Important Information from Thames Valley Police

High Speed Train Meetings:

We would also point out the dangers of owners of Village and Community Halls allowing excessive numbers within such buildings and that it is the responsibility of the organisers of such meetings to ensure they manage those attending with a view to the Police not having to be called to deal with potential disorder.

The intention of this request is to avoid police being called to such meetings which adversely effects the operational capability of our normal day to day response. It is not intended to stop venues being hired for such meetings.



I can remember wondering, when I was younger, why it was that week after week in church services we would say 'Sorry' in our Confession when, whilst not necessarily leading a totally blameless life, I was doing what I felt was the best I could to 'love my neighbour'.

But as I've grown older I've come to realise that Jesus' understanding of what was meant by my 'neighbour' was rather more demanding than I had realised. He once told a parable, Matthew 25: 31-45, that well and truly shocked those who heard it and is just as telling today. Some people know the story as 'The parable of the sheep and the goats', others as 'The final judgement'.

In the parable Jesus identifies two sets of people. To one set of people he said "I was hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me a drink; I was a stranger and you received me in your homes, naked and you clothed me; I was sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me." The other set of people, Jesus said, did none of those things.

The parable reports confusion in both groups – 'When did we see you hungry, thirsty, a stranger, naked, sick, in prison?' they said. Obviously neither group could recall having seen Jesus in distress, but Jesus' startling retort was "I tell you, whenever you did (or didn't do) this for the least important person, you did it for me". Jesus turns upside down the idea of 'neighbour' – not just the person who lives next door but any person, anywhere, and especially those who are the most vulnerable and most in need. On that sort of scale I recognise that there definitely are times when I have, in the words of one of our Confessions, seen the ill-treatment of others and have not gone to their aid; when, through the actions of governments and big business, I have condoned evil and dishonesty and failed to strive for justice. It is too easy for us to turn a blind eye to the suffering inflicted on the poor peoples around the world so that we in the rich nations can live the comfortable lifestyles to which we have become accustomed. The church talks a lot about the hope of life after death, but many of the world's poorest peoples get little chance to experience life before death.

Well, this month there is no excuse for turning our back on the world's poorest people, for the week from 9-15 May is Christian Aid Week This is our opportunity to help people around the world to keep hope alive, through helping with the house to house collections or simply by being generous in our giving.

Please don't ignore the cries of the world's neediest people.

Recent news

The CoP Card scheme which all Year 6 pupils at Edlesborough, Cheddington, Wingrave and Brookmead Schools are participating in started on 22 March. This is a police and community scheme that is running in all Buckinghamshire schools and involves pupils being involved in community activities. Each child will have to collect stickers to place on their cards. Stickers are awarded for completing tasks, challenges or attending events.

Neighbourhood Action Group (NAG) information

Speeding - PCSOs Dodson and Baker used the Speed Indicator Device (SID) to access speeding in Winslow Road Wingrave. The results showed that there is a problem here and the neighbourhood team will be returning soon with the speed gun.

Parking - It was discussed and agreed that areas across the Wing South neighbourhood would be researched to see which streets were having big issues with parking and at the next NAG meeting it could be decided how to best tackle these issues. Still under review

Fly-tipping – The car park at Pitstone Windmill has now been cleared of all rubbish and signs have been erected informing people not to fly-tip or leave valuables on display.

Fly-tipping costs council tax payers and private land owners in Buckinghamshire:

- up to £1 million per year to clean up.
- it also costs us all a poorer environment.

In Buckinghamshire the **Illegal Dumping Costs** campaign (run jointly by the local councils as the Waste Partnership for Buckinghamshire and supported by Thames Valley Police) brings those costs back to the dumpers themselves:

• Over 135 offenders have been convicted in Buckinghamshire since 2006 at a rough average of one every 10 days.

This has helped change the fly-tipping problem in the county from a run away 10% annual increase ten years ago, to a one third reduction since 2003. Nearly half of all convictions have resulted from evidence supplied by eye witnesses to the offence:

If you believe you are witnessing someone fly-tipping, please take and write down the vehicle registration number and report what you have seen as soon as you can to:

Illegal dumping often results from a waste producer (including householders) paying casual callers to remove their waste without making the required checks to ensure that

- check on line at www2.environment-agency.gov.uk/epr/

The publicity campaign promotes that we must all (even at home) do all we can to ensure that the waste carrier is authorised. It has been the law since 2005 and **if we don't make sure we are using a registered carrier** (please keep a record of who they are and how they may be contacted or their vehicle number) **then we risk a fine if our waste is dumped illegally by that person.**

At the time of writing this newsletter the official crime figures for March are not available however I will comment on the crimes we know about at this time. There were six theft from vehicle offences reported, three of which were in the beauty spot car parks. There were no robberies and one attempted house burglary. We had seven burglaries to out buildings which is a reduction of three burglary offences from February. From the statistics we have to hand we expect a reduction in crime this month which is good news.

Anti-social behaviour

In Cheddington this month we received a report of two cars racing up and down the High Street. One resident in Pitstone had eggs and oranges thrown at their front door whilst another in Wingrave had pasties and other food smeared over their car. Another Wingrave resident heard a knock on their door and when they answered it they discovered fishing line tied to it and several young people were heard running away. The reel was left behind and is now being kept at Wing Police Office. If you are missing a fishing reel please get in touch with us.

We have also received several calls from Wingrave about young people playing football in the street. This has been happening mainly in the evenings when residents are home from work and expecting a relaxing evening. There are good facilities in the village for playing football and we would ask parents to ensue their children use these and not the streets where the constant bouncing of balls disturbs other residents.

Although vehicle crime in the Vale is one of the lowest rates across the entire Thames

The misconception is that by parking in the middle of nowhere, possessions will be safer but the truth is that a quieter setting provides the perfect opportunity for a thief. Don't give thieves an easy opportunity. Follow the steps below to protect your car and valuables

- Securely look all doors and shut windows and sunroofs, even if you're leaving your car for just a few minutes
- Don't leave anything on display in your car, even a coat can be tempting



The new high speed rail route

You will be aware of the Government's proposals for the high speed rail route, which would cross parts of the Chilterns AONB where various options are being explored to lessen any environmental impact. The route would leave London via the Ruislip area, making use of an existing rail corridor. It would then cross the Chilterns in the Aylesbury direction, partly in tunnel before following the route of the A413 past Wendover, passing to the south west of Aylesbury.

AVDC held a Special Council Meeting on 14th April to consider their response to the consultation on the Exceptional Hardship Scheme. They believe that the rail route would be extremely damaging to the Vale.

By now you will be aware that the new Waterside Theatre is due to open in Aylesbury on Tuesday 12th October with the Northern Ballet's Swan Lake, something not to be missed. Cash help for village businesses

Aylesbury Vale District Council is hoping to boost the number of rural businesses taking advantage of grants available to help protect the future of everyday services. Administered by the council, the Vital Villages grant scheme provides funding for projects such as physical improvements to premises, the purchase of equipment to enhance services, marketing activities and staff training.

Grants of up to £5,000 are currently available. Applicants must be able to show how the project benefits their community and be able to fund half the costs of the project themselves. For example a grant of £5,000 was awarded to the North Marston Village Shop Committee to help towards setting up a community shop. Residents have been without a local shop since 1984 and the nearest supermarket is some distance away.

It was founded in 1885 to support the second expeditionary force to Egypt. Over the course of more than a century SSAFA has adapted and evolved to meet the changing needs of our armed forces and their families, not least in incorporating the RAF soon after the end of World War I.

As the number of fatalities and serious injuries sustained in Afghanistan, the latest of more than twenty military conflicts since WWII, continues to rise, SSAFA still plays a vital role in helping service families to come to terms with loss and life-changing injuries. Our two Norton Homes allow injured troops to spend time with their loved ones away from the hospital environment, giving them the chance to enjoy something akin to normal family life together - dining, watching films, short outings, talking and planning for the future.

Other forms of support include teams of social workers and health professionals. respite homes for families in difficulty, a housing advice service, holidays for disabled children. Anyone with any length of military service, however long ago, and any of his or her dependants, qualifies for help throughout their lives.

SSAFA shares responsibility for this national provision with other military charities, including some, such as the Royal British Legion and Help for Heroes, with very high profiles SSAFA's unique, if lower, profile' contribution is in the direct contact between our volunteer caseworkers and individuals in difficulty. Caseworkers are expertly trained in the specific knowledge and skills needed to respond sensitively to a wide range of problems, whether practical, financial or emotional, and to secure appropriate help.

Teams of caseworkers are located in every county and city area in the United Kingdom. In Buckinghamshire, we currently have about 45 caseworkers who handle some 350 to 400 clients a year and probably help more than that because relief for one person very often means relief for other members of the family. SSAFA Bucks is here for Buckinghamshire people.

We need help - in three ways:

- More clients. Despite our constant publicity we suspect that there are more people in our communities who would qualify for help but who do not come forward. Any help from readers in bringing our service to the attention of potential clients would be much appreciated.
- More volunteers for casework or for other roles in publicity, fund-raising, counselling or general help as a home visitor - would be welcome.

A Spot of Bother by Mark Haddon



Mark Haddon's first novel, 'The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-time' won the Booker prize and had been read and enjoyed by most members of our group. Consequently our expectations of his second book, 'A Spot of Bother' were rather high. The story concerns George and his family. At first glance, an ordinary family in the throes of an unexceptional situation: a family wedding. But, as the book progresses, each member of the family proves to be in a personal crisis, thus adding to the chaos of the forward planning of the wedding.

George, the head of the family, is newly retired and terrified of what appears to be a aimless existence stretching ahead. He discovers his 'spot of bother,' a lesion on his thigh which he wrongly assumes to be cancerous. This promotes thoughts of, and fear of death, triggering a breakdown. Around him, his family concentrating on their own concerns, are blissfully unaware of his trauma. His daughter is worried about her choice of groom. His wife is being unfaithful with one of his ex colleagues and his son hesitates to bring his boyfriend to the wedding, unsure how that will be received.

A Spot of Bother is darkly funny. It is very easy to read and at first seems lightweight, with short chapters and switches of viewpoint. As you read on, however, there are many observations of family life that are sharp and ring very true. The book deals with mental breakdown and homosexuality and raises a lot of social issues. We thought it a good book for a group to read and discuss. Most of our members rated it highly: although not as highly as Mark Haddon's debut novel.





The most important thing is to be someone who can listen without prejudice. This might be a skill you don't know you possess. The only other thing we ask is that you do not judge people; we aim to be there for anyone who needs someone to talk to, on the phone, by email or even face to face.

One volunteer describes it like this.

"I like the idea of 'creating a space' from the moment we lift the phone, or at the door when we say "Hello, how are you doing?" That space isn't a physical space, it's an emotional space and it is a safe place for the caller to begin to discuss their feelings for as long as they need.

Because we do so in a non-judgemental way and give no advice, this is a very special space that has been created for the caller. How many other organisations do this? This

is our uniqueness if you like and something we can promote in confidence."

We welcome people from all walks of life, and we have disabled access for wheelchair users.

Anyone over 18 who can commit to one shift a week, and one night shift a month is urged to attend. It might just change someone's life - your own.

Table Corner



For a large gathering, there are very few houses indeed with dining rooms large enough to seat all your friends for a formal plated meal, so a buffet is often an excellent alternative. The key to making your buffet a success is to have easy to serve food (cold dishes would be the easiest) and to present

it with some creativity. So here are a few tips to consider for your next event:

- 1. If possible, set the buffet table up in the middle of the room, so guests can access the food from both sides. This will help with the flow of traffic and decrease the serving time (you do want your guests to talk to one another rather than queue).
- 2. Try to create as many levels as possible on your buffet table. This is visually more pleasing to the eye than a plain flat surface. You do not need formal stands. Kitchen bowls, garden pots (clean obviously!) or any sturdy alternative can be covered with elegant linens, on which the dishes are then placed.
- 3. When using different heights, place non-dangerous items such as the bread basket or the salads on the higher levels.
- 4. Try to have a table that is as colourful as possible. Not all the china needs to match and seasonal flowers in small vases are always very attractive.
- 5. Place items in a logical order: first the plates, then main course followed by relishes then the napkins and cutlery. This way people have a hand free before they collect the cutlery.
- 6. If you have enough space, plan a different table for the glasses. Towards the end of the meal, when guests have all helped themselves to a drink, that table can also be used to serve the dessert.
- 7. Finally and it might seem trivial, don't forget to have a serving implement for every dish!
