

Please could I also ask local gardeners to think of growing on a few plants for our popular plant stall.

This is a very popular community event getting lots of people out and about in the villages on the day and raising funds for local charities.

Chainsaw Carving

Chainsaw carving is a fast growing form of art introduced into this country from America where it began in the early 60s.

This week I visited local carver Dan Collison at his Grandads farm near Tring where he demonstrated his skills. I felt honoured to be there as he normally does not operate with people around him due to the safety of himself and others.

He showed me his working tools of the trade which left me, a layman, quite dumbfounded to see such an array of saws and attachments and increased my vocabulary with words such as carver bars, profilers and a jonsered. I still don't know what that was! Dan

explained that the natural shape of the wood used determines the form the sculpture will take.

Dan was working on a commission of a bear, adding the finishing touches using a chainsaw with a delicate skill as he cut the texture of its fur giving it a real life like quality. He was pleased with the end result having spent 3 days fashioning it from a large tree trunk. It was now ready for the next stage which

was treating the wood to give it durability.

Dan, who studied arboriculture at Guildford College, took up carving a few years ago and has honed his craft producing the beautiful sculptures from the wood that can be seen today in his extensive portfolio. I was impressed with the range of his work which included bears. owls, acorns, fairy mushrooms, eagles, kites, rabbits and garden benches. Dan says that it's a good way of recycling; majestic trees that once stood proud can still be seen as a thing of beauty when enhancing our gardens and parks instead of being cut up and burnt.





Table Corner – On Your Marks...!

First of all I should apologise for last month's article. Through inattention, I sent Focus a work in progress rather than the final draft. The result was "some doubtful grammar, and an extra definite article in the article", as exclaimed Mr Searle. Oh dear... (*Don't apologise! My fault as editor!*)



Well no one is perfect and you do have to be really careful. This was brought to my attention again a few days ago when, in the middle of cooking a mandarin layer, I found that I did not have any vanilla essence. My mind suddenly flashed back roughly 72 hours to recall our 2 year old playing with the attractive little vanilla essence bottle, and dropping it on the kitchen floor. Oh dear again...

I had forgotten to apply one of the first techniques you learn as a chef: the "mise en place" (MEEZ ahn plahs) which, you will have guessed, is a French term for having all your ingredients measured, cut, peeled, sliced, grated, etc. before (I can't emphasize that enough) you start cooking. And, while they wait for use, don't forget to protect those prepared ingredients from contamination, risk from flies, spillage, and drying out if they are susceptible (cling film).

The reason mise en place is so basic is that:

- 1. Any missing ingredients can be spotted before it is too late. Thank goodness we live in Dagnall and have, as you probably do, wonderful neighbours!
- 2. It saves you a considerable amount of time, as you do not have to stop and assemble items in middle of your recipe.
- 3. It allows you to start and continue the actual cooking process on a clean, clutter free area.
- 4. It gives you the peace of mind of knowing that, if not the cooking, yet at least the ingredients are right.

The TV and demonstration chefs absolutely always do it. Have you noticed the number of little glass dishes they have on display? One for the egg yolk, one for the grated lemon etc. So bring out the inner demonstration chef in you and buy a set of little bowls that will allow you to proudly display your 25 grammes of cornflour. And of course, do not forget your mise en place! Have fun!

Many people confuse the two and toxocariosis is blamed incorrectly. Toxoplasma gondii is a parasite which lives in the intestines of cats, never in puppies and dogs. Unfortunately cats' droppings contain infection. We all know cats bury their droppings but unluckily the infection can remain in the soil for up to 10 years. Hence the risk of contamination. There could also be a risk from cat litter if not changed every day.

The effects of toxoplasmosis can be particularly devestating to an unborn child if a woman catches it in early pregnancy.

Many cat owners probably know of this danger, in which case I apologise for wasting their time. This letter is intended to alert those who don't. Molly Nicholson



I don't know whether you've heard, but I understand that we will soon be having a General Election. People will be stuffing election literature through your door, trying to solicit your vote, but I wonder how you will choose, or whether you really care, who will represent you for the next five years. Perhaps some of you may be pleased that you live in the constituency of Mr Speaker Bercow, and that you will not be required to make a choice. Perhaps you simply think that the whole system needs to be changed and none of the parties deserve your vote.

But why should someone from St Mary's be discussing such things, after all, aren't we told that we shouldn't mix religion and politics? I suspect this is because we like to think of 'gentle Jesus, meek and mild' rather than the Jesus who was filled with passion about how much better life could and should be for ordinary people - about God, the kingdom of God, and God's passion for justice. Jesus spoke to peasants as a voice of peasant religious protest against the central economic and political institutions of his day, and he challenged the authorities with public acts and public debates.

We, too, live in a time where there is considerable disquiet about the central economic and political institutions of the day. We are told by all the main parties that life is going to get worse for ordinary people while the wealthy and powerful seem to manage to avoid paving their fair share of taxes, the circumstances are not so dissimilar from those in Jesus' day. So in thinking about where to cast your vote Christians may well ask themselves the question that was popular in the 1990s - "What Would Jesus Do?". Well, Jesus had his own political manifesto (see Matthew Chapter 5 – The Sermon on the Mount) Just as he did in his own day, Jesus would be looking for the rich and powerful to stop taking advantage of ordinary men and women, to stop encouraging people to go deep into debt. He would be looking for leaders committed to ensuring that the poor don't have to struggle to find their food each day, who will not leave hundreds of thousands in mourning as a result of their foreign policy, who will allow citizens to go about their ordinary lives without constant supervision without telling them they have something else to be fearful about, who will tackle the disease in society not by treating the symptoms but holistically, treating the needs of body, mind and spirit.

In return these leaders would require ordinary people to take the responsibility to play their part in society – to treat their neighbours as they would like to be treated themselves, to accept others, even those with different labels, as people not to be feared, to be honest and peaceful, to be thankful for all the gifts God has given them.

You will have to decide which party comes nearest to these ideals - perhaps the system does need to be changed. Jesus' passion was for a society based on justice for all people – it got him crucified. Maybe the best we can hope to do is to vote for the party that doesn't try to crucify Jesus again and again in order to stop his message of hope from being heard, so that genuine change can be bought about.

Climbing Mount Kilimanjaro for Rebecca Jane Stokes

I am flying out to Africa on 21st July with my friend Vicky to climb Mount Kilimanjaro. I am doing this to raise money for the paediatric intensive care unit at the Evelina Children's hospital (next to St Thomas' hospital in London) that looked after our daughter Rebecca.

Rebecca was born on 14th June 2007. The pregnancy and birth went well and we took our beautiful baby home, looking forward to caring for her and watching her achieve all the milestones we all celebrate; learning to crawl, walk, talk, starting school, leaving school, getting married, having children of her own.

Our lives changed forever when Rebecca was 11 days old she became very ill very quickly. I took her to Luton and Dunstable A& E and the staff there acted very quickly to stabilise her. They did not know what was causing her to be so ill, only that her heart had stopped beating for a short time and her organs were starting to fail. They managed to stabilise her enough to transfer her to the Evelina Children's hospital, which specialises in heart conditions.

The doctors and nurses were all wonderful and they worked very hard to keep Rebecca alive and find out what was wrong with her. She had to be on a ventilator and had several infusions to keep her alive. It was so awful to see our baby connected to all these machines and not be able to hold her or comfort her. The staff always explained what they were doing and answered any questions we had. Eventually after numerous tests they discovered she had a rare disease called enterovirus myocarditis, which is an infection in the heart that causes irreparable damage. Her condition slightly improved but then she got another infection, which overwhelmed her tiny little body. The doctors told us that she would not get better, only the machines were helping to keep her alive. We made the heartbreaking decision to take her off of the ventilator and she died on 11th July at just 27 days old.

The hospital was so supportive while we were there, and they still are now. I really want to do this as I want to give something back to them. I also feel I am doing something for my daughter Rebecca, who we all miss so much every day.

2nd Saturday in April will be Cafe Community and the 2nd Sunday in each month Cafe Style Worship.


3rd Sunday in each month will be a Communion Service.



Dog Issues

Over the past few months we have received several complaints from local residents to do with dogs and their owners. These complaints include dog fouling, dogs attacking other dogs and dogs being aggressive towards members of the public. I'd like to take this opportunity to explain where the law stands and what you can do to help.

There is a misconception circulating Edlesborough that the police will arrest or fine dog owners if their dog is not on a lead whilst walking on The Green. There are some white signs on The Green asking dog owners to keep their dogs on leads however these are advisory notices intended to stop dogs from attacking other dogs or injuring innocent members of the public. There is a bylaw that applies to dog owners using The Green and this is displayed at various points around The Green. This bylaw instructs dog owners to keep their dogs under proper control whilst on The Green. This has been misunderstood on occasion to mean that the dog must be on a lead. This is not the case although the dog being on a lead would ensure that a dog walker would not fall foul of this bylaw (no pun intended). There is no official definition for the term proper control, however, a good guide would mean that your dog responds to your commands and is kept close at heel. If the dog can lie down or return to you on command, your dog would then be under close control. If you're not sure that your dog can do this the responsible thing is to keep them on a short lead and / or muzzle it.

Where dogs attack other dogs this becomes a civil matter and should be dealt with by the dog owners. Section 2 of the 1871 Dogs Act explains further the circumstances and what you should do.

Please can I ask all dog owners to ensure that they take appropriate steps to be responsible for their dogs whether that be walking them on a lead, clearing up after them, keeping them under proper control whilst on The Green (or anywhere else in the village) or keeping your property secure so that the dog(s) do not get out and worry passers by.

Should you require more information or advice please give one of your local neighbourhood team a ring or an email and we'll do our best to help you.

Last year we entered 14 teams in the Adult/Junior South Beds League with the Adults managing a few runner up places but again the Juniors showing us the way home winning the Mini Red with Josh Farnfield, Morgan Emmett, William McCool and Alex Piddington. The Under 13 team of Will Sanders and Scotty Mercer were yet again triumphant playing at times against top county standard opposition, probably the most consistent doubles pairing in the club, so watch out James and Rhys your Men's Doubles trophy may be in danger. Tennis is a total body exercise that gives the cardiovascular system a workout, strengthens the major muscle groups in the arms, legs and torso. Provides practice in sprinting, jumping and lunging, studies show a player changes direction five times in ten seconds during a point (this doesn't always apply to the adults) so is ideal for improving reaction times and motor control. Bone density is also improved in young players, helping prevent osteoporosis in later life.

On a sad note Debbie Ellis and Lindsey Rigby are standing down from the tennis club committee and the club would like to thank them for all their hard work in helping to develop the club and provide the opportunity of tennis for Edlesborough and the surrounding villages. We hope our sadness will be turned to joy when volunteers come forward and offer to become committee members.

meeting and confirmed that the council tax bands for 2010/11 have been finalised. **Police Report**

There have been 7 recorded crimes in the parish, many of those being vehicle related and the police ask all residents to be aware of car crime and take necessary precautions. The police are aware of young people hanging around the bus stop at the corner of Moor End. The police have been regularly checking these young people, by officers passing the location, for possession of alcohol and other substances and for any related anti-social behaviour which has been dealt with accordingly.

Visibility Concerns – junction of Dunstable Road and Bower Lane/Harling Road – the Parish Council contacted Central Bedfordshire regarding residents' concerns on the poor visibility for road users at the junction with Dunstable Road and Bower Lane/ Harling Road. The report received back states that currently this road junction is classed as low priority and therefore at this time would not be pursuing this further. However, they did state that they would review this problem again when determining priorities for future years' funding.

Dog Fouling – Once again the Parish Council are having to remind all dog walkers/ owners *it is an offence* for any person in charge of a dog to allow the dog to foul a footway (any public place) or grass verge. Failure to clean up after your dog will incur a penalty. *PLEASE USE the dog hygiene bins situated all round the parish*.

Allotments – the Parish Council has looked at land available within the parish for additional allotments and has now drawn up draft proposals for additional allotment space. The Parish Council are happy in principle to this land being used for additional allotments and are now looking into the suitability of this land for allotment use.

Cemetery – The Parish Council are looking into the introduction of cemetery markers for all plots at Bower Lane Cemetery, a marker situated at the beginning of the line of plots (rather than for each individual plot) and are looking into the options available. Due to a few enquiries, the Parish Council wished to reiterate to all residents that the Parish Council do not offer a service for reserving burial plots within the cemetery.

Northall. We will keep you posted on our progress.



How can a chapel in the fields better serve the communities around it and the growing community that meets there each Sunday? This is a question which Northall Baptist **Church** has been asking of itself. We would love to see the building more used for in ways that are compatible with its primary purpose as 'a place of Christian worship'. For that it also needs to be 'fit for purpose.'

So we've removed the pews, carpeted, and brought in comfortable chairs that can be moved around. This may be into traditional rows for Sunday worship, in a circle or small clusters for meetings and discussion groups or around tables for shared Sunday lunches. For the first time we were able to make a central aisle for a wedding on 19th December 2009 (a very snowy day you may recall - but that's another story.)

Come the better weather for outdoor work, there will be ramping to aid wheelchair access; however for now we can use the portable ramp which also serves the chapel front door.

Our speaker was Mrs Cynthia Gresham, High Sheriff of Bedfordshire. The post has a history of over 1000 years, and was originally set up for the protection of the King and collection of taxes. The High Sheriff is usually nominated five years in advance and finally nominated for one year in office by the Oueen in a warrant from Buckingham Palace. The High Sheriff is the Queen's representative in the County, and has to be present during all royal visits. Throughout the year the work involves attendence at many different functions. Cynthia listed such occasions as: citizenship ceremonies, long service awards and anniversaries of schools, universities and voluntary organisations. She has to hold a garden party and a church service. The Priory Church in Dunstable was the venue for this service. Another duty of the High Sheriff is to attend court if a circuit judge visits, and to entertain the judge. Cynthia performed this duty when the judge visited Luton Court, and she also visited Luton Prison for a day.

High Sheriffs receive no payment for their year of office, and have to buy their own court dress. Cynthia had her outfit with her, beautifully made by Sousters of Woburn. On ceremonial occasions a sword is carried on behalf of the High Sheriff. Cynthia had brought this along with her, together with a photo of herself and her sword bearer - a young man about to join the army.

At one time a High Sheriff had to come from an aristocratic or extremely wealthy background. However, today this does not necessarily apply. In fact, Cynthia is very proud to be the first nurse to be appointed. She considers it to be a year of great honour and privilege. It is a busy time, as there is no deputy, but she has had a wonderful year. It really was an interesting talk, especially as Cynthia was obviously so enthusiastic about the experience of her year of office.

A week after our meeting many of our members attended Linda's funeral. The attendance was high, yet again, at a coffee morning we held in aid of Iain Rennie Hospice at Home and also Hospice of St Francis. The proceeds, together with a separate collection, amounted to £352. This will be shared by the two charities who helped Linda and her family during her illness. Our thanks go to Maureen Shipway for the use of her home, and to all those who supported us in raising our donations in memory of Linda. Val Harris.

The Lincoln Lawyer by Michael Connelly



Michael Connelly a former police reporter for the Los Angeles Times, is the author of sixteen acclaimed and bestselling novels. He is as fully at home in the world of criminal defence. A few of our reading group did not really like "American crime" writing, but those that did found it a good read. All the qualities that have deservedly brought him a legion of readers are on display again here: brisk pacing, clever twists, artful writing and an atmosphere of complete authority on every page. A court room drama, with twists, shocks and surprises.

In the Lincoln Lawyer, Loius Roulet, a Beverly Hills playboy arrested for attacking a woman he picked up in a bar, chooses Mickey Haller, who drives a Lincoln, to defend him, and Haller has his first high-paying client in years. It is a defence attorney's dream, what they call a franchise case. And as the evidence stacks up, Haller comes to believe this may be the easiest case of his career.

Then someone close to him is murdered and Haller discovers that his search for innocence has brought him face-to-face with evil. To escape he must deploy every tactic, feint, and instinct in his arsenal — this time to save his own life.

For the writer of this review the twist at the end came as a surprise – however keen readers of criminal fiction may find otherwise!

One of the members of our group who was very much delayed getting to work during the bad weather had this book with her. "It certainly helped make the four and a half hour journey more tolerable" she said.

Wild Swans by Jung Chang

This is an autobiographical saga covering three generations of women in one family. The book is written by Jung Chang as a tribute to her mother and grandmother and charts their lives through the turbulent times of twentieth century China.

Her grandmother was born in 1909 and grew up under a feudal regime. Due to her beauty, she was married to a warlord and became a concubine, bearing him a daughter. After his death, she escaped with her baby and married a respectable middle class doctor many years her senior. This part of the book shows vividly the traditional role of women in China before the revolution.

After the revolution, the position of women changed, and as a member of the Communist party Chang's mother rose though the ranks of the regime to a high position. Chang's family, by virtue of their privileged position, were protected from the hardships and injustices that led to the cultural revolution. As the ideology changed it led to the arrest of Chang's parents as 'enemies of the people'.

This is an extremely large book, both in length and the subjects it covers. It gives us an insight into a world that is largely kept hidden from us. Members of our group, who had visited China, commented that they felt they were only shown 'approved' sights.

We concluded that it was a difficult read and many of us thought it overlong, but overall it shone as a tribute to three generations of courageous and intelligent women, who overcame great hardship.

On top of this we have our very own Speed Buddy to record the speed of a shot, which we are planning on presenting at the Village Carnival in July to see who can claim the hardest shot in the village! 


Eaton Bray Cricket Club



Eaton Bray Parish Council Skate & Ride Area with Additional Seating School Lane Recreation Ground

Two and a half years ago some of the young people from Eaton Bray approached the Parish Council [PC] with a request for a skate park. Somewhere for them to ride in safety! The PC agreed to look into the

possibility of providing an area for the boys/girls to ride. None of the councillors knew anything about skate parks at the time, but we certainly do now!

Funding was the first hurdle but with much appreciated help from Beds County Council (Sue Norman) and with help from Ross Bagni, the majority funding was found and subsequently secured for the build. The PC also pledged some funds if the build went ahead.

We then had to find out what types of skate park were available and what we could afford with our budget. Here the young people were very useful. They knew what was out there and they knew what they wanted. They worked closely with us in research, public consultation and design of the build.



Whilst the Parish Clerk gathered as much data as she could relating to skate parks for the PC to assess, the councillors walked the streets surveying the public for their opinions. We put up posters, advertised on the Eaton Bray website and put flyers in Focus. The public consultation saw the Coffee Tavern bursting at the seams and a comment was made that we needed more seating in future! The audience was made up of a good mixture of all age groups with the young people well represented and good arguments were made on both sides of the divide. By the end of the evening the majority were in favour of the project going ahead. This correlated with the data we had gathered in our survey.

Now all that remained to do was to get the user group together to work out a design, find three companies to quote, (this found me personally wailing down the phone at one poor man, "I'm a housewife not a business woman!") and apply for funding, where I am most grateful for Ross Bagni and Cllr David Marriage's input. Forms are not my forte!

We then had a lull. I think that was the most nerve-racking part!

When we finally got the go ahead everything happened very fast. The boys got together



with our chosen company (Wheelscape) and they worked with them to design a bowl.

Once the build started it took just 1 month to complete with the young people keeping a watch on things. They proved very useful and reported suspicious activity in the park in the evening to the police. As soon as the fence came down and permission was granted, the bowl was well used, attracting riders and skaters from other areas. We have been amazed at the different activities the bowl has attracted. Skateboards,

BMX bikes, scooters, unicycles, radio controlled cars/toys and just children running up and down! Great fun was had by all in the snow! Ages ranging from very young children to teenagers and beyond! I have also had people comment on how quiet it is. That's because it was designed that way! (Phew!!!) Cllr Margret Hawkes, Eaton Bray Parish Council



Any one for Digiscoping?

I love to see the birds in my garden and believe that we are very fortunate to live in an area that is so diverse in its many species. To this end I decided to try my hand at photographing them and went onto the Internet to kit myself out with a digiscope: that is a camera attached to a telescope to give me better close ups of the subject matter. I trawled very large companies and eventually settled on my choice of equipment having spoken to a salesman on the phone before ordering it.

It was fine for a while, until silly me dropped the camera and broke it! The repair was uneconomical so I decided to get in touch with the salesman again. He informed me that the old camera was obsolete and that the newest model would do the trick. It didn't, it would not fit over the end of the scope and the adaptor ring was a different size. I contacted the telescope manufacturer who happened to be based in Luton. They explained that my second camera was also obsolete. Although they could not help, they gave me a number to ring informing me that this company might be able to help me out. They told me the firm was in Luton, so I could at least visit their premises and show them my problem as the journey wasn't that far. I rang the company on the Luton number and was invited to go to see them. To my surprise, they were operating just down the road at Icknield Way Farm, off the Tring road. I was even more surprised when I got to the unit to find that it was a small factory turning out all manner of attachments and equipments for the camera industry.

Within 10 minutes of my arrival the camera was fitted with the new adaptor ring and I




