

As we approach the shortest day of the year you might have noticed it getting colder and darker; though some people, snug in their cosy houses with hot water on tap having plenty of food from the supermarket reached in air-conditioned cars, don't experience the extremes of the season. It wasn't always so - I'm sure many older readers recall the experience of waking up with ice on the bedspread. They remember what it felt like to be cold, dark and hungry and how they looked forward with hope and expectation to spring and the joy of warmer, lighter days and more food to eat.

Hope, expectation and joyfulness – those should be the characteristics that mark our celebration of Advent and Christmas. Advent – the four weeks before Christmas - is a time when the church meditates on the state of the world with its darkness and violence, at the coldness which people can show one another, and considers its hopes for the future of the human race, hungry for a better way.

How can we bring an end to the ever more sophisticated ways we have of killing one another, wars over resources, mass starvation, poor healthcare of most of the world's inhabitants, the greed of the wealthy, fear of strangers, pollution, climate change? An end to injustice has been the great hope of people from time immemorial – the world groans for such a change - for someone who will show us how to bring about change. Surely, it's too much to hope for, too much to expect.

But the Christian message is that in the birth of Jesus, at Christmas, God does change things. That is exciting, that is Good News, and it is why so many of our Advent and Christmas carols are filled with joy: 'Hark the glad sound!' Rejoice, rejoice, Emmanuel shall come', 'A great and mighty wonder', 'Hark! The herald angels sing glory to the new-born King', 'Joy to the world, the Lord is come'.

Born a little baby, Jesus came and showed a different way, a way based on love, peace and justice for all people; and if the world is not to spiral into more and more despair perhaps His way is the one to try. It's not easy; I quoted G K Chesterton last month, well, here he is again "The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting. It has been found difficult, and left untried".

Christmas brings Good News, a message of joy for the world; but maybe you have missed it, maybe you have failed to be excited. Perhaps, like our experience of the seasons we are too comfortable, too distracted by modern commercial Christmases, to see the excitement that the message of Jesus brings to many millions of people throughout the world. Come along to church this Christmas and be awakened to the joy.

Finally, if hope, expectation and joy have been the themes of this article, please share with the congregation of St Mary's in their hope, expectation and joy at the announcement of a new vicar, Rev Coralie McCluskey; she will move here to take up

her post in February. Please pray for her and her family as they prepare for their move and for her new ministry.

## Edlesborough Parish Council News including Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall

#### The Green

A further 2 seats are being installed in front of the Pavilion in at attempt to reduce the amount of vandalism caused to the guttering and roof due to footballs being constantly kicked against the Pavilion walls.

The General Purpose Committee agreed at it's meeting in November that no football would be played by either EB Lions or the adult football teams on the Green other than on that part of the Green towards the Memorial Car park end and in no circumstances on land in front of the Pavilion or the cricket pitch which is for the recreational use of parishioners.

#### The Memorial Hall

Shot gun pellets have damaged the windows of the Memorial Hall. This matter is being treated as a severe and dangerous crime. If any nearby residents hear or see anything suspicious would they please immediately ring Thames Valley Police on the 999 number.

#### Affordable Housing

The Parish Council in conjunction with Community Impact will be carrying out a Housing Needs Survey for each of the three villages of Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall early in the New Year. Please refer to the separate item in this issue of 'Focus' Edlesborough Severage System

#### Edlesborough Sewerage System

Up to date plans of the current sewerage system have been supplied to the Parish Council by Anglian Water.

#### **Speed Limit Review**

The Area 13 Speed Limit Review decisions had now been made and the original proposals made by Bucks CC for Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall would be implemented without any changes.

#### Northall drainage

Bucks CC have been made aware of problems on Leighton Road one of which is currently being looked into.

#### **Core Strategy**

Following the scrappage of the original Core Strategy it will be progressed under the title of "The Vale of Aylesbury Plan" and it is intended that this will involve a significant amount of engagement with town and parish councils.

#### Advice from Bucks CC - snow clearance

Do not use hot water as snow could be replaced with black ice increasing the risk of injury.

Use sand or ash as a salt substitute should salt supplies run out.

When shovelling snow be careful not to block residents paths or drainage channels,

Be a "good neighbour" by clearing snow for those people who may be unable to do so themselves.

#### Warning!

Several energy companies use a password security system which is available to domestic customers who can register a password against their account. Anyone claiming to be

from your energy company, reading meters etc. can then be asked for this password to confirm they are genuine. If they are not able to give you the password, do not allow them access to your property. Contact your individual companies to find out if they operate such a system – the numbers will be available from your energy bills.



## Edlesborough Book Group 'TROUBLES' by J.G. FARRELL


'Troubles' by JG Farrell, is the recent winner of the 'Lost Booker Award'. Written by J G Farrell in 1970, it is a tragi-comedy which seeks to portray the reasons behind the struggle of the Irish people to regain their independence from the British in the aftermath of World War One. It also focuses on the plight of the resident Anglo Irish aristocracy, as they are forced from their homes and from their comfortable lifestyle. Central to the plot, is a once grand 300 room hotel which is situated on the coast of County Wexford. The Majestic Hotel is owned and run by Edward Spencer and his

family. It has been severely neglected recently because of the fading fortunes of the Spencer family and the lack of visitors during the war. Edward however, is a martinet and insists that the old standards and customs are upheld by his family and also by the tenants on his land. He demands that they sign a loyalty oath to the King. They are increasingly reluctant to do so.

Major Brendan Archer, who is convalescing from the effects of the first world war, arrives at the hotel in 1918. He had met Edward's daughter, Angela, once whilst on leave in Brighton. They had corresponded and on the strength of these letters Angela appears to consider herself engaged to the Major. He would like to reintroduce himself and to see if there is a future in their relationship. He gradually becomes more involved with the mouldering hotel and its eccentric inhabitants. Sinn Fein have begun their attacks and the story continues, gradually introducing us to the struggle of the Irish people. J.G. Farrell uses the Majestic Hotel as a symbol of the glory days of British rule and his powers of description conjure up a vivid atmosphere of the dust and decay of the old building as it gradually has to give way to its fate.

'Troubles' divided our book group. It was a definite love or hate situation. There was, however, no question of the excellence of the writing and the skill of the author. The picture he paints of the hotel and the small local community is vivid and tangible. There was also humour in the book, which not all our readers appreciated.

J.G Farrell wrote 'Troubles' as the first book of a trilogy, which has been widely acclaimed. He died tragically, aged 44 in a fishing accident. Who knows how his writing would have continued.




