Let's Talk Together

Residents of Leighton Rural area, if you want to see action taken to improve your area or if you simply want to highlight local issues and be part of the solution, then come to the Let's Talk Together meeting on 6 December.

The meeting for Leighton Rural area, including the surrounding villages, is being held at Eaton Bray Village Hall, Church Lane between 7pm and 9pm and will be chaired by Councillor and Executive Member Mark Versallion (Heath and Reach ward). Local issues can be discussed at the market stalls such as speeding, the M1 link road and transport issues such as car parking.

Importantly the Let's Talk Together meetings are a great opportunity to meet with service providers, local Councillors and Bedfordshire Police, agree the Local policing priorities, get crime prevention advice, arrange a free home fire safety check, join the Neighbourhood Watch, Street Watch or Speed Watch to help improve your community. The organisers are keen to work with local communities to tackle issues together and look forward to people getting involved at the meeting.

Central Bedfordshire Councillors will also provide residents with an update on the council's budget setting process and how residents can get involved in this and have their say.

The Let's Talk Together meeting is organised by the Central Bedfordshire Together partnership which includes Central Bedfordshire Council, Bedfordshire Police, NHS Bedfordshire, the Fire and Rescue Service, Town and Parish Councils and other organisations who play an active role in the community. Meetings usually last around two hours, but you can attend for as much or as little as you like.

When the world was dark and the city was quiet, you came. You crept in beside us. And no-one knew. Only the few dared to believe that God might do something different.

Walking along the quiet Eaton Bray / Edlesborough footpaths on a still, bright, chilly November morning I had no idea what to write here. 

The Post Code Action Group has now completed the tasks set out in the Parish Plan. Namely:





- We have completed the Royal Mail process for change of postal addresses, and every property in Edlesborough/AVDC now has Edlesborough in the address (and not Eaton Bray)
- All the changes of address have been notified to Land Registry (Leicester Office)
 and it has made a 'multiple change' to the Register. Changes to individual register
 details will be made when there is activity on that register. i.e. home-owners
 affected by the change of address need take no action with Land Registry.
- Edlesborough Parish Council will inform the Chief Constable of Thames Valley Police of the changes to addresses and remind her that in spite of the Bedfordshire postal address, the whole of Edlesborough comes within their area.
- If you still experience problems with Thames Valley Police, reply "I pay my Council Tax to AVDC" to resolve the problem. Please also inform a member of EPC."
- As Windsor has had no success in its attempt to 'lose' the Slough post code, there is absolutely no chance of us having more success!

We hope you agree that this EDaN Action Group can now disband. We have done our best to take action on the issues raised in the EDaN questionnaire.

Fixing Shadows by Susan Barrett

One woman, the Duchess of Fainhope, and her desperate struggle to retain power, is the driving force for this melodramatic novel. The main story begins dramatically in 1873. The duchess and her daughters' governess, Miss Mantilla, give birth to sons within hours of one another. Tragically, the much needed heir to the dukedom dies.

and the two women solve their individual problems by exchanging their babies. Thus, securing the Duchess her position, but also linking her inextricably with the governess because of their shared secret.

The novel then follows their lives and that of the adopted heir, between Fainhope Hall and Victorian London up to the Blitz in World War Two. There are numerous minor characters all of whom are vital to the plot, but they have little depth and we, as readers, find little with which to empathise. The book is meant to be a Dickensian pastiche, but these characters do not come alive on the page making us indifferent to their stories. The one exception to this is Lucy, the abused and downtrodden nursery maid, whose life we do care about and who plays a pivotal role in the drama.

The prose imitates the Victorian style and is very florid, with lengthy descriptive passages. The reading group was mainly unimpressed with Fixing Shadows. No one hated it, but it is not a book we would recommend.

Wing South Neighbourhood Update

Recent News

The local policing team were out patrolling the villages throughout Halloween. We are pleased to report that there were no issues of anti social behaviour and that people were able to enjoy the evening in the right spirit.

Road Safety issues

The Police Community Support Officers have been out in October gauging recent trends in speed in certain villages in response to requests from our Have Your Say meetings. They have found emerging issues in Westfield Road, Pitstone, Winslow Road, Wingrave and High St, Edlesborough. The Neighbourhood team will be out in November with the speed gun to enforce these speed limits.

Operations tackling serious crime

We are continuing to run Operation Attali and seeing great results in keeping crime low. Officers from across the rural neighbourhoods have been in your local villages into the early hours looking for those wanting to commit crime, checking to see that farm gates have not been damaged, and responding to members of the public who have reported suspicious activity. This Operation will continue to run throughout November.

Crime Stats

The Wing South area continues to show a decrease in crime levels on last year which is fantastic news. In October 2011 there were 21 recorded crimes compared to 45 in October 2010. For the period April – September 2011 we are seeing an overall reduction in crime of 36% compared to the same period last year. Burglary Dwellings are down 52%, Theft of Vehicles is down 57% and Burglary Non Dwellings (sheds, garages etc) are down 71%. Please remember to visit the National crime mapping website (www.police.uk) which shows the crime recorded in your village. Crime in your area is below the national average which is welcome news. If you require information for your street please do get in touch with us.

Offenders brought to justice

- On the 21st October a 53 year old male was arrested and charged with harassment in Edlesborough
- On the 18th October an 18 year old male was arrested and cautioned for causing criminal damage to a vehicle in Pitstone.
- On the 27th October a 19 year old male was charged for possession of a controlled drug on the Beacon in Ivinghoe
- On the 25th October an 18 year old male was given a formal warning for possessing cannabis in Station Road, Cheddington.
- In this period a 15 year old male has been charged with a burglary.


I feel sure that the children were important to my father, otherwise the photos would not have been treasured for so lona.

Those mentioned above, and others, have helped us through this terrible time. And along with Claire's continued inspiration to "Go for it" we shall try to have a more "normal" Christmas this year.

And that's what's prompted me to write this piece. For wherever I can, I want to use the experience of these past two years to help others. So please, when you meet family and friends this year, remember that your best Christmas present is their presence.

Training Pitch – Project 'E B Astro'

We are working on an exciting project to build an all weather 3rd Generation pitch within the village envelope. This is at an early stage, but would, if successful mean we can provide all weather all year around facilities on an artificial surface to all our teams.

Clearly this will be subject to funding (this is a highly expensive investment) and planning, both of which are detailed and complex, but would transform our facilities and vastly expand opportunities for our local children, improve their fitness and skills. It would also reduce both travelling to training and be provided at only a minimal cost to parents. We are working closely with Eaton Bray Parish Council who have been extremely supportive of this project so far, which is budgeted to cost around £200,000, a massive investment in rural sport and a huge fund raising project is just underway.

Golf Day

We had a hugely successful Golf Day in September 2011 at Three Locks golf club,

where almost 40 golfers enjoyed bright sunshine to play team golf and a fantastic day was had by all. Our sincere thanks to Paul Cook (from Eaton Bray, our U13 Coach) for running a brilliantly organised event and we raised almost £2,500 as early fund raising for our new training pitch.

Committee

We have been blessed with a very keen and enthusiastic committee for the last 9 years and moreover have a wonderful group of dedicated coaches, which is now in total over 40!

As part of our continued development there are several key roles we are now looking to appoint and we are seeking keen mums or dads interested in the Club – be them parent, coach, grandparent etc.

- 1. ASST CLUB SECRETARY to support our excellent Club secretary and help with general organisational matters. This would suit an organised IT literate helper and is only a couple of hours a week.
- 2. ASST GROUNDSMAN to help Adrian Bush with lining and looking after our pitches and goals.
- 3. U5/6 COACHES to support our youngest age groups.

All these role are very much occasional/part time. 

Table Corner and the Festive Season

At the risk of sounding like Delia with her Cheat products and recipes, there are a few items which I think are definitely not worth preparing yourself. Not because you can't (most of us could, I am sure) but rather because they take a lot of time to prepare. At the top of my list must be puff pastry. Whilst on a pastry course a couple of years ago, we made it from beginning to end. It took such an awfully long time that I wondered who in their right mind would ever think of making puff pastry rather than buying the ready made version. The saying "time is precious, use it wisely" is even more important at this most wonderful time. We feel festive and want to give the best of ourselves, but the truth is that we are pulled between so many activities, the children or grandchildren's Christmas shows, Christmas shopping, Carol concerts, parties with friends etc. So we have to be very wise indeed with our time. Unless you are wonderful at it, or have an old family recipe which is always your favourite, I also think that shop bought mulled wine and mince pies can be acceptable if you choose from experience.

Despite what I said above, I believe that most shop items or dishes will always be that: just shop items. They do not have the flavour, quality nor the personal touch that home made food possesses. Our signature dish for example is boeuf bourguignon. You can buy it in any supermarket. But I guarantee you that at the first taste, you will experience the difference between ours and the shop bought version. Have you ever tried to buy a dressed salmon in a shop? Not really an option. And this is precisely where I think that we should spend our time at this time of the year. Making some home made brandy butter, creating the best stuffing we can imagine and not settling for one tasting of cardboard. And it need not be difficult. For example, and if you want something a little different from the traditional turkey as your piece de resistance, you could have a beautifully decorated whole gammon. The trick once you have cooked and cooled down the gammon is simply to glaze it. How do you do that? I think that my favourite

recipe is with marmalade. You simply and gently remove the skin of the gammon, taking care not to take the fat with it. Heat your oven at a high temperature (200C). Then cover your gammon with a mixture of 8tbsp of fine cut marmalade, 6tbsp of demerara sugar and 1 tsp of ground cloves. If you really want a stunning piece, before you cover the gammon with marmalade you can score the fat into diamonds, then push a clove into the centre of



each diamond. Roast for 20 minutes (for a 4kg piece). Et voila! Serve it hot and it is also equally delicious cold.

Have a great festive season. I hope it is not too stressful, but relaxing for you and your family!

One on the North coast, where he thought he'd arranged this tournament, and another Boulogne, a very small village 870 miles south of Calais, 10,000 feet up in the Pyrenees near the Spanish border, and the one from where our French colleague was now asking 'allo.... allo.... are you steel zere'? down the phone. Yes, the one where John had actually arranged the tournament. I should have mentioned that his guide book was on Persia.

Once we had regained our composure – and John had come round – I spent the next 20



When John gets a new guidebook, probably!

So endeth the reminiscing, and also so endeth my monthly scribbles in Focus for EBLTC. After 15 years (with a couple of short respites!) it's time to hand the reins over to someone who talks sense. We're hoping that he or she will come forward at our AGM in January, so if you're interested, please let me know! In the meantime, to misquote some popular phrases, it's Goodbye from me, but not Goodbye from them. So long readers, and thanks for all the fish. It's been real. Was Nice to see you, to see you Nice!!



Housing Benefit Changes if you are under 35



From 1 January 2012, if you are a single person aged 25-34, have no dependent children and rent accommodation from a private landlord, you will normally only be entitled to the shared accommodation rate of Housing Benefit. People in this position were previously entitled to the

rate for self-contained one-bedroom accommodation.

If you are already getting Housing Benefit on 1 January, the change may not affect you immediately – your local council will tell you when the change will take effect. If you make a new claim from 1 January, the change will affect you straightaway.




