Does the Thought of Your Next Heating Bill Leave You Cold?

With the recent announcements from the main energy providers of large increases in the price of energy, the cost of keeping warm is rising. It is becoming harder for residents to keep their homes heated to the recommended temperatures of 21°C (70°F) in the living room and 18°C (65°F) in other occupied rooms. To help combat this, a free phone helpline has been set up to advise residents in Buckinghamshire how to cut their energy bills.

The service is offered by the United Sustainable Energy Agency in partnership with Buckinghamshire County Council, the four Buckinghamshire District Councils and Buckinghamshire Primary Care Trust. If you are finding your energy bills unmanageable, you are not alone. Currently over 5 million people in the UK cannot afford to pay for the heat they need. Any resident in Buckinghamshire who is struggling with their energy bills can call **0800 107 00 44** for free, impartial advice on:

- Cavity wall and loft insulation including the grants available
- Grants and loans to help with heating system replacements
- · Government and energy company payments
- How to switch energy suppliers to get the best deal
- · Advice on fuel debt
- How to be more energy efficient in the home

Some of these improvements can take a few months to install; don't wait until it gets cold to phone. The helpline is available Monday to Friday 9am to 5pm.

Church Mouse

St Mary's PCC met on Thursday 8th September.

It has been proposed that the Garden of Remembrance be maintained by the Parish Council along with the rest of the churchyard. This is with the Parish Council for approval. Notice has been given to the contractors who have been cleaning the church and regular cleaning will now be undertaken by a rota of volunteers. The Parish Directory has been updated and will be reprinted shortly. There is a proposal to build a small extension to the church to meet the very obvious need for a toilet and kitchen area. This is still in the very early stages of planning. This year St Mary's was a part of Open Churches Sunday, which will continue as a Diocesan event in 2012 and will be held on Sunday 24th June.

The PCC have agreed with a request from the Parish Council not to hang banners on the War Memorial railings. A manhole cover has been stolen from the churchyard and will be replaced shortly with a less valuable one. The Fabric Committee reported that minor issues had been addressed and there have been no major problems.

The Harvest Supper and Quiz will take place on Saturday 1st October in Eaton Bray Hall. Tickets are also on sale for the Poppy Prom on November 12th.

Advent and Christmas Services will follow the usual pattern this year with a Carol Service held in St Mary's Eaton Bray on Sunday 18th December at 6.00.p.m.

The Revd. Coralie McCluskey reported on her initial reflections after 6 months in the Benefice. She commended all the good things she has found in place and went on to outline the beginning of her plans and aims for the future. The meeting ended on this very positive note.

New Bus Service - Use it or Lose it!

A new bus service commenced on Monday, July 25th 2011 serving Totternhoe, Eaton Bray and Billington. The new Route 71 will operate 4 times per day through the villages to Leighton Buzzard on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, AND also extends further to THREE times per day to Dunstable calling at Sainsbury's and Asda.

This now connects the villages to 2 choices of towns and ALL four major supermarkets for shopping.

South Beds Dial-a-Ride are a Community Bus operator based in Totternhoe and have reached agreement to provide a complementary service to Central Bedfordshire Council to greatly expand this service using their minibuses which are a regular sight around their base in Totternhoe.

From April 2011 the 73 service was reduced to only one return per day to Leighton Buzzard on 3 days per week, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays only, giving only a short stay in the town.

The new service is experimental and will be reviewed if underused. See bus stops for timetable details or contact South Beds Dial-a-Ride on 01525 222331.

Each month so far we have written about a different Lions project. We recognise that some of these may not always feel relevant to the local community but our 'Message in a Bottle' really can make a difference to a significant number of people everywhere. This scheme is free to the user. Whilst it is focused on the more vulnerable people in our community, anyone can fall downstairs, so this scheme can benefit anyone, including you. As a minimum it will save the Emergency Services valuable time identifying you and your emergency contacts. By telling whether you have special medication or allergies or not, it is a potential lifesaver and provides peace of mind to users and their friends and families.

The Message in a Bottle scheme ensures that important medical and personal information is on hand for the emergency services when they are called out to your home. Members of the Message in a Bottle scheme place a small plastic bottle in their

fridge containing details of all relevant medical information. A green cross sticker is placed inside your front door and another on the fridge to alert emergency services to its presence. Lions work in partnership with local councils, health services and emergency services to deliver the scheme.



Many Lions Clubs across the country have taken to recognise this initiative as a means of fulfilling the motto 'we serve' and often fund this scheme from their own charity accounts

EDaN Buses & Transportation

Community Car Service for Dagnall, Northall and Edlesborough

The EDaN Community Car service is now very busy. From May to August our wonderful volunteer drivers made 73 trips to transport passengers to their selected destinations. These were mainly medical appointments including Dental.

At the moment we have 16 active drivers plus 6 who volunteered their services but we have been unable to contact them. If you are one of those very kind people who volunteered and you have not been approached by Peter, our co-ordinator please would you get in touch with me so we can include you in our rota.

During August, 12 of our drivers were on holiday leaving just 4 drivers to take care of 16 trips that were booked that month. The Community Car Service has also helped save the job of one passenger who lost the use of their car and CCS were able to transport them to and from the station for 2 weeks until the situation was resolved.

Grateful thanks must go to all our driver volunteers who have given so much to this Community Transport Scheme and without whom we would not be able to continue. I would also like to "Thank" Peter our co-ordinator who is doing an outstanding job matching drivers to passengers and getting everyone to their destinations. Peter and Viv our relief co-ordinator have also completed numerous trips over the summer to help passengers when we have not had sufficient drivers and this is very much appreciated by all concerned.

The Scheme is growing quite quickly now, word has spread.

If you are disadvantaged by local public transport and live in the villages of Edlesborough, Dagnall or Northall maybe we could help you to get to your medical appointments, visit friends or just do a little bit of shopping. Charges do apply but only to cover the cost of fuel and a very small admin charge.

Brightly shines the Sabbath day, Calm and peaceful is the morn As the farmer wends his way through the sheaves of golden corn.

These words evoke memories of a Harvest time immortalised in the paintings of Constable and his contemporaries and the poetry of Longfellow, Tennyson and Shelley. I found them in The Seasons, a collection of poetry and prose, beautifully illustrated with delicate drawings and watercolours, compiled between the years 1887 and 1890 by Louis Lawrence. The opening lines were written by Rev. R Wilton and are a fine example of morally uplifting verse by those who are long



forgotten. As I write this the Harvest is over and has been reasonable. The yield is down so that farmers with livestock may face having to pay a high price for any extra feed they buy this winter. Harvest Festival is still one of the most popular celebrations in town and country churches and a reminder at this time of the year of how fortunate we are and the necessity to share what we have with the poor at this time.

The joy of the Harvest celebration, however, contrasts sharply with the reports in newspapers or on the television about the famine and ongoing conflict suffered by so many in other parts of the world, not forgetting the personal illness and grief suffered by friends and neighbours in our communities. I am often asked how I cope with this and sometimes challenged about my belief in a God that lets all this happen. Sadly I have no perfect answers but take the time to pray for strength, guidance, a helpful word or just knowing that I'm not alone when I have to face a sad or difficult visit.

October not only celebrates Harvest but also the life of St Luke, described as the "beloved physician". Luke is not only the author of the gospel named after him but also the book of Acts, which tells the story of the early Church. Luke's gospel depicts Jesus as compassionate and caring, whose desire was to bring wholeness to anybody who was in need, spiritually, physically or emotionally. This ministry of prayer and loving concern is central to the work of the church. At St Mary's there is a prayer list that is used daily and if you would like a name added please ring me on 01525 20261 or add a name to the prayer board in the church. On St Luke's day, Tuesday18th October, at 5pm there will be a short service with prayer for healing and if you would like to join me please come along.

In July a party from Elf made a trip to the Industrial Heritage Centre based at Frogmore Mill, Apsley, which is run by 'Paper Trail' a registered charity, manned by volunteers. This is where the first commercial paper machine was installed in 1803, thus starting papers' industrial revolution, and – at a much later date – Basildon Bond was produced. Whilst full scale commercial production no longer takes place, a small company is operating there and the whole process of paper making, from start to finish, can be seen – and one of the original 'monster' machines is still in situ, although no longer in use. The print room gives the history of printing from Tyndale's Bible through newspapers and almost up to the computer. Our visit also included a short trip on the canal which was the main source of transportation both of the finished paper and delivery of raw materials to the Mill. The guides were excellent with their information and explanations – a place well worth a visit.

Have Your Say...

About the Future Growth in Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall

Edlesborough Parish Council has agreed that it needs to produce a Neighbourhood Plan. This will involve a period of public consultation to establish what the wishes of the local community are in relation to future development (how much or how little) within the villages of Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall between now and 2031. The Council will be distributing questionnaires to individual households and businesses within the three villages during the Autumn as part of that consultation. The more questionnaires that are completed, the more the eventual Neighbourhood Plan will reflect the wishes of the three communities as a whole. The Council would therefore encourage as many households as possible to participate in the consultation process by completing and returning a questionnaire.

What are Neighbourhood Plans?

The new Government Localism Bill proposes to give Parish Councils a right to produce a Neighbourhood Plan.

A neighbourhood plan is a document where the local community define what sort of new development they wish to see over the next 20 years or so and where they wish that development to be sited. The plan can identify the timing (phasing), the type, style and size of new developments, and the infrastructure requirements necessary to accommodate that development.

The District Council (AVDC) will still prepare the overall planning policy document (The Vale of Aylesbury Plan) which will contain elements such as housing numbers and strategic infrastructure etc. The Neighbourhood Plan will have to accommodate all those strategic proposals, however it can accommodate more development if the local community so desire. For example it can allocate more housing, but not less.

Every Neighbourhood Plan will have to undergo an independent examination, to check that it conforms with The Vale of Aylesbury Plan, the National Planning Framework,

other national guidance, European Directives etc.

Subject to passing the independent examination, the draft plan will then be put to a local referendum and will be 'approved' if more than 50% of those voting, vote for it. Once 'approved' through a local referendum, AVDC will have a duty to adopt it.

Once adopted a Neighbourhood Plan becomes part of the formal planning process. This means it will form the basis of developments coming forward, how they are shaped and will be a key part in deciding if they gain planning permission.

Having a Neighbourhood Plan would not therefore mean that we could override the minimum housing numbers or the fundamental strategic policies imposed on the Parish by AVDC in the Vale of Aylesbury Plan. What it would mean is that we would have more influence on where, when and how those housing numbers are accommodated and the type of housing and development that results.

Edlesborough Parish Council

More Officers to Tackle Crime in our Communities

Bedfordshire Police have drawn up ambitious plans to improve the service provided by the Force while also saving taxpayers' money.

From October 2011, the Force and the Police Authority will deliver a more streamlined process to improve both operational capacity and capability. This means that more officers will be available to deal with incidents reported to us by the public.

The Force carried out a detailed review of the way it organised key departments to identify areas where costs could be cut and performance improved. During the process, residents confirmed they were happy for structural matters to be dealt with by the Force so long as they received an appropriate police response when needed and crime continued to fall.

The new changes will see the number of police officers dedicated to local policing double from 92 to 185. This means a larger number of officers will be available to tackle local crime, anti-social behaviour and other community concerns while PCSOs will carry out more patrols.

There will no longer be any geographic boundaries or divisions separating communities. Instead, a Chief Superintendent will oversee Local Policing while another will be responsible for Tackling Crime.

Through reorganisation, the Force and the Police Authority will speed up response times. A new centralised team will respond to incidents county-wide officers will get to where they are needed more quickly as well as save money.

Meanwhile, a greater number of incidents will be resolved over the telephone to reduce demand on frontline staff thanks to a new appointment system for non-emergency issues. A recent survey found that people accepted this as a good way of dealing with non-urgent matters. A new three digit non-emergency number will be introduced in the autumn, after which time all you will need to dial is 101 for non-urgent situations. Peter Conniff, Chair of Bedfordshire Police Authority, said: "We've listened to our residents throughout the review process and their comments have very much informed our strategic decisions. The changes have been made to promote greater access to police services and deliver a more effective response that meets the expectations of our communities."

Ivinghoe Library Progress

Ivinghoe Library, which is used by people across the Beacon villages, has come a step closer to moving into community control. The Friends of Ivinghoe Library have submitted a business plan to Bucks County Council proposing that the change is made as of April 2012.

Currently 5% of library users come from Edlesborough, with the remainder hailing from Pitstone, Ivinghoe, Marsworth, Cheddington, and the surrounding area.

In recognition of this wider base, the Friends committee plans to rename the service "Beacon Villages Community Library" and will shortly be starting an extensive programme of activity to engage schools, clubs, businesses and residents across the villages.

The Friends anticipate that building links throughout the wider Beacon Villages Community will take time to gain momentum, so the business plan is based on maintaining the current service in 2012-13, with the library staffed by our library manager and supported by volunteers. The aim is to extend opening hours as our volunteer base grows and to engage with the community to make further service improvement in years two and three.

Bucks CC has committed to providing an annual support grant and we will also be approaching Parish Councils to seek support.



Table Corner & Pumpkins Creations

I can't believe that last time I wrote these little musings it was mid summer and now we are already in autumn! Oh dear, oh dear. I bet I will not be the only one to think, where is the time going? On the good news front, with autumn in the air, our favourite flavours and colours are back with



beautiful apples and endless shades of gold, red and brown. A time of discovery for the young ones kicking the leaves or carving funny faces out of pumpkins.

Last autumn Arthur and Adelaide and a friend made pumpkin faces from shop-bought orange pumpkins - nothing is perfect and there is no vegetable patch in the Searle garden! The scary creations were lit by internal tea lights from behind their eyes and the children were rather pleased with their artwork.

This year Adelaide brought home, I am pretty sure from her playgroup, three seeds of yellow pumpkins which we started in pots and transplanted into the garden. At the time of writing, each plant has grown several arms, each a crooked three metres long, over the compost heap, through and over a hedge and out onto the lawn. They are so in the process of growing that it is only a question of time before we dare not go near these monsters after dark. Carving is still very much planned for the 31st of October, but I can't wait to tell Adelaide that apart from the scary faces this year we are also going to make an even scarier soup out of her pumpkins!

So if you also need something hearty to make you feel brave enough to harvest pumpkins, strong enough to scoop them out, and imaginative enough to carve those horrible faces or simply to recover from the whole experience, here is the recipe. They are many versions out there, but this one is so simple that you can even make it with

help from your own children or grandchildren.

Ingredients: (Makes 4 servings)

1 tablespoon butter 1 onion, diced 800 gr pumpkins, chopped to 2cm cubes 600 ml vegetable stock 140 ml double cream 1/2 tsp sugar (optional) salt and pepper to taste



In a large saucepan, cook the onion in the butter for 3-5 minutes, until they turn clear.

Add the pumpkins and carry on cooking for 8 minutes. Then add the stock, stirring to combine. Cook over medium heat for another 10 minutes until the squash is soft. Add the cream, some salt and pepper, and puree the lot to obtain a rich pumpkin soup. Bon appétit!



Aristocrats of the Prune Orchards

Most readers of Focus will know that our area was once famous for the production of a particular variety of plum with excellent eating and preserving qualities. It was also said to be of great value in the straw hat trade in Luton and Dunstable where the locally made straw plait was turned into natty ladies and gents headwear. The local plums - or more correctly their skins were used to make a dye with which to tint the straw hats in a fetching shade of purple fashionable in the late Victorian and Edwardian periods. Eaton Bray, Edlesborough and adjoining parishes were extensively planted with plum orchards and the trade flourished into the 1950s, but since then these orchards have ceased to be managed for fruit production and are, for the most part either used for grazing or are disused and reverting to scrub.

But they still have a great value for wildlife and support a range of characteristic fungi, lichens, plants, insects, birds and mammals. And some of the old fruit trees support species which are not found anywhere else.

In the depths of last winter's snow and ice some of you may have noticed some odd looking characters, well swathed in weather stopping garments, peering through hedges or over gates, or taking a close interest in any gnarled and ancient orchard trees which could be reached by public footpath or bridle way. They looked odd because they were carrying a heavy load of sample jars, tape measures, ordnance survey maps, assorted paperwork and other gubbins necessary for their business. They were volunteers carrying out an initial survey of the condition of local orchards and their trees on behalf of Natural England and the People's Trust for Endangered Species. If you own or live close to an orchard they may have knocked on your door, or left an information pack about the work.

More specifically they were looking for trees of an age and condition suitable for one of Britain's rarest creatures: a beetle known as the Noble Chafer. This beautiful beetle (see picture on page 73) depends on dead and decaying wood and is found only in traditional orchards, large numbers of which are being destroyed for agriculture or development, or are disappearing through neglect.

The Noble Chafer is a handsome creature. Adults are about 2cm long and a striking, iridescent green in colour. They survive for only 4 to 6 weeks and the very fortunate who live in the areas where they breed may see them on the wing, or visiting flowers such as hogweed, on hot, sunny days in July and August.

They mate at this time and the females lay eggs in the decaying wood of old fruit trees. They prefer orchards with mature trees, 50 to 80 years old – just the sort which are vulnerable to clearance or removal. The larvae feed on the rotting wood, taking two years to develop into adults. During this time the larvae produce characteristic droppings called frass. This often accumulates in the hollows and crevices of the old trees and is an indicator of the presence of the Noble Chafer.

Until very recently the Noble Chafer was believed to survive only in a few orchards in Gloucestershire, Herefordshire and Worcestershire, south Oxfordshire and parts of the New Forest. But no longer! For, as a result of the findings of the initial survey, and a very detailed follow up investigation by specialists in the field, the Noble Chafer has been discovered in an old orchard in Edlesborough. And it may be in others in this

area. This is sensational news and has caused great excitement amongst naturalists and wildlife organisations.

If you own, lease or rent an old orchard and are interested in finding out if the Noble Chafer has made its home there you can ask the People's Trust for Endangered Species to send an expert to carry out a survey. Or you can search for "frass" yourself. Collect a handful of the wood mould that has accumulated in a hole or crevice in an old fruit tree. This will be fine, woody material, but it may contain frass, which are lozenge shaped pellets about 3mm long (see picture on page 73). Should you also find larvae in the mould sample, return them carefully to the hole or crevice – but take a photograph if you can. If you find frass or larvae please report your find to the People's Trust for Endangered Species (PTES).

Also contact the PTES if you would like to know more about, or take part in the work to map, investigate and record the condition of old orchards and their wildlife.

Edlesborough Book Group

Kipps by H.G. Wells

Our choice for July was a novel by HG Wells, first published in 1905. It tells the story of Arthur Kipps, an orphan, cared for by an uncle and aunt, who are shopkeepers and who tell him little of his background and parentage. His is an uneventful childhood, playing with the local children, although his uncle, being very aware of his position as a business man, disapproves. Kipps enjoys the company of the neighbouring children and while Sid Pornick is his regular companion, Kipps secretly admires his sister Ann. When Kipps leaves school to be apprenticed to a draper in Folkestone, he and Ann split a sixpence, each of them taking a half as a memento.



Kipps gradually becomes used to the routines and hierarchy of the draper's shop and starts to make friends and live independently, although he is always aware of being not quite "right" socially and is constantly trying to dress or act the part by observation of his peers.

One day his life is changed. His attention is drawn to an advertisement in a newspaper from a solicitor, asking for Arthur Kipps to contact him. Apparently. Mr Waddy, who was Kipps grandfather, made a deathbed decision to forgive his daughter and acknowledge his grandson Arthur, leaving him a house and a considerable fortune, the income of which is twelve hundred pounds a year.

Our hero's life is turned upside down. Unsure of himself and his social etiquette, Arthur is easy prey to people who in the guise of friendship are feathering their own nests. Leading the way is Mrs Walshingham whose daughter Helen was Kipps' wood carving class teacher. Mrs Walshingham, a regular customer at the draper's shop, once despised Kipps as lower class, but now persuades her daughter that Kipps is an eligible suitor. Kipps is both delighted and bemused by his good fortune and the new friends and opportunities that present themselves. His efforts to cope with his new life and how he deals with his friends from the drapers and his childhood are both comic and poignant, giving the reader an insight to the rigours of the Edwardian class divisions.

Although written as a comedy, and based on his own background in Kent and experience as a draper's assistant, Wells has written a very sharp social satire and shows his own disdain of the snobberies of the time.

Our group was fiercely divided this month, which always makes for a good evening's discussion. Some of us liked the book very much, others didn't like it at all and there were those who hadn't quite made up their minds, but saw positive points during the discussion.

Bitter Sweets by Roopa Farooki

Our choice this month was a book based on the premise of "the sins of the fathers". The story begins with deception and continues through the generations of an Indian family, where everyone is either a liar or is directly affected by the lies of a relative.

An arranged marriage between the playboy son of wealthy parents to a girl he believes is his intellectual equal, falters when he discovers that the bride and her family have deceived him and she is in fact lazy and illiterate. A daughter is born to Ricky Rashid and Henna, but having done her duty, whenever there is a chance of another pregnancy, Henna checks into a clinic for a medical check up. Shona, their daughter does marry for love and moves to England, but her circumstances force her into a situation which requires her to deceive her family.

After years in a loveless marriage, Ricky meets a woman to whom he is attracted and who seems to return his interest. The inevitable happens and he too is caught up in an elaborate web of lies.

This house of cards has inevitably to fall and Roopa Farooki holds our interest as she unrayels the various characters' dilemmas and brings the story to its conclusion.

This is the novelist's debut novel and she has relied a lot on her own background to illustrate the lifestyles of the various characters. The majority vote from our reading group was positive, most members enjoyed the book and it was very easy to read. It certainly gives discussion a good starting point.



Salvation Sound - October 2011

Sometimes it is difficult to pray; we often think that our prayers are unimportant when we consider world situations, but that is not so. All heart-prayers are heard, (all incense rises towards heaven, no matter the perfume it's composed of.)

And they are answered; prayers are really desires and desires are fulfilled according to their strength. It seems that sometimes prayer is more readily heard when a large number of people pray together, as in church; but Jesus took himself away from the crowd many times so that He was able to speak to his Father alone. Sometimes I feel the need for solitude. A time when I can not only commune with the Lord, but a time for reflection and recollection and self-examination. A time in which to ask and try to receive the answers to the inevitable questions. Why? How? and When?

How do you feel when you try to make a 'phone call to a company only to be greeted with a computerised voice? Press 1 if your call is urgent...

Press 2 for more grace.

Your call is important, please hold.

Then comes the music...Thankfully God is always available. "Call to me, and I will answer you" (Jer 33:3) has not been replaced by "All lines are busy".

Communication (prayer) with God is a two-way thing. He speaks to us through His word and through the indwelling voice of the Holy Spirit, sometimes interpreted as our conscience. He paid the price to keep the lines open so that we can experience the ioy of being still and knowing that He is God; Psalm 46:10.

None other has ever known: (Miles)



Vivien Bennett, a recent speaker, will remain in our memories for a long time. Vivien was a thalidomide victim due to the fact that her pregnant mother took the drug to ease morning sickness. As a result, Vivien was born in 1961, very disabled. She had no legs, very stunted arms and only four fingers. However, she is a fantastic lady, as we learned when she told us about her life.

Vivien was fostered as a baby and lived with her foster mother until her death in 2002. In 1971 they went to live in Wing in a purpose-built bungalow provided by the council, and Vivien still lives there. There are hoists in the bedroom and bathroom, and the T.V., hi-fi, curtains, front door, etc. are worked with a fob similar to a car fob-key. She has a car, but needs to be driven by a carer. At one time she had artificial limbs fitted at Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre, but was unable to cope with them. She does have an electric chair for moving about.

As a girl, Vivien attended primary & secondary school in Wing. She learnt to swim in the school pool, and joined the school orchestra where she played the mouth organ. She told us of the time she met Larry Adler, the famous harmonica player, and proudly played music with him on the stage of the Festival Hall. She played 'In an English Country Garden' to us - what a fantastic lady. In fact, she said she could play music before she could speak!

Vivien was able to pass her exams by using her right hand for the written work. College followed school where she studied music and English, and she gained a place at the London School of Music. In 1983 she started teaching at a Leighton Buzzard school and has worked there ever since. She has many hobbies, including singing, painting & needlecraft (some examples of which she had with her). She also finds time, when not working, to compete in bar skittles, table tennis & darts. Another enjoyment of hers is travelling abroad, when accompanied by a carer. In 1979, at the age of 17, Vivien made contact with her natural family, when she discovered she was one of four children.

and they still see each other from time to time. She has never wished for children of her own, but enjoys teaching them and helping with families of friends. Friends and carers play a big part in Vivien's life, and have helped her over many years. She told us of one occasion which they kindly arranged for her: to meet Lesley Garrett. This was when they went to Milton Keynes Theatre to see the musical 'Carousel'. After the show Vivien was invited to meet the singer in her dressing room, which was a great thrill to talk to the 'lovely lady' (as she described her).

Vivien is a happy lady who leads a very busy life. She is someone who deserves a great deal of admiration, and she certainly raised feelings amongst our members that evening. What a great lady!
