DOG ATTACK ON THE GREEN, EDLESBOROUGH

On the 25 November last my Yorkshire Terrier was savagely attacked by a large dog which the gentleman owner was unable to control and which subsequently slipped its lead resulting in the attack. After 8 visits to the vet and considerable expense my dog has made a full recovery. Since then I have found that other peoples' dogs have suffered similar attacks from different dogs. We know some dogs will fight given the chance but it is the owner's responsibility to ensure that all precautions are taken to stop this happening. The lead should be strong enough and the collar tight enough for the dog to be restrained safely.

This was a frightening and unsettling experience and has made me very wary and nervous of other dogs when walking mine.

If your dog is unfortunate enough to be attacked, obtain any information you can and notify the Police, who, I was surprised to know, do need to know about dog-on-dog attacks!

I'd just like to remind people to respect the notices on the green requesting owners to keep dogs on leads at all times.

DOG ATTACKS ON THE INCREASE

I am concerned about the increase in aggressive dogs making unprovoked attacks on other dogs on The Green and the 'walking routes' around our villages. My own dog was viciously attacked on the 6th January. My fourteen year old daughter was walking our Shih' Tzu on the lead and had just reached the grassy area at the back of Mill End Close when a dog appeared from the direction of the small bridge. It set about savaging our dog until the owner appeared saying her dog had slipped its lead.

My daughter was distraught, blaming herself for not being able to protect our family pet. Soba's injuries required treatment from the vet so I had to drive to Leighton Buzzard in heavy snow. The vet said Soba had been very lucky to escape with fairly superficial wounds, especially as he had had major surgery a month earlier. This could have been a fatal attack.

A few weeks earlier, my friend's dog suffered a much more brutal attack on The Green, also from a dog which had slipped its lead. Chatting to people around the villages, it is clear that several attacks have taken place because owners are not taking responsibility in ensuring their dogs are on leads, with collars which fit properly and are, therefore, capable of restraining them. Furthermore, if a dog is known to have aggressive tendencies, it should be muzzled when in public.

Fortunately, my dog is recovering well from his injuries. My daughter, however, is now apprehensive about taking Soba for a walk on her own. I urge all dog owners to be more thoughtful and responsible - you must be able to control your dog/s!

Life, they say is what happens when you are planning something else!

As I sit looking out on my garden everything is white, with several inches of snow. Three weeks after the first snowfall, the novelty is starting to wear off and I trust that by the time you read this Spring will be beginning to show itself in our villages.

The weather caused so much disruption to our neatly planned lives. Many of you will have been unable to get to work, or been housebound because of the snowfall. Some of you may have had your travel plans at Christmas disrupted, unable to fly or travel by train. Our modern society seems to take it for granted that our lives will run smoothly – yet, in reality, life is rarely that easy, and when something out of the ordinary happens we often struggle to cope and ask questions like "Why is it happening to me?" or "Why now?; and we complain "Life isn't fair". Those of you who are experiencing bereavement, or who have lost your job, or who have suffered financial loss or unexpected illness will know what I mean – and don't think the congregation at St Mary's is immune to these events.

But even joyful events can turn your life upside down. Just before Christmas, and quite out of the blue, our son and his girlfriend informed Christine and me that we are to be grandparents and that there would be a wedding in February. Well, words simply cannot express our joy at the news but, suddenly, there is panic in our household as we wonder what to wear and when we will find time to go shopping, especially given how busy the diary is for January. But, even with such wonderful news, we know things could go wrong; childbirth remains one of the most dangerous events for mother and baby, as some of you will be painfully aware. I am reminded of words from Rudyard Kipling's poem "If you can meet with Triumph and Disaster and treat those two impostors just the same".

From the earliest times to the present day people have tried to identify ways of living that might guarantee a happy or successful life and to understand the mystery of, apparently random, life-changing events - even Albert Einstein, unhappy with some random elements of life, was quoted as saying "God does not play dice".

Perhaps the ancients were closer to death, and life, than we are today – they certainly gave the subject considerable thought. I find two ancient writings to be helpful; the Tao-te-ching, by an ancient (6th century BC) Chinese wisdom writer Lao-tzu whose teaching is similar to Zen Buddhism, and the book of Ecclesiastes from our Old Testament, written in 300-250BC.

The way of living in accordance with the Tao is 'not grasping', not trying to hold on to what we believe should be rightfully ours: things, people, youth, status, beauty, life itself. We grasp by trying to domesticate reality but grasping, the Tao says, is futile. Indeed, in Buddhism, it is considered to be the primary source of suffering.

Ecclesiastes (a very user friendly read) has a similar message: life is not about pursuing the rewards promised by the path of conventional wisdom but about living simply and

in the present. True wisdom means carpe diem, seize the day – don't miss it, don't let life slip by unnoticed. Instead, live life to the full - for all of us life is short. As the author says:

Go, eat your bread with enjoyment, and drink your wine with a merry heart. ... Enjoy life with the wife whom you love. ... Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might. ... For time and chance happen to all men.




Favourite Walks in and around Bedfordshire





Eaton Bray Lawn Tennis Club



Brrrr, winter has arrived with gusto in South Beds and as I pen this one particularly chilly Sunday morning, the snow is falling outside like a scene from Ice Station Zebra, except that there isn't a submarine in my garden, or lots of fighting. Apart from the few remaining Starlings however, who are far too lazy a species to make any long flight south to warmer climes, and instead have launched themselves into a civil war under my bamboo bush over a few morsels of discarded juicy bacon rind from my morning's healthily prepared grilled breakfast. The problem for the Starlings, searching through the deep snow for their few scraps, is replicated during these weather conditions on our tennis courts. Play is dramatically hampered by the habit of the tennis ball to land with a loud 'plop' into 8 inches of snow and stay there, exactly at the point where it landed, refusing to bounce or otherwise act in the manner expected by such an important piece of equipment in any game involving a bat, racquet or other striking implement. As such, the combination of uncooperative balls and the requirement to wear our racquets on our feet to move around rather than hold them, has resulted in the temporary postponement of games and tournaments on our courts in Eaton Bray until the sun comes out again.

Now this got me thinking. Not only is this a shame for our regular players who will now have to find some other method of staying fit during the big freeze – my wife is already using up twice her normal calories chatting to me as she can't get out – but also for the hundreds of spectators who flock to the courts every week to watch their favourite sporting heroes battle it out over three sets. One of our member's cousin's friend's uncle's mates knows a bloke who's sister's boyfriend works at the Eden project down in Cornwall. Apparently they're replacing one of their 'Biomes', those big plastic greenhouse type tents that house all those sub-tropical plants you can amble around. So I've made a few enquiries, and it turns out that the old one is available at a very reasonable rate. All we have to do is get a few members together, hire a van, go down to Cornwall, dismantle it (we'll need a ladder if anyone's got one), bring it back to the village and re-erect it over our courts. Ex-chairman Glenn works for a building company so he can be in charge. We'll need a few car tyre pumps to inflate it, but by my calculations if we can get all 130 members pumping away for a couple of weeks solid, then we can get it fully serviceable before any more snow arrives.

Before you know it we'll be playing our tennis in balmy conditions surrounded by sustainable-forest wooden walkways, bubbling streams and Amazonian flora. All we need are a few pot plants, so if anyone can spare any Bursera Fagaroides, Pummello or Muscella Lasiocarpa, as a few examples, can you please drop them off at the Clubhouse (leave outside if we're not in) and we'll plant them in our new Biome as soon as we get it up. Spectators will henceforth enjoy watching their tennis in idyllic surroundings, from comfortable benches situated alongside steaming tropical pools, peering through

exotic flora and sipping ice-cold drinks from our new vending machine. We really are almost there with my latest plan. The only other items I'm after to make it a goer are a few benches, a footpath or two (B&Q decking or the like is ideal), some unwanted garden ponds and streams, three or four fan heaters (2KW preferred) and a vending machine. Oh and 25 grand for the dome; we'll fund the van to get it back here ourselves. Right, a quick reminder about our joint Tennis Club/Village Hall Swing into Spring dance on Saturday 13th March; full details are elsewhere in this magazine but Jim Balls and his Racquets always bring the house down (hence the high cost of repairs to the Hall whenever they've played) and you'd pay a lot more to see them at the Grove or Milton Keynes Theatres (because they'd have to pay a fortune to be allowed to play there). Then there's the two-course dinner included, some dancing, and all for £16 if booked early. Finally don't forget the next joint Quiz Night at the Hall - Saturday 24th April - these are always a 170+ sell-out, so book early!

1) Speed Review

The Speed review process, although started, appears to have no fixed time structure and any alterations proposed may still be challenged by revenue constraints. We will be looking for the outcome to be based on safety requirements and also for environmental improvements. After this speed review, it is unlikely that Bucks CC will review traffic speeds in the foreseeable future, so decisions made this year (hopefully not due to lack of finances) will affect our area for the next 15yrs plus.

2) Speedwatch

Our feedback from the local police indicates that those vehicles we recorded speeding through the villages were in the main local! (i.e. from between Berkhamstead and Leighton Buzzard.) One vehicle came from the Aylesbury area and one from Huddersfield. Two of the vehicles, we are told, were un-insured.

So please be aware of the speed limits and please ensure that your vehicles are street legal.

We re-iterate we are seeking to improve safety and the local environment, - not to penalise drivers

By the time this article is published we could be in the balmy heat of an early spring (!), but if not, the poor weather conditions will leave the road surfaces in a worse state than normal, so take care and safe motoring for 2010!

However parish council representations are not binding on the local authority ... the decision maker ... is the district or borough council or unitary authority."


Christmas Lunches were a great success and a cheque for $\pounds 500$ has been sent to The East Anglia Air Ambulance Charity.

Lasting Powers of Attorney

Lasting Powers of Attorney (LPA) were introduced on 1st October 2007 and are powerful legal documents. Rather like a Will records who is to act as Executor(s) at the time of a death, the two LPAs separately record who (Attorney(s)) is to manage the property and financial affairs and make decisions about the personal welfare of the Donor

A Personal Welfare LPA is only operative after the Donor's loss of mental capacity. Loss of mental capacity is determined by a medical practitioner and can result from an accident or illness, and can be temporary or permanent.

A Property and Affairs LPA is also often made dependent on a Donor's loss of mental capacity, but need not be so. For example, a person may still be capable of making decisions but restricted mobility makes it more practical for an authorised person to implement the decisions and any related tasks.

Accidents and illness can strike at anytime so LPAs are not just for the elderly. LPAs are important to everyone. Anyone who owns or are directors or partners in a business may well wish to chose different attorneys for their personal and business affairs.

For both types of LPAs more than one Attorney can be appointed. They can act together and or independently, and the authority granted can be open or restricted. The authority granted by the Donor to one Attorney does not have to be the same as that granted to another. It is not necessary to have both types of LPA, but it is probably sensible to do so.

When a person loses their mental capacity and there is no LPA available a member(s) of the family or a friend(s) will need to apply to the Court of Protection to obtain the authority to make decisions on their behalf, whether in respect of financial matters and or personal welfare. This is not straightforward and is an expensive and lengthy process. Alternatively the Court will appoint a 'Deputy', usually a solicitor, to oversee the management of the incapacitated person's affairs at a very high cost to their estate. In a similar way to having an up to date Will available, having LPAs available when they are needed relieves loved ones (and a business) of a great deal of expense and time wasting. By recording the person(s) who is to act on behalf of the Donor when they are unable to do so, certainty prevails and family differences are avoided at a very emotional and stressful time. Appropriate decisions and actions can be taken immediately.

Once a LPA is registered with the Court of Protection, the nominated Attorney(s) can act according to the powers granted to them. At all times an Attorney must act in the best interests of the Donor. The Court of Protection oversees that this is so.

LPAs are far more complex than the Enduring Power of Attorney which the LPA Property and Affairs replaced. It is recommended that expert guidance is obtained on all the options available, ideally in the privacy of your home, and that the LPA(s) are prepared by solicitors. **INTERFACE WILLS** provide this service, as well as Wills, Deeds of Variation and Advance Directives, locally and throughout the UK.

Wheels to Work is a moped loan scheme for young people (aged 16-19, or up to 25 in some circumstances) who find it difficult to access work or training opportunities because of a lack of transport. Eligible candidates will receive a 50cc moped for a period of up to 9 months, in return for a small monthly wear and tear fee.



What the scheme includes:

- A fully taxed, insured and safety checked Yamaha YN50 moped
- Helmets and safety clothing
- Insurance, tax and breakdown cover
- Road safety training
- Compulsory Bike Training (this must be passed before the moped is released)

All that we ask in return is that you pay a small monthly wear and tear fee, pay for your own fuel, wear the provided safety equipment and bring your moped in for monthly safety checks.



My Cleaner by Maggie Gee



My Cleaner, is the story of two worlds and what happens when they collide. On one hand there is the apparently successful, middleclass home life in West London of Vanessa Henman. Whilst in Uganda, there is Mary Tendo, her erstwhile cleaner and home help. Vanessa is neurotic and self-obsessed, convinced that she is a great writer, with a great novel somewhere inside just waiting to be written. Whilst in reality, all that she has had published are some keep fit manuals. She is a divorcee with an only son, Justin, who is withdrawn and depressed and is refusing to move from his bedroom.

When Justin was young, Mary Tendo had cared for him and had acted as a surrogate mother, when Vanessa had been too self absorbed to notice him. Consequently, Mary and the little boy had formed a firm bond and Vanessa hopes that Justin will respond to his old nurse.

However, since her return to Uganda, Mary has managed to maintain a responsible job at an hotel and enjoys a privileged position. So, when she returns to the Henman household, she is no longer the meek biddable servant that Vanessa remembers. In fact she is quite crafty and manipulative and intends to use the situation for her own advantage.

Then, the dynamics start to shift and a power struggle begins. Maggie Gee uses the differences between the two women to show gradually, their similarities. Although superficially their views and lifestyles are poles apart, both women are intelligent and

ambitious. Slowly but determinedly Mary begins to dominate the household and her employer.

The book cleverly examines racial tensions, class attitudes and cultural differences; which gives book group members plenty of discussion potential. Our group found the book entertaining and easy to read. The ending was judged a little disappointing, but as a sequel has been published recently, we thought that that explained why plot lines were not finished off satisfactorily.

Edlesborough Parish Council News

(including Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall)

AVDC Refuse collections

Despite the severe weather conditions prevailing over the Christmas and New Year periods the Parish has been fortunate in having all rubbish collected at the stated times. Several injuries were caused to refuse collectors throughout the District and many villages had to forego collections.

Pot Holes/road repairs

The Clerk has constantly been reporting new pot holes caused by weather conditions and Bucks Highways have appointed more 'gangs' to carry out urgent repairs. Two severe water problems occurred in Northall and Edlesborough and, once confirmed by Anglian Water that they were not water main problems but due to blocked drains, Bucks Highways immediately dealt with the situations. Bucks CC are currently deciding how to deal with the pot holes in The Green which is mainly caused by the road surface being higher than the adjacent verge, as soon as weather conditions improve work will be undertaken.

Edlesborough Play Area

One of the swing seats has been repaired and additional bark supplied.

Litter Bins

Additional litter bins of a larger capacity have been positioned by the footpath leading from The Green onto the village Green, outside Northall Village Hall and close to Munns Shop in Dagnall. A further Litter Bin will be installed in Edlesborough High Street. These will be emptied by AVDC.

Edlesborough Memorial Hall

There has been a significant increase in bookings over the past few months. Snow clearing material was supplied during the adverse weather conditions.

Kick Wall/Beautifying the Pavilion

Did you say "Soupe" for supper?

Nothing says "welcome home" better than the wonderful aroma of a pot of homemade soup simmering at the back of the stove. And this is possibly true the world over.... I shan't bore you here with another onion recipe, nor the cabbage one (which incidentally - and partly due to its side effects - inspired the 1981 comedy called "La Soupe au choux"). No, below you will

find a recipe for an absolutely fantastic French mushroom soup. It is Incredibly easy to make and delicious. But before we get to the recipe, I thought that, in this soup context, I would mention a not very well known fact. Which is that the origin for the word "restaurant" was first used in France during the 16th century to describe a highly concentrated, inexpensive soup. This soup, sold by street vendors, was called and advertised as "restaurer" and as an antidote to physical exhaustion. In 1765, a Parisian entrepreneur opened a shop specializing in restaurers. This prompted the use of the modern word "restaurant" to describe the shops... Isn't that fascinating?

Now on to the soup. Please don't forget you can always make it the day before (just as stews) and that it will gain flavour overnight. Just as stews, soups can be frozen up to 3 months. Perfect for those cold winter nights...

Ingredients

Serves 8

50 g butter 500 g fresh mushrooms, thinly sliced

75 g flour

1.5 litre chicken (or vegetable) stock ½ tsp dried thyme

1 bay leaf

2 large egg yolks

125 ml whipping cream

2 tbsp chopped parsley

Method

In large heavy soup pot, melt butter over medium heat; sauté mushrooms for 5-6 minutes or until moisture from mushrooms has evaporated; sprinkle flour over mushrooms (to thicken the soup) and cook for 1 minute (note: it is important to cook the flour thoroughly to get rid of the starchy flavour); Gradually stir in the stock; bring to the boil, stirring constantly. Add thyme and bay leaf, reduce heat and cover. Simmer for 25 minutes. Remove bay leaf. In small bowl whisk egg yolks with cream; from the pot remove approx 250 ml of the stock and stir into cream mixture (this is to prevent the yolks cooking) and then return all to saucepan. Heat over low heat until hot (but not boiling) about 5 minutes; add pepper to taste. Scatter some parsley to finish the soup. Bon appétit!
