I remember vividly my last day at Dunstable Grammar School. The last exam was over, it was a scorching summer day, we all dived into the swimming pool and let off steam. Ah, freedom – to quote Alice Cooper "no more pencils, no more books, no more teachers dirty looks". Weeks of freedom ahead, sweet, utter freedom. What could be better?

But before long it happened to me – just as it does to most children. Inevitably, ironically, pathetically - that feeling of freedom slowly morphed into something else, something sad and unwanted - boredom!

Parents know what I'm talking about. For a few days in early summer your kids are thrilled. But before too long you hear that classic complaint: "Mum, I'm bored. There's nothing to do." Freedom - it sounds great, doesn't it? But is it enough?

We tend to think of freedom as freedom from something that constrains or subjugates us. On the last day of school we celebrate freedom from the daily demands of education. Certainly, freedom includes freedom from but this isn't the whole picture.

There is another side to freedom, one we sometimes neglect. It's freedom for something - the freedom to be able to do things we haven't been able to do in the past. The freedom of summer holidays isn't just the freedom from school. It's also the freedom for lots of things: the freedom for getting enough sleep, the freedom for going on holiday, the freedom for doing some fun reading, and so on.

Paul is quite specific in his letter to the Galatians about what Christian freedom is for (Gal 5:13 & 14): You have been called to live in freedom to serve one another in love. For the whole law can be summed up in this one command: "Love your neighbour as yourself."

We see a marvellous illustration of how to live as free people in the life of Nelson Mandela. For decades he laboured in South Africa to bring an end to apartheid. Ultimately his revolutionary strategies got him in trouble with the government, who put him in prison. Nelson Mandela was confined in a South African prison – for 27 years. Finally, in 1990, aged 72, he was released.

One might suppose that after almost three decades in prison Mandela had earned a comfortable, restful retirement. But he saw freedom from prison as freedom for service. So he used his new-found freedom to work for the cause of racial reconciliation and justice in South Africa. Four years after his release, he became the first African President of his country.

Now it's unlikely that you and I will ever make an impact on the world like Nelson Mandela has done, but our life in Christ should mirror his. For in Christ, all of us have been set free from the prison of sin and death, not so we can live for our own comfort, but so we can serve one another in love. The more we do this, the more our neighbours will see Christ in us and be drawn to him.

Why do I mention this? Well, by the time you read this I will have retired - I will enjoy

the freedom from having to go to work every day. Can I live up to the words I have just written?

## Long Live the Pavilion!

#### But No 'Kick Wall' for Edlesborough Green

In November, December and March, Edlesborough Parish Council (EPC) published articles in 'Focus' in its endeavours to obtain parishioners' views on matters concerning the Pavilion and a possible, purpose designed Kick Wall. Some 29 people wrote to EPC about these - 9 on the Pavilion and 20 on the kick wall.

**Pavilion**: All of the responses concerning the pavilion were supportive of keeping this facility on the Green. As a result of this encouraging feedback, EPC is pressing ahead with a project to engage with existing and potential user groups to plan a way to improve the building and its appearance. In particular, EPC is now encouraging local sports and other organisations, to work together and develop ideas for the future of the Pavilion, which can then be considered by EPC and by the community at large. In order for you, and the clubs and societies to which you belong, to have your say about this, EPC has developed a questionnaire. This has already been sent out to the main contacts for existing users of the pavilion, but we want as wide a participation as possible, so **please give us your opinions by contacting the clerk on the email below for your copy of the questionnaire**!

In the meantime, EPC will be pursuing short - medium term ideas for improving the appearance and functionality of this facility, together with taking action to deter the Pavilion itself from being used as a kick wall.

**Kick Wall**: As far as the kick wall is concerned, there was a very different story! Only 7 out of 20 people were in favour, and a further 2 were not opposed in principle. However, 11 people were very much opposed to a Kick Wall, citing noise, nuisance and the feeling that this would be a blemish on the Green. Based on this feedback, and after careful consideration, EPC will not pursue this matter any further.

#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT For Edlesborough Annual Parish Meeting 15th April 2010

My report covers the period May 2009 - April 2010

Your Council is made up from representatives from three Wards, the villages of Edlesborough, Northall & Dagnall. Edlesborough has 5 Councillors Cllr John Wilkinson Chair of the General Purpose Committee & also responsible for planning throughout the Parish, Cllr Marilyn Pryce-Jones deputy Chair GPC, Cllrs David Brown & Alan Williams both GPC members & Cllr Julie Ratherham. Northall has 2 Cllrs Kevin Cubbage Vice Chair of your Council and a GPC member he is also responsible for keeping the Web site up to date and oversees the accounts. Mark Wilson is Northall's second representative. Dagnall also has 2 Cllrs newly appointed Mark Taylor who replaces Tim Jones. Tim resigned due to work commitments. I would like to take this opportunity to thank him for his service to the Parish & also welcome Mark to his new role. I also represent Dagnall and I'm also a GPC member. Your Council would not be complete without our industrious Clerk Lin Sargeant. Lin not only deals with the everyday workings of your Council she is also the Responsible Financial Officer, she attends the GPC, recording minutes and it seems is always available to answer Parishioners concerns or point them in the right direction.

County Cllr Avril Davies and District Cllr Terry Jones continue to support and keep your Council fully informed on all issues of interest or concern. To the entire Parish, District & County Councillors, not forgetting our Clerk Lin on behalf of myself and the Parishioners I once again thank you all for your total commitment.

**www.edlesborough.gov.uk** Our popular Web site continues to go from strength to strength. Cllr Cubbage updates our website on a regular basis. This is your first port of call if you wish to know anything about the Parish.

**The General Purpose Committee**. The GPC makes decisions with regard to many issues, saving valuable time at full council meetings. Areas they cover include allotments, cemetery, street lighting, Memorial Hall and open spaces. This vital committee consists of the six Cllrs previously mentioned and the Clerk who takes the minutes. All decisions made by this committee are ratified at full council.

**Local Area Forum** Cllrs Wilkinson & Williams accompanied by our Clerk attend these very useful County Council organised meetings on your behalf. This is the one meeting where specific items can be discussed with the relevant Bucks CC officer. This forum also deals with the delegated budget where we can and do apply for funding for relevant projects. We are presently waiting for the results of our latest bids for a build out at Dagnall and bus shelters.

Allotments I'm pleased to report we only have one allotment available at Cow Lane, half a plot on the green, but there are still plots available at Northall.

Cemetery The new cemetery entrance, access road and turning circle has been

welcomed and everyone seems in agreement the contractors did an excellent job. The huge mound of soil has been removed; mowing the graves has commenced enhancing the appearance of the whole area, it's finally turning into the proposed lawned Cemetery. The new entrance is off the bridleway on the strip of land purchased many years ago by the PC parcifically for this purpose.

**Edlesborough Memorial Hall** The hall continues to be well used by a large range of local clubs, organizations and private individuals. Bookings for the hall and also the pavilion can be made through our helpful facilities & booking manager Beverley Sage. A clean venue is guaranteed thanks to our cleaner Lesley Riley. At the present time we are getting quotes to replace the boilers for a more efficient heating system in the hall. We continue to support Dagnall & Northall Village Halls with a £1,000.00 donation to assist with maintenance & running costs. We also help with their finances by grass cutting and playground maintenance.

**Edlesborough Green** The green continues to offer first class facilities to the community, and the various clubs that make use of the green offer great opportunities especially to the youth of the parish, for this we support and thank them. We recently have had a problem with dogs out of control; please if in doubt keep your dogs on a lead under proper control. Due to a very poor response to the proposal of a kick wall to try and protect the pavilion, which is used for that purpose at the moment, this project appears likely to be put on hold. We continue to host the very popular St Mary's Carnival, which raises huge amounts of funding for local groups.

**Pavilion** Cllr David Brown has spent many hours looking on the best way forward with regard to the development of this essential sports facility. All sports clubs & interested groups have now been contacted with a view to establish a vision project for the future of the pavilion.

**Open Spaces** We continue to report rubbish dumping to Aylesbury Vale DC who quickly remove the offending articles. The freighter service is still provided twice a year enabling you to dispose of unwanted large items. We also continue to support the green sack scheme for disposable garden rubbish. These can be purchased from Sue Parker or me.

Although we have increased the number of dog bins throughout the Parish some inconsiderate dog walkers are still not clearing up after their dogs. Please be considerate to others & clean up, or now the light nights are returning you could end up with a  $\pounds1,000.00$  fine. For your information the cost of emptying the dog bins costs  $\pounds3,750.00$  per annum to operate so please make use of this facility.

For the first time in 2009 Edlesborough entered the best kept village contest, unfortunately Dagnall & Northall did not fit the criteria, ie. they had no churchyard so couldn't enter, but I'm pleased to report Edlesborough received the runner ups award, a fantastic result in our first year. We have entered again this year so lets keep the village free from litter & dog faeces.

A matter of concern at the moment is the Local Development Framework Core Strategy which decides how many houses will be allocated to Edlesborough, at the moment it's between 20 & 80 but both Cllrs Wilkinson & Williams are attending consultations on your behalf, no decision has been made at this time.

Road Repairs We continue to monitor the condition of our roads & pavements and

report any holes or problems to highways on call. Conditions have been very difficult this year due to the severity of the winter. We are aware there is still lots of repairs to be done especially on minor roads.

**Traffic Calming** The speed limit review for our area 13 has at last commenced. You can view all the proposed speed limits, maps and relative information online via www. buckscc.gov.uk/haveyoursay. You can also register your support or objections to the proposals in writing, online or by email, before the 14th May for addresses contact the Clerk or visit our Website.

Cllr Alan Williams continues to input data & monitor developments on the Freight Strategy. Cllrs Wilkinson & Williams also monitor the Local Transport Plan (LTP3)

Volunteers from the EDaN group continue to man speedwatch and collect data on speeding, the analysis is forwarded to the Police and other relevant parties.

**Police Matters** Our PCSO's Jackie Dobson & Chris Baker continue to bring a Police presence to our villages supported by our Community Police Officer Jared Levens. An Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) check was recently carried out in Edlesborough on the A4146. 700 vehicles passed through the checkpoint, many vehicles were stopped for irregularities. Speed checks are also regularly carried out throughout the Parish. If you have any worries or concerns please feel free to stop and talk to the officers as they patrol the streets or give them a ring on the 08458505505 if you wish them to come and see you with regard to a specific problem. I am pleased to report Anti Social behaviour seems to be on the decrease. We are all well aware of the problems the cars with their loud music in the Memorial Hall car park late at night cause, and we are working with the Police to solve this problem. Thank you Jared, Chris & Jackie for your continuing support to our community.

The highlight of the past year for me was standing on the A4146 at Church End on a November morning alongside the local Scout movement to my left, various organisations from Eaton Bray as well as our own Parish to my right and a large congregation all able to pay their respects to the fallen in the 2 world wars in complete safety and silence, a very memorable & moving moment indeed. ### Focus on your Life!

Have you heard of "target fixation"? I heard about it recently, where drivers hit objects they're trying to avoid. 

#### Catch 22 By Joseph Heller



Catch 22 is a satirical look at the hierarchical systems of war and the effects on those caught up in them. The book's title has passed into common language usage, as an illustration of a hopeless situation.

In this story, Yossarian is a bombardier, stationed in Italy during the final months of World War II. He is battle weary and desperate to finish his tour of duty and to return home. However, the Colonel keeps raising the number of missions and so the squadron must continue fighting.

Yossarian tries to plead insanity in order to be grounded, but the doctor points out that, according to army regulation Catch 22, men who ask to be grounded, prove themselves aware of personal danger and are therefore sane. Truly mad people, readily agree to put themselves in peril, therefore Yossarian is thwarted by Catch 22.

The story follows his many attempts to beat the system, introducing a huge cast of characters and sub plots to prove the main theme of the book. This being the absurdities and insanities of bureaucracies, military ones in particular and the people who enforce them blindly.

The group found the book difficult. The humour was a little obscure and we struggled with the large number of characters, finding it hard to engage with their situations. We did however, have a lengthy discussion about war, its effect on mankind and whether sometime soon lessons will be learned from history.

## **Table Corner**

Table Corner – Pascale's Raspberry Crème Brûlée

With little raspberries about to appear in our gardens, I thought that I would share with you one of the Little Dagnall Catering Company's favorite dessert recipes – Pascale's Raspberry Crème Brûlée. Not only is it easy to make, but it can also be made ahead of time - ideally the day before, to give time for the cream to set. At the last minute, the only thing you will have to remember is to glaze the sugar and decorate your ramekin. Serves 4 in small ramekins:

Ingredients:

175 g fresh or frozen raspberries

3 tbsp caster sugar

1tbsp Grand Marnier liqueur

4 egg yolks 225 ml double cream 2 tsp brown sugar

If using frozen raspberries, don't forget to defrost them very gently so that they maintain their flavour. Preheat the oven to 150° Celsius. In a food processor, puree the raspberries with the caster sugar, Grand Marnier and the egg yolks. Strain the puree through a fine sieve and combine with the cream, leaving the seeds behind and discarding them. Divide the cream/juice combination between the 4 ramekins.

Place the ramekins in an oven dish or tin and fill the dish with boiling water until the water is about 1 centimetre below the top of the ramekins. Cook in the oven for one hour until the cream is set. If the top of the cream is slightly brown when you take the ramekins out of the oven, do not panic, the discolouration can be skimmed off. Leave the ramekins to cool down completely, and place them in the fridge for at least 6 hours or overnight.

Just before serving, sprinkle each ramekin with the brown sugar and place under a preheated grill to melt the sugar. Keep an eye on the process so that it doesn't over cook. Take out, and if you so wish, you can also decorate each ramekin with a little icing sugar, a few raspberries and perhaps a mint leaf.

### **Dagnall Weather Station (AONB)**

April has been a very dry month with 40% less rain than last year. In the middle of the month, we had a period of 16 days where no rain was recorded at all (10th - 25th). We had many summer-like days contrasting with frosty mornings, with highs of up to 20.5°c and lows of -1.3°c. But, at this time of year, the frost or colder parts of the day are short-lived because the sun rises early; between 05.30 and 06.30 - see plot below. 

#### **Recent News**

On Friday April 30th a Trading Standards operation was undertaken in the Wing South area in conjunction with the Neighbourhood Policing Team. One Public House was caught selling alcohol to a young person under the age of 18 and has subsequently received a fine for this offence.

#### **Crime Stats**

Overall crime is down in the Wing South area by 5.8%. Anti Social Behaviour is down by 45% and Burglary has reduced from 14 crime in January to 8 crime in March. Wingrave has very good facilities for playing football so it would seem the culprits wanted to damage the Bowling Green and/or upset members of the Bowling Club.


We still need reminders today; I write things down, lists of things to do - things to buy etc. otherwise I forget. We all so easily forget God and His love for us, we forget that
