THE EATON BRAY VILLAGE SIGN

Designed to commemorate the Queens Diamond Jubilee 2012, it is a shield based on the Bray family's Coat of Arms and depicts scenes from Eaton Brays past. It is topped off with a crown as a mark of respect for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second in her Diamond Jubilee year.

In the top left hand side is an image of the last Manor House in Eaton Park which was pulled down circa 1790. Before this, there had previously been a Manor House of Sir Reginald Bray that had been built on the site of the castle of William Cantelupe which stood here in 1221 surrounded by the moats.

Top right is St. Marys Parish Church, a 13th century example of Parish Church craftsmanship with magnificent arcades built with local Totternhoe stone (clunch). A 13th century font survives as does the famous Thomas-De-Leighton door hinge. A short walk back to the church you will find a brief history and guide book on sale and your chance to bide-a-while in this historic place of worship.

Centre is the War Memorial with the names of the local lads who gave their all for us in the two World Wars. Dedicated in July 1923 by S. Howard Whitbread.

Lower left, shows a device for breaking down Hemp (Flax) for the making of rope. It was used as a symbol by the Bray family known as "the Hemp Bray" or Brake.

Lower right. A device called a Plait Mill, it was used to flatten the plait much like a mangle. Our village was once famous for its straw plait, indeed, I doubt it could have survived in the 18th and 19th centuries without it. Straw was plaited into lengths of 20 yards – or a "score" as it was known, and sold to the hat manufacturers in Luton.

The Chevron shown here comes from the Coat of Arms of the Bray Family (seen below on the post).

Lower centre. Moat Farm in the High Street. Once the home of the Henley's, they were one of the larger duck breeders in the village. It was said that you could smell the ducks as you came down Lancot Hill. The Henley's also manufactured bricks and tiles form the area now covered by bungalows in Church Lane. The clay dug in these pits contains no iron and as a result the bricks produced were a yellow colour. There are plenty about in the village, see if you can spot them.

The Bray Coat of Arms.

The shield is divided by a chevron and depicts three Eagles feet showing their claws. These were said to be "armed", that is to say the Brays were fighting men or Knights. We know that Reginald Bray was fighting at Bosworth Field as it was reputed to be he who found the fallen crown on a thorn bush and handed it to Lord Stanley who, in turn, placed it upon the head of Henry Tudor, Earl of Richmond proclaiming him Henry V11 in 1485. Five weeks later Reginald was knighted by the king, and granted the manor of Eyton for his services, hence the modern name Eaton Bray.

Lower right. Carnations represent W.E.Wallace and Son Ltd. one time Eaton Bray's largest employers. Starting up in Eaton Bray in 1886, they went from strength to strength producing thousands of blooms a day right up to the mid 1970's. The range of colours was wide and included numerous varieties that were grown only by this company. Some of the names live on like Wivelsfield, Northcliffe. Coral and Saffron Rise as road names on the Wallace Drive Estate.

Lower left. Prunes, this unique variety of plums grow only on the Vale of Aylesbury from Hockliffe in the north to Western Turville. All the villages in between grew the crop and on a good year could fetch £80 per ton. A small orchard could produce enough fruit in a season that, when sold, would pay the rent on a cottage for a year.





My favourite compares the Christian life to running a race. *Do you not know that in a race the runners all compete, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you might win it. 

The Rye - All-weather Training Pitch

Following the public consultation period earlier this year, Eaton Bray Parish Council gave their approval for the All-weather training pitch at The Rye and detailed plans have now been submitted to Central Bedfordshire Council. This application was discussed at a lively Parish Council meeting in July and an

objector initiated an article in the Dunstable Gazette that was thankfully balanced in its reporting, highlighting the benefits that the pitch will ring to the Parish.

The main objections seem to be with the planning and consultation process and the existing traffic and parking issues rather than the facility itself!! Needless to say, the relevant Agencies are making their representations to assist us in making sure that no archaeological burial site will be descrated, more and improved parking facilities are provided and <u>all</u> living trees are properly preserved.

Our vision is to see The Rye once again become a vibrant part of village life with modern facilities that will draw villagers and enable the whole village to make use of their "village green" alongside the small number of dog-walkers that currently use the site. Plans have been carefully drawn to ensure that the facility will not restrict use of The Rye to any existing or future group of users and it preserves its open space, grass area.

One consideration is the appearance of The Rye, which is currently scarred by a condemned clubhouse and a number of dead trees surrounded by nettles and weeds. The proposed scheme will be of a similar nature to the Tennis courts on Edlesborough Green and School Lane, Eaton Bray and will in time blend in as the re-planting and replacement trees mature. Would Andy Murray be such an outstanding representative of Great Britain if the authorities of Dunblane weren't able or willing to provide the right facilities?

We are very mindful of all neighbours and the impact the all weather pitch will have, as we are both local parishioners ourselves and keen to work with all the local community, not just those supportive of children's football. In particular the all weather pitch has been designed in full consultation with the planners to ensure;-

- Minimal visual impact,
- Landscaping to ensure those close by have attractive views unspoilt,
- High end expensive floodlighting to ensure no adverse light spill,
- Set back from the boundary to ensure hedgerows and trees are unaffected and landscaping to further reduce any impact,
- Improved and more efficient car parking, with several additional spaces found to avoid car parking in the Rye itself,
- High cost fencing which is visually acceptable given the green open space,
- Controlled hours of use,
- A careful sensible financial operation to ensure the site is well maintained and funded without need to seek users from outside the villages.

We are often told how wonderful it is to see all of the village children regularly playing organised sport in the village rather than 'hanging around' and this development is essential for the continued well-being of EB Lions, the village children's football club.

The training pitch will provide state-of-the-art facilities for our youngsters to train during the winter months and being a multi-use surface it will also be available to other organised village groups for any number of leisure activities. - if your Eaton Bray based club or organisation would be interested in using the pitch please contact us to discuss the suitability of the surface.

To forge an even stronger Club in the years ahead, the committee of EB Lions AFC and local schools need this all weather training floodlight facility. It embraces community involvement, child health and fitness, legacies for our children, outreach to new and more diverse audiences, experience and volunteer support. It is needed for our future, one that clearly reflects the vitality of the Club and the considerable commitment of our committee and coaches (of which there are almost 50).

This will enable us to position EB Lions to be:

- One of the Regions most dynamic, modern and thriving Clubs because of our outstanding focus on management, efficiency, youth experience and development;
- A vital cultural gathering place and an indispensable community educational resource;
- A major contributor to the village's youth well being by serving as a magnet attraction for a growing local audience.

We look forward to the exciting opportunities this training facility could bring to the Parish.

Dear Editor

We are writing to complain about the way the Parish Council of Eaton Bray have represented the community and their belief that they can 'give' the Village Green - given to the villagers for everyone to use - away without a full representation of the facts.

The public consultation document that was printed in the February issue of The Focus asked for parishioners views on 'enclosing a small part of the Rye Recreation Ground to build an all weather training pitch'. However this omitted key facts such as the 4.5 metre high fence surrounding six goal areas, with a 3 metre fence in-between, the use of the facility until 10pm at night seven days a week and the erection of six 8 metre high floodlights. In addition only positive reasons for this development were given. In addition to this the Parish Council consulted, in November 2011, with Defra about the two acts that protect this Village Green. The implication, that 'this enclosure will benefit the community' agreed by Defra and PC' (The Eaton Bray Lions Astro Project) and therefore meets the requirement of the acts to allow an area to be enclosed, is grossly misleading. When we consulted Defra about this they assured me that they are not at liberty to make such a decision. Finally it is planned that the Village Green should be leased to Eaton Bray Lions for twenty one years. To date the villagers have no idea what the terms of the lease would be; it is planned that these terms would be agreed AFTER the planning permission has been gained.

In addition the majority of people using this facility would come from outside the village which would undoubtedly lead to more traffic and noise for those who actually live here.

We fully respect the council's right to support this development but we strongly object to the distinct lack of clarity and openness that has been shown by them; the council have obviously supported the venture to such an extent that they have ensured an agenda that will make the development appear more favourable to the community and to planners.

We believe that the Parish Council should represent all the community and represent all the facts clearly and honestly. This has undoubtedly not been the case with this planning application.

News from Cllr Avril Davies

Bucks County Councillor for Edlesborough, Northall and Dagnall Transport to Cottesloe School

My faith in Bucks County Council hit another low point when, after not only introducing charges for school transport, they failed to apply the policy correctly causing unnecessary additional stress, anxiety and confusion for parents affected.

Having previously negotiated with the cabinet member that, despite the consultation implying Bedfordshire schools would have to be considered 'nearest school', they would not be included when the County came to apply the policy. Instead they went ahead with Tring School as the nearest school to pupils living in not only in Dagnall, Edlesborough, Northall, but also Cheddington, Slapton, Ivinghoe, Pitstone and Marsworth, and therefore the only school to which free transport would be provided.

Letters were sent out to all pupils attending or about to attend the Cottesloe School that, as not the nearest school, payment would be required before being allocated a seat on a bus. After many emails and telephone conversations between myself, the lead officer, and the cabinet member, this was eventually rectified and the letters were reissued with the Cottesloe correctly identified as the nearest school for all villages except Pitstone where Tring is officially still the nearest school attended by 60% of secondary school children. However, when Tring is full, free transport to Cottesloe should be provided. I have been told that a straightforward appeal on the grounds that there was no place at Tring School, should secure free transport to the Cottesloe for those already going there, or going in September. If this has not been happening I need to know as this is a bit if a 'grey' area.

This leaves three matters still unresolved.

Pupils selected for the grammar schools under the Bucks system are having to pay. Not as much as proposed last year, but payment none the less, which as Buckinghamshire has a selective school policy cannot be just.

Worse still, pupils eligible for means tested financial assistance are not eligible for help with travel costs as the Aylesbury grammar schools are more than 6 miles away. This is one of the national regulations and I am appealing in every case for the cabinet member to apply natural justice to those in rural areas subject to the Bucks school system. In the worst case scenario pupils are having to contemplate leaving a school they were selected for by Bucks in mid career because the fares are unaffordable.

Finally charges for sixth form travel remain from between £600 to £900 per pupil per annum to any school, Wing, Tring or Aylesbury. This is a double blow after the removal of the government Educational Maintenance Allowance which helped pupils from families with low incomes. That is an area I continue to challenge as in my opinion I do not believe the charging policy, which subsidises other school travel, is legally based.





Can I learn to play?

The club secretary will give you information about bridge lessons starting in **September** at the **Northall Village Hall** and also about free software that will enable you to teach yourself.

Bridge Players

Why not bring a partner and play duplicate bridge on Friday evenings from 7.30 p.m. to 10.30 p.m. The club meets at the Eaton Bray Methodist church schoolroom throughout the year. If you need a partner, please phone the club secretary on **01525 221779**.

What's it all about?

Bridge is a card game of the whist variety and has been played in its present form since 1925. Duplicate whist has been around since 1891 and it was natural for bridge to develop along the same lines.

At the start of the evening players and their partners sit at tables for four and shuffle and deal the cards. The hands of each deck are placed into duplicate boards in positions marked North, East, South and West. Normally 24 to 28 boards will be played during the 3-hour session. After the hands are played they are replaced exactly as received into the duplicate boards and scores are written onto a travelling score card.

The tournament director organises proceedings so that players move to play as many opponents as possible and to play as many of the boards as time allows. The luck of the deal is largely eliminated and the bridge played becomes a satisfactory test of skill. When players first pick up a hand they enter the auction phase in which the nominated dealer makes the first call. Players use silent bidders so that players at other tables do not hear what is happening. On conclusion of the auction one player becomes what is known as declarer. The player on declarer's left makes the opening lead and declarer tries to make the bid contract. The result is entered onto the score sheet. The results are published on the website each week or printed out for the next session.

At the Eaton Bray Taverners Bridge club the bridge played is according to the rules of the World Bridge Federation and the orange book of the English Bridge Union.







Today has come the news of the rescue of the British medic who had been captured by the Taliban in Afghanistan, along with another Doctor and Afghani aides. News has come too of the loss of another young soldier. As we watch the spectacle of the Diamond Jubilee Celebrations this coming week, there will be many representatives from all three Services who have served in Afghanistan, or will be waiting to be posted there. No matter whether we agree with the campaign in Afghanistan, I wonder whether you, like me, think about the people in Afghanistan: those who have been born there and those who fight there. Here is one person's account.

The US Chaplain's story

I wept for a soldier who told me last month he was worried he'd grown used to killing insurgents. His eyes moistened as he told me how his parents saw him as a hero. "They wouldn't call me a hero if they knew what I do," he declared. "Is it normal to see killing as routine?" he asked. I assured him that he wasn't crazy, or he wouldn't have come to me. While some of my tears were for him, I likely was thinking of my son, who joined the Marines two years ago. "Dad, we're learning to kill from 500 yards," he wrote from boot camp, "Is it wrong to kill?"

1 answered him with an ancient scripture: "There is a time to kill." (Ecclesiastes 3) Sometimes, we are compelled to eradicate evil with deadly force. In so doing, we run a risk of destroying our own moral fibre. In the process, tears will come. They are a way of protecting our core being. If we didn't shed tears for such horrendous losses,

we wouldn't be human. That's the simple difference between the good guys and the bad guys — we cry when we are forced to use violence; they don't. As I considered my tears, it occurred to me that maybe they were proud tears. We were asking so much of our young heroes. Most of them knew the price they'd pay, and many of them had overpaid.

"You going to be all right?" my chaplain assistant asked as the office phone rang. It was the ICU. The soldier who asked about the purpose of all this wanted to see me again. "I want you to pray, chaplain." he said. "I want you to pray for the insurgents that did this." "What should I pray?" I asked. The soldier responded by telling me to pray the prayer that Jesus prayed from the cross, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." I'm not sure I've finished crying.

Edlesborough Book Group Buddha Da by Anne Donovan

This novel is set in Glasgow and is written in the Glaswegian vernacular. This is at first quite daunting, but Anne Donovan writes very clearly and phonetically, making the words form a rhythm that soon becomes easy to read and gives the book an authentic ring.

The story is told by three narrators, each one taking a chapter in turn to tell their view of the situation. They are Jimmy McKenna, his wife Liz and their daughter Anne Marie. Jimmy is a self employed painter and decorator and as the book opens seems to be a happily married working man, content to spend his leisure time drinking with his mates, or with his extended family. His life and that of his family changes when, after a chance meeting with a Buddhist monk, he becomes curious about the Buddhist religion.

Impressed by the peacefulness and tranquillity he encounters when he visits his local Buddhist centre, he begins to question the lack of faith in his own life. He goes to a weekend retreat and what had started as curiosity becomes firm belief. Liz, who at first watched Jimmy with benign amusement, becomes more and more exasperated by her husband's outlandish behaviour. Things finally come to a head when Jimmy decides to become a celibate in accordance with Buddhist belief. Liz cannot understand her husband's apparent selfishness and lack of consideration for her and their daughter. For her it appears that Jimmy no longer wants a normal marriage and she forces him to make a choice.

Anne Marie appears to be a very bright little girl and quite mature in her observation of her parents' dilemma. Hers is the voice of reason, she reports the peculiar things that are happening within her family, but without prejudice or blame.

The book group was very divided in its opinion of Buddha Da. This is always a good thing as it generates discussion. Some people found the phonetic writing difficult to assimilate and were put off. Others found the story not well enough constructed, saying that Anne Donovan raised interesting points but did not carry them through. The ending was rather rushed and unsatisfactory, but there were some group members that enjoyed the book and felt that the Glaswegian argot lent weight to the book.
