

Offenders

Have you seen people in your neighbourhood wearing bright orange bibs and cleaning up graffiti? They're part of a scheme called Community Payback which seeks to make offenders pay back the community for their crimes. They wear bright orange bibs so you can see that justice is being done. The scheme has been used in Prebendal Farm, Mandeville, and Elm Farm in Aylesbury following requests from residents for graffiti

and litter to be cleaned up. This work benefits the community and means the offenders pay back the community for their crimes, something you have told us you want to see.

Projects can include removing graffiti, picking up litter, repairing and decorating community buildings, and working on environmental projects. Community Payback is a tough and visible consequence for people who have committed a crime. About 300'000 hours of community service, or approximately £1.5m of free labour is provided each year to communities across Thames Valley.



Don't Fall Foul of the Law

Central Bedfordshire Council is asking dog owners to show consideration for other residents by using poop-scoops and dog waste bins when they are out walking their pets after receiving 268 complaints in the last year.



The council's dog wardens have the power to hand out fixed penalties of $\pounds75$ to any dog owners caught failing to clear up after their pet when it's in a public place.

Cllr David McVicar, Portfolio Holder for Safer Communities and Healthier Lifestyles at Central Bedfordshire Council said: "With over 620 dog bins installed across Central Bedfordshire, there is no excuse for not doing the right thing. People take pride in their community but public areas are becoming blighted by dog mess.

"I would urge all dog owners to act responsibly or face receiving a fixed penalty if they fail to clear up after their pets. Dog mess is the public's most hated type of litter and it is dangerous.

"People may not realise that Toxocariasis - an infection of the round worm - is spread via dog faeces and young children are particularly at risk due to their weaker immune systems.

"The Council has already successfully prosecuted a resident for not cleaning up after his pet and I hope that all dog owners do their bit in keeping our pavements and parks mess-free."

Dog walkers must scoop their dog's mess up from all designated land to which the public have access. Designated land includes:

- Footways and paths, including public footpaths
- Play areas, picnic sites and outdoor eating places
- Sport playing pitches including 5 metre border
- Formal parks and land where the grass is cut
- Land outside schools and hospitals
- Car parks, public transport bays and surrounds
- Cycle ways and surfaced areas near to houses
- Shopping areas, markets and public circulation areas
- · Cemeteries and war memorials
- Land surrounding toilets, recycling sites and public buildings

If you want to report a problem with dog mess, please call 0300 300 8631 (North)/ 8632 (South) or email customer.services@centralbedfordshire.gov.uk

If you are a dog owner, here are some things you can do to help;

- 1. If you walk your dog always carry the means to clear up after them. A simple plastic bag will do the trick or buy a poop scoop from a local pet shop
- 2. You can also buy biodegradable plastic "Doggy Bags" from the a number of pet supply retailers
- 3. Every time your dog fouls, bag it and bin it. Take the poop scoop home and dispose of it there or use one of the bins if available. Remember rain does not wash the problem away.
- 4. Never let your dog out alone to "go to the loo".



Ward Cllr Ken Janes attended the meeting. He informed the meeting that there is to be a new application for development at the Five Bells site.

POLICE REPORT

There were 20 recorded crimes within Eaton Bray Parish for July/August.

Theft/Burglaries: There has been a rise in burglaries to sheds/garages. The police wished to remind all residents to ensure that they keep their shed/garages locked and secure at all times.

Speed Checks: The police carried out seven separate speed checks within the parish during June/July. From those checks 36 people have been dealt with for exceeding the speed limit.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

Cemetery: The new notice board has been fitted in the cemetery and the council are in the process of putting together relevant notices to be displayed.

Energy Rebate Scheme

From June, the government is introducing the Energy Rebate Scheme. Under the scheme, electricity suppliers will be giving $\pounds 80$ off electricity bills to all eligible customers. This rebate is a one off for this year only.

Customers will be eligible if, on 26 March, they or their partners:

were aged 70 or over and were receiving the guarantee credit element of pension credit but not the savings credit element (those receiving both will not eligible for the rebate) and were responsible for the electricity account where they live and were not on a discounted tariff. A discounted tariff includes energyplus care, Energy Assist, Essentials, Fresh Start, First Step Tariff, Price Promise, Spreading Warmth Tariff, StayWarm (and receiving a social discount), and WarmAssist.

A partner means a member of a couple who are married, civil partners or living together as if they were married or civil partners.

The rebate does not apply to those who, on 26 March:

were living permanently in a care home or were in hospital getting free in-patient treatment and had been doing so for more than 52 weeks.

All eligible customers will get a letter informing them about the scheme by the end of July. The rebate will be awarded automatically to those eligible customers and will appear on the next bill received after June. Those eligible customers on prepayment meters may get a post office voucher to cash in, a top-up to their card or a cheque. Their supplier will let them know how they can claim their rebate.

Customers who are not automatically eligible may receive a letter asking them to contact the Energy Rebate Scheme Claims Helpline before 31 August in order to check whether they qualify for the rebate.

If customers were eligible on 26 March, but have subsequently died, their estate will still receive the rebate. A letter will be sent to the estate of the deceased informing them of how to claim the rebate.



Kathie Froud was thanked at our latest meeting for arrangements she had made to enable members to go out for a very enjoyable pub meal.

A husband and wife team, June & Ken Brazier, gave a very instructive talk on 'Mercy Ships'. This is an international Christian charity which uses hospital

ships and land based programmes to give health care, free of charge, to the world's forgotten poor. It began in 1978 when a wealthy American purchased a retired ocean liner and paid for it to be converted to a hospital ship. Since then a number of such ships have visited more than 150 ports in developing countries. All work is done voluntarily, from surgeons to gap year students, and all helpers will tackle any job they can. Not only do they receive no wages, but they pay for all their own food during the time they spend working for the charity.

Free surgery is carried out on board the hospital ships, and further health care is given locally. Help is given to thousands of people who normally would never receive such care. Surgery is performed for conditions such as cleft lip and palate, congenital abnormalities, burns, cataracts and dental procedures. On shore help is given for such projects as clean water, sanitation, agriculture and construction. Skills training and the

provision of tools and resources are all part of the help given by Mercy Ships.

June and Ken (who is a Rotarian) signed up a few years ago for one of the visits to Sierra Leone and, whilst there, helped with the building of a clinic. They now help raise funds for the hospital ships.

Mercy Ships is a really caring concern, and brings hope and healing to thousands of poor people. Their helpers are all volunteers, but what rewards they must receive in doing such wonderful work.

Since our last meeting a group of members, family and friends went on a coach trip to Buckingham Palace. We toured both the state rooms and the gardens. It was a marvellous experience to see such splendour inside the Palace and to tour the beautiful gardens. In fact, the time spent there was too short to 'take in' the sight of so many lovely rooms and garden scenes.

What a contrast to the world of Mercy Ships!!

Getting Prepared for Winter

With winter just around the corner - its that time when temperatures begin dropping, and the weather becomes cool and crisp, it's time to prepare any outdoor taps or pipes for winter weather. So here are a few tips to follow to get you prepared.

Firstly, you should detach any garden hoses from outdoor taps, drain the hoses, and store them for winter. Then for those pipes that lead to outdoor taps, you should close the shut off valve. Once you've closed the shut off valve, turn your outdoor taps on so that any water remaining in them can be drained.



The next preventive measure you can take is to insulate your pipes. This is especially important for pipes that are located in cellars, garages, lofts, crawl spaces, and other areas of your home that don't receive much, if any, heat. The more insulation a pipe has, the less likely it is to freeze. In addition, you should take notice of any areas of your home near pipes where there may be cracks or gaps, in which cold air could get in.

Should you have plans to be away during the winter months, even for a few days, you need to make sure to leave your thermostat set to keep your house warm so the pipes don't freeze. When water freezes it expands by roughly 10%, so when the water has nowhere to go it just bursts the pipe. This is important, as just a 3mm crack in a pipe can spew over 900 litres of water per day, which is both inefficient and expensive.



If you have the unfortunate experience of waking up to frozen pipes you should turn on your taps, as this will relieve the pressure as the ice melts inside the pipes. You can use appliances such as a blow dryer or a heat lamp to defrost the pipe. Under no circumstances should you use a blow torch or candle. In addition, you can leave your water running a very small, slow trickle through the pipes to prevent them from freezing again.



Golf Injuries

Golf injuries are reported to affect 15-20% of golfers each year. They are mostly due to overuse, although some can be traumatic injuries. Golf requires explosive power when driving off tees and the repetitive swing action can put stress on muscles and joints, causing injuries.

The 3 main causes of golf injuries are:-

- 1. Incorrect golf club grip.
- 2. Poor swing technique, including over-swinging, twisting the spine during the swing or hitting the ground during the swing.
- 3. Not warming up correctly.

Low back pain is the most common injury and accounts for 20%. Other common areas affected include elbow, shoulder and knee, which we will discuss in more detail.

Low Back Pain

The repetitive action of the golf swing is the number one cause of low back pain, making the importance of correct technique essential. The discs, ligaments, muscles and facet joints can all be affected. To help prevent this, correct any swing faults with Maurice and perform core stability exercises to improve strength and posture.

Golfer's Elbow

This is inflammation of the tendons of the forearm, where they insert into the bone on the inner side of the elbow. The inflammation is caused by forceful gripping activities such as gripping the club. To help prevent this, do a regular stretching and strengthening programme, select larger club grips and also select irons with large heads and "sweet spots" to lessen vibration. Also, graphite shafts produce less vibration.

Knee Pain

The weight bearing and rotational forces during the swing, plus prolonged walking, can lead to knee problems. To help reduce this, try strengthening the muscles around the knee.

Shoulder Pain

The repeated stresses of the golf swing especially if performed incorrectly can lead to damage of the Rotator Cuff (the muscles around the shoulder joint)

To help prevent this developing, check your swing with a golf professional and perform a regular exercise programme to maintain flexibility and strength around the shoulder. Tops tips for injury prevention in golfers

- 1. Perform a proper warm up. To include stretching the muscles of your shoulder, neck and back.
- 2. Perform regular core conditioning exercises. To improve your core strength in your back and shoulders.
- 3. Ensure you are using the correct equipment including having the correct club grip. To help prevent development of wrist and elbow injuries.
- 4. Ensure you have a good swing technique. Poor swing mechanics and overswinging can all lead to injury. Swing faults can be addressed by a Professional.
- 5. Listen to your body. To avoid overuse injuries, decrease your play time at the first sign of aches and pains.

Residents are being asked to consider using their timer light switch to leave a light on if they plan to return home after dark. Other advice is to regularly vary the times they

set timer switches to turn on and off. Over the last few years the community safety partnership have given out over 5000 light timers and energy efficient light bulbs. AVDC have a limited supply this year but residents can pick one up in local stores and supermarkets for about £2

From October staff from Thames Valley Police and the District Council Community Safety Team will be at locations across the Vale handing out information about how to secure homes effectively against burglaries.

"A home in darkness between 4pm and 9pm tells potential burglars that nobody's home. By using timer light switches, preferably fitted with a low energy bulb, residents can protect their property by creating the impression that someone's home" said Kama Wager, Crime reduction officer. "We want to make residents who return home after dark aware of simple steps they can take to make their home more secure."

The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society

A very different book this month. Already a cult fiction read in America with many US citizens travelling to Guernsey, to follow in the footsteps of the fictional heroine and to visit the places mentioned in the story, it is gradually gaining a following in Great Britain. We were intrigued by the title and were curious to find out more about Guernsey and its eponymous literary society.

The book takes the form of letters and gradually, the reader is introduced to characters in London and their extreme opposites in Guernsey. The story begins in post war London: Juliet Ashton is an author struggling to find inspiration for a new novel and is also at a crossroads in her personal life. Quite out of the blue, she receives a letter from a young farmer living in Guernsey, who has found her name in a second hand book of essays by Charles Lamb. Fascinated by his interest and comments, she replies and begins a correspondence, which draws her into the world of Dawsey Adams and his friends, all members of the Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Pie Society.

As they exchange their views and personal stories, Juliet learns more about life on Guernsey during the German occupation and the struggle to survive. Inevitably, Juliet realises that this is the book that she would like to write and visits Guernsey to meet the characters behind the letters.

This is a charming book. It is very easy to read, the letters gradually unfolding the plot and the characters' letters revealing their personalities. It was well received by our members. Most people enjoyed the book and the criticisms were mild, mainly concerning a weakness in the plot.

The Island and The Return by Victoria Hislop

Victoria Hislop achieved phenomenal success with her first novel, 'The Island' and has recently had a second book published. Our book group thought it might be a good exercise to read the two books between us and then discuss them. We wanted to see if the first deserved its acclaim and if the second book was as good, or better than the first.

The Island is the title and also the dominant character of the first book. It is named Spinalonga and is a real island off the mainland of Crete, which until 1957 housed a leper colony.

Victoria Hislop has woven a fictional family story around the island and its inhabitants; and in so doing tells us how leprosy and its victims were perceived before modern medicine discovered successful treatments.

The story begins when Alexis Fielding decides to explore her Cretan ancestry and why her mother is so secretive about her childhood. She travels to Crete, where an old childhood friend of her mother's reveals a turbulent family story covering three generations. Alexis learns of her great grandparents, her grandparents, her great aunt and her mother and of their connection with the island of Spinalonga.

We all enjoyed reading the book although there were reservations about its pacing. We thought the ending was rather hurried in proportion to the detail of the rest of the story. The Return, is set in Granada and starts with another modern protagonist, Sonia, who is on holiday and is keen to dance flamenco. By chance she wanders into a little

café owned by the Ramirez family and uncovers an account of their involvement in the Spanish Civil War. The family consists of Concha and Pablo and their children, Emilio, a musician, Antonio, a teacher, Ignacio, a matador and Mercedes who loves to dance flamenco. In 1936 peace is shattered by revolution and the family is torn apart by its separate beliefs.

The novel is in part the love story between Mercedes and Javier Montero, a talented guitarist, and an account of the war in Spain. The historical detail is very thorough and a lot of research must have been done to achieve this. However, our members thought that the factual accounts overshadowed the story. Nevertheless, we thought that the two books gave us an insight into two subjects which we had neglected and we felt that now we know a lot more about them.

Table Corner & Comfort Food!

With the shorter evenings upon us I thought that I would write about our favourite topic: comfort food! No not chocolate, let us be sensible here, but risotto. It is a quick, full of flavour, and satisfying meal that is easy to cook providing you follow a few basic steps:

- 1. Use the right rice. This is paramount as a short round-grained rice with a high level of starch is the only one that will give you that velvety consistency. Arborio is good but Carnaroli is even better.
- 2. Enhance the flavour by using good pre-heated stock
- 3. Sweat the onion in rapeseed or good quality olive oil
- 4. Make sure you roll the rice in the onion before adding any liquid
- 5. GRADUALLY add the stock to the rice whilst stirring GENTLY
- 6. NEVER leave it unattended... stir every minute or so

For 4 persons here are the ingredients and the method:

900 ml stock (either vegetable or chicken)

1 onion, peeled and chopped

3 tbsp rapeseed oil

200g Carnaroli rice

25g butter

75g freshly grated parmesan

Cooked green vegetables, seafood or chicken

In a large frying pan, heat the oil and add the onion. Cook for a few minutes until it has softened and is translucent but not brown. Add the rice and cook for about 2 minutes. Again do not allow the rice to become brown. Gradually add the stock to the rice 3 - 4 tbsp at a time, stirring gently. When this has been absorbed by the rice, add the next 3 - 4 tbsp. Repeat this until the rice is tender, you might not need all the stock. Season. Finally add the butter, let it melt and stir gently so as to not break up the rice grains. Finish by adding half your parmesan and either vegetables, chicken or fish. Serve with adding the remaining parmesan.

The result: a perfect, creamy and velvety risotto! Bon appétit!
