At the end of May I became a grandfather to a baby girl, Imogen – it was an event that made me stop and ponder on the miracle that is a new life. Through Imogen's mother, Rachel, I have learnt more about the relationship between a mum-to-be and the developing baby than I ever did when I experienced fatherhood. Rachel regularly described how the unborn infant was responding to external stimuli and, as she did so, I felt very close, as many expectant parents must, to the Psalmist who wrote of God's complete knowledge and care some 3,000 years earlier:

"You created every part of me; you put me together in my mother's womb. When my bones were being formed, carefully put together in my mother's womb, when I was growing there in secret, you knew that I was there – you saw me before I was born."... Psalm 139

And, on Bank Holiday Monday, a tiny, totally dependent child entered the world and began that wonderful, terrifying, blissful experience that is life. It made me wonder "What do I wish for her? What would *you* wish for a newborn child?" Well here are a few characteristics I hope she will have as she grows up:

- Generosity so she can experience the paradox that the more you give the more enriched you become.
- Courage so she can stand up against those who would promote injustice and fear.
- Love so she may treat all people, equally, as her friend.
- Perception so she can fully experience God in the created world, and be thankful.

I am moved by words of Alfred Wainwright, of Lakeland map-book fame:

Sunshine and colour and love; these make life worth living. Not success or wealth. The warmth and brightness of sunshine, the arch of a rainbow, the tenderness of a smile; these are pure gold even when pockets are empty. To have these with me always I would joyfully forego the most coveted position; I would choose happiness rather than affluence. And I cannot be persuaded that I have a false sense of values.

Finally, all new born babies need a sense of urgency. The life we have been given is a wonderful gift, but one that flies by all too quickly – as the Prayer Book says "Man that is born of Woman has but a short time to live". So I'll finish with a paraphrase from my favourite poem, Rudyard Kipling's 'If':

If you can fill the unforgiving minute

With sixty seconds worth of distance run'

Yours is the Earth and everything that's in it,

And, which is more – you'll be a woman, my delightful grand-daughter.



Annual Parish Meeting/Annual Meeting of Eaton Bray Parish Council Held on Monday 10th/Tuesday 11th May 2010, 7:30pm at the Coffee Tavern Chairman's Review of the Past Year and Plans for the Coming year

Reporting of crimes: The police wished to remind all residents to contact the police when encountering an incident - at any time of day/night. Expressing the importance of obtaining as much details as possible, i.e. details of the incident, descriptions of the perpetrators, car registration numbers, etc. this will aid the police in their investigations.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

St. Mary's Church Gate: the quotation received for work required on the church gate was put to the Parish Council and it was agreed this work should proceed.

Village Sign Post: the quotation received for the installation of the village sign was agreed in principle; with the Parish Council looking into the option of a replacement directional sign/wording.

Skate & Ride Opening Plaque: An official plaque is to be sited at the Skate & Ride area to celebrate the opening of this wonderful facility.

Nuisance Youths – **Bus Shelter/School Lane Car Park:** concerns were raised with the Parish Council regarding nuisance youths in the School Lane Car Park/Bus Shelter; the council are looking into these issues further, with further discussions with the local police.

The Eaton Bray/Parish Council Website is currently receiving around 10,000 to 11,000 page views a month; this is made up over 2,000 different visits, with each visit viewing 5+ pages.

CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE REPRESENTATIVE/S

Concern was raised regarding a planning application, not called to the Development Management Committee, although a request had been put in by the Parish Council. The Gypsy & Traveller Site Manager from Central Bedfordshire Council attended the meeting and explained her role in relation to the Chiltern View Site.

POLICE REPORT

PC Dady informed the Parish Council that they are aware of the recent problems regarding loud noise/nuisance youths in School Lane Rec Ground car park and are dealing with these incidents as/when reported. They also informed the council of nuisance motorbikes in the area and are currently carrying out investigations into the perpetrators of this.

<u>Reporting of crimes:</u> Once again the police wished to remind all residents to call the police when encountering an incident, at any time of day, and try to obtain as much detail as possible to aid the police in their investigations.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

Visibility Concerns at junction of Dunstable Road & Bower Lane/Harling Road: The Parish Council have again raised concerns regarding the poor visibility for road users at the junction with Dunstable Road and Bower Lane/Harling Road, due to a recent serious road incident. The council are in communication with Central Bedfordshire Council regarding this matter.

Litter Bins: The Parish Council have agreed to the purchase of two more litter bins for the parish, one to be sited at the top of Knights Close and one at School Lane Recreation Ground.

Cold Calling Signs: There were signs situated around the parish, many now are missing. The council agreed to organise replacement signs for the entrances to the village, Manton Road & Springfield Road.

Review of Financial Regulations/Standing Orders: The Parish Council agreed to retain the current Financial Regulations and Standing Orders of the Parish Council for the 2010-2011 financial year.

Cemetery: The Parish Council agreed to the purchase of a new notice board for Bower Lane Cemetery to give all visitors a visual point of reference/information.



Table Corner - Variations On Eton Mess



A late request from a bride and groom for a change of menu for their wedding in July gave me the idea for this month's Table Corner. In a sense, the change is not that great in that we remain in the tradition of great English summer desserts, moving from a blueberry fool to an Eton Mess. For this wedding I think that we should maintain the classical version of the dessert and serve it with strawberries since

British strawberries will be at the height of their season then.

The variations for Eton Mess are endless, you could have raspberry with mint and vanilla cream for example, there are many butterscotch versions and even Sophie Dahl in her "The Delicious Miss Dahl" series presented her own rhubarb and rosewater Eton mess.

My favourite recipe, apart from the traditional strawberry version, is the one using passion fruit and strawberries. Here we use crème fraîche or thick Greek-style yoghurt which creates an interesting contrast to the sweetness of the meringues.

The recipe for 6 goes like this:

- 6 home made (I will skip the recipe here as most of us know how to make meringue) or ready-made medium sized meringues
- 250 ml double cream
- 250ml crème fraîche or thick Greek-style yoghurt
- 50g icing sugar
- 10ml (1 tbsp) vanilla essence
- 500g strawberries cut into halves or quartered
- 3 passion fruits, pulp only

Clean the strawberries, and cut into halves or quarters if large. Set aside a quarter of them for decorating at the end and mash the other ones with a fork. Cover with cling film and place in the fridge for roughly an hour.

Put the double cream, vanilla essence and icing sugar into a bowl and whip until

reasonably stiff. Gently fold in either the crème fraîche or thick Greek-style yoghurt. Break the meringues into pieces (not too small) and place into a bowl.

Combine the cream, strawberry mash, passion fruit pulp with the meringue, being careful not to crush the meringue into pieces that are too small.

Serve in clear bowls and garnish with the remaining strawberries. Et voilà, a simple yet very appetising Summer dessert.

Chairman & Treasurers Report - May 2010

This past year has seen some significant changes for our village hall and the recreation ground. Last year I advised that we had the money for the track and work would start shortly. We have now completed the track as well as cleared the ground up to the fence making the recreation ground larger and improving the overall view and aspect. We have achieved this through the hard work of many helpers in the village and careful management of the finances. This careful management has enabled us to provide a few other improvements including the new swings for the children which are now only waiting for some decent weather to allow us to lay the matting down.

We have also made some serious improvements to the hall this last year. We have resolved the major problem with the damp, exposed the original vaulted ceiling, provided new wiring, caged the radiators for safety purposes and redecorated. Although we recognise that more needs to be done to improve the heating, the feedback I have received is that the changes are a major improvement. The hall is now a pleasant place to work in and have events in.

We can also look forward to further improvements. We have now secured a grant of £20,000 from AVDC which will enable us to start work on our extension and refurbishment in line with the plans we published last year. We should be able to extend the hall to provide the much needed storage and commence on the kitchen redevelopment. We have planning permission and approval from building control and are currently just awaiting approval from Thames Water.

Last year our income remained fairly stable at around £8.5k despite the recession, however our costs have increased to around the same amount. With all the works we have undertaken this year it is difficult to assess the exact running costs. My belief is that the income available to the hall does support the main operating costs of the hall including the heating, lighting and cleaning. The balance of monies held by the hall is currently £4,880 which is slightly under our preferred balance of £5,000 but acceptable with what we have achieved this year.

I would like to thank the members of the committee for their support this year and particularly the elected officers Sharon Quinn and Liz Coates.

Many thanks to everyone who has supported us during the year and we look forward to your continued support and more successes in the coming year



All About Leather

All About LCCUI



Leather is a natural product and as such, bares all the hallmarks of it origin. Unique and individual markings may appear on a hide giving the leather a unique identity, which enhances its natural beauty and characteristics. Markings such as insect bites, horn scratches and healed scars can all be seen on leather and are a result of damage caused to a cow's skin during its life time. Only a small percentage of hides have few marks and are in good enough condition to be left untouched. So 'Aniline Leather', also known as full grain leather, is therefore more expensive.

Which Leather Do I Have?

Aniline Leather: The leather is dyed in a dye bath and no pigmented coating is applied, allowing the leather to breathe naturally showing all its own unique markings and shade variations. Because of this, no two aniline leathers are the same and so when you purchase one you are buying an exclusive item with its own story of nature to tell.

Pros: The most natural type of leather available, it is very soft and delicate to the touch and bares all of nature's own markings on the hide. It stays warm in the winter and cool and ventilated in the summer. **Cons:** Because the leather contains no protective coating it is very absorbent and so is prone to staining and fading.

Pigmented Leather: Coated with a fine pigmented spray, which gives the leather a sound covering of colour with no shade variations. Sometimes known as corrected grain leather, this is when an artificial grain pattern is embossed into the hide.

Pros: The process in which the leather is made makes it very durable and hard wearing. It has high resistance to light and is very easy to clean and maintain. The colour is uniform and all defects are masked. **Cons:** Reduced breathability and the grain pattern is masked making this type of leather less natural.







May was yet another dry month, with over half of the month's rain (17.4mm) falling in one day, on the 2nd May. We also had unusual sharp frosts on the 12th & 13th, with temperatures down to -2.4°c. Normally in May, frost forms just before dawn and lasts for a short time, but this month the temperature dropped below zero at 0130 and remained there for 5 hours. This was enough, not only to catch the early potatoes, but also to take the tips of hardy shrubs that had burst in to life in the summer temperatures we had in April. And yet, we only had to wait ten days for highs to reach 29.2°c.


