attended the meeting. The Parish Clerk clarified to Cllr Janes that the Parish Council had supported Eaton Bray Lower School's application for an additional classroom but had commented that they thought the design not being in keeping with the current building.

#### **Refuse Collections**

The Parish Council have received this response from Central Bedfordshire regarding fortnightly refuse collections (AWC): "...the issues of public health were thoroughly explored... Environmental health professionals generally agree that AWC does not pose a health risk provided householders take precautions... The introduction of AWC has been very successful...total amount of waste collected has reduced, increase in recycling has been very significant and the cost of waste management has been kept as low as possible." Residents with concerns should contact Central Bedfordshire Council direct on 0300 300 4344.

#### **School Lane Recreation Ground Improvements**

The Parish Council reported that as the funding for the Skate & Ride project has been approved, they are now in the final stages of the project and currently going through the proposed designs/quotations for this facility. As soon as this process allows build will commence.

#### **Bower Lane Cemetery**

The ground under the back hedge has been cleared and seeded with grass, has grown very well and looks really good. Food has recently been found in the Cemetery ground; the throwing/eating of food in the cemetery is prohibited, the Parish Council are looking into the possibility installing a notice board for the cemetery to display ALL cemetery rules/regulations.

This is the story of a married woman, with 6 children, who decides, when she is deeply in debt, that the only way to improve her financial situation and keep her children in private schools is to become an escort. The book has a good balance between description, storytelling and reflection which made it a good read.

Dawn reveals her journey from young girl to married mother and escort, dwelling on her choice of husbands and boyfriends, purchases and expenses, friends and clients, pimps and madams. This is a far cry from the glossy world of 'Belle du Jour', replacing sexual delights with the real world of prostitution; exhausting, dangerous and hardcore.

The story was well written and the group felt some sympathy with Dawn but considered that there were other ways of overcoming her problems. There was a mixture of admiration for her honesty and the way she put her children first and annoyance that her values were so unrealistic. It doesn't seem possible for one person to put themselves through so many ordeals that could have been avoided.



What a delight! Sue Mitchell and some of her feathered friends (Birds of Bray) came to our August 2009 Meeting at the Memorial Hall. Her elegant birds were the very model of decorum and quite impervious to the admiration bestowed upon them by the Members. Whisper, the Eagle Owl, reigned supreme over her "parliament", all she needed was a pair of specs and a mortarboard and she could have stepped straight out of a kiddies story book.

We were all pleased to hear that all of Sue's birds are bathed, de-bugged, wormed and allowed to fly freely regularly and that none have been taken from the wild. Sue also told us of the many expressions and words still in use today which originated from the days of falconry, when it was a way of life. i.e. "on the cadge" and "rousing" from sleep.

All Sue's birds are birds of prey and they are all capable of killing mammals very efficiently if they need to for food. Roughly speaking the larger the bird the larger the mammal.

A couple of us acted as trees for Willow, the barn owl's roost, so that she could launch and return in pursuit of her supper.

It has to be said, that the 2 aforementioned lady trees were more of the spreading chestnut type than the slender willow. (sorry Val R). None-the-less, Willow peformed with precision as she positively whizzed across the heads of the ladies.

What pleasure Sue's dogs and birds must give to the patients they frequently visit in the local hospices, schools etc., It is really good to know that if a bird is fortunate to "land" on the Mitchells doorstep, then it has a home for life and is never handed on to anyone else. How lucky is that?

These magnificent birds didn't seem at all disturbed by the general W.I. clamour or all the petting and tickling they received, and this alone, has to be a true testament to the care and kindness received from the Mitchell family. A super evening all round, and right up my street I can tell you.

At a recent meeting we were thrilled to learn that Edlesborough was runner-up in one section of 'The Best Kept Village' competition. Congratulations to everyone whose hard work had made this possible.

Our speaker that evening was Christopher Clarke, a Freeman of the Worshipful Company of Goldsmiths, whose subject was hallmarking. He said it was the oldest form of consumer protection for gold, silver and platinum, the three precious metals. Hallmarking is not Government controlled. The Goldsmiths Co. carry out the tests and marking, and there are four basic marks: the maker, where marked, when marked and quality. The work is done in one of four assay offices found in London, Birmingham, Sheffield & Edinburgh.

The quality of gold is measured in carats - 24 (pure), 22, 18, 14 & 9. Silver is either Britannia or Sterling, but platinum has one quality only. Mr. Clarke said hallmarking was very important and was fact. There were huge fines for fakes.

To end, we report the sad news of the death of an ex-W.I. member, Marjorie Clarke. We remember Marjorie as a keen and supportive member over many years. Val Harris

For most women their posture adapts to compensate for this shift and you may find yourself either slumping forward and flattening out the curve in your low back, or counter balancing the weight by leaning back, at your upper body, which leads to a greater curve and a shift of your weight on to your heels. The muscles of your back, lower abdomen and your pelvic floor are designed to move and stabilise the joints in your back and pelvis but as your baby grows they are not able to do their job as efficiently. This ,along with the adaptations you may make to your changing shape, combined with hormonal (hormones are chemicals that carry messages around your body) changes that loosen the ligaments around the pelvis, can result in low back pain, upper back pain, pubic bone discomfort and general postural strain.

#### What can you do to reduce those risks?

**Stand Tall** – imagine that someone is making you feel taller by pulling a string attached at the back and top of your head at the same time as you tightening your tummy muscles and pelvic floor as much as you are able .

**Sit Correctly** - make sure your back is well supported. You may prefer a dining chair to a soft chair or sofa. Placing a small rolled up towel in the hollow of your back may help if you are finding your back is adopting a flattened posture.

**Avoid Heavy Lifting -** Your loosened ligaments make them vulnerable so ask for help whenever possible. If you do have to lift, make sure you hold the object close to your body, and bend your knees rather than your back. If you are shopping divide your goods into equal loads for each hand.

**Wear Comfortable Shoes** – Generally, if you are finding the curve in your low back increasing, flat shoes may be more comfortable as heels will accentuate the curve.

Adapt The Way You Carry Out Your Chores- e.g. when vacuuming stand in a walking position, with the Hoover in front of you, then move your feet to the next area and Hoover in front of you again. Don't be tempted to push it so far away from your body that you end up bending and twisting your back.

**Exercise Regularly**- but unfamiliar routines may damage the joints that loosen during pregnancy so it is wise to seek advice if you are unsure of the suitability of your exercise regime. The most appropriate forms of exercise include swimming, walking, aqua natal classes, Pilates and yoga. It is important that the instructor is qualified or experienced in teaching pregnant women. If you are experiencing pelvic girdle pain, or symphysis pubic dysfunction, then always seek advice from a Chartered Physiotherapist prior to beginning any exercise.

#### You can reduce the risks to your pelvic area and pubic joint by;

- a) Standing evenly on both feet.
- b) Sitting on both buttocks and not crossing your legs.
- c) If you have other small children don't carry them on one hip.
- d) Avoid movements where you are swinging your leg sideways, for example when you get in and out of bed, or a car, turn your hips, pelvis and back in the same direction, while keeping your back straight, so you are moving as a whole and not

twisting.

Once your baby is born there is a period of time, while your hormones re-adjust and you resume your usual tasks, when your spine remains susceptible to damage. This may even be increased by a busy, unfamiliar schedule involving lifting and carrying car seats and prams, combined with feeding postures, picking baby up from their crib and carrying them. It is important to protect your back in the same way you did when you were pregnant.

If you find you cannot resolve your discomfort with this simple advice seek the help of a Chartered Physiotherapist who will be able to identify your specific problems and aggravating activities. They can then provide you with a tailored programme that will fit in with your schedule. They can also advise and provide you with supports to relieve/reduce low back pain and pelvic girdle discomfort.



#### Aylesbury Vale Community Chest tops the £1 million mark

More than £1 million has now been awarded to voluntary and community organisations through the Aylesbury Vale Community Chest scheme.

Since the £5 million grant fund was launched in 2007, nearly 200 local groups have received funding for community projects.

The Community Chest is run jointly by Aylesbury Vale District Council and the Vale of Aylesbury Housing Trust. Each year up to 2017, the fund will award around £500,000 in grants to support projects that improve lives in our communities.

Two types of grant can be applied for: micro-grants of up to £1,000, which are awarded monthly, or project grants of up to £25,000, which are awarded three times a year. To be successful, each project application needs to demonstrate local need and involvement plus the benefit to the community.

#### Register to vote the easy way

See you there, don't forget 7.30 for 8.00pm.



#### **Table Corner**



People believe that catering for numbers of people larger than their 'normal' number is a black art. Have you ever asked: How do you know how much food to prepare for 60 guests? Do you multiply the recipe quantities by the

number of guests? What if there are many dishes to be served at the same time?

Well, I would like to tell you that there is a foolproof formula to solve that problem. However there isn't! It is more about knowing who your guests are and the type of food that is going to be served than the exact number of guests. The age and ratio of men to women is the first factor to take into account. Young men are well known to have bigger appetites and are more likely to help themselves twice! Children and our senior guests like nibbling and prefer smaller portions respectively.... and ladies eat specific items!

The time of your party also matters. You will require less food for a late dinner party than for a hog-roast served at lunch time with guests expecting another round at about 8.00 pm.

Armed with your recipes, there are a few guidelines that you can follow:

- When multiplying a recipe, always round up the number of people, not down. There
  is nothing more embarrassing than running out of food
- To be on the safe side, always plan spare bread rolls or baguettes which you can cut as a last resort if you have accidentally planned too little food, or the unexpected arrives
- If serving a rich dish, allow smaller proportions for each person
- If you are having a variety of dishes, be aware that your guests are likely to taste a little bit of everything – even if you think you know their choices. This means that you have to plan smaller portions but that the average consumption (and unfortunately wastage) will be greater. If you want to avoid this problem, reduce the numbers of dishes
- Finally, if you know that one of your dishes is always more popular than the others, plan much more of it and much less of the others!

I hope this helps!



#### Anti Social Behaviour in Edlesborough

Anti social behaviour has long been a problem in Edlesborough. The Parish Council faces a considerable bill each year simply repairing vandal damage to Council property, particularly to the Pavilion, Memorial Hall and the play equipment on the Green. Also villagers often complain about unacceptable behaviour by a minority of youths, particularly late at night.

The Parish Council has recently managed to get the problem recognised as a priority by Thames Valley Police through the medium of the Neighbourhood Action Group. Consequently our Neighbourhood Police Officer, Jared Levens, and our two PCSOs Jackie Dobson and Christine Baker, are trying to address the issue. Jared would like to organise extra officers to patrol the village late at night to deal with the problems, but he needs the evidence to justify the deployment of what are very limited resources to this task. Unfortunately the number of incidents currently being reported to the Police is not sufficient to provide the evidence that Jared needs.

Whilst the Parish Council always make a point of reporting damage, we believe that many people don't because they think that nothing will be done about it – "so what's the point?" Unfortunately that becomes a self fulfilling prophesy - as far as the Police are concerned, if you don't report it, there isn't evidence to suggest that incidents are occurring.

Similarly people observe unacceptable behaviour but don't want to get involved for various reasons. Either they feel that if they get involved they will become a target for troublemakers, or whilst they may be disturbed by the behaviour, they don't believe that a specific crime has been committed and so they don't feel entitled to report it.

If you are the victim of anti social behaviour, however slight, or if you witness unacceptable behaviour taking place, don't leave it to someone else to do something about it - Phone 0845 8 505 505 – the non emergency number for this district. You will be asked for your name and address, but that doesn't mean that your name will be divulged to the individuals that you are complaining about. You are entitled to anonymity if that is what you want. The Police can and do take action if a nuisance is being committed even if it doesn't involve an identifiable criminal offence, but they have to be there in the first place to deal with it.

Key information the Police will need if you can provide it is:

- Names of those you know are responsible.
- Description of the people including clothing.
- Registration plate of the vehicle and description of the car / motorbike.
- Explanation of what the individual(s) and / or vehicle(s) are doing.


