#### New Look Dagnall Village Hall

#### A Great New Space

If you haven't visited Dagnall Village Hall lately, you are in for a surprise. Over the last few years, we have carried out some major work on the Hall. At the end of 2010, we secured a grant from Community Chest, Aylesbury Vale District Council which enabled us to extend the hall to the side. This provided much needed accessible storage and an extension to the kitchen. The extra storage cupboards meant that we could clear out the back hall (previously used as a table



and chair store!) gaining us a lovely sized room for additional use and hire.

In 2011, we successfully applied for a Big Lottery Grant to turn the kitchen from chaos (albeit bigger than before!) into a fantastic, fitted, level room (no more steps, creating a hazard and preventing wheelchair access). We have two sinks, considerable work surfaces and cooking/fridge facilities. A great place for preparing and serving food for your event.

In addition to the extension work, we exposed the original vaulted ceiling showing the roof beams, creating a light and airy, stylish room. We also recently improved the lighting creating a lovely atmosphere, whatever the occasion.

Another great feature (although not new!) of Dagnall Village Hall is our stage. We



recently hosted a Jean Martyn Concert (Britain's Got Talent Finalist) which was a resounding success, with over 100 people seated comfortably – without the stage this brilliant evening would not have been possible.

So...if you are thinking of hiring a hall for your event and previously discounted Dagnall because it was not 'fit for purpose', please think again and come and see us - we are very proud of our Hall

#### Did you know?

The Dagnall recreation ground is owned and managed by the Village Hall – we know that there is some confusion about this as you may think that it is a Council facility. It is only through the goodwill of the Village residents that the bin is emptied and the playground is weeded (amongst other things).

As well as providing recreational facilities and space for residents, the recreation ground is used for fund-raising events such as fetes and race days and the local youth football club, EB Lions, use it for football matches.

• If you would like to use the recreation ground for a gathering/event, please would

you let the Committee know, so we can ensure that another event has not already been scheduled for that time.

- We need to check that our licences and insurance covers your planned activity, for the safety and well-being of your guests
- Please do not park on the recreation ground as it causes damage and may prevent access.
- We are not trying to restrict the use of the recreation ground, just aiming to ensure that the recreation ground is used responsibly and remains a village facility for all.

#### Dagnall Village Hall Treasurer's Report May 2012

Treasurers Report - May 2012

Overall our income excluding grants was up on the previous year at £10,644 (30.61% higher) while our costs excluding projects stayed at almost the exact same level as last year £8309 (0.24% higher).

The main contribution to increased income was hall hire up 43% and particularly private hire which was up 145%. I believe this is directly related to the improvements that have been to hall over the last two years.

Our costs have remained level with last year. For services, electricity was down 41% while oil was up 22% and water rates were up 100%. Our general maintenance costs are also lower by 20% as a result of the investment we have made

During this year we received a grant of £10,000 from the Community Chest to complete the kitchen. The total project cost £10,014 with the majority of this being the building work £6144 and the kitchen units £2712.

The final position on funds held by the Village Hall at 31st April is £7391.62. This is made up of the main bank account £5383.81, cash: £200.94, Sports & Recreation: £950.22 and the 100 Club float: £820.00.

The trip to Foulness Island on 9th June was also thoroughly enjoyed by all who attended and we continue to raise funds for the high visibility children's waistcoats we wrote about last month. However, as if that wasn't enough, we are about to trail another community service project and this is where we need your help.

#### Fancy some fish and chips?

We are hoping to start a monthly fish and chip delivery service to housebound residents in our villages. We were initially approached by Social Services and Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity who brought to our attention a number of people who are unable to walk as far as the fish and chip shop. As soon as we heard this, we knew we wanted to help. Through working with these charities, we have committed to a trial of this project starting on Friday 27th July.

If there are any 'housebound' residents who fancy a fish and chip supper delivering to them on Friday 27th July, please call me on 01525 229 656 by Wednesday 25th July. We will then collect your payment on Thursday 26th July and will delivery your supper to you on Friday 27th between 6 and 7pm depending on the number of orders we receive.

If this is a success, we then plan to start a 'fish and chip' club where people can register with us for a monthly delivery service. We must stress that we are not making any money from this – you will only pay for the cost of your supper. Our delivery service will be a free of charge community service project.

Like all of these things, it will only be a success with your help so if you feel you would benefit from this or know anyone who might then please do get in touch. The trial night will 'test' the demand for this service so please don't think, 'I will wait until it is established before I place my order' ....this may mean you miss out if we don't see enough demand.

Hopefully the community in general is starting to see the benefit of having a Lions Club and the impact it can have on everyone's life, from the potentially life saving high visibility waistcoats for our local children through to the food delivery service for our elderly or housebound residents and a whole host of other activities in between. If you have a few hours to spare and feel you would like to get involved with us then please do get in touch – as always, more members are always welcome and the more members we have, the bigger impact our community will feel overall.

Alternatively, if you know of someone who may benefit from our help then please do let us know.

#### Don't let Thieves House-Sit this Summer!

Sometimes the last thing we think about is home security when we're about to jet off for sun, sea and sangria. Although Aylesbury Vale is a low crime area, it doesn't mean if you don't secure your home that you will return to your home as you left it.

Follow the Community Safety Partnership top tips to keep opportunist thieves at bay this summer:

- Do not leave valuable items like your TV, sound system and other hi tech gadgets where thieves can see them.
- UV Mark belongings with your postcode and house number. Keep a list of the make, model and serial number of these items and take photos of any valuable items that can't be marked.
- Make your home appear occupied. Cancel milk and newspaper deliveries and ask a trusted neighbour to collect your post. Use automatic timer-switches to turn on your TV or radio so it sounds like someone is home.
- Make sure you have up to date contents and buildings insurance.
- Put all your tools away so they cannot be used to break into your house and lock your garage and shed with proper security locks. If you have to leave a ladder out, put it on its side and lock it to a secure fixture with a "close shackle" padlock or heavy duty chain.
- Cut the lawn before you go and trim back any plants that burglars could hide behind.
- Most burglars get in through a back door or window. Make it difficult for them by locking all side or back gates and adding trellis to the top of walls and fences. Fit lights that come on at night to cover the sides and back of your house.
- Make sure you've locked all outside doors and windows and, if you have a burglar alarm, make sure it is set.
- Don't advertise your whereabouts on social networking sites, it together we can could attract unwanted attention from opportunists.



## Highlights of the Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting/Annual Meeting held on Monday 14 May 2012 from 7:00pm at the Coffee Tavern

A full copy of the minutes for Eaton Bray Parish Council can be found on our website. The Clerk wished to thank all the Parish Councillors and many others who have worked for/with the Parish Council over the year. All the work and support that everyone has given is much appreciated.

## Projects Completed And On-Going Cemetery

We have received a number of positive comments this year regarding the improved condition and appearance of the cemetery. The new Grounds Maintenance Contractor has been able to achieve this by cutting the grass on a very regular basis. He has also instituted an ongoing programme of work to cut the neglected, encroaching and over grown hedges back to the original boundary line. Members of the Community Payback Scheme spent three days clearing debris from around/under the hedges to the front and sides of the cemetery. In excess of three tons was removed. There is a plan to replace the front hedge in the autumn with a new Laurel hedge. The Council is still looking at a range of options regarding the acquisition of extra burial land.

#### Coffee Tavern/Cottage

- Currently there are six Trustees
- The Coffee Tavern has been quite well used; however it would be good to see more local groups/people making use of this village facility, to encourage this the letting fee has remained at the 2009 level.
- Window boxes and planters have been added to the outside of the building.
- A new Parish Council Notice Board has been fixed to the front of the building and a Community Notice Board has been sited in the Coffee Tavern Garden.
- The fire alarms & emergency lights are checked and serviced every six months. The extinguishers are checked and serviced annually.
- The condition of the 'Grass Crete Matting' in the Car Park is being monitored and the Parish Council kept informed.
- The cottage was totally redecorated, three Passyfier Vents were installed to the outside walls of the lounge and the two bedrooms and a number of roof tiles were replaced and the flashing repaired.
- Risk/Fire Assessments have been updated.

#### **Recreation Ground Improvements**

The two new pieces of play equipment are in storage and ready for fitting. The Council are awaiting details of quotes for the safety matting required for these pieces. The Parish Council are working with the local football club, EB Lions, for the provision of an all-weather training pitch at The Rye Ground.

#### Additional projects and news for the coming year

- The Coffee Tavern Trustees are looking into the tidying up of the car park.
- Now the new 20mph speed limit signs and restrictions are in force for School Lane, the Parish Council will be working with the local police to ensure these speeds are adhered to.

- Village Sign; the working group are in the process of finalising design/funding.
- The Parish Council hope to encourage residents to join an Improvement Team; volunteering their help to improve the parish in which they live.
- The Parish Council are looking at purchasing additional Christmas lights to add more cheer to the parish at that time of year.



#### Are Wasps a Problem?

When summer eventually gets here, don't let wasps spoil your BBQ or weekends in the garden. Although a gardeners friend that eats many pests and bugs, they can become a major pest themselves.

The Queen emerges around mid April from hibernation and constructs a small 10-20 chamber nest and lays an egg in each one. Sterile female workers then hatch, and by late summer the colony can reach from 3000-30,000 individuals.

The nest can be in some very hard to access places, e.g. under roof tiles, facias, in lofts or holes in the ground. More people get stung trying to deal with the nest themselves

as the wasps can become very aggressive when provoked.

I have been to a lot of jobs where people have spent money on sprays that just don't get right into the nest to kill the colony, so if a professional approach is needed please contact pest controller Mr A McClelland.

#### Edlesborough Book Group Book Review

#### Toast By Nigel Slater

This month we chose to read "Toast" by Nigel Slater, a well known food writer and TV chef. It is sub-titled "The Story of a Boy's Hunger" and uses as a device for its chapter headings, the names of dishes and brands of food popular in the sixties and seventies. The book is not really an autobiography; it is rather a memoir of childhood and early adolescence. Nigel is the youngest son of a middle aged, middle class couple, and because of the large age gap between his brothers and himself, his childhood is rather repressed and lonely. He is very close to his mother, but rather wary and in awe of his father, who in the way of the post war generation, is rather distant.

When Nigel is nine years old his mother, an asthmatic, dies and his world is turned upside down. His father, left with a small boy to care for as well as coping with his own loss is overwhelmed by this and very soon Nigel has a stepmother. His relationship with her is difficult and he appears never to come to terms with the fact that his father has married the housekeeper. As a group we found Slater's descriptions of lemon meringue pie, bread and butter pudding and the joy of toast extremely well written and brand names such as Arctic Roll, Smash and Fray Bentos pies very evocative. But this does not make much of a book, which most of us disliked. The author appeared to be a rather self interested, rather snobbish boy and some of his more intimate memories we found rather unnecessary and distasteful. Maybe he has grown into a nicer adult - we hope so.

#### **Employment and Support Allowance Changes from 1 May 2012**

From 1 May 2012 (later in Northern Ireland), changes were made to contributory Employment and Support Allowance (ESA). The changes are:

- if you're in the Work-related Activity Group, the amount of time for which you can get contributory ESA is limited to 365 days. If you have already been getting contributory ESA for 365 days in the Work-related Activity Group, it will stop immediately
- if your limited capability for work began in youth (before the age of 20 or, in some cases, before the age of 25), there are no special conditions of entitlement
- if you reclaim ESA within 104 weeks of a previous claim, your claim will no longer be linked to the previous claim unless the period between claims is twelve weeks or less.

If you're not already getting income-related ESA, you may qualify for it when your contributory ESA stops. If you're already getting income-related ESA, you're likely to qualify for more when your contributory ESA stops. Income-related ESA is meanstested, so the amount you get will depend on your other income and capital and the income and capital of your partner.

#### Salvation Sound - July 2012

The stream is fed by well-springs hoarded by nature... the stream of humanity is fed by wisdom and effort, hard won experience, and the hand of God. In Psalm 8 it tells us that He, God, appointed man and made him ruler of the fish and creatures in the seas. The occupation of several of the apostles was that of fishermen. Mark.1 v 17 states that Jesus said "Come with me, and I will make you fisher's of men." John chapter 21 tells a fishermans story. Read it for yourselves; then thank God for his bounteous grace to us. Talking of grace, on a lighter note, I came across this, a Yorkshire grace:

"We thank Thee, Lord, for common food, for trotters, tripe, pigs cheek, for steak and onions, with their crude, but appetising reek, potatoes in their jackets make us plain folk honour Thee; And thou art with us when we bake fresh shrimps for Sunday tea. Thy peoples' praise is overdue but, see, dear Lord, we kneel to offer thanks for Irish stew, and tasty cheap cow heel.

And wait a minute, Lord! don't miss the last word on our lips; We thank thee most of all for this, Thy gift of fish and chips...

Do you remember the days when "a piece of cod and six pennyworth of chips and a bag of scrumps." was the order of the day; wrapped in newspaper, sprinkled with vinegar and salt first. My word, didn't they taste good! Especially as the scrumps were mine to eat on the way home!

The sailors' hymn "Eternal Father strong to save", talks of the perils of the ocean deep. William Whiting penned the words with such deep feeling that I wonder what his connection with the sea was. Another writer, Priscilla Jane Owens wrote the hymn "Will your anchor hold in the storms of life" Was she, I wonder, one of the wives waiting on the cliff top to see if all the fleet returned to harbour after a violent storm.

A lazy summers day; a wandering mind; my time of leisure over, I come to this conclusion; "I've anchored my soul in the haven of rest,

I sail the wide sea no more:

Now the tempest may sweep

O'er the wild stormy deep,

But in Jesus I'm safe evermore".


