



Holly Leaf Maths At Edlesborough School

All the children at Edlesborough School have enjoyed a day of maths investigations. Years 5 and 6 measure the height of trees in the school grounds using clinometers whilst Years 1-4 carried out a holly leaf investigation. Some of the children have produced the following reports:

Firstly we pictured a holly leaf in our minds, Miss Cullen told us to count how many spikes you think a holly leaf would have on it. I thought there would be about 8 spikes. Then we had an argument about if a holly leaf has the same amount of spikes or a different amount of spikes on each leaf. We had to give reasons why we thought it has the amount of spikes or not. (Josh Yr 3EF)

It was very exciting holding a holly leaf for the first time ever. I had to put my holly leaf at number 22 which had the most leaves which means it's the most common amount of spikes. I had to count up all of the spikes three times. (Ryan Yr 2)

Miss Cullen took us outside to draw a bar chart and to learn holly leaf maths. When

Miss Cullen called out a number, like 20, people had to go out and put their holly leaf on the chart after we counted the amount of spikes. (Adam Yr 2).

Finally, we counted up how many leaves had how many spikes. The number 20 was the mode, which meant that the number 20 was the most common amount of spikes. The range, which means from the least amount to the most amount of spikes was 11 to 24. (James Yr 3)







# **Edlesborough Book Group**

The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas by John Boyne And



The Snow Goose by Paul Gallico

This month, at the suggestion of one of our members, we read two books with a similar theme, that of the effect of war on innocence. We thought this would stimulate an interesting discussion and this proved to be the case.

The story of "The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas" is told by Bruno, a nine year old boy living a sheltered life in Berlin with his parents and older sister. His parents are well off and they live in a large house with servants. Bruno has school friends and his life generally is comfortable and unrestricted. He is blissfully unaware of the war and of his father's part in it, apart from the fact that he wears an impressive uniform.

Bruno's life changes radically, when he is told that his father has an important new position and they are moving to the country. On arrival, he is shocked to find a much smaller house to live in and much less freedom. However, a combination of curiosity and boredom leads him to explore his surroundings. Notably, the curious buildings beyond a high wire fence he can just see from his bedroom window. Every day he walks to the boundary of the fence and one day encounters Shmuel, the boy wearing the strange striped pyjamas that everyone seems to wear beyond the fence. A friendship forms between the two boys despite the differences in their upbringing and circumstances. The narrative as seen from Bruno's eyes is compelling and his story stays with you long after the book is put aside.

"The Snow Goose" is a gentle, beautifully written novella. It was written during World War Two and concerns an artist, Philip Rhayader. He is physically handicapped and lives a reclusive life in an abandoned lighthouse on the Essex marshes. One day a young girl brings an injured snow goose to him. It has been wounded during its migratory flight and is close to death, however Philip and the young girl, Fritha, restore the bird to health and release it back to the wild. A friendship is formed between the lonely girl and the hermit-like artist and over the years she helps him with his birds and the snow goose returns each year to visit them. When a call comes to help rescue the stranded battalions at Dunkirk, Philip puts to sea in his small boat. Fritha waits for his reurn, realising that she loves him. The descriptive passages in this tiny book are perfect and the atmosphere it creates is wonderful. We were unanimous in recommending both books as rewarding reads, both books we would read again and pass on to our children.

Church Wardens: Graham Mockett (01582 668210) and Peter Bennett (221284) Carnival Day may seem a lifetime ago, but my house today (7 July) has Carnival equipment to be put away and washing up from the Tea Tent still to be done. I have a long list of Carnival jobs, so please forgive the Carnival related theme of this article. I wrote, in June, about my hopes for my grand-daughter and observed that, whilst the life we have been given is a wonderful gift, it is one that flies by all too quickly. That thought has been with me since, and it came to mind on Carnival Day. This year was my 22nd on the Carnival Committee and I realised that I have been 'doing' Carnival for more years than many of the youngsters who helped on the Green have been alive. Some I knew as new born babies - like my grand-daughter - yet, in what seems like only a moment, they have grown up before my eyes, becoming confident young adults capable of challenging and demanding jobs. It is so easy for us oldies to worry what will happen when we retire – well, on the evidence I saw on Carnival Day, I believe there are young people in our village community who will be entirely capable of building on what has been created.

Carnival, for me, is often about individual stories: A young teenager asked if she could help in the Tea Tent. I put her on the rota not even sure that she would turn up; but I saw her blossom on Carnival Day as a confident, smiling, enthusiastic adult – the classic fairytale story of the frog who turned into a Prince or, in this case, a Princess. Two young men behaved like superheroes, helping out all day, everywhere, wherever help was needed, and young girls worked all day, with a smile, at a hot BBQ.

Near the end of a long and tiring day it was a joy to see so many youngsters grab black sacks and help clear the Green of litter – we always try to leave it cleaner than we find it. To them, and to all who helped, my thanks along with those of the Parish Council, who wrote "Very many congratulations .... for tidying up the Green so efficiently; just a few hours after you would not have thought anything had been happening on the Green."

And when most people had gone, there remained a substantial pile of rubbish in front of the pavilion to be put in the skip. This has happened before and we have asked for help from teenage boys having a kick around. Usually they (very) rudely decline our request, and it is left to weary bodies to make one final effort. But this year the youngsters helped and the rubbish was quickly cleared.

Finally, on Carnival Day we had a considerable amount of 'found' property handed in by young people, some of which contained substantial sums of cash. Well done and thank you to all those honest youngsters.

I give thanks that God has showered us with so many blessings on Carnival Day, and pray especially for the coming generation who will pick up the baton from the present Carnival Committee. If you would like to help in any way next year please get in touch with me (Tel: 220136).

## Safe and Secure Summer Home

Summer is finally here and whether you are planning a get away in the sun or you're simply out to do a spot of gardening, it is important to keep your home safe and secure. Whilst Aylesbury Vale has one of the lowest rates of burglary in the entire Thames Valley area, the summer months typically lead to increased opportunities. The majority of burglaries are opportunistic and take place when a house is empty or when doors and windows are left insecure, even if you're at home and as close as the garden.

Aylesbury Vale District Council and Thames Valley Police are working in partnership to keep burglary low over the summer months and asking residents to follow the home security tips below:

- Remember to close and lock your doors and windows, whether you are just in the garden or in your home.
- Ensure your home looks occupied even when you're away for example, user timer switches with lights, cancel milk or mow the lawn before you go.
- Mark belongings visibly and permanently with your house number and postcode using a UV marker pen.
- Remove all valuables from view. If you normally leave a valuable bicycle in a shed, consider securing it in the house. Similarly, ensure tools in your shed are out of sight and secure.
- Get help from your neighbours you could ask them to collect post, open and close curtains or park in your driveway.

# The Dagnall Day @ The Park - Reflections on The Event

The Dagnall Fete had been an annual village event and the planning and day ran smoothly each year, after many years of practice and experience of getting it right.

This year, however, after a successful 'Day at the Races' held in 2009, and a consultation session with the Village, we wanted to repeat the most popular aspects of the 'Race Day' as well as create a new approach that everyone would enjoy. This would take us out of our comfort zone as the organising committee.

At the first planning meeting, at the end of January (remember the snow!), we quickly agreed that the purpose of the day would be

- Keep the event close/tight on the recreation ground (keep people together, not too spread out)
- Invite the other community groups to be involved (choir, playgroup, over 60's, Church, School and Gardener's society).
- Focus the day on tournaments/sports/competition
- Have free 'side' activities
- Repeat the 'high fund raising' activities of previous years

We also agreed that the following would benefit from any funds raised:

- 40% Iain Rennie (who have had an impact on so many people in Dagnall)
- 60% divided between the church, playgroup, village hall and school

These were the easy decisions! After that, we were working with a new format, little history of what worked and what didn't, but also a willing set of minds to create a fun day that the village would enjoy. Over eleven meetings and five months and many times when we had to remind ourselves of the purpose (see above), we were ready for the 'Dagnall Day @ the Park'. Our final meeting (two days before) saw us creating a contingency plan for the BBQ/Hog Roast – we had expected to sell 150 tickets and in fact had sold 250! We also discovered that we did not have a band for the evening due to unforeseen circumstances. With some head scratching and relying on support from many people in the village (e.g. making large bowls of salad and hundreds of jacket potatoes), Saturday 19 June dawned.

Unfortunately, the weather was unkind to us (although not raining), the temperature dropped to 15°C with a biting wind. Despite this, we had six great Village teams who entered the competition (10 members per team, mixed ages and genders), with a really high standard of entry (we asked for a decorated wheelbarrow, in some cases, they were like small mobile homes!). John Bercow opened the day for us and noticed straight away that the format was different, in a good way.

The team games provided the entertainment, with a mixture of intense competition and good fun. One of the games involved searching for puzzle pieces in jelly and then flour, no hands! Due to the cold weather, we decided not to have the teams run through the paddling pool of water however, they were not so soft – after the water balloon game had finished, they threw water bombs at each other and any of the audience that got too close! The winning team, Team Taylor, were presented with a cup.

The lovely ladies from Dagnall Church provided tea and cakes (free except for a donation), there were free bouncy castles, a plant sale by Dagnall Gardeners Society, a duck shoot, a play area (with free face painting) provided by Dagnall Playgroup and Under 5's and the new swings in the playground area had been installed. The children

had a great time with the freedom to run around safely.

In addition, we had displays from Tae Kwon Do, Playgroup and Dagnall School. The Dagnall Community Choir did a fantastic repertoire and made us really proud that this is a part of our village. The Day @ the Park continued with a Hog Roast and BBQ (helped to warm us up!) and a band who entertained us into the evening. Fund raising activities included a beer tent, silent auction, prize draw and sponsorship.

We are due to have a meeting to discuss the day and feedback from those who attended – please email sjquinn@aol.com if you have any comments. We will report the final total funds raised in the next edition of Focus. There were too many people involved to thank everyone personally, but that is what we had intended – a truly Community day. # Table Corner - Summer Bites!

First of all, I would like to thank all of you who came to the Edlesborough Carnival either to bring a recipe or simply to say hello. It was wonderful meeting so many people from near (and some visitors from as far away as Norfolk) and I hope that you all had as good a day as we did. The Carnival Recipe book is now under way....

This August and September edition gives me the opportunity to share one of my favourite items for any party at this time of year: mini skewers! Non-meat ones, too. When you have a lavish party with starters, main course and desserts, and want to provide an appetizer with that little bit of a difference, then mini skewers are the answer as they are simple, light and wholesome.

At the top of my list are these three:

Melon and watermelon

King prawn, mango and cherry tomato

Berries and grilled cheese

### Melon and watermelon skewers -

Carve melon and watermelon into balls – easiest done with a melon-ball scooper. Thread them in fours or fives on skewers, alternating colours for best effect. Refrigerate for half an hour. Splash a drizzle of port on them, followed by a little chopped fresh mint. Serve immediately.

# King prawn, mango and cherry tomato skewers -

Fry your king prawns lightly, and only for a minute or two at most, in olive oil and add a little salt. Leave to cool. Peel and cube the mango – the mango can be peeled if you score the skin into segments with a sharp knife-point first, and the cubes will probably be more like squared slices depending on the variety you are able to buy. Slice your cherry tomatoes into halves. Thread them on a skewer as above, alternating cherry tomato, prawn and mango.

# Berries and grilled cheese skewers -

The tartness of raspberries and the sweetness of cape gooseberries pair fantastically well with haloumi cheese. For this skewer, simply thread first a cape gooseberry, then a raspberry followed by a piece of grilled haloumi. For extra decadence, you could even drizzle honey!

# Grand St Mary's Duck Race Saturday 10th July 2010

As the sun came up on a glorious July day, and the weather forecasters predicted temperatures in the 80's there was one small group cursing the weather, yes the Canadian Duck specialist racing team had been preparing



for months for a typical English summer - wind, rain and cold - and their tactical planning was now wasted! Indeed as the ducks gathered in the pit lanes and had their final team briefings, Team Canada was missing completely and only arrived at the start line with seconds to go - and the Siberian team were looking distinctly unhappy about the high temperatures, the rumours amongst the international media was that they had been hoping for ice on the Ouzel.

Despite these last minute hitches for some racers the rest of the highly trained athlete ducks were straining for the starters gun. As the 1pm start approached the large crowd counted down and suddenly more than 200 ducks were off!

The race went against expected form with number 124 taking an early lead – bookies

had a momentary panic given the pre-race odds on 124 were 124/1!! But they needn't have worried, after the initial surge 124 dropped back into the pack while 65 and 143 began to make a decisive break away from the field.

These pre-race favourites took the race by storm from here on building a five length lead by the "crayfish chicane" which grew to 12 lengths in the fast current past the reeds at the race mid-point. It was fast becoming a two duck race – until disaster struck for 65 when a floating leaf knocked it off it's previously clinical racing line.

Number 143 took full advantage and by the final straight past the "tombstones" she had a clear and insurmountable lead – the final winning margin was a duck race record at 10 lengths (although they are tiny ducks so ten lengths is only 18 inches).

Duck 65 came in a creditable second holding off a late sprint from the early leader 124. The cheers of the crowd were still ringing around the riverbank as the last duck limped in – number 113 brought up the rear and will soon be taking up a new career in Aylesbury!

The winning duck earned £33 each for his two owners – while the owners of the runner-up each got £22! Even the third-place duck earned £11 each for it's two owners. Most importantly though, the race earned over £300 for the Carnival charities – so thanks to everyone who bought a duck or sold on the races behalf – including Cheeky Monkeys and Janes. Thanks also to Buckingham and River Ouzel Internal Drainage Board for preparing the river.



# Highlights of the meeting for Eaton Bray Parish Council

## Held in the Coffee Tayern on Monday 5th July 2010 at 7:30pm CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE REPRESENTATIVE/S

Ward Cllrs Marion Mustoe and Ken Janes attended the meeting. Many residents are very concerned with the development of the Five Bells. It was felt that for the size of plot, five detached homes were inappropriate and encroaches on to common land. The Parish Council recommended that a site visit from Central Beds Council be made to the development site.

### POLICE REPORT

There were 13 recorded crimes in Eaton Bray within June.

Nuisance Behaviour: The police have increased High Visibility policing for the area as and when they can and have spoken to individuals they have encountered at the time ... and will of course continue to monitor the situation.

Youth Club/Group Facilities: A meeting is to be held at the coffee tayern on Wednesday 14th July 2010 at 10:00am to plan youth club/group activities for Eaton Bray and Totternhoe

### MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

Visibility Concerns at the junction of Dunstable Road & Bower Lane/Harling Road: The Parish Council have chased Central Bedfordshire Council regarding this matter.

Nuisance Youths: Residents are experiencing excess noise at night from School Lane Car Park. The Parish Council agree that the level of noise being experienced by local residents late at night is not acceptable and confirmed that they are in talks with the local police about this issue.

Speeding down School Lane: Many vehicles are using speeds well in excess of the current 30 mph limit down School Lane The Parish Council are currently in talks with Central Beds Council looking at the options available to reduce speed on this road.

Dog Attack in Recreation Ground: There was a recent dog attack at the recreation ground, where one dog was attacked by another. The Parish Council wished to remind all dog owners/walkers that ... "all dogs in the recreation ground should not at any time be left unattended and must always be on a lead."

Parish Byelaws: Due to recent incidents in the parish, the Parish Council are looking into reviewing the parish Byelaws to give more power to the Parish Council and the police to deal with issues/situations as and when they arise.



### Dagnall Weather Station (AONB)

With only 26mm of rain, June was another very dry month.

According to the Met Office, the first six months of the year has been the driest for more than eighty years, with an average across the country of 356.8mm of rain. Here, at the Dagnall Weather Station, we have only recorded 252.4 mm - almost one third less

Overall, it was a hot and humid month. Unfortunately for potato growers, on the 8th to 11th of June, the conditions were ideal for potato blight; the temperature did not drop below 10c and we had humidity above 90% for more than ten hours each day. This is known as a "Smith Period", and time to spray.

The Dagnall weather station is now live on the web with 15 mins updates from approx 0800-2200 hours each day. http://myweb.tiscali.co.uk/dagnallweather.

Maria showed us some beautiful designs, which proved how varied gardens can be. She certainly loves her work, and gave us a really interesting demonstration on the creation of so many contrasting and beautiful flower beds.
