



- AVDC will remove obscene and offensive graffiti from AVDC property in view of a highway, road signs and telecom boxes.
- The Parish council will remove graffiti from bus shelters in villages.

Tomorrow, June 11th, I'm off to Church Farm. Ardeley for the official launch of the Hertfordshire FCN (Farm Crisis Network) group. It has taken 2 years to get to this point and as coordinator of the group I'm really looking forward to the event. If you've not lost interest already you may be asking yourself what I'm talking about. Well, this is the other side of me, the Agricultural Chaplain, the farmer's daughter who would love to have some sheep, a saddleback pig or two and a cow in the vicarage garden. Sadly I have to make do with pigeons and grey squirrels. The compensation is the vegetable patch currently infested with horse radish, bindweed and couch grass but the beans, herbs and assorted green salad leaves are



fighting back and there is a promising crop on the fruit trees and blackcurrant bushes. What is Farm Crisis Network?

Farm Crisis Network (FCN) is a network of groups of volunteers drawn from the farming community and rural churches, ready to walk with farming people and families as they seek to resolve their problems. The last few years have seen some of the biggest changes in agriculture for decades. Major change is always difficult bringing strain and anxiety, other problems include: animal disease (foot and mouth, bluetongue and TB), debt, bereavement, stress, relationships, loneliness, inheritance, crop failure, low product prices, increasing bureaucracy and form filling. FCN supports over 1000 families every year

The villages of this Benefice, Dagnall, Northall, Edlesborough and Eaton Bray are surrounded by beautiful countryside. Walking just a little of the Benefice boundary on Rogation Sunday the group was aware of crops growing, of livestock in the fields and the beauty and order of the countryside cared for by those who work in agriculture. We do not know what difficulties the farmers are facing in our rural communities but farming matters. Farming matters because food production matters and farming matters because the environment matters, not just to us but to the whole world.

Chairman & Treasurers Report - May 2011

This has been another year of significant projects. In last year's report, we had received a grant for the first stage of our village hall development plan. We got the final approval from Thames Water in June and started the building work immediately. This first stage saw the completion of the side extension providing much needed and accessible storage for all of our hall users. The kitchen has also been extended but as you will see more work is needed and that requires more funds. I would like to thank John Thompson for all his work on this project and particularly the incredible value for money that we received.

Unfortunately we have also seen the "not so nice side of things" in the village with two thefts from the village hall. The cost of repairs, the cost of replacing the stolen oil and the need for additional security all adds to our costs. You will notice that bollards have now been installed in the entrance and there a number of people in the village who organise for these to be lowered and raised helping to stop crime from a number of directions.

On a brighter note we have placed new flower beds and maintenance of the village hall grounds is being done on a regular basis. Many thanks to Michelle, Josh and others for keeping it looking so nice.

On finances, our income was noticeably down on the previous year (38% lower at \pounds 5508) with costs also decreasing (12% lower at \pounds 8289). Some of the income reduction is due to timing with around \pounds 440 due to be paid in after the accounts were closed. Not having a full fete and stopping the Dagnall dip last year also made a big dent in the numbers. The decision to stop the Dagnall Dip in favour of a new 100 Club draw was agreed during the year. The major advantages to this will be considerably less effort for the dip sellers and a larger more guaranteed income stream. The new 100 club started in April but accounts for this will not show till the 2011/12 financial year. Our major project this year was funded by the Community Chest AVDC. The sum of £20,000 was provided to fund the first phase of our development plan and construction of the new extension was completed at a cost of £19,671.

The final position on funds held by the Village Hall is £4214.02. This is made up of cash: £130.22 main bank account £3133.58 and Sports & Recreation: £950.22.

I would particularly like to thank the elected officers Sharon Quinn and Liz Coates and the other members of the committee for their support this last year, as I have not been able to support them as much as I would have liked.

I would also like to confirm that I am standing down as Chairman and Treasurer and I am pleased to announce that at the AGM on 24 May 2011, Gary Holloway was elected Chairman and Pascale Searle was elected Treasurer.

Many thanks to everyone else who has supported us during the year and we look forward to your continued support and more successes in the coming year.

Highlights Of The Meeting For Eaton Bray Parish Council

Held in The Coffee Tavern on Monday 6th June 2011 at 7:30pm CENTRAL BEDFORDSHIRE

Michelle Flynn, the Rights of Way Officer (Central South) for Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) attended the meeting. She went through the current CBC procedures for the seasonal contracts for Rights of Way within the area and asked if the Parish Council wished to have more involvement within the scheduling/cutting of the rights of way. The Parish Council agreed to look at this in more detail and asked for further information on CBC's current costs/schedules for this area. The Parish Council also raised concerns regarding the general grass cutting within the parish and asked if the relevant section at CBC could contact the Parish Council to discuss further.

Ward Cllr. Marion Mustoe attended the meeting and confirmed that the Paddocks planning application would be going to committee on the 22nd June next. The Parish Council requested that a site visit be made to this location due to a number of concerns. The Parish Council were updated on the current situation on the potential development in Bower Lane and were informed that the inspector report for Central Beds (South) has been challenged as to the content of the strategy; therefore the core strategy covering development within this region of Central Beds has potentially been moved back to 2012-2013. Cllr Mustoe confirmed that the Bedfordshire Music Centres are to remain, full details to be published on the parish website.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

Potential Development - Bower Lane/Harling Road to Mill End Close: The Parish Council wished to thank everyone who took the time and trouble to complete and return the questionnaire. A feedback report can be found on the Parish Council's website.

Recreation Ground Improvements: The painting teams are now organised in preparation for the work in School Lane and The Rye play areas.

Height Barrier: The Height Barrier and Chain Link Fence at The Rye Recreation Ground have now been replaced.

Edlesborough Parish Council Chairman's Report - Part 2

Presented to Edlesborough Annual Parish Meeting on Thurs 21st April 2011 The first part of this report was included in the June 2011 issue of Focus.

I should like to thank the **EDaN Traffic Management** team for their continuing work on traffic calming, and especially the 100 hours their volunteers spent on operating the Council's 'Speed Watch' radar equipment over the past year. Following a recent, and very well attended, meeting in Edlesborough Memorial Hall, the Team has been boosted by a further **27** volunteers. After appropriate training, they will operate 'Speed Watch' in Northall, Dagnall and Edlesborough whenever they have a couple of hours to spare. Three volunteers are needed to operate the equipment so that all the data on speed, type and colour of vehicle, sex and approximate age of the driver can be accurately recorded and given to the police. In the last 2 weeks of March over 50 drivers were reported to the police for exceeding 45mph in Northall, with one car recorded at 69mph.

This monitoring and surveillance work will become even more important when the new, reduced speed limits are introduced this summer and drivers through our villages are suitably encouraged to comply.

On behalf of the Council, and indeed all parishioners, I should like to place on record our very grateful thanks and appreciation for the splendid work being carried out by the EDeN Steering Crown and all the other EDeN teams:

the EDaN Steering Group and all the other EDaN teams:

• the **Beautifying the Villages** team, who have made such a wonderful contribution with their planters around all 3 villages, the inaugural 'May Day' fund raising event last year on the Green and the unveiling of the excellent, new Edlesborough village sign. We are all now anxious to see similar village signs for Northall and Dagnall that should be in place by the Autumn of this year.

To complement the team's work, and the new surfacing, the Council is replacing the existing decrepit and unsightly 'hangman's gate' at the entrance to the bridleway from Edlesborough Church to Ivinghoe Aston. To help ensure that horse riders and pedestrians always have good access to the bridleway, appropriate new signs will also be installed.



- the **Transportation** team who continue to fight the cause for maintaining, or even improving, our vital bus links with local towns. In the meantime, they have established the **Community Car Scheme** and have made a wonderful start in attracting so many volunteer car owners to help provide lifts for residents on local journeys to shops, doctors' surgery etc..
- the **Cycleways, Pavements and Footpaths** team, the outcome of whose work over the past 2 years will begin to be seen over the coming months.
- the **Post Codes** team who are tenaciously fighting their way through the Post Office bureaucracy and procedures to enable householders in the parish to have Edlesborough in their address rather than the historic Eaton Bray.

EDaN also organised 2 concerts last year at St Mary's Church in Edlesborough, not only to raise funds, but also to encourage parishioners to appreciate the church as part of our rich architectural heritage. The Churches Conservation Trust is delighted that we are now making more use of this historic building and are giving us every encouragement to continue. So, please make a note that the next classical music concert is being held on Saturday 16th July 2011, and is entitled "Beauties of the Baroque".

EDaN is certainly more than living up to our original expectations, especially with the way in which it has encouraged so many willing and enthusiastic volunteers to become involved in helping to shape and improve our community.

Another important area of our policy work concerns giving the Council's response to AVDC on **Planning Applications**. Over the past year some 39 applications have been carefully considered, with 'The Bell' being the most publicised, and arguably, the one which has attracted most interest in Edlesborough. The Council has given every possible support and advice to the 'Save the Bell' campaign. After much correspondence and two AVDC Planning Committee meetings, we have yet to learn whether we have provided sufficient planning reasons for the application to build 2 houses in the car park to be rejected.

The Council's experience on planning matters over many years will be put to good use when it becomes directly involved in developing its **Neighbourhood Plan** over the coming months as part of the Government's new 'Localism Bill', and AVDC's new 'Vale of Aylesbury Plan'.

The Council is literally inundated on a weekly basis with **policy and consultative papers** from AVDC, BCC and a myriad of other organisations which have, or could have, a bearing on the lives of parishioners. Much unseen work is therefore undertaken by Councillors in reviewing these documents and submitting the Council's views and comments.

Car parking in the High Street outside the school, and around the junction with Pebblemoor has long been a problem. Over recent months the Council has been pleased to work with the school, its 'safer routes to school' team, Under5s, Bucks CC and the police to try and improve the situation. Towards that end it has recently carried out a small extension to the car park on The Green and formed a new pedestrian exit onto the High Street. At the time of writing this report, a guard rail on the pedestrian exit remains to be constructed before the exit and the car park spaces are then clearly marked out.

However, the Council recognises that considerably more car parking capacity is required and is therefore planning to construct a major extension. This would almost double the number of spaces from the recently increased 29 to a total of 55. This project is being viewed as a top priority and the required funding of some £32,000 will be secured as soon as possible. Subject to obtaining various approvals it is hoped that work could commence within the next 12 months.

In this report I have only had the space to comment on some of the key issues. However, much of the Council's work also concerns the daily grind through so many other matters which are, or could be, of concern to parishioners. For all of this unrelenting, steadfast commitment to duty I am most grateful to our **Clerk, Lin Sargeant** and to my fellow Councillors:

- John Wilkinson, who represents the Edlesborough Ward, who is our Vice-Chairman, Chair of our General Purposes Committee (GPC) and who also takes the lead role in assessing all planning applications for Council's decisions.
- **David Brown**, (Edlesborough Ward). Unfortunately, David has decided to stepdown from being a Councillor at the forthcoming May AGM. He has been on the Council since 2003, and has always made a very valuable and substantial contribution, especially during his time as Chairman of the GPC.
- Marilyn Prys-Jones (Edlesborough Ward), who is Vice Chairman of the GPC
- Alan Williams, (Edlesborough Ward), who is Chair of the EDaN Steering Group and a member of the GPC.
- Julie Ratheram (Edlesborough Ward).
- Mark Wilson (Northall Ward).
- Dagnall Ward: unfortunately, since Anne Thompson's death we have had no representatives. However, we hope that this situation will change at the forthcoming May election.

Information from Citizens Advice Bureau Default Retirement Age to be Abolished



The government has confirmed that the default retirement age (DRA) of 65 will be abolished from 1 October 2011 with phasing-in beginning in April.

Currently, an employer can lawfully retire an employee aged 65 or above provided the employer follows a set procedure, requiring the employer to give at least six months' notice of retirement to the employee. If the procedure is followed, then dismissal for retirement at age 65 will not be unfair or age discrimination. If the normal retirement age for the job is under 65, then provided the employer can justify the lower retirement age and follows the same set procedure, any dismissal for retirement will again not be unfair and will not be age discrimination.

Under the changes, the last day employees can be compulsorily retired using the DRA is 30 September 2011. From 1 October 2011 no employee can be compulsorily retired by an employer because they have reached the age of 65, unless that retirement can be objectively justified. So the last day to provide the six months' notice required by the DRA provisions was therefore 30 March 2011.

ACAS has also issued guidance which outlines the changes and provides advice on how employers and employees can manage both the transition stages and new procedure. The guidance (available on the ACAS website at www.acas.org.uk) covers practical issues for employers in managing older workers and also issues such as succession and workforce planning, performance management and ensuring consistency and fairness in their policies and practices.

The changes will apply to all employers and all company sizes and sectors. However, individual employers will still be able to operate a compulsory retirement age provided

that they can objectively justify it. The Department for Business, Innovation and Skills gives air traffic controllers and police officers as examples of where this might be the case.

These changes do not affect employees' state pension age and entitlements, which may well be different from the age at which they retire.

NHS Charges in England

From 1 April 2011, the charge for an NHS prescription increases by 20p per item, to $\pounds 7.40$.

Dental treatment charges increase by 3 per cent to $\pounds 17.00$, $\pounds 47.00$ and $\pounds 204.00$ for Bands 1, 2 and 3 respectively.

Optical voucher values remain unchanged.

National Minimum Wage: New Rates

From 1 October the new rates of the national minimum wage will be as follows:-

the adult rate will increase from £5.93 to £6.08 an hour

the rate for 18-20 year olds will increase from £4.92 to £4.98 an hour

the rate for 16-17 year olds will increase from £3.64 to £3.68 an hour, and

the rate for apprentices will increase from £2.50 to £2.60 an hour.

Tax Credit Renewals

Tax credits claimants need to renew their claims by the 31 July deadline. If they do not, their payments may stop and they may receive notice of an overpayment. Renewal packs are being sent out between April and July. Last year, over five hundred thousand households did not renew by the due date and subsequently had their payments stopped. Around half of these were subsequently sent notice of an overpayment.

HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) is now running its annual media campaign to remind people to renew as soon as they receive the packs. The campaign includes national and regional TV and radio advertisements and press releases. For the first time, it includes the use of Twitter. Bureaux that use Twitter may wish to follow HMRC (@HMRCGovUK) and re-tweet its tax credit renewal tweets.

Tax credits: Treatment of Increases in Income

In the tax year 2011/12, if your income goes up by more than £10,000 since the previous tax year, the amount of tax credits that you get for the current year will be reduced. Increases in income of £10,000 or less will not normally affect your tax credits for the current year, although they will be taken into account in the following year. A tax year runs from 6 April one year to 5 April the next.

Previously, the disregard for income increases was £25,000.

Any increase in income of more than £10,000 should be reported to the Tax Credit

Office straightaway, in order to prevent an overpayment building up in the current year, which will have to be paid back. It is also advisable to report an increase of less than £10,000, to prevent an overpayment arising in the following year.





Table Corner and the Joys of Coulis

Mr Searle will tell you - and many of you may be surprised by this - that I absolutely hate shopping. Even food shopping. The main reason is that, perhaps due to the decadence of shopping on line, when I am sent to a shop by necessity I absolutely cannot find a single item. Well this happened again last week when pushed for time and thinking I absolutely had to have something called raspberry coulis ready within the next hour, I rushed to one of our large superstores only to end fruitlessly (!) after walking kilometres through the aisles, to the information desk, and asking 2 assistants who had no idea as to what coulis might be. I gave up by saying to myself, "don't worry I will make it myself!" I had by then wasted longer than it would actually have taken me to make the said coulis, as it is one of the easiest recipes you will find. All you need is a saucepan, a sieve and the ingredients below.

Ingredients

1 kg raspberries

200g caster sugar (or a little more according to the fruit's sweetness and personal preference)



Well, you might say, but what do you use coulis for?

In our case we use it a lot as a topping for cakes – cheesecakes especially. It tastes wonderful on vanilla ice cream and also teams up nicely with chocolate cake. A drizzle on waffles has never gone amiss in the Searle household and my daughter simply helps herself to it by spoonfuls.

One extra use it has (and your guests will be very impressed with this) is to decorate plates. Once you have the coulis strained as indicated below, keep on simmering it, stirring on a gentle heat until it becomes thicker and has more or less reduced by half. You can then decorate your plate with artistic flourishes, a little bit like paint.

Method

Place raspberries and sugar into a saucepan and heat over medium setting, stirring often, until the fruit starts to bubble. Reduce the heat and simmer for 5 minutes or until the raspberries are soft. Remove from heat and allow to cool. Then press them through a sieve to strain to a smooth consistency. Don't be tempted to liquidise the pulp in a blender as the seeds are a little bitter and will destroy the clean fresh taste of the fruit. It will keep for 2 days in the fridge and up to 6 months in a freezer. Et voila! A refreshing item for the summer!



Dagnall Weather Station (AONB) Weather Conditions for May 2011

May turned out to be a warm and windy month with a higher than average wind speed reaching gusts of 39 mph.

Although there was more rain than the previous months (33.6 mm), it was not enough for gardeners and farmers. The ground was already dry at the start of May, which was made worse by the strong winds, high temperatures and sunny days. They combined to produce evaporation levels of 0.80 mm/hr.

The Met Office recorded the country's driest spring for 20 years. I've used their data to compare against the records for Dagnall.

East Anglia was the driest district in the UK with just 28.1 mm of rain, only 21% of the long-term average. The lack of rain in East Anglia made it the driest for 101 years, beating the previous record of 51.9 mm in 1996.

*The meteorological spring is the combined months of March, April and May.
