Anne was actively involved with the youth of the Parish during this time and developed a close relationship with both Dagnall and Edlesborough schools.

Sargeant, (41 Pebblemoor, Edlesborough, Nr Dunstable, Beds. LU6 2HZ), or through the collection points at Edlesborough school, Dagnall school or Edlesborough Post Office. Entries should be clearly labelled on the reverse with competitors Name, Age and Contact details.

Competition entries should reach the Parish clerk, Mrs Lin Sargeant by Friday 24th June 2011. Winning photographs will be displayed at the village Carnival on Saturday 2nd July 2011 where Certificates will be awarded in each age category and the overall winner will be presented with the Anne Thompson Cup.

It is anticipated that the cup will be awarded each year but that the theme of the competition will change to appeal to different interests.

Serious Incident

Thames Valley Police is investigating an incident in which a young girl was approached by two men as she walked along Mill Road in Slapton between 4.30pm and 4.45pm on Friday 1st April.

The girl, who is aged 14, was walking home from an equestrian centre when a small white van with blacked-out windows pulled up alongside her.

Two men got out of the car and one grabbed the girl by her hair. The second man then grabbed her around the neck and made threats towards her, before the men got back into the vehicle and drove off.

The girl was shaken following the incident but unharmed.

Officers are appealing for anyone who saw a white van acting suspiciously in the area, or anyone who has information about the incident, to contact the 24-hour Police Enquiry Centre on 0845 8 505 505, or if you don't want to speak to police or leave your name, call the charity Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.



Dog Fouling



Eaton Bray Lower School is no more – but all is not what it seems, so please read on! The heading suggests, particularly at this time of year, new life and a fresh start, and that is exactly what is happening in Eaton Bray. Your local School became an Academy on Friday 1st April 2011.

To explain the reasons for this, I would like to take you back to the nineties. Eaton Bray School seemed constantly under threat at this time. We did not have high numbers, and in fact at times only three classrooms were in use, the fourth being 'moth balled' as they called it. We were regularly told that village schools were not necessary and that unless numbers increased the School would be closed. We were then given some freedom with Local Management of Schools and the creation of strong Governing Bodies. For us, this was the beginning of a new era. We were fortunate to have dedicated, committed School governors who worked with the School, and gradually we grew and developed. Our numbers increased, we designed and added a purpose built Pre School, which became part of the School, our School grounds were developed, and this year we extended the library and built a new classroom. Most importantly, we have a fantastic staff team and some of us openly admit to loving our jobs and looking forward to another Monday morning! This rubs off on our children and here are some of their quotes reported on their School census!

Tilly, "All the teachers are kind and caring",

Sulaymaan "It's a good place to be, the teachers try to make learning fun". Finlay "The best thing about EBLS is that there are lots of kind generous people" Finally, Peter provides a list!

"The children are nice, we have fun, we learn lots of facts and the rules are fair" As I hope you are beginning to realise, we feel Eaton Bray School is a special place and

we wanted to keep it that way. With fears of cuts and changes, and so many unknowns, we felt the way forward was to become an Academy. [This was made possible because of our 'Outstanding' status achieved at the last OFSTED inspection]. Accordingly, the Governing Body and the whole of the School staff voted unanimously to apply for Academy status, and this was accepted by Government, and came into effect on April 1st. So, we have a new beginning, which fits well with the history of Eaton Bray as it is the 150th anniversary of Eaton Bray School this year.

I would like to thank everyone who has made this possible, and hope that staff, parents and most of all, the children will continue to enjoy Eaton Bray School. We are here to stay! Sue Hounslow, Head

Highlights of the Meeting for Eaton Bray Parish Council

Held in The Coffee Tavern on Monday 4th April 2011 at 7:30pm Police Representatives

There have been 9 recorded crimes from January-March 2011, in comparison to 31 crimes for the same period in 2010.

<u>Anti-Social Behaviour</u>: The police wished to remind all residents to call the police when encountering an incident, and obtain as much detail as possible to aid the police in their investigations. Especially with regards to anti-social behaviour which generally increases with the warmer, longer days.

<u>Youth Activities:</u> The police are looking at setting up activity days during the school holidays in Eaton Bray (School Lane Recreation Ground). Details to follow.

Central Bedfordshire

<u>Dog fouling:</u> It is an offence to allow a dog, which you a responsible for, to foul and not clear it up immediately when in a public place. If residents are aware of persistent offenders letting their dog/s foul the footpaths, recreation ground etc., they can contact the Central Beds Dog Warden Service who will look into this matter further. The dog wardens have the power to issue fixed penalty notices to members of the public who allow their dog to foul and fail to remove it. The dog wardens conduct patrols but need the public's help to report areas of excess dog fouling. The dog wardens can only issue fixed penalty costs of £50 if they see dog fouling happening. Potential Development

The Parish Council have received a very large response to the questionnaire printed in Focus/on parish website and would like to thank all those for taking the time to complete/return the questionnaire. The Parish Council have received a communication from Central Beds Council:- "... Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) is currently in the process of preparing a new set of planning documents known as the Local Development Framework, and part of that is the Core Strategy which is being produced jointly with Luton Borough Council ... The purpose of the Core Strategy is to set out a vision for the area, including sites for future development on the edge of Luton/Dunstable/ Houghton Regis. The strategy states that within the rural area of Central Bedfordshire 750 dwellings are to be provided between 2011 and 2026, within this target 112 have already been allocated leaving 638 dwellings 'to find'. The strategy states that these dwellings should be within or around seven villages [one of those is Eaton Bray] ... Therefore to locate suitable land, CBC sent out a 'Call for Sites' in June/July last year; where they invited landowners, developers and other interested parties to submit their sites ... the site referred to [Bower Lane/Mill End Close] was submitted to us as part of that process. A key priority for the CBC is to develop 'brown field' sites first wherever possible in order to minimise loss of 'green field' land. However, CBC recognise that in order to meet the rural area housing target ... some development on green field land is likely to be required due to lack of brown field sites within existing village boundaries

... It is very important to note that CBC has not yet assessed any of the sites submitted ... and so has not come to a view with regards to their potential suitability for future development ..."

Edlesborough Book Group

The Cellist of Sarajevo by Steven Galloway

At the beginning of the Bosnian war in 1992, an incident in Sarajevo became the inspiration for this novel. An explosion, killing twenty two people as they queued for bread, was witnessed by a cellist named Vedran Smallovic.



Outraged by innocent citizens being slaughtered indiscriminately, he vowed to play his cello on that spot for twenty two consecutive days; to honour the victims and to defy the perpetrators. The piece he plays is Albinoni's Adagio, a piece of music rescued from the ruins of Dresden.

Steven Galloway weaves his fictional account around the central figure of the cellist, telling the stories of three characters who, in different ways, are trying to survive the terrible things that are happening to their lives. Sarajevo is under siege and to cross the city is fraught with danger, mostly from the snipers hidden in its surrounding hills. A young woman has joined the ranks of resistance fighters who are trying to defend the city. Her pseudonym is Arrow and we never learn her real name. She is a superb shot and is proud of her skill, although she is careful only to shoot soldiers. In this way she justifies the killing and feels that she is defending her city. Because of her excellent record she is detailed to protect the cellist from snipers and by so doing, renders herself vulnerable.

Kenan is a family man, setting out to collect vital clean water for both his family and an elderly neighbour. He does this twice a week and each time has to decide on the safest route. The bottles he carries are awkward and weigh him down, especially on his return journey when they are full.

Dragan is elderly, but still doing essential work as a baker. He has no choice but to cross streets that are targeted regularly by snipers. Every crossing is a gamble with his life and his city is no longer recognisable as the place he loves. Even to exchange greetings with a neighbour is out of the question now.

The one constant in the city is the cellist's performance. Every afternoon he appears, dressed in evening dress and plays the hauntingly plaintive Adagio. We, as readers, see the effect the music has on the three main characters, and how it changes their view of the events around them.

This book was chosen for us by the local library. The majority of the group enjoyed the story and thought it well written. However, we found the unfamiliar place names confusing and so found the routes taken and the time lines of the story hard to follow. We knew very little about the Bosnian war although it was very recent, and realised to our shame how quickly we forget major historical events.

This traumatic start was only the beginning of what had been an unsettled life. The royal family lived for a time at the Ritz hotel in London, before moving in 1941 to Sunninghill, Berkshire then to Parmoor near Frieth in Buckinghamshire.

After the Second World War Leka's parents moved to Egypt but left Leka in Britain for his education. After passing out of the Royal Military Academy at Sandhurst, he joined the British Army. He later became a successful commodities trader.

After his father's death in 1961, 22year old Leka was proclaimed king by an Albanian government in exile. He set up home in Spain with his wife Susan, an Australian,

but was on his way to start a new life in Rhodesia when his plane was surrounded by troops during a refuelling stop. It transpired that the Albanian government had hired the Africans to abduct him.

Now 72, Leka has returned to Albania since the fall of communism and now lives in Tirana.

Jean was a superb speaker whose enthusiasm and attention to so much detail, left everyone wanting more. She gave a complete life history of King Zog 1 and the Queen Geraldine and their families accompanied by her slides and answered many questions.Next months meeting will be on Monday 9th May at 7.30pm and will involve discussing and voting on the two resolutions to be presented at the National AGM in June. Are you of little worth ?

Matthew 10: 31. "Do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows". In the town where Ethel lived she went to her minister and asked if she could teach in Sunday School. He informed her that he thought she was too old! She was 76 years of age.

One day whilst Ethel was weeding her garden a young Chinese student from the local university stopped to comment on the flowers that were growing there. She invited him in for a cup of tea; as they talked together about their lives she had the opportunity to tell him of Jesus, and His love for her and what changes loving Him had made in her life. The next day the lad returned with another student; and so began Ethel's ministry; because of her age the Chinese students listened to her with respect. When she died 70 Chinese believers sat together at her funeral. Yet she was thought to be to old to teach little children!

Dagnall Weather Station (AONB) Weather Conditions for March 2011

With only 3 days of significant rain, March has been one of the driest on record with just 6.4mm (¼ inch) of rain. Part of this measurement is not actual rain falling from the sky, but something known as 'Hoar Frost'. This happens when the temperature falls below 0°c, the dew freezes on the measuring apparatus, melts when the temperature rises and runs in to rain gauge. You can see this on the chart below. Over the last few years March rain has averaged 54.6 mm for the month, with a high of 89.0mm in 2008. The Dagnall weather station is now live on the web with 15 mins updates from approx 0800-2200 hours each day. http://myweb.tiscali.co.uk/dagnallweather.




Table Corner RHUBARB CHEESECAKE

During a recent dinner party where we entertained certain august Dagnallites (I am sure they will be pleased with that), it was agreed that I should share this rhubarb cheesecake recipe. The rhubarb is combined with mascarpone cheese and ginger. Rhubarb and ginger is a classic combination, which always brings out the best in the fruit in my opinion. So here is the recipe:

Serves 8 to 10

Ingredients

500 g chopped rhubarb

500 g mascarpone cheese

175 g caster sugar

50 g butter, melted

175g shortbread biscuits for the base (ginger shortbread biscuits would be ideal)

3 eggs, beaten

2 tbsp cornflour

A piece of stem ginger (bought in a jar with its own sugar syrup) plus 2 tbsp syrup from this.

Preheat the oven to 180oC/Gas Mark 4.

Line the base of a medium sized spring form cake tin with baking parchment.

Poach the rhubarb by heating gently in a saucepan for roughly 10 minutes along with the finely chopped stem ginger, the syrup, 100g of the caster sugar and 4 tablespoons of water. Let it cool down then strain into a bowl making sure you keep separately both the strained rhubarb as well as the syrupy juices which will be used to drizzle over the cake.

Crush the shortbread biscuits coarsely, and mix them with the melted butter. Place this in the bottom of your tin and leave in the fridge until you finish the other steps.

The last stage is mixing the mascarpone cheese with the cornflour, the beaten eggs and the remaining sugar until you obtain a smooth mixture. Carefully add the strained rhubarb and gently mix. Pour this into the tin and bake in the oven for 50 minutes until golden and firm. Leave to cool. The "icing on the cake" will in this case be the syrupy juices, which you should drizzle on the cake just before serving.

In my opinion, this cheesecake is best served at room temperature.


