St Mary's Village Carnival 2011

Don't you just love Carnival Day? To see our villages decorated in such a colourful way, with thousands of people flocking to Edlesborough Green in almost perfect weather to enjoy the most relaxed and pleasant of afternoons!

At the very end of the day I spoke to four youngsters, average ten or eleven. They told me they had had a brilliant afternoon and, as I wrote in the Carnival programme, that is all we can hope to achieve – that our children will grow up having fond memories of the villages from which they came, and remember St Mary's Village Carnival with pride.

For, first and foremost, St Mary's Village Carnival has become an event for the whole community; there is a huge involvement by residents of the villages and I want to say a profound 'Thank you' to



Our Carnival has grown to become one of the largest events of its kind in the country; run entirely by volunteers to raise money for local good causes. This year there were over 150 stalls of all kinds and we saw one of the biggest processions in recent years with around 40 vehicles including nine floats dressed to the Carnival theme of 'Pirates'. Judging of the floats, by Rev Coralie McCluskey, must have been incredibly difficult for, as well as ships loaded with pirates, the floats included the whole cast of Peter Pan (with pirates led by Captain Hook) and modern day Somali pirates attacking a family cruising the oceans. Results of the procession were:

- Lower School: 1st Edlesborough U5s, 2nd Eaton Bray Academy, 3rd Totternhoe Lower School
- Middle School: 1st 1st Eaton Bray & Edlesborough Cubs, 2nd Edlesborough School, 3rd - 2nd Eaton Bray Brownies
- Adult Groups: 1st GIFT, 2nd Cats Protection Society, 3rd Janes

One of the features of the Carnival is the way so many households dress their houses with balloons, bunting and to the theme of the event – it is a joy to walk or drive through the villages. This year the standard for the prize of Best Dressed House was very, very high and there were at least 15 houses in contention for the prizes. Trophies, donated by Ben Wright, of Edlesborough Autos, were awarded to 44-46 High St Edlesborough and 39 Moor End, Eaton Bray, with commendations to the runners up – 9 The Green, Edlesborough and 9 High St, Eaton Bray as well as to Buds of May and Janes.

The star prize winners at the Carnival were all local including the winners of 'A weekend for two in Rome' won by Martin Christmas, a beautifully carved statue created by our chainsaw carver, Dan Cordell, won by Mavis Purcell and a cheque for £152.50 to B S King the winner of Clarabelle.



I can only guess how much money is brought into the villages as a result of the event. The Carnival Committee expects to have raised a similar total to last year – in the region of 12 to 13 thousand pounds, which in the present economic climate is a fantastic result; beneficiaries of this sum will include St Mary's Church, the Hospice of St Francis, Berkhamsted, and Weatherfield School, Dunstable, plus many local good causes. In addition to the money raised by the Carnival Committee, maybe another £30,000 would have been raised by stall holders, much of which will come back to





the local community. If your organisation could benefit from a donation from the money raised by the Carnival Committee please contact me, for example by writing to me via the website – www.stmarysvillagecarnival.co.uk.

The success of the day depends on so many people, but none more so than the excellent Carnival Committee for whom I have nothing but praise and admiration. They work together as a great team, turning their hand to whatever needs to be done – as a result many visitors comment on the Carnival's outstanding organisation. As you may be aware four experienced members of the committee are retiring this year. If you feel you could contribute to the Carnival Committee please get in touch with me on 220136.

You may feel that being on the Committee is too much but that you would be prepared to do some small task at next year's Carnival. Here are a few examples of some of the many easy tasks you could volunteer to help with:

- Organise the banners get the date changed, put them up two weeks before Carnival and bring them in afterwards.
- Organise the printing of posters and stick the posters onto boards.
- Get onto The Green by 6.30am on Carnival morning to erect two tents then take them down again mid-afternoon.
- Selling Grand Draw tickets to people in your neighbourhood.
- Make cakes for the Cake Stall and / or Tea Tent

It takes hundreds of people to make our Carnival the success it is. Please get in touch with me if you would like to be involved.

My final words once again are 'Thank You' to everyone in this wonderful community in which we live for enabling a very special event.

Carnival

A roof will be put on the dustbin area of the Cemetery to prevent water from getting into the bins which, on numerous occasions, get so full that lids are unable to be put back on, 2 new bins have been put in this area in an attempt to ease the problem.

You Know it Makes Sense

Traditionally, drink-driving is primarily thought of as a seasonal problem at Christmas but actually nearly a third of road traffic collisions involving drink-drivers in Bedfordshire occur during the summer months. To promote safe drink-driving this summer, Central Bedfordshire Council is working in partnership across the county to highlight this important message.

Drink driving statistics

The legal alcohol limit for driving is 35 micrograms per 100ml of breath, or 80 milligrams per 100ml of blood.

One unit of alcohol equals one of the following: -

- One half-pint of 'normal' strength beer, lager or cider (3-4% by volume)
- One small glass of wine (100-125ml)
- One measure of sherry or port (50ml)
- One standard measure of spirits.

Motorists who have been drinking the night before may also still be under the influence the next morning. The exact time it takes for alcohol to leave the body depends on the individual's gender, age, state of health, tiredness, weight, amount of food eaten, and other factors.

Causing death by careless driving whilst under the influence of alcohol can result in a prison term of up to 14 years. Even being in charge of a vehicle with excess alcohol could result in a prison sentence of up to three months, a driving ban and a fine of up to £2,500.



A History of Dagnall Village

An extract from the publication 'A history of Dagnall Village' courtesy of Geoff Spencer and Dagnall School, published in 1999

LATE 19TH CENTURY

Around the turn of the century, Dagnall was still a comparatively isolated village. The majority of the villagers worked within the vicinity of the village, either on the land or within their own homes.

The roads were little more than cart tracks which meant in winter the village became even more isolated as these extracts from the school log indicate:

"Owing to the winter coming on two children who live at Whipsnade and one who lives at Wards have been withdrawn from school for the Winter."

"Owing to the severe state of the weather the children have been prevented from attending school."

"Attendance is worse than on Monday last, the roads are flooded from side to side."

"Owing to the severe snowstorm today only a few children came to school, the school has therefore closed for the day."

The village was however, more self contained. In the 1880's there were quite a number of shops and trades, viz.

Milk was collected from the farms and meat was delivered by the Butchers from adjacent villages.

The village plaiting school had now ceased to function. Those still wishing to learn had to go to the plait school in Edlesborough. The cottage industry of straw plaiting was now a dying trade, although being continued by some of the older villagers.

Working on the land was the predominant occupation at the time, although a sizeable number of villagers were working at the Brewery owned by the Batchelor Brothers.

Lord Brownlow owned all the buildings on the Ashridge side of Hemel Hempstead Road apart from the Methodist Chapel, the Golden Rule Public House and the Red Lion The buildings on the other side between the Vicarage (later the Hollies, now Crossways) and the Allotment Gardens were owned by the Batchelor Brothers. Here lived IAMES and IANE BATCHELOR adjacent to the brewery itself. Behind the brewery and along Malting Lane was the Malt House, Piggeries and Cottages for those working in the brewery. At the corner of Studham Lane another building (now Three Counties Cottage) was also part of the brewery and connected to it by a pipe line. In Malting Lane there was a small private chapel built by John Batchelor, who apparently didn't see eye to eye with either the Church of England or the Methodists, and where he preached his own sermons. John Batchelor lived with his sister DORCAS in a large house on the north end of the village which he

called The Rectory (now Colliers). He is remembered as a likeable yet eccentric character.

In 1882 he opened a building in his garden which he called a 'Church Public House' or 'Travellers Rest'. Over the door were the words 'Free to All'.

At eight o'clock each evening the doors were opened and passing tramps were provided with a bed of straw for the night. The lobby contained benches and tables but the only liquid refreshments available was water. However, free beer was

available the following morning at the brewery when the tramps resumed their travels.

When his sister died he had her buried in his garden. Later when he had his leg amputated in a London Hospital he brought it home with him and buried that as well. As he said at the time on "Resurrection Morning he didn't want to go hopping around on one leg".

He had his coffin made several years before he died and installed it in his

house in an upright position, fitted it with shelves and used it as a cupboard.

Old villagers remember him being pushed through the village in his bath chair when they were children. He would always stop and give them a sweet and expect them to give him a kiss. He died on 4th September 1911 aged 77. His sister was exhumed from his garden under a licence by the Home Secretary, Winston Churchill dated 5/9/11, and they were both buried at New Mill Baptist Chapel in grave number 17 on 7th September, 1911.

Opposite the Brewery was (and still is) Cross Keys Farm owned by William Twidell. This was also a Public House and small Brewery. Brewing was usually only carried out once a fortnight and sufficient beer was made for sale at Cross Keys and for sale in barrels to the farmers of the surrounding villages. By tradition farmers were expected to keep their men well supplied with beer when working in the fields. "Twidells Beer" seems to have been much preferred by the locals to that made in Batchelors Dagnall Brewery.

William Twidell was something of a local businessman. He was involved in the Carrier trade, known locally as Going the Road. This was regular traffic of horse drawn waggons along Hempstead Road up to London carrying hay and straw for the stables. The following day they would return with horse manure from the London Mews. Twidell also had a trade in supplying galvanised water tanks which his carter brought back from London. There being no mains water supply, rainwater was collected from the roofs to augment that which was collected from the wells.

In addition to the Public Houses in Hempstead Road there was also THE BELL (now Bethshan) run by DAVID WHITMAN. This was at Pound Bank. There were 32 cottages in this part of the village. At Pound Bank, along Studham Lane and at the beginning of Whipsnade Road and Whipsnade Lane. Whipsnade Lane was known locally as Lucy's Lane, LUCY MAUNDERS living here with her brother TOMMY MAUNDERS in a pretty thatched cottage called THE ROBBIN HOOD at the beginning of the lane.

Whipsnade Road and Lucy's Lane curved round Dagnall Hill and Holly Frindle to the village of Whipsnade. This was common land and a very picturesque part of the village, abundant with wild flowers and shrubs. Alas, it was all cleared with the coming of the Zoo

Between the Malting Lane cottages and Studham Lane Cottages was an area of open fields, an orchard and a house associated with the kennels. The North Bucks Harriers having moved to Dagnall in 1877.

The Dagnall Branch of the Good Intent Lodge of the Manchester Unity of Odd Fellows was a thriving lodge not only of Dagnall workers but also of those from surrounding villages. It held regular meetings and provided sick pay to its members when they were off work

The Secretary James Jones was known locally as Sunset Jones. One of the rules of the club was that if you were drawing sick pay you had to be indoors after sunset. Jones was a stickler for the rules, so any member drawing sick pay and visiting one of the pubs in the evening with his mates, had to keep a good lookout for Sunset Jones.

Only those in regular work however could afford to belong to sick clubs. The uninsured had to rely for treatment under the Poor Law.

The old Poor Law Act laid down that each Parish was responsible for the maintenance of its own poor. Overseers of the Poor were to be nominated annually and a Poor Rate levied upon the inhabitants. In 1834 the labour-rate system was introduced whereby farmers must either employ out-of-work labourers on their land or help pay towards their upkeep.

Parish Relief, however was not easy to get and apparently was looked upon as a last resort. The village was largely self sufficient and most villagers had family connections with other members of the village. So in times of hardship they tended to help each other.

Most people had a piece of land or an allotment where they could grow their own vegetables. A lot of them had chickens. The eggs being for their own use and for sale to the egg man. The children were pressed into service on such jobs as collecting wood for the fire, gathering acorns to feed the family pig or for sale, picking blackberries, etc. At harvest times there was always work to be had in the fields and a variety of seasonal jobs on the Ashridge Estate.

It was the custom at harvest time that once the farmer had removed the last stook of

corn from the field the women and children could 'glean' it for the remaining grain. Having threshed it at home they would take it to the mill to be ground. Families could get sufficient flour this way to keep them in bread for several months.

Although labourers worked long hours, their wages were very low. Dawn to Dusk in winter and 6am to 6pm in summer, six days a week.



Regeneration By Pat Barker

Siegfried Sassoon is a well known poet, noted mainly for his First World War poetry. What is not widely known however, is that in 1917 he made a declaration in writing, making clear his doubts as a serving officer as



to the motives behind the continuance of the war. The letter and its subsequent reading in Parliament caused an outcry, putting Sassoon in danger of a court martial. To avoid this and because of his heroic war record, doubts were raised as to his state of mind and he was sent to a military psychiatric hospital in Scotland for assessment. There, at Craiglockhart, he was put in the care of W.H. Rivers, a psychologist, given the task of convincing his patient that his duty is to return to the front.

Pat Barker has written a fictionalised account of this event in Sassoon's life and her novel is a powerful evocation of the effects of battle upon the human psyche. We see Rivers struggle with his conscience as he tries to heal the minds of traumatised young men in order for them to be sent back to the battlefields to face death again. His feelings towards Sassoon become almost paternal as he gradually understands more about the young poet and his denunciation of the war that he has fought in so bravely. As he hears more of the experiences of Sassoon and the other men being treated for their mental disorders he begins to empathise with them, making it even more difficult for him to perform what he regards as his duty. The story introduces other themes; homosexuality being treated as an illness, or being hidden and the difficulties of class within the military hierarchy.

The evening that we discussed this book as a group was very rewarding. The narrative, although dealing with very serious issues, was extremely fluent, drawing in the reader inexorably and, as the various stories of the officers unfolded, we became eager to know what became of them. Regeneration is complete in itself, despite being the first book in a trilogy. We all thought that the book was an excellent choice for a group discussion.

News from the Lions Den

Firstly, we must say a sincere thank you to everybody who came along to see us at the Edlesborough carnival on 2nd July. It was our first 'public' event and we were made very welcome. We are delighted that so many of you came to say 'hello' and enjoyed our games. It was a milestone moment for this proposed new club to hand over our star prize of dinner for 4 at the Doubletree by Hilton when the winning ticket was pulled from the Treasure Island board!

In total we raised an impressive £190.00 from the day – every penny Lions earn is donated back into local causes and this new club will be no different!

The proposed club has decided to make it's first donation to the Medical Detection Dogs in memory of a former Lion who sadly passed away earlier this year after a short battle with cancer.

Dogs are renowned for their sense of smell. For centuries doctors have know diseases have characteristic odours which, dogs may be able to detect. Cancer cells release small amounts of volatile substances. Cancer Detection Dogs are being trained to detect these volatiles, it is hoped that this work and research will enable scientists to develop an early cancer screening system.

Medical Alert Dogs are trained to assist individuals who manage complex medical conditions on a day to day basis. Dogs are taught to identify the odour changes that are associated with certain medical events. For example for someone living with diabetes, hypoglycaemia (low blood sugar) or the avoidance of it can be a daily problem. Symptoms can vary from confusion, seizures to comas and be life threatening. Medical Alert Dogs are trained to recognise blood sugar levels outside the normal range. Dogs, once trained, can warn and get help before the symptoms are felt. They will bring their owner any necessary medical supplies such as glucose and blood testing kits and get help if necessary. They can also be trained to push alarm buttons.

Medical Detection Dogs provide alert dogs for those with other very dangerous health conditions including Addisonian crisis which causes severe pain, convulsions and unconsciousness. Pain seizures which lead to collapse and hospitalisation. Narcolepsy, a malfunction of the sleep/wake regulating system which causes sleep attacks and paralysis.

They are continuing to investigate other debilitating and potentially fatal conditions which dogs may have the ability to help with. These include severe allergic responses and migraines proving dogs really can be 'man's best friend'!

We are hoping to organise a presentation evening in the autumn to include a talk from the Medical Detection Dogs Team and perhaps a meeting with some of the dogs themselves. Full information will be circulated closer to the date once final details have been confirmed.

It was incredible to see how many of you got into the carnival spirit and decorated your houses — we don't envy the judges who had to choose which display was the best! It is this very community spirit that convinces us that our proposal for a Lions club will be successful and we sincerely hope that more people will come forward and join us.... We need at least 8 more members before we can become a fully functional Lions club so if you are interested or know anyone who may be, then please do get in touch. Edlesborough W.I.

The speaker at our recent meeting was Ann Leaver, and her subject was 2,000 years - Milton Keynes. In 1967 farmers had to give up their land in order that the new town of Milton Keynes could be built. It was designed on a grid system, with the idea that each square should be a separate village community. Today there are twenty-three such villages, each surrounded by green belt, with a population of around 350,000. In fact, Ann feels it should be classed as a city.

Milton keynes is a 'new' town, but has a very old history. Digging for the new town had to be carefully carried out, and relics of the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages were discovered. Romans settled in areas such as Fenny Stratford, as did Saxons and Danes. Amongst other historical facts, we heard that Oliver Cromwell's son died in the area. Many examples of building carried out over hundreds of years still exist. Two examples are Watling Street built by the Romans for their soldiers, and the church at Wing built by the Saxons. Ann demonstrated a number of such building work in a slide show following her talk. Looking at these buildings over hundreds of years, up as recently as Milton Keynes shopping centre, we can see how much designs have changed. The new town certainly has a remarkable old history, which surrounds us all the time.

Later in the month members enjoyed a pub meal when we visited 'The White Lion' in Dunstable.





June, at last, brought us some rain. It rained on 20 days amounting to 83mm (3.267ins) - 153% more rain than the previous 3 months added together (see plot below). We did not have the storms and thunder that were forecast, on the 17th at 12.30 I recorded a rain rate of 109mm per hour but, of course, it only lasted a few minutes.

There were great fluctuations in temperatures between day and night. On the 27th we had highs of 29.6°c, but within 48 hours the temperature had fallen to 6.0°c



Bereavement Service and Tell Us Once

The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) has recently completed the roll out of its new **Bereavement Service**. The Service aims to help people dealing with the death of a relative by collecting all the information it needs to know about the deceased in one phone call and, at the same time, carrying

out a quick eligibility check to find out which benefits the surviving relative may be entitled to. It can also take claims for Bereavement Benefit and Social Fund Funeral Payments over the phone. The Bereavement Service numbers are:

The **Tell Us Once** service is a new service operating in certain local authority areas only. Following the registration of a death, it allows you to report a death to several government departments and agencies in one contact, including, for example, the DVLA, the Passport Service, the Pension Service and HM Revenue and Customs (for Child Benefit and Tax Credits). You can access Tell Us Once either face to face through the local authority or via a dedicated freephone number operated by the Pension, Disability and Carers Service. The Story of a World War 11 Bomber Training Unit Michael Warth

For five years at the beginning of the 1940s the quiet countryside around the Buckinghamshire village of Wing was the scene of a period of activity not witnessed in those parts before or since. As with numerous other sites in the east of England, an area of open fields was selected for the construction of an airfield to be utilised by the RAF

for the training of bomber aircrew. The peaceful country lanes were soon to be busy with the movement of men, women and vehicles, whilst the skies above were filled with the many types of aircraft as they took off and landed at RAF Wing. The story of the airfield and Number 26 Operational Training Unit which was based there is one of great friendship and trust, courage and bravery, sadness and joy. The events of those few years shaped the lives of all who were there and their memories offer an insight into life in such an establishment in the extraordinary days of World War 11.
