



Proposed 'Kick Wall' for Edlesborough Green

In the November issue of 'Focus', Edlesborough Parish Council (EPC) indicated that it was investigating the provision of a purpose designed kick wall, which would be located somewhere appropriate on Edlesborough Green. Having taken account of the space required, existing football and cricket pitches, access for Carnival vehicles, proximity of roads, houses and other matters, we believe that there are three possible locations. These are shown in white and numbered 1, 2 & 3 in the aerial photograph below:



Location No.	Location Description	
1	Near the children's playground, backing on to the trees, and between the full size and mini football pitches.	
2	Near the cricket nets, backing onto the trees, near The Green road.	
3	Near the basketball stand and Memorial Hall car park	

An example of a typical kick wall (sometimes known as "goal ends", or multi-use games areas), is shown right. They come in various sizes and styles, are robust, heavy duty, and hard wearing, provide plenty of play value for various games, such as football, basketball, hockey, cricket, and general kick abouts. EPC is currently considering a version about 6m long x 3m high, without a basketball net (as we already



have one elsewhere on the Green), and with a grass tiled surface about 6m wide x 15 - 20m long in front.

Colour, and improved resolution pictures of the Edlesborough Green locations and the kick wall, can be seen on www.edlesborough.gov.uk You can also see a typical example on Ivinghoe Green.

EPC would very much welcome parishioners' comments on the above - including those from children and teenagers! Please let the Clerk have these by <u>Monday 4th</u> <u>January 2010</u> so that they can be fully considered at the Council's next meeting. We will then update parishioners with another 'Focus' article, and if appropriate, some idea of the timescale to raise the necessary funds and possible implementation.

Table Corner Some good old traditions...

As it is traditional in a December issue to talk about the festive season, I thought that I would explain a little bit more about Christmas in Belgium (you might remember that this is where I am from).

The first elementary fact is that we do not celebrate Christmas on the 25th of December. It is celebrated on Christmas Eve, i.e. on the 24th, in the evening - with a rather elaborate meal that is eaten with all the family before the Midnight Mass and/or the opening of Christmas gifts if you are not a church-goer. You are very unlikely to find any turkey on the table. And even more unlikely (despite its name) to eat any of these smelly, little, green, cruciferous vegetables otherwise known as Brussel sprouts (would the "Love a Sprout campaigners" please refrain from writing in). What you will find though is the best food that a family can afford. So after the aperitif, the first course might be seafood followed by let's say beef en croute. The dessert is more traditional with a "bûche de Noël" (meaning 'Christmas log') being served. All it is, is a really rich creamy cake in the shape of a log. It is down to its maker to decorate

it. You can add little trees, miniature houses, a Father Christmas or little baubles. In recent years, Belgians have also started having the iced version of the bûche. On Christmas day, the bakeries will be open especially to sell for breakfast the traditional "cougnou" meaning Bread of Jesus which is a sweet bread shaped like a baby Jesus.



The main festival for children in December is called St Nicholas, on the 6th December. This is the day they get plenty of toys and lovely food. Christmas is more of a family gathering. 



First of all, I would like to begin this letter with a sincere expression of my thanks to all of you who helped with my licensing to Eaton Bray with Edlesborough on November 2nd. It was lovely to meet so many of you who came to support me on this occasion. Many, many thanks. I generally read Morning Prayer at 9am. and Evening Prayer at 5pm in St Mary's and so if anyone would care to join me for these times I would be delighted.

I have been very lucky in my life to be able to travel, and have been periodically to northern Europe and Scandinavia. I have found that Sweden in the winter months, and particularly around the month of December and leading up to Christmas is a real wonder of little spots of warmth and light. I can remember wandering around the old town in Gothenburg in flurries of snow, and wondering where I could find a place to eat. Only then to realise that most of the restaurants had become underground basement retreats, down intriguing stairways lit with enormous beautiful outdoor candles shining the way. Once inside, there was always in abundance, a welcome of warmth and hospitality. For me, therein lies the magical mystery of this time of year; our intention to find or to carry ideas and memories of warmth, light and a regained sense of wellbeing in order to illuminate the darkness, perhaps in the most unusual or unlikely places.

It is this theme of light in the darkness that is central to our celebration of Christmas. We have the stories of the first Christmas which abound with images of light. The star which shines in the night sky, in order to guide the wise men to the place of Jesus' birth, is bursting with radiance, and the night sky is filled with light as the Angels bring the news of Jesus' birth to the shepherds keeping watch over their flocks.

Nobody really knows the day, the month or the season of Jesus' birth, but surely there can be no accident that Jesus' birth has been associated with the darkness of the winter solstice, and the 'night' time. In the middle of the night, on the longest night of the year, Jesus is born. He is, 'the true light that enlightens everyone, the light of the world'. All of the imagery leads us to see Jesus' birth into the world as an event that will be truly life giving. This shift from darkness to the birth of the one true light I would like to suggest is called in another word, 'Hope'. God comes into the world and brings Hope to all. My wish for this lead up to Christmas is that in all the rush and preparations, we may glimpse once again perhaps in the most unusual of places, the Hope of the Christ Child.

May I take this opportunity to wish you a peaceful and blessed Christmas. Roger




The Traffic Management Team are continuing to use the "Speedwatch" equipment which is still proving to be very effective at reducing traffic speeds, but disappointingly we are recording a higher number of speeding vehicles!! We hope that these are through traffic and that our message is getting across to local drivers to drive within the speed limit. Letters from Thames Valley Police will be arriving through letterboxes soon. We hope that you are not about to receive one!

The long awaited Bucks County Council Speed Review has started. It will consider an appropriate speed for the Traveller's Rest area, for Northall (A4146) and for other parts of the A4146. Before the outcome of this review is finalised there will be further consultation. Providing we are given sufficient warning of the dates of consultation meetings, we will use this magazine to advise everyone who might wish to attend the meeting. We would be very glad of your support.

Some members of the Team recently attended a meeting where residents of Water End and district were in discussion with the Herts Highways Agency regarding ways of reducing speeds and increasing road safety on the A4146 just south of our three villages. This was an eye opener to all who attended!! Water End appear to have made very little headway so our Team is reviewing how best to approach Bucks County Council in order to achieve a higher success rate by putting forward achievable goals. More on this later.

Edlesborough Parish Council (including Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall) News

Apologies that the October report was duplicated in the November issue of Focus. The October report informed parishioners of the proposed Road Closures for the Remembrance Sunday service held at Edlesborough War Memorial and the Parish Council would like to apologise to residents that they were not forewarned.

On the Road Project

Also due to appear in the November 'Focus' was information regarding this project which is run by AVDC and the first event would take place on Edlesborough Green on 9th November comprising a skate park, i-van with multi-media and interactive facilities and various sports for 11-14 year olds all free of charge. Notices of this project were on the Parish notice boards and it is hoped that a further date will be arranged for this to take place in Dagnall early in the New Year.

Edlesborough Play Area

The Parish Council are pleased to report that the wooden balancing beams have now been replaced by steel beams and the vandalised Galactica and roundabout have been repaired. The Council apologise for the delay in getting these repairs carried out. Should further damage occur to the roundabout steps have been taken for it to be immobilised until repaired.

P.A.I.N (London-Luton Airport

The Luton Airport Annual Monitoring Report for 2008 has recently been published. In 2008 the Airport handled 10.2 million passengers compared with 9.9 million in 2007. The number of commercial passenger aircraft movements increased by almost 3% but the total number of aircraft movements decreased by 2% as a result of fewer cargo and general aviation movements. The proportion of scheduled flights compared with charter flights continues to increase. There was a decrease in night movements compared to 2007. The split of Westerly to Easterly operations was very similar to previous years. The report indicates that a large proportion of Olney 26 flight path departures turn north before they reach the Parish, suggesting that during Westerly operations approximately 6% of departing aircraft overflew the Parish instead of 20% if all aircraft followed the designated flight path for longer. The Parish Council will be submitting it's response to the NATS TCN consultation when received.

Allotments

Allotment rents have been collected and the Clerk will be contacting names on the waiting list to offer vacant plots available.

Remembrance Sunday

Having obtained an official Order for road closures, diversion signs were erected thus enabling the service to be conducted without traffic going past the War Memorial and the congregation were able to assemble in the road. A separate article will appear in this issue.

Litter Bins

Additional litter bins to be purchased and distributed around the Parish.

Burial Fees

The present fees will be increasing as from 1st February 2010.

Road/Footpath repairs

Bucks CC have been chased up to carry out work to remove the 'hump' in the pavement of Pebblemoor, to establish what can be done to improve the pot hole situation around Brook Street and The Green, to install white lines at the junctions of Orchard End and Jacksons Close and to report on the continued flooding at the junction of Eaton Bray Road, Northall with the A4146.



Recent News

Inspector Garside says "I look forward to the challenge of my new role and hope to get to meet as many of you as possible over the next few months. For me Neighbourhood Policing is all about the community knowing their local officers and being confident that we are tackling the issues which mean the most to you. I expect my teams to be visible and engaged with their neighbourhoods and delivering a high quality of service at all times."

In conjunction with Bedfordshire police and local farmers we now have Operation Animal in place to combat hare coursing. If you see any suspicious vehicles or people entering fields please report them. By working together we hope to catch these criminals who show no regard for farmers' land or livestock.

We continue to be involved with the community in as many ways as possible. PCSO Dodson and PC Levens call in at the Ivinghoe Youth drop in every week and this month PCSOs Dodson and Baker have talked to the Ivinghoe W.I., PC Levens is taking the Beavers to see the custody suite at Amersham police station and PCSO Dodson is talking to the brownies about being safe and seen at night and PCSO Baker will be leading the All Age service at St Giles church, Cheddington on Sunday October 18th. Nag Info

The Wing South Neighbourhood action group met in September and the next meeting is scheduled for November 16th. We continue to work on our priorities of speeding, theft from vehicles and anti social behaviour.

- PC Levens has been out with the laser gun in Ivinghoe at Station Road, Ivinghoe
 and Pebblemoor, Edlesborough. PCSOs Dodson and Baker have the SID booked
 this month and residents of Cheddington and Edlesborough have been out with
 their community speedwatch devises.
- Patrols of beauty spot car parks, where many thefts from vehicles occur, continue to be a priority. Extra patrols in these car parks and surrounding villages are carried out not only by us but also special constables and plain clothes officers in unmarked cars. Members of the NAG and PCSO Dodson, with the aid of an AVDC display on car crime, were in Pitstone Hill car park on Sunday September 20th to educate the public about not leaving valuables in cars. This successful venture coincided with the Chiltern festival and a similar operation by Hertfordshire police at the monument car park.
- Our priority on anti social behaviour in Edlesborough has been hampered by people's reluctance to phone the police. We would encourage everyone who is affected by any sort of anti social behaviour to ring 0845 8 505505. By calling us when events are happening gives us a better chance of catching those responsible.

Offenders brought to Justice

Recently three youths were arrested in Edlesborough at 3am for stealing and riding a

quad bike. They are currently on bail pending further enquiries. This was an excellent response to a crime in progress and hopefully this will send out a strong message to young people and their parents that the police will take tough action against anyone committing crime.

Crime Stats

Overall crime is down in Wing South by 6% from the same period (April – August) last year. Sheds and garages are currently most at risk of being broken into in our area so we encourage you to ensure that these are kept locked and secured. Where possible good outside lighting will help deter criminals. There are good sensor alarmed padlocks on the market at good prices.

If you have any issues you wish to discuss with the Wing South team we are holding a police surgery on Tuesday October 27th at the Nup End Café, Methodist church, Nup End Lane, Wingrave 10.30a.m. – 1200 p.m. Come along for a chat and enjoy a cup of coffee at the same time. Surgeries are booked for Dagnall, Marsworth and Mentmore in the coming months and details will be on the website once the venues have been confirmed.

Over the course of this month a number of road safety checks will be conducted as we work with the Roads Policing Department. As the nights get darker it is a good opportunity to educate drivers and prevent serious accidents occurring.



National Minimum Wage increase

From 1 October, the adult rate of the National Minimum Wage (NMW) increases to £5.80. The other rates also increase.

Also from 1 October, tips and service charges paid to a worker through the employer's payroll do not count towards the NMW.

Redundancy pay increase

From 1 October, the statutory limit on a week's pay for statutory redundancy pay increases to £380 (from £350). This increase also applies to the calculation of compensation for unfair dismissal and other claims, for example, failure to consult over collective redundancies.

Tax refunds

From 1 April 2010, the time limit for claiming a tax refund will be reduced to four years from the end of the relevant tax year. This applies to all claims submitted on or after 1 April 2010. For example, a claim for the tax year 2005/2006, which ended on 5 April 2006, must be made by 5 April 2010.

People who may be entitled to a refund should be encouraged to make claims promptly to avoid the possibility of losing the right to claim for the earliest years.





Zap vour carbon

Aylesbury Vale District Council is encouraging residents to check the environmental impact of their own lifestyles on the environment by using an innovative new web-based system.

The ZapCarbon website (www.zapcarbon.com) allows householders to manage their carbon emissions and see the positive differences they are making by entering readings from their electricity meter online.

Once the extent of their electricity use has been established, residents are being challenged to go about reducing their carbon footprint by making simple changes, such as swapping ordinary light bulbs for energy efficient ones or switching off electrical items left on standby, which can have a positive effect on the environment whilst actually saving them money.

Residents can regularly enter their meter readings into the system to find out how much their electricity consumption has changed. Graphs are provided to show how much progress has been made.

Householders can also access advice about actions they can take to cut their emissions and arrange online contests with friends, groups or clubs to see who can save the most energy.

Business Grants

More and more businesses are being given a helping hand with grants from Aylesbury Vale District Council.

The AVDC business grants panel recently awarded four grants to new and existing businesses, a total amount of £16,000. It brings the grand total for 2009 to £22,000 of grants from the council for local firms.



Letter to the Editors

It is getting cold.... Not relevant if you live in EB, but ... What should you be paying for LPG &. Oil?

Yes I know the above sounds more akin to a Watchdog or an awful sales pitch. Forgive me, perhaps not the tone required for our parish magazine, but I hope in this case the editors will allow the transgression. Most of us live comfortably enough, but fuel poverty is a real issue for some residents. Not an issue if you have piped gas, but many of us only dream of it, so here goes.

The Government has had the Monopolies Commission look at the 'pay or freeze' antics, sharp practice, and contracts tie-downs surrounding much of the LPG supply industry. It has helped, but unfortunately we still have no cost transparency. It is still very likely you pay the current average of 48pence per litre, whereas, your neighbour can be paying as little as 33ppl. That 15ppl doesn't sound like much, but on an average bill around here, that is a £5-700.00 a year difference. In our case, we have neighbours supplied at 46ppl. Whereas, until recently, we were paying 54ppl. Ouch?!

A request to remove the tank last August, backed up by knowledge of what a company pays for LPG used in forklifts, eventually got the rate down to 33ppl - with rental (a std 1200L tank) at 50per annum. For us, this made a comfortable £900.00+ pa saving. For those of you still dreaming of piped gas to your village, bear in mind, at 33ppl per litre this cost pretty much matches any KWh energy rate the more fortunate might pay on a piped mains gas supply. (Go to www.coedcymru.org.uk/calculator.htm for more on this) So it pays to ask. Incidentally, you

would need to be paying 36ppl for Oil to match this per KWh rate.

This leaves one question, "Will we ever see a mains supply in our village?" With the installation cost per household variously quoted at £3500-5000, it seems most unlikely. This means, we're all left to secure lower Oil & LPG costs - and if you can do that, there's no need. It becomes weight of numbers, so gone on, ring your supplier. (Name Supplied)


