In a world where conflict and confrontation are increasingly prevalent; where the innocent are often victims of man's inhumanity, greed and desire for power and where sometimes we ask, where is it all going to end, it is in the lives of the saints I often find the support, inspiration and strength I need. I have always been passionate about the Saints particularly St Mary, the mother of Jesus, St David because I'm Welsh and all those people I have known in my life, who will never get into the calendar of saints, but have dedicated their lives to helping others, fund raising and just loving people who are in the greatest need.



This month we celebrate Britain's first martyr, St Alban, at the Alban Pilgrimage as giant carnival puppets retrace the last steps of St Alban and his remarkable story. Roman chariots, centurions, lions, roses and executioners all take their place in the spectacular procession from Roman Verulamium to St Albans Cathedral.

Alban, a citizen of Verulamium (St Albans), was executed for sheltering a Christian priest fleeing Roman persecution. Originally a worshipper of Roman gods, Alban was so influenced by the priest's prayer and teaching that he converted to Christianity. When the authorities discovered the priest's hiding place Alban exchanged clothes with him. The priest escaped and Alban was arrested. He was taken to the Imperial Basilica (the area where the Roman Museum and St Michael's church now stand) and ordered to renounce his Christian faith. Instead Alban declared his Christian faith using words that are still used as a prayer, "I worship and adore the living God who created all things". He was executed on a hill outside the city walls and the Cathedral and Abbey church of St Alban stands on the site of his grave.

This year's **Festival Pilgrimage**, **Saturday 18th June**, begins at **10.30am** with a procession from Roman Verulamium (site of Alban's trial) to the Abbey with an enactment of the martyrdom. This will be followed at 11.30am by a Festival Eucharist at which The Very Revd June Osborne, Dean of Salisbury will preach. During the afternoon there will be family activities and refreshments available at the Roman Quest outside St Albans and at 4pm the Revd Dr Leslie Griffiths, Superintendent of Wesley's Chapel will preach at the Festival Evensong.

If you do decide to go along, Pilgrims traditionally wear a rose to symbolise the blood of Alban and the roses that according to legend, sprung up on the route to his execution.

Just to round it all off, there will be an ongoing BBQ and other food served throughout the event.


For drivers and youngsters there will be soft drinks, along with wine for non beer drinkers. All the Beers have been especially chosen by CAMRA members.

Highlights of the Eaton Bray Parish Council Minutes

Annual Parish Meeting/Annual Meeting of Eaton Bray Parish Council Held on Monday 9th/Wednesday 11th May 2011, 7:30pm at The Coffee Tavern Chairman's Comments: The Chairman wished to thank all the Parish Councillors, Clerk and many others who have worked for/with the Parish Council over the year. All the work and support that everyone has given is much appreciated.

Cllr. Margret Hawkes, Chairman of Eaton Bray Parish Council

Cemetery: The new Grounds Maintenance Contract has now been agreed, with the additional monthly minor works being continued for 2011. The front hedge of the cemetery is being cut back away from the public footpath and any undergrowth encroaching on the footpath being cleared. Gaps in the hedge are to be filled with temporary fencing to allow for the Whips to grow. Many of the cemetery boundary hedges have encroached into burial land and this is something that the Parish Council will look into this year.

Recreation Ground Improvements: Two new pieces of play equipment have been purchased for the children's play area in School Lane, with fitting to be arranged for later in the year. The Community Payment Scheme has now been agreed by the Parish Council, who will utilise this service for the repainting of all the parish play equipment. The Parish Council are looking into creating a separate entrance to the School Lane Car Park for pedestrians.

Additional projects for the coming year: The Parish Council will be looking at the options available for road safety in the parish, i.e. speed control, safer routes to school. The Parish Council will be looking at the improvements needed to many trees within the parish.

Election of Councillors: Cllr. Piggott was elected as Chairman of the Parish Council and the council were pleased to co-opt new councillors to the Parish Council.

Many Thanks – Retiring Parish Councillor Dave Pearson: The Parish Council wished to send a message of thanks to retiring Parish Councillor Dave Pearson. This long standing Councillor has done so much for the community in which he lives and has such wonderful knowledge of this village. His presence on the Parish Council will be greatly missed.

Accounts for year ending 31st March 2011: The Clerk distributed details of the accounts for the Annual Return. It was agreed to approve the annual accounts, the Chairman signed on behalf of the Parish Council.

Central Bedfordshire Council: Ward Cllr. Marion Mustoe attended the meeting who confirmed that Councillor James Jamieson has been elected as Leader of Central Bedfordshire Council's Conservative Group. Councillor Jamieson represents Westoning, Flitton and Greenfield and has lived in Bedfordshire for 25 years. He became a Central Bedfordshire Councillor when the new Unitary Authority was created in 2009. He has been Chairman of the Council's Overview and Scrutiny Committee (for Customer and Shared Services) for the past two years. He has enjoyed a successful career in business. He worked for several national and multinational companies including Unilever, Whitbread, UBS and Hambros before establishing his own management consultancy firm in 2005. He and his wife have two children and are actively involved in the local community.

Edlesborough Parish Council Chairman's Report - Part 1

Presented to Edlesborough Annual Parish Meeting by Kevin Cubbage on Thurs 21st April 2011

This is my first report as Chairman and covers the period April 2010 – March 2011. I am trying hard to continue **Mrs Anne Thompson's** sterling work, who was our Chairman for the past 11 years and who, despite tremendous will power and courage, lost her fight for life on 9th October 2010. She will be greatly missed not only for her concern and input to the Parish as a whole, but especially by the many people and organisations she supported in her village of Dagnall.

Anne always took great pleasure in preparing and presenting her Annual Reports. She was so proud of the work that all the Councillors and Clerks did on behalf of all the parishioners.

A great deal of this work involves looking after the day to day amenities which many of us take for granted. In the past year, for example, over £8,000 was spent on **street lighting**, which after the cost of paying for the Clerk, Hall Manager and Caretaker, was the Council's single biggest item of expenditure.

Your Council takes a special interest in ensuring that **Edlesborough Green** lives up to its reputation as our "jewel in the crown", and which provides so much pleasure and recreational interest for so many parishioners. A net £6,400 was spent on maintaining it and the playground during the year. This included the provision of larger, green litter bins located on the road-side of the Green so that they can be emptied by AVDC's weekly refuse collection. I should like to take this opportunity of thanking the small and dedicated group of volunteers who have given so much of their time over the years in emptying the old, small yellow bins, and who still carry out a regular litter-pick on the Green.


Although the **Pavilion** on Edlesborough Green is well used by the Tennis Club and football teams, it continues to be a drain on our limited resources. This is due to excessive maintenance and repairs caused by it being used as a 'kick wall' and some wanton vandalism. In addition to on-going net expenditure of £2,700 during the year, a further £3,500 has been invested in the provision of 3 more seats and paved area. Not only will this provide more seating, but it will also help deter the front of the pavilion being used as a kick wall and the consequent repeated damage to the roof and guttering. I am disappointed that the Council's endeavours to develop a more meaningful and economic future for this facility have yet to generate any real interest with residents – and especially the users of the Pavilion.

Very much through the endeavours of Beverley Sage, the Hall Manager, **Edlesborough Memorial Hall** enjoyed its highest ever income of £11,000, which went a long way towards covering higher than normal expenditure of £16,000, due to some £5,000 being spent on new boilers and internal redecoration. This net cost of £5,000 should be seen in the context of the annual donations of £1,500 the Council gives to each of the **Hall Management Committees** at **Dagnall** and **Northall** to help them run their Halls and to help towards the cost of maintaining their playgrounds.

During the year the Council and the Police have had many complaints from residents in Edlesborough regarding the antisocial and most unpleasant behaviour of a minority

of dog owners who do not clear-up their dogs' mess. All council tax payers should be aware that £3,400 of their money was spent on the provision and emptying of **dog hygiene bins** through out the Parish during the year. Everyone should help to ensure that this expenditure is worthwhile by encouraging all dog owners to use these bins. Other significant areas of expenditure during the year included:

- £2,500 on the grass cutting and maintenance of **Edlesborough Churchyard**, helping to make this most important, historic site so attractive. Although the Churches Conservation Trust is responsible for Edlesborough Church, it does not have the funds to look after the grounds.
- £1,900 on the **Parish Cemetery**, which was almost covered by burial fees of £1,750. During the year further progress has been made in developing the lawned cemetery.



• £1,500 to **EDaN** (the Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall Parish Plan) to help towards implementing some of its projects. This brings the total of the Council's contributions to date to £12,745. EDaN itself has been very industrious and successful in raising net funds of a further £11,543.

Before leaving this financial overview I should also mention that the **Precept** (the money that Edlesborough Parish Council receives from the Parish's council tax payers), for next year has been held at the same level of £64,000 as for 2010/11.

Apart from doing everything possible to obtain best value out of its financial expenditure, the Council also spends a great deal of its time on policy matters. No where is this more true than on **traffic calming** where its endeavours to improve safety and quality of life scored a notable success in 2010. After 13 years of campaigning and lobbying, Bucks County Council finally agreed to reduce speed limits in Northall, between Northall and Edlesborough and the entry roads around the Travellers Rest roundabouts. Northall residents are to be congratulated for the way in which they worked together to demonstrate their support to BCC for the proposals, and which no doubt helped to influence the decision makers.

I realise that Dagnall residents must still be wondering what has happened to the longed for **build out** at the entrance to the village on the Dunstable Road. This project has stumbled from lack of funding from BCC, to the engineers then finding that there is insufficient road space, then to the possibility of a traffic island, which was also then ruled out because of lack of road space, and then most recently, a proposal for a pedestrian crossing. This latest proposal is still being subjected to various safety audits so that the precise location of the crossing can be established. In the meantime, the good news is that the 'Local Area Forum' of BCC has agreed that this project is a priority and that adequate funding has been made available.

Come along, sign up for Dog Watch and receive a goodie bag. Micro chipping, grooming and flea treatment will also be available for your dog at reduced prices.

Aylesbury Vale Community Safety Update

Recorded serious acquisitive crime in the district during April 2010 and March 2011 has fallen by 21.4 per cent against the previous year, a reduction of 341 crimes, according to the latest statistics. There were large reductions in theft from a motor vehicle, from 797 to 595 (25.3 per cent fall) and robbery from 89 to 65 (27 per cent). Theft of a motor vehicle dropped from 194 to 191 (1.5 per cent). There was also a significant decrease in domestic burglaries, down from 511 to 399 (21.9 per cent) from 2009/2010.

All crime, which incorporates every single recorded crime in Aylesbury Vale was reduced by 8.7 per cent.





The Met Office has recorded the warmest April on record and, here in the Dagnall area, we can certainly confirm that. The "mean temperature" was 12.2°c, which is almost 4 degrees higher than the average of the last few years (8.9°c). The lowest temperature was only 0.7°c; it was a very unusual month. It was, again, very dry with only 16.4 mm (0.65 ins) of rain, which makes the total rainfall for the months of March and April, 22.8 mm (0.9 ins); which compares to a recent average of 89.8 mm (3.54 ins). To show you how warm it was, the plot below looks at the week beginning 19th April 2011, and the corresponding week in April 2010,



Not lah-di-da French cuisine, but two good basic dishes that have been part of home cooking for such a long time that - for the English - the first French cuisine dish that comes to mind is probably Boeuf Bourguignon.

I am sure that we will come to the coq au vin details soon but in the meantime, although you can find many Boeuf Bourguignon recipes, what many of them do not mention (but that all good French cooks know) is that the two paramount tricks for this dish are:

- 1. Use good quality **full bodied** red wine preferably French of course. It need not cost the earth. You can find a bottle for roughly £5 to £6.
- 2. Resist the temptation to use diced beef from the meat shelf. Go to your local butcher and ask for **chuck beef**. Not only is it more appropriate for a long stew, but also its higher fat content will add extra flavour to your dish.
