Kevin Cubbage - candidate for AVDC Elections

The elections will be held on **Thursday 5th May 2011** when 59 people, representing some 36 wards will be elected to serve for a term of 4 years.

I have been Treasurer of NVHMC since 1989, and along with Lorna and all the other enthusiastic Committee members, we have worked very hard helping to make Northall Village Hall one of the best halls anywhere. And soon we'll have one of the best children's playgrounds!

I took-up running in 2003 and some of you will have seen me running around our local villages giving a cheery "Good Morning" as I pass. I managed to run the London Marathon in 2005. In 2010 I was very proud when Joanna and I both ran the London Marathon. I have been a very active member of Edlesborough Parish Council (EPC) since 1999. In 2002/3 I was instrumental in designing and implementing new monthly accounting systems, annual budgeting and project management disciplines. In 2003 I became a self-taught web designer and webmaster, and www.edlesborough.gov. uk was subsequently launched in April of that year. Since then I



have worked hard, in conjunction with Lin Sergeant our Parish Clerk, to keep our website informative, easy to navigate and up to date.

I served as Vice-Chairman of EPC from 2004 until November last year when I became Chairman. I have many ideas for improving the amenities and quality of life in Edlesborough, Dagnall, Northall and Ivinghoe Aston. My fellow Councillors on EPC and I will, I believe, be in a much better position to achieve our objectives if we have direct representation on AVDC - someone who lives locally and who is aware of issues at first hand.

Good News For "Wannabe" Croquet Players

Leighton Linslade Croquet Club has now obtained from Leighton Linslade Town Council (with the option of renewal) 6 years guaranteed use of its three lawns in Pages Park together with the use of toilet facilities and its own dedicated clubroom. We are now able to accept more members, and although we do have set sessions during the week and at weekends, members may play at anytime unless we are holding a competitive match or giving a coaching course for members. Our season runs from April to Early October and the annual fee is £65. Anyone may come for trial sessions at a cost of £5. Mallets and any other equipment needed will be supplied by the club. We do ask that you wear flat soled shoes. Should you, as a result, decide to become a full member your annual fee will be reduced to £60. At the moment the club has members from Eaton Bray, Northall and Edlesborough amongst its present players. During the off season we run a Social Club in Pages Park Pavilion from 10am until midday on a Wednesday at a cost of £2 per session. This charge includes a hot drink and biscuits. We play board and card games, darts and snooker, and generally enjoy meeting up and being social. Our lawns open unofficially on the Saturday 26th March and will be officially opened by the Mayor and Mayoress of Leighton Linslade Town Council at 2pm on Sunday the 3rd April 2011.

We play a version of croquet known as Golf Croquet which is fully recognised by the Croquet Association of which we are members. We field two teams in the East Anglia Croquet Federation's League. In 2005 we won the League and missed out last year by just one hoop after a season long campaign. In 2009 we reached the national finals of the Inter Club Plate competition, unfortunately losing to our old rivals Letchworth. Also last year we reached the quarter finals of the Inter-Club Murphy Shield, and again were narrowly beaten, this time by Belsay Hall at Tyne & Wear

Medical Detection Dogs

Medical Detection Dogs who are a charity based in Great Horwood (nr Milton Keynes) are dedicated to training dogs to detect human diseases by odour. Working with universities and hospitals, studies have been done which showed that dogs could be trained to detect cancer in urine. Dog are renowned for their sense of smell and this research really is fascinating and extremely worthwhile as it could potentially lead to new methods of detecting cancer. These dogs work for two or three days a week and live with families, leading happy normal pet lives; they will never be placed with clients and only work in the training environment on samples on a carousel. The dogs are not trained to indicate on individuals. I was privileged to witness the carousel test first hand and was extremely impressed! Dogs are also trained to alert individuals managing day to day life threatening conditions by detecting minute changes in body odour; these include diabetes blood sugar alert dogs, severe pain seizures and Addison's disease. Alert dogs warn their owners and bring vital medical supplies and get assistance if required. The charity's work is extremely interesting I am sure you will agree. The charity is looking for volunteers including fundraisers, puppy socialisers and speakers. Wing South Neighbourhood Policing Update

Here is the latest Wing South Neighbourhood update from Police Community Support Officer Christine Baker:

Recent News

We have recently had reports of dogs running loose in fields in Northall where sheep are lambing. Although the dogs were not attacking the sheep in any way their presence disturbed the sheep. Please remember to keep your dogs under control especially at this important time in the farming calendar.

Our new neighbourhood van arrived towards the end of February and you may have already seen this around the villages. This provides a large high visibility presence and will be very useful for 'Have your Say' meetings. We hope to take it to as many fetes as possible this summer. Some villages have already booked us for their events. If you are organising a fete or other community event do let us know the date so we can add it to our diaries.

Young people, despite several of our villages having well attended youth clubs, often tell us there is little to do in the evenings. They will be pleased to hear Bucks County Council in conjunction with Street Dreams are putting on a free event at Pitstone Memorial Hall on Friday 18th March from 6.00 -10.00 p.m. This is for anyone aged 11 -17 and from any village. Activities will include street dance, I-van, PS3, DJ'ing, skateboard, sumosuits, Nintendo Wii, music, food, films, basketball and football. We hope to see lots of you there!

Road Safety issues

We have been dealing with parking issues at Edlesborough School where drivers have parked too close to a junction and the large number of parked vehicles means visibility is poor for those cars going up and down the High Street. This has resulted in cars mounting the pavement to get past and making it dangerous for the children walking home from school. PC Jared Levens has been working closely with the safer routes to school coordinator and all parents received a letter from the head teacher advising them where to park safely.

Operations tackling serious crime

Over this month we have increased our presence in the village and recently we have changed our shifts to work into the early hours of the morning to deter and catch criminals who operate in the moonlight. As the days grow longer now we have started to see an increase in visitors to the beauty spots and our patrols are dedicated at these peak times.

Offenders brought to justice

- On the 4th February 2011 a 20 year old male from Leighton Buzzard received a Police Caution for possessing cannabis when his vehicle was stopped in Mentmore.
- On the 11th February 2011 a 25 year old male from Chiltern View, Eaton Bray was arrested on suspicion of Burglary by the Wing North and Wing South Neighbourhood Team. This burglary occurred in Great Brickhill in January. This male is currently on bail and is due to return to Aylesbury Police Station on the 28th March.

Crime Stats

In February 2011 a total of 15 crimes were recorded in the Wing South area by Thames Valley Police. Five of these crimes were domestic related which shows that there was

very little crime across the Wing South area this month which is great news. This is a big decrease from February 2010 where 38 crimes were recorded. The new crime mapping website (www.police.uk) appears to be having some teething problems as when I looked today it still had statistics for December 2010 showing. If you require information for your street in the mean time please do get in touch with us. We also had some great team working in Ivinghoe Aston where residents have witnessed a possible suspect vehicle leaving the scene of a crime and through some quick emails and phone calls we have been able to make some good enquiries. Evidence which shows what can happen when the police and communities work together. Please do keep giving us the information



The Verney family has lived at Claydon House for over 400 years. One of the most colourful family members in the 16th century was Sir Francis Verney who left England to become a pirate on the Barbary Coast.

From Saturday 12 March, pirates, plus other heroes and rogues from the Verney family, are the theme of an exhibition and events throughout the year at Claydon.

In his twenties Sir Francis decamped to Tunis where he "turned Turk", converted to Islam and joined a North African pirate fleet. When he died in extreme poverty in Messina, he left just his turban, a silk robe and a pair of Ottoman slippers. These extraordinary 400-year-old garments will be on show, together with a selection of letters and papers from the family archive, to give a fascinating personal glimpse into the lives of some of the family's heroes and rogues.

Fundraising is a Family Affair for this Dagnall Family

Two brothers, their sister and two family friends from Dagnall are preparing for their toughest challenge yet – a 7 day Marathon in the Amazonian Jungle this October. But the challenge of walking and running 220 kilometres through some of the world's hardest terrain at 95% humidity isn't quite enough for this family – just to make it a little bit tougher they have set themselves the target of doing it all for charity and are aiming to raise £20,000 for the Hospice of St Francis which cared for their mother who died last October (2010).



Sally Thorne, aged 43 from Dagnall, sadly lost her mother on 9th October 2010, the same day the race will start this October in Brazil. The grandmother of eight, Anne Thompson, bravely battled with secondary breast cancer in the lung for over two years before passing away peacefully at home surrounded by friends and family. When her illness became really tough she

was referred to the Hospice of St Francis in Berkhamsted and enjoyed respite and care. She initially stayed on the In-patient Unit for two weeks in the beginning of August and then returned for a longer stay at the end of August before returning home.

Sally said: The people at the hospice of St Francis made her time there very normal and looked after her just like she was one of their friends. All visitors were made welcome and nothing was too much trouble for them. They helped Anne live her wish and helped her to go home before she passed away in October 2010.

Mother of two Sally, her older brother John Thompson aged 45, and younger brother Luke Thompson, aged, 34 all live on the same street in Dagnall where their mum Anne also used to live. Taking part in the trek with them are their friends Kingsley Basson aged 37, and Christine Davies, aged 42, also from Dagnall and Northall.

The Jungle Marathon is a 7 day trek along existing paths in primary jungle. There will be natural obstacles to pass including streams and rivers and they will be totally self sufficient carrying their own foods and provisions. Nights will be spent in hammocks at campsites along the shores of the river.

Following the trek on their arrival in England the family is arranging a charity celebration ball. Other fundraising events lined up throughout this year are: Golf Day 5th August (day before Anne Thompson's birthday) followed by a pig roast and a Race

Night on St George's Day 23rd April.

All funds raised from the trek and the other events will go towards the Hospice of St Francis. Located in Berkhamsted the hospice provides professional support and care for people with terminal or life-limiting illnesses. It brings peace, comfort and dignity to patients, helping them to live life to the full, for whatever time is left. The care is tailored to each patient's individual needs whether that's in the In-Patient Unit, Day Hospice, or patients' homes. Also support




for families and carers is essential. The Hospice of St Francis really does provide total care when time is precious.

Invitation to the Waltz by Rosamond Lehmann

Our choice this month was a classic 'coming of age' novel written in 1932 which describes a young girl's first adult social occasion. Her doubts and fears in the week leading up to the grand ball to which she and her elder sister have been invited, are examined in great detail and form the driving force behind the story, which is set just after the first World War, in 1920.

Olivia Curtis is the younger daughter of a comfortable middle class family, who live in a large house in a small country village. She and her elder sister, Kate, have been invited to a ball in honour of their friend Marigold Spencer. The story opens on Olivia's

17th birthday a week before the event, through the day leading up to it and to the grand finale of the ball itself.

Although, in essence a very slight premise on which to base a novel. Rosamond Lehmann manages very subtly to underline the class differences between Olivia's family and the villagers and also the gap between the Spencer and the Curtis family. Gradually, as she takes her bolt of scarlet satin to the local dressmaker to be made into her ball gown and anticipates, with dread, her first outing as an adult, she starts to notice the world around her and her place in it. All the inadequacies of inexperience and extreme youth are beautifully described and the nuances of upper class etiquette set down in such a way as to be social comment.

The ball itself, has differing results for Olivia and her sister. Kate is more confident, and in her young sister's eyes, more beautiful and accomplished in every way. On the surface, Kate appears to have had the more successful

evening, but we know that Olivia in a quieter way has achieved even more.

There is a sequel to this novel, called 'The Weather in the Streets' which finds Olivia ten years on, and in love with an unsuitable man. It could be interesting to find out more about the 'grown up' Olivia.

A Beacon of Light: Bridget Elizabeth Talbot OBE

There is a pleasant linear walk near where I live, starting at St. Mary's church on the hill in Edlesborough and continuing via Ivinghoe Aston on to Ivinghoe, about three miles away.

As the footpath had recently been resurfaced, I decided it was high time I explored this track. Little did I know how a simple stone seat along the route would take me on a journey that was to include the Yorkshire Dales and details of the life of a truly remarkable woman who was influential in saving the very countryside I was to enjoy. I set off and was quickly among the rolling hills of this northern end of the Chilterns. All the usual suspects adorned the low hedgerow on one side of the path – common mallow, rose-bay willow herb, scabious and the ubiquitous bindweed. A kestrel hovered overhead and sheep were grazing. The view ahead was a delight with ripening wheat and a glimpse of Ivinghoe Beacon in the distance. A little over a third of the way towards Ivinghoe, a small stream crossed the path, meandering its way down from the higher chalk hills towards the Vale of Aylesbury. I crossed the stream on a small concrete bridge in a hedge and emerging the other side, relaxed on the handily placed seat on the other side. On standing up I noticed some indistinct writing carved into the stone bench and was intrigued to read the following:

IN MEMORY OF BRIDGET ELIZABETH TALBOT OBE

OF LITTLE GADDESDEN & KIPLIN HALL

SEAMANS FRIEND AND DEFENDER OF HUMAN RIGHTS
SHE HELPED TO PRESERVE THESE DOWNS FOR YOU WHO READ THIS
DIED 29TH NOV. 1971

INVENTOR OF LIFE SAVING WATERTIGHT TORCH FOR MARINERS

Several thoughts immediately came to mind. Who was this woman and for what did she receive the OBE? Little Gaddesden was not far away in Hertfordshire but where was Kiplin Hall? Lastly, how did someone who was clearly interested in the countryside come to invent a waterproof torch for mariners?

On completion of my walk I quickly accessed the internet and found intriguing details about Bridget Talbot on the Chilterns website (www.chilternsaonb.org) under 'people and places'. More information was to follow when I contacted the archivist at Kiplin Hall, a Jacobean country house near Richmond in North Yorkshire. Apparently the last owners of the hall were Bridget Talbot and her cousin Sarah Turnor and in a recent exhibition of family scrapbooks and artefacts they found 'a box containing three cigarettes given to Bridget Talbot at the Sultan's palace, 1920' and an oval bone and agate box with a label in her own hand: 'Cor. Day 1953 – Hairs from the mane of the Queen's greys taken at Westminster during the time Queen Elizabeth II was crowned' Was it, the archivist speculated, the then 68-year old lady herself who had a close encounter with one of the horses that pulled the royal carriage at the 1953 coronation? Bridget Elizabeth Talbot was clearly a remarkable lady and I think, one of those redoubtable women who didn't just think about what should be done in a situation –

they got on and did it. This is typified by her work with the Anglo-Italian Red Cross, for which she was awarded the OBE in 1920.

Our main interest is of course the incident which benefited the Chilterns. On 5 October 1925 it was announced that the great house and park at Ashridge, Hertfordshire, was to be sold. Having been born at Little Gaddesden, Ashridge was her childhood playground, so she was determined that others should also enjoy the famous beechwoods and rides that she herself had experienced. Using her considerable political connections, she trawled around London for supporters to her cause and by 10 October there was a letter in The Times urging people to send money to The National Trust with all speed, to purchase land between Ivinghoe Beacon and Berkhamsted Common. "We believe that there are few if any parks that combine so many features of desirability for public acquisition as Ashridge...it is amongst the most richly timbered of parks and has adjoining it stretches of downland, with magnificent views." The letter was signed by Stanley Baldwin, Ramsay MacDonald, Lord Oxford and Lord Grey of Fallodon - a considerable achievement for a few days work. In due course the estate was indeed purchased for the National Trust and as a consequence we are all still able to enjoy it today.

And the waterproof torch? It seems that Bridget Talbot sailed on the four masted ship Panir to Finland in 1937 and on her return a couple of years later began the National

Labour Enquiry into the state of the Merchant Navy. Presumably appalled by the loss of life of sailors who could not summon assistance due to their torches being waterlogged, she set about designing a waterproof version that attached to a lifebelt. Again using her considerable connections, she was successful in getting the torch made standard issue for the Merchant Navy, the Royal Navy and also the RAF.

Bridget Talbot died on 29 November 1971 at the age of 86 and asked for her ashes be scattered 'over the little stream off the grass road between Edlesborough and Ivinghoe, in view of the nine miles stretch of wood and country, and a stone put up...to say that I saved them for the National Trust.' If you are fortunate enough to walk that way, rest and be thankful that she did.

Table Corner and a Spring Recipe

Now that spring has officially sprung, and with most British lambs born at around this time of the year. I thought that I would share with you one of the easiest vet tastiest recipes we have in our repertoire. It is a French classic, perfect for a convivial meal with friends. The meat gently drips over the potatoes as it cooks, creating a meal full of flavour. Although it appears a little awkward to prepare, it is actually fairly easy. And there are 2 methods. You can either have 2 racks, one above the other, with the one below large enough to support your roasting tin (which must be wide enough to fit under your leg of lamb) and the upper one clean enough (as the meat is cooked directly on the rack) to fit your leg of lamb just above your tin. Alternatively, you simply can rest the leg directly onto the potatoes, which is equally good but not the "traditional" method

Serves 6 to 8

For the meat

Ingredients

For the potatoes

2.5kg leg of lamb, on the bone 2 stalks rosemary, leaves finely chopped 2 stalks thyme, leaves finely chopped

50g butter, softened 3 large cloves garlic, finely chopped

A couple of knobs of butter 2 medium onions, thinly sliced 1.5kg peeled and thinly sliced potatoes 4 stalks thyme, leaves only 400ml chicken stock 2 bay leaves

Preheat the oven to 200°C/Gas Mark 6

Meat

With the tip of a sharp knife, make about 20 deep cuts in the flesh of the lamb. Season well on all sides. Mix the herbs and garlic into the butter and carefully smear the butter all over the outside of, and into the cuts in the lamb. Prepare the potatoes.

Potatoes

Melt the butter in a saucepan, add the onions and a pinch of salt and cook for 5-10 minutes until the onions have just become soft and translucent. Grease a roasting tin large enough to fit under your leg of lamb. Layer the potatoes and onions in the tin. sprinkling each layer with thyme leaves and seasoning well. Start and finish with potatoes. Pour over the stock and place the bay leaves on top.

Put the potatoes on the lower shelf of the oven and position the lamb on the rack above or directly onto the potatoes (second method). Cook at 200°C/Gas Mark 6 for 20 minutes then turn down the heat to 180°C/ Gas Mark 4 and cook for 1 hour 15 minutes to 1 hour 40 minutes, depending on how well done you would like the meat to be. 





Salvation Sound - April 2011

Lent is almost over, and Eastertime is come once more. What does it mean to you? Is it a time of restoration for you? A time to reanimate your life? To infuse with courage and hope? On Easter day Christ rose from the grave after His crucifixion. He resumed His life.

Sometimes we find these things hard to believe - the Resurrection is perhaps easier to believe when we call to mind those lesser facts which have recalled us to life from the depths of self pity or depression. Maybe a certain piece of music "speaks" to you, or the songs of birds at dawn, a new love or friendship, or even just the reading of a well loved book, or having to move yourself because of someone's urgent needs. These things can give rise to an awakened sense of gratitude. Jesus was always saying thank-you to His Father; He took the cup and gave thanks. He took two fish and five loaves and gave thanks - just two examples - for throughout the gospels runs a stream of unspoken gratitude.

At this time of year it seems impossible not to feel grateful to God - especially in nature when we can see the new crops growing in the fields around us, shining from the touch of spring rains. Or see the green mist on the willow trees which precedes the first leaves, the colour of spring flowers, sunshine after clouds, new life on farms, simple things. "Consider the lilies" Jesus said, the ear of corn, the vine, the sparrows, the child. Seeds were I think one of His favourite symbols of rebirth and one that we as 'country folk' will understand. Easter day is the feast of happiness, joy and gratitude. On it we should think of the kindness of Christ, for He forgave the appalling things done to Him by man whilst on this beautiful earth. Just a day or two before, in a haze of pain the dying Christ said "forgive them!" He turned to a criminal and told him that they would be together in paradise - such a hard thing for us to understand, let alone accept this reality. But we believe that Christ's death invalidates death for us, for we too will see paradise! He lives and so we live -

I was there at the foot of the cross. For it's with my mind that I can see. I know that when He died, it was for me. That far away day, is yet very near. I'm filled with wonder, and yes, sometimes fear; For my faith is weak, 'though it is sincere. Today it is to me that He calls. He lifts me when I stumble or fall. His presence is always by my side, And it's in His love that I abide. Yes. I am here at the foot of the cross. But I am not filled with a sense of loss. For I now that He will come again, And when He does there will be no pain. It is here, the foot of the cross, Wherever we meet, the foot of the cross. the mercy seat.

The thought of His love, it's undying ember; I can't forget----


