# A Small Snippet of History for those at the Village Hall Quiz

...Where Roman Watling Street crossed the old Icknield Way a town grew up for the first time. It was called Durocobrivis. We know its name because it was written down in a Roman guide book for travellers, which said it was 12 miles from Verulamium. There had been no towns in Britain before this time - only farms, settlements, inside hillforts, sometimes collections of wooden homes making a village.

Watling Street came from London and passed through Verulamium, near where St.Albans is now, and then went on through Durocobrivis.

For those not at the quiz, Durocobrivis was the name for Dunstable in Roman times.

Last month we told you about the Lions message in a bottle campaign and how it can make a difference to the lives of everyone. This month, we are covering a subject with both local and global impact. Sight.

Lions International are recognised worldwide for it's service to the blind and visually impaired. The organisation initially became involved through a challenge issued in 1925 by a lady called Helen Keller, an advocate for the blind. She challenged Lions to become the 'knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness'. In 1930, Lions introduced the white cane which we wrote about in an earlier entry and is still widely in use today around the UK and the world.

Working in partnership with other organisations in countries of the developing world, Lions work provides 600,000 professional glaucoma screenings and provides 20,000 corneal transplants each year.

We collect more than 5,000,000 pairs of used eyeglasses each year and distribute these to developing countries. We provide thousands of people each year with free, good quality eye care, glasses, Braille writers, large print tests, white canes and guide dogs. Campaign SightFirst is Lions most ambitious and most successful initiative ever. Lions operate this program, which is the worlds largest blindness prevention programme, with the aim of establishing long terms solutions for eliminating preventable and reversible blindness. The major causes of blindness come from cataracts, river blindness, trachoma and, especially in developed nations like the United States and the UK, diabetic eye disease and glaucoma.

Thanks to this program, Lions can proudly report that they have restored sight to 4,600,000 people through cataract surgeries. Further serious vision loss was prevented for 20,000,000 people and improved eye care services for hundreds of millions were improved.

Lions have :-

Awarded £100,000,000 for 698 projects in 80 countries

- Provided 60.000.000 treatments for River blindness
- Built or expanded 207 eye hospitals, clinics and wards
- Upgraded 314 eye centres with new equipment
- Provided management training at 92 facilities
- Trained 83,500 ophthalmologists, ophthalmic nurses, other professional eye care workers and village health workers
- Launched the world's first ever initiative to combat childhood blindness in partnership with the World Health Organisation. Thirty paediatric eye centres will be established as a result of this.

Lions Eye Health Programme (LEHP) is a community based public awareness initiative that encourages the early detection and timely treatment of glaucoma and diabetic eye disease and the appropriate treatment for low vision. The programme is run in collaboration with the International Glaucoma Association (IGA), Diabetes UK,



the Irish Glaucoma Association and the Diabetes Federation of Ireland

Importantly, now everyone with an interest in eye health care can participate in LEHP, not just Lions clubs!

We plan to start collecting eye glasses to continue supporting this work so if any of you have an old pair of glasses that you no longer require, please send them to Rachel at 9 Eaton Park, Eaton Bray. Lions World Sight Day was launched in 1998 by Lions International. It is a global event that focuses attention on the problem of preventable blindness. The shocking fact is that every five seconds one person in the world goes blind and one child goes blind every minute.

# 101 Non-Emergency Number

Bedfordshire Police have launched a new number providing people with a new way to get in touch about non-emergency issues. 101 is now the main number to call Bedfordshire Police when it is less urgent than 999. As well as making the police more accessible to communities, it is intended that 101 will reduce the number of inappropriate 999 calls. There will be a single flat charge of 15p per call, regardless of the duration, time of day, mobile or landline. You should call 101 to report crime and other concerns that do not require an emergency response. For example:

- · Stolen cars
- If you suspect drug dealing/taking
- To give us information about crime in your area
- To speak to your Local Policing Team

In an emergency, always call 999 when you need an immediate response, For example:

- Because a crime is in progress
- Someone suspected of a crime is nearby
- When there is danger to life
- When violence is being used or threatened

### 101 will not:

- Change the way in which we respond to non emergency calls
- Connect people to a large national call centre

• Result in calls receiving a lower priority than if 999 had been called for a non emergency issue

101 should not be used to report:

- Fly tipping
- Noise pollution
- Stray dogs

These should be reported to your local council:

- Central Bedfordshire Council: 0300 300 8000
- Luton Borough Council: 01582 546000

# Thames Valley Police Wing South Neighbourhood Update From Police Constable Jared Levens:

#### Recent News

Children at Edlesborough School bought their bicycles and scooters to school on 28th September and PCSOs Jackie Dodson and Chris Baker spent a busy day marking them with house numbers and post codes. This is done using specially designed stickers which tear into very small pieces if attempts are made to remove them. If you have a bicycle and would like to have it marked in this way do get in touch with us. We can give you the stickers and instructions on how to apply then to your bike. We just need to know your post code and house number or name.

We have recently had a meeting with Adult Social Care, one of our partner agencies, about a new initiative called the in touch scheme. The Adult Social Care team have identified some of our more senior community members who may benefit from a periodical visit from one of our team members. For us it is an opportunity to meet more members of our community and the benefit is that we can feed back any concerns to the adult social care team and we can also offer advice and guidance around crime prevention and other matters to our community members. This is a voluntary arrangement and we will only be visiting people who wish to see us. We hope that this will be a positive example of how we can work with our partners to the benefit of the community.

# Road Safety issues for the bad weather

- Stopping distances are 10 times longer in ice and snow.
- Gentle manoeuvres are the key to safe driving.
- Wear comfortable, dry shoes: cumbersome, snow-covered boots will slip on the pedals.
- Select second gear when pulling away, easing your foot off the clutch gently to avoid wheel-spin.
- When **climbing a hill** it's important to avoid having to stop on the hill by waiting until it is clear of other cars or by leaving plenty of room between you and the car in front. Try to maintain a **constant speed**, choosing the most suitable gear well in advance to avoid having to change down on the hill.
- When driving **downhill**, reduce your speed before the hill, use a low gear and try to avoid using the brakes. Leave as much room as possible between you and the car in front.
- Always **apply brakes gently**. Release them and de-clutch if the car skids.
- If you have an automatic, then under normal driving conditions (motorways, etc)

it's best to select 'Drive' and let the gearbox do the work throughout the full gear range. In slippery, snowy conditions you can make driving much safer by selecting '2', which limits the gear changes and also makes you less reliant on the brakes. Many modern autos have a 'Winter' mode which locks out first gear to reduce the risk of wheel spin. Check the handbook if you're not sure.

• If you do get stuck, straighten the steering and clear the snow from the wheels. Put a sack or old rug in front of the driving wheels to give the tyres some grip. Once on the move again, try not to stop until you reach firmer ground.

### Recent Ivinghoe "Rave"

At approximately 01.50hrs on Sunday 2 October Police were notified of a "rave" occurring at Ivinghoe Beacon. Officers from Thames Valley and Bedfordshire Forces deployed to the location. On arrival officers found between 600-800 persons attending the rave many of whom had travelled to the location by vehicle. Attempts were made by Police to block access routes and legislation was used to direct persons to leave the site. By 15.00hrs on 2 October the location was clear. An investigation is underway to identify and prosecute the event organisers for holding an unlicensed event of this kind and bring to justice those responsible for causing damage. CCTV footage from the Police helicopter will assist the investigation. We recognise the disruption that this event caused many local people with loud music being heard across a number of surrounding villages. The Police will be working closely with the National Trust to review this incident and consider future options to deter people from using this particular location in this way.

Why did the Police not stop the event straight away? The Police did not have any prior knowledge that this event was due to take place. Officers were deployed as soon as we were informed but on our arrival officers discovered that the event was already well under way with in excess of 600 persons already at the location. The poor visibility due to time of night, the geography of the area and the ratio of police officer to party goer numbers did not allow for an immediate dispersal of persons to take place.

Is anyone being prosecuted? There were a number of different organisers involved in this event. An investigation is under way to identify these persons and put them before the Courts. Sound equipment and vehicles were seized from some people on the night as part of this ongoing investigation.

**Do the Police need my help?** A number of people phoned us on the night reporting loud music and traffic congestion. If you have information which you think may be relevant to assist our investigation please phone 08458 505505 and quote reference number 227 2/10/11.

# Man Arrested After Illegal Rave - Bucks

Thames Valley Police has arrested a man following an illegal rave at Ivinghoe Beacon, Buckinghamshire on 2 October.

On Monday (10/10) a 20-year-old man was arrested in Haverhill, Suffolk on suspicion of causing a public nuisance and organising an unlicensed music event. He was bailed to return to Aylesbury police station on 16 November, having been given conditions not to enter Buckinghamshire.

PC Gareth Morley from Aylesbury CID said: "We will not tolerate illegal raves. They cause disturbance to local residents and damage to the environment, especially in areas of scientific interest and natural beauty such as this.

"We will seek to robustly prosecute organisers of such events, and part of this action will involve the seizure of vehicles and sound equipment.

"Thames Valley Police is committed to identifying those people responsible for the misery and upset caused on 2 October and pursue and arrest them wherever they may be.

"It is hoped that this arrest will be the first of many in this investigation."



# Table Corner and a Multitude of Scents

As we all know, a smell can bring on a flood of memories. Mr Boiler, who came to bring back some heating to the Searle household earlier this year, entered and immediately had a beaming smile. Those who have seen me in my cooking outfit will immediately know it had nothing to do with my attire, which is far from fetching. "You are cooking with butter!", he exclaimed, "I love that. It reminds me of my childhood. My mother was French and she always used butter. The wife will have none of it now – 'bad for the heart' she says..."

Cooking can bring about a wonderful range of flavours and aromas, and a few undesired ones as well. The same is true of smoked salmon. Yet the simplest remedy is simply to rub your fingers or the surface with a slice of lemon. 



# Edlesborough Book Group Book Review

# Everyman's Guide for Scientific Living by Carrie Tiffany

When this book was short listed for the Orange prize in 2006, one of our book group members read it and recommended it. It is a debut novel, written by English born Australian author Carrie Tiffany who, drawing on



her experience as an agricultural journalist and park ranger, has written a book set in Australia during the years of drought in the late thirties, leading up to World War Two. It begins on the Better Farming train, which was an actual train, sent by the government across the country, with experts on board who could lecture the farmers and their wives in the outback, on husbandry agriculture and also domestic matters such as needlework and child rearing. On board are, Jean Finnegan a young needlework expert and Robert Pettergree who is a soil scientist. A relationship quickly develops between them and they leave the train to marry and set up home together. Jean is very young and as this is her first experience of love she is determined to make a success of her marriage. Robert is older and has very firm ideas about his way of life, which he believes should be approached scientifically. He is convinced that by adding phosphates to the drought ridden soil of the Mallee Valley, he can improve its quality and produce better crops. He is blinded by his beliefs and his faith in science and sets out to prove his methods by taking note of his experiments, making lists and crop comparison year by year. Jean is supportive of her husband, in spite of common sense telling her that the experiments are not working and that things are getting worse not better. Her marriage imitates the aridity of the Mallee Valley, but she persists, writing endless lists and charts for Robert as he continues his fruitless experiments.

The book is written in the form of Jean's notebook and includes photographs and charts, which make it appear more authentic. It is written in her voice, very simply, but the short sentences make it seem rather journalistic in style. Jean is a very well drawn character, with whom we all sympathised and the impact of drought, the depression, and the onset of war was well described.

The book had a very mixed reception from the group, but overall it was well received.

# Edlesborough W.I.

We were transported back in time at our recent meeting when Mrs Janet Dineen gave a talk entitled "Buckinghamshire Cooking". Way back in years, when lace making was a very successful trade in Buckinghamshire, the lace makers had one day off a year on 25th November. This was a special occassion known as Tanders Day or Catterns Day, according to which area of the country it was celebrated. A great deal of cooking was done for this festival day, using a variety of locally provided ingredients, and Janet passed around details of recipes used. In Bucks. metheglin, a spiced mead known as 'bee wine', was drunk. The lace makers bought this from Honey House in Olney.

Janet told us some interesting facts about Bucks. cookery. For instance: Aylesbury ducks were not allowed to swim if they were to be eaten. Many of them were kept in the house, where children helped to rear them. The Vale of Aylesbury was evidently the biggest beef area in the Kingdom, and provided meat for royalty. Aylesbury game pie was a very popular dish served by local inns. Another meat dish was Stokenchurch pie, made up with 'odds and ends', including macaroni. Crayfish used to be found in the chalk streams. They were known as crawleybobs, and a popular meal was crawleybobs duff. However, there are no crayfish found locally now. Watercress beds were found in many areas, but none are to be seen today. The same applies to the cherries which were made into pies and eaten at Cherry Feasts.

Edlesborough features in the history of Bucks. cooking. Figs were grown here and were used for fig pudding, which was eaten at gatherings on Dunstable Downs on Palm Sunday. Also, as is well known, Aylesbury prunes were used to dye straw which was plaited for the millinery trade. The Luton hat trade employed many of our local people, particularly women and children, who carried out the plaiting in their homes. Janet showed us examples of straw plaiting she had done.

Whilst she was talking to us, Janet made up a mixture for biscuits using one of the old recipes. Members were able to sample some made earlier, and agreed they were very tasty. The recipes we studied certainly created a great deal of interest amongst the ladies and they enjoyed learning about cookery in times gone by.

# Rt. Hon. John Bercow MP Unveils Northall's Village Sign

The EDaN Beautification Team was delighted to welcome John Bercow to Northall on 1st October to unveil their second pictorial village sign. His sincerity and quick wit put everyone at their ease and an enjoyable afternoon followed in the mini-heatwave, organised by them...

We are indebted to Mike Scott, Kevin Cubbage and Mick Yates for all their hard work, both installing the bollards and planter and hauling the very weighty sign up on to its


post in time for the unveiling ceremony.

### Northall Village Sign

At the top in gold, the Edlesborough rose brass, now kept in church archives in Bedford, a treasure from our 13th century church on the hill

Flanking this are straw plaits, a very lucrative former trade enjoyed by these three villages, used by the Luton hat trade. The prune plums were sent in baskets by pony and trap to nearby Stanbridgeford station to catch the London train and used to dye sailors' uniforms in the 19th century.

The main picture at the top depicts Butler's Manor, first mentioned in 1302. The current



and Patricia has been instrumental in raising funds for this project, also donating towards the sign. It is a local legend that Dick Turpin watched from the attic room for coaches to plunder and he is shown here with Black Bess. The red kite, soaring aloft, is now a familiar sight locally, as is the green woodpecker and the rare Duke of Burgundy butterfly.

Pratts Farm supplies us with goose, duck and quails' eggs, the former noisily 'strutting their stuff' when strangers approach, especially nearing Christmas!

The Swan pub is a popular local attraction – one of the last few remaining in the parish villages, after the loss of at least ten over the past 100 years.

Lastly, the war memorial separates these bottom two pictures, commemorating the fallen from Northall and Edlesborough; a sobering touch to a beautiful sign.

The sign has been installed on AVDC's S106 Knolls View Amenity Lane which has served no useful purpose for many years. Now, with AVDC's active support,

the area of land is being transformed into a real amenity for the village. The sign, surrounding flower bed and bollards were installed by team members' husbands and planted and cared for by the EDaN Beautification Team. In an arc at the back of the Amenity Land, we have sown a wild flower meadow and plan to install cycle racks and benches in this welcoming space when funds permit.

The Dagnall sign is now well on its way to completion. The unveiling will take place on the wide verge opposite the Red Lion on Saturday 3rd December at 12.00 p.m. John Bercow will be doing the honours for us once again, when you can also enjoy singing along with Dagnall Community Choir. We are then all off to the roundabout, where Mr. Bercow

will commemorate a plaque on the flower planter to the memory of our dear Anne Thompson, a great lady who always had the interests of Dagnall at heart.

Father Christmas is expected to put in an appearance and there will be plenty of stalls where you can buy gifts for family and friends. See you there!



The chef prepared a dish of tongue - being a wise man he explained "It's the best of meats because it reminds us that we may use the tongue to bless and express happiness, dispel sorrow, remove despair and spread cheer.

Sometime later he was again asked to prepare a meal, but not to take too much trouble. In fact the worst of dishes would do, for the master was having to feed some of his unwelcome relatives! The chef again prepared a dish of tongue.

He said "This is my most worthless dish - it reminds us that we use the tongue to curse and break hearts, destroy reputations, create strife and set families and nations at war with each other.".

Think about the chef's point of view. We may not have to eat tongue, but we sometimes have to "eat our own words", before we learn to avoid sayings things that we wish we could retract. Without our tongue we would have great difficulty in making ourselves understood, but often times we speak without thinking; and that can cause many a problem. We should remember that the tongue is not in control, the person behind it is. Our morning prayer should include these words from an old song,

"Direct, control, suggest, this day All I may think, or do, or say."

Proverbs 12:18 says "There is one whose rash words are like swords thrusts, but the tongue of the wise brings healing."

If you want your tongue to boost someone's moral and not belittle them, ask God to make you a wiser person.

"A wise old bird at on an oak -The more he saw the less he spoke, The less he spoke the more he heard: Lord, make me like that wise old bird."

#### Weather Conditions for September 2011



But then summer returned for the last few days of the month, reaching 27.7°c — only 1.9 degrees lower than the highest temperature in June. In the midst of all that, we had average rainfall.



#### Citizens Advice Bureau

#### Cheque Guarantee Card Scheme Closure

On 30th June, the UK Domestic Cheque Guarantee Card Scheme was closed. This means that it is no longer possible to guarantee a cheque using a plastic card.

After this date, clients will still be able to pay for goods and services by cheque but just cannot use a plastic card to guarantee it. As now, a trader may decide whether or not it is prepared to accept a cheque in payment. The trader will have the certainty that under cheque clearing rules, a cheque will be cleared and will not bounce at the end of the sixth working day after the cheque has been paid into the trader's account. The trader will know it is safe to release goods or services at this point.

Clients should be advised that there are also other alternatives to guaranteed cheques such as debit or credit cards, cash payments, online payments, phone banking payments. The end of the Cheque Guarantee Card Scheme does not mean the end of the use of cheques. In December 2009, the Payments Council set a target date for the closure of the central cheque clearing in 2018. However, closure will only be confirmed if, by 2016, suitable alternatives to cheques are in place and are being successfully used by individuals and businesses.

#### Wills Drawn up by a Solicitor in Exchange for a Donation to Charity

November is Will Aid month. This is a partnership between the legal profession and certain charities. Every November, participating solicitors waive their fee for writing a basic will. Instead, they invite you to make a donation to the Will Aid charities. Suggested minimum donations are £85 for a single basic will or £125 for a pair of basic mirror wills.

More information about Will Aid is available on its website at www.willaid.org.uk. The website contains a useful will planner to help prepare for the meeting with the solicitor and a tool to enable you to search for a participating solicitor by postcode.

#### Winter Fuel Payment

Most people who are eligible for Winter Fuel Payment will receive payment automatically without having to make a claim. This includes anyone who has had a Winter Fuel Payment in previous years. However, you will need to make a claim if you don't get state pension, and are not receiving any other social security benefits, and were born before 5 January 1951. You can call the Winter Fuel Helpline on 0845 915 1515 for a claim form or get it from the Directgov website at www.direct.gov.uk. Claims received by 23 September will be processed and should arrive before Christmas. Claim forms must be received on or before 30 March 2012 to meet the final deadline.
