### Edlesborough W.I.

At our last meeting Christine Yates made the exciting announcement that Edlesborough had been awarded first place in the Buckinghamshire Best Kept Village competition. We all felt very proud and looked forward to the presentation of this award and the erection of the sign.

A few weeks later a group gathered outside the Memorial Hall, where the sign was erected. Chris had been asked to receive the sign and certificate in recognition of the part she had played through leading the EDAN Beautification Team. Our institute has every reason to be proud of her. Well done Chris!

At our last two meetings we had talks on Ethiopia and plants for small gardens. Ethiopia is a country many of us know little about, and we learned some very interesting facts from our speaker Wendy Black. For instance, their calendar is 7 years and 8 months behind ours. We saw slides of their churches (they are orthodox Christians) many of which are built down as much as twelve metres, and this is done by hand. The churches are full of beautiful paintings, which our speaker viewed on her journey through Ethiopia. Two hundred languages are spoken by the people there, who gave a very friendly welcome to the tourists. Oxen and wooden ploughs are used on the land, and fishing on the lakes is done in boats made from rushes. Donkeys are also used in their work but, sadly, many of them are ill-treated. However, this situation is improving with help.

The scenery in Ethiopia is very beautiful in the mountainous regions, with outstanding waterfalls. The ladies do their washing in the rivers, and the children look after the animals. There are numerous wild animals including wolves, wild dogs, monkeys and baboons. Birds such as cranes, flamingos and love birds are also to be seen, as are the most beautiful butterflies. Coffee is something grown in many parts of the country. It certainly was a side of Ethiopia that many of us did not know existed, and proved to be a very interesting talk.

At our last meeting we listened to Edwin Rye on the subject of plants for small gardens. Edwin and his wife open their garden in Wendover in order to raise money for a school in South Africa. He told us his garden appeared in last year's T.V. programme "Love Your Garden" with Alan Titchmarsh. Edwin has a vast knowledge of plants, and brought some lovely specimens with him. He also passed round photos of many of the flowers in his garden. He gave many tips on the treatment of different plants, and answered a variety of questions asked by members. Edwin obviously loves his plants, and it was a pleasure to listen to him. At the end of his talk, his wife spoke to us about

a crèche in South Africa for which they raise money and visit each year. During the evening we ran a plant stall, and many ladies went home with bargains!

A week after our last meeting a number of us went to the White Lion in Dunstable for a tasty pub meal. It was a really enjoyable evening, as usual on our jaunts. We always have a great time.

The children form Dagnall school once again provided their art work, which this year was judged by Mr B Frost the flower judge and the society secretary Angela Allen.



### 'Lights, Camera, Action... a Film Made in Edlesborough'

The clapper-board snapped shut in front of the camera, as I hovered behind the film crew. It wasn't exactly Leavesden Studios, but I was still pretty excited!

Every now and then we all see cameras and lighting equipment and wonder what's going on. This occasion, up at Edlesborough church in mid-June, was the making of a short film accompanying an original song by a local artist – Soffia Osk.

Soffia is an 18-year old singer-songwriter, originally from a tiny fishing village in Iceland, who moved to Beaconsfield a few years ago, and attended Berkhamsted School. The video was made by volunteers, using the song as a backdrop to its story. I knew Soffia from school so I went up to the church and helped out with a few odd jobs on the filming: making cups of tea; fashioning the daisy chains, (an important part of the storyline); making a hundred cheese and tomato toasted sandwiches; and generally trying to stay out of shot!

Watching the film being made was a fascinating process, but what surprised me most was the hours and hours of waiting around – you don't see that on the DVD extras.

And so that was my Edlesborough film-making experience. Next time I drive past a camera crew I will be reminded of a day spent making daisy-chains, toasties, and a lot of hanging around.

### World Challenge - Argentina 2012

Many thanks to everyone who helped us raise the funds necessary for our expedition to Argentina by collecting clothes and household textiles, empty printer cartridges and unwanted mobile phones.

We set off in the middle of July and arrived at Buenos Aires in the morning after a 16hr flight with a transfer in Frankfurt. As we were in different teams this is where we parted company and went to different hostels which were arranged by World Challenge. The next day Stuart had a bus to catch. This bus journey took 24 hours to the beginning of the trek phase in the Andes.

Both of our teams had arranged to complete our trek in the same sort of area, and everyone agreed that the mountain scenery was absolutely phenomenal. The night sky was alive with stars and shooting stars while the sun rises and sunsets were just breathtaking. The trek took 7 days to complete and we climbed to 4300 metres, with mules carrying our big rucksacks and we carried our smaller (but still sizeable) day sacks. Our mountain guides, Juan and Jen were both lovely people, and also very interesting to talk to as they had many exciting experiences to talk about.

In the project phase of our trip Stuart had to help out at a school with a nursery, which was close to the Iguazu National Park and near to the town of Andresito. Here I helped to build a storage shed made of wooden planks which would be a great benefit to the school and also helped to paint wooden toys for the children in the nursery. The children took to the toys so much that they started to play with them, giving little time for the paint to dry! After losing embarrassingly to a group of teenage girls in a game of volleyball we said our goodbyes as we left for our next destination.

Meanwhile Alex's project was based in a city just outside of Buenos Aires called Tigre. We were welcomed into a school with about 50 children varying between the ages of 8 and 15. During our project we formed close relationships with some of the children which helped as we were able to teach them English. Outside of the classroom we were asked to paint a mural on the inside of the playground wall along with 3 hopscotches and a volleyball court. We decided that for the mural we would involve the children and paint the name of the school 'SAN ANTONIO' with different children helping to hold the letters up. We drew and painted 3 different designs of hopscotch and also an extra mural on the outside wall which gave the place much nicer atmosphere than when it had graffiti written all over it. On the last day we had a fun sports day with the children, getting involved in 3 of their favourite sports, volleyball, football and dodge ball.

After all this, we had time for rest and relaxation. We went zip-wiring high across a wide river in a deep valley and white water rafting where we got very wet and saw many kingfishers. We also visited the world-famous Iguazu Falls which were breathtaking. In the last days of our trip we were able to spend a couple of days in Buenos Aires and visit many different parts in the vibrant city, such as the spectacularly brightly coloured La Boca area and the Plaza de Mayo, where Eva Peron gave her speeches. We also saw the March of the Mothers whose children disappeared under the military rule. We also managed to squeeze in some tango lessons before we came home!

We have been given a great opportunity to explore a completely different culture in

a country half way around the globe, which is very different from England. We met so many different people who were surprised we had travelled so far, and we had a fantastic time. Alex Nilsen and Stuart Ranson





### Edlesborough Book Group

#### The Woman in White by Wilkie Collins

The Woman in White is famously described as the first in the genre of "sensation novels". First published in serial form in 1859 and then as a novel



in 1860, it has been in continuous print ever since. Given that Wilkie Collins was a friend and protege of Charles Dickens, a certain level of writing and story telling is to be expected and this book does not disappoint. The prose is rich, descriptive and easy to read pulling us into the very complicated story a little at a time, so that we have time to digest each twist and turn of the plot. The characters are colourful and varied, each taking a definitive role in this Gothic tale of love, mystery, greed and deception. We have heroines to cheer and villains to boo; all the fun of a Victorian melodrama.

A young impoverished drawing master, Walter Hartright has an eerie encounter with a mysterious woman in white one evening, little realising that his impulsive action in saving her from her pursuers will entangle him with a dastardly plot against Laura Fairlie, a young and beautiful heiress living in Cumberland. Fate takes him to Limmeridge House where he meets Laura and her half sister Marian. Marian is the polar opposite to Laura, not possessing the good looks of a stereotypical heroine, she is blessed with inner beauty of sprit and bravery. However, the inevitable happens and Walter is drawn to and falls in love with Laura. Alas, Laura is promised to Sir Percival Glyde and the lovers part as honour dictates. Now, we are introduced to Sir Percival and his cohort Count Fosco, a very dubious character, and the plot thickens. The ensuing convolutions of the story are very entertaining and the surprises come thick and fast. The device of having various characters narrate the story as if they are giving evidence is an excellent one as it underlines the plot very well.

Everyone in the book group enjoyed this book and the style and content was highly praised. We also noted the suffocating lives of Victorian women. Even those blessed with an independent spirit would have found it hard to live independently in those days. It is also interesting that when we have read the classics of times gone by, we have always enjoyed them and agreed on the excellence of the writing. We are now going on to read "The Moonstone" as our first taste of Wilkie Collins has made us want to read him again.

### So Much for That by Lionel Shriver

A brief synopsis of this book's theme, does nothing to encourage the fainthearted Lionel Shriver is a courageous and original writer who takes controversial subject matter and deals with it honestly, not sparing the reader from unpleasant facts. So Much for That, is the rather ambiguous title of her novel which deals with the dilemma many Americans face when dealing with serious illness, that of the extent to which they can afford medical cover.

Shepherd Knacker has a dream, one he has nurtured for many years, to escape from the rat race at an age when he would still be able to enjoy his life in a tropical paradise. To this end he has already sold his successful handyman business in New York for one million dollars and is living in rented accommodation, whilst he tries to persuade his wife and son to go with him to Pemba, his East African spice island of choice. His wife, Glynis procrastinates, and frustrated, Shep delivers his ultimatum. If Glynis and Zach

will not join him, he will fly out alone. At this point Glynis reveals that she has been diagnosed with mesothelomia, a deadly form of cancer and now, Shep's life changes; he is now the carer with all the responsibility and drudgery that that role entails. We see the debilitating effect terminal illness has on all the family members and what a small proportion of the medical bills are actually covered by insurance. This puts even more strain on an already tightened budget; but the sick person is still sick and the bills have to be met. Somewhere along the line a decision has to made as to how effective all the procedures are. Shepherd's best friend Jackson and his wife are also caring for their congenitally sick teenage daughter. Jackson is an armchair politician and spends a lot of his time railing against life in modern America.

Lionel Shriver uses this novel as a vehicle to vent her rage about the relationship between health and wealth in America and the disadvantages of being an honest working class man in the clutches of bureaucracy. She is fearless in her choice of subject and eloquent in her tirade against injustice. Although the subject matter is dark, the story is told with ease, is excellently written and has lesser characters who add a little lightness to the plot . The book raised many issues to discuss and all who had read the book, praised its intelligence and courage.





#### Salvation Sound - October 2012

"My eyes are dim, I cannot see, I have not brought my specs with me". Words remembered from, I think, an old 2nd World War song. The Lord says "You will open the eyes of the blind and set free those who sit in dark prisons." Isaiah 42: 7.

How fortunate are we, those of us who can see? Not many of us have perfect sight. I have recently had one of my cataracts removed; and am in the queue for the sight of my other eye to be improved. What a difference the operation made; the faces of people on the televisiion screen became clearer, colours were brighter, I could read the road signs as I approached them when driving,...but...I can't see to read properly, because the eyes now don't work well together and I am not to have new 'specs' until the other cataract is removed! But that really is not for much of a hardship. Our Father God has a special kind of love for the afflicted. The song writer Annie Johnson Flint put it well when she wrote: "To added afflictions He addeth His mercy."

A lady who went totally blind at the tender age of four was asked what colours meant to her. She said "texture and taste. Red is warm and velvety. Green is wet grass smell, it is restful. Blue is like water. Yellow has a sound; that of laughter. Violet is soft and quiet. Purple is dark, intense. Orange is loud, shouting, like the smell of the fruit, full of zest, a banner of colour. Brown is the smell of leather. White is the colour of summer. Black is like night, giving the comfort of a warm blanket and assurance. Grey,.. I don't like grey, it's an inbetween colour; like a dull, rainy day, waiting for the sun to shine again."

How favoured we are to have healthcare. Saul, on the way to Damascus was blinded by the Light of the Lord, his companions took him into the city, some three days later, days in which he neither ate or drank, he was visited by a man, a disciple of Jesus, who said to him "Brother Saul, receive thy sight". The whole purpose of Saul's life was now permanently changed. You can read his story in Acts 22. What a difference those days made to him; he turned from doing evil to doing good.

Our sight is a gift from God, not a fringe benefit, a gift that makes joy possible. One cannot but help add that there many more gifts to be had from Him. If you love and serve the Lord He will continually add His blessings.

There are occasions in our spiritual experience when it is necessary for us to take off our spectacles and look at ourselves with true eyes. There was darkness in the world when Christ was crucified, there is still darkness today. He died because dimmed and blinkered eyes could not see what was happening and so sat back and did nothing. There is ugliness, sin, depravity and injustice still in our world today. We are responsible for this world, and each other.

Have your eyes checked; then look around with clear and rational vision, and be thankful for the beauty of this place where we live and for the scenes set before us which because they are there every day, we do not really see. As summer departs the bright display will soon be gone and we will experience Octobers mists...

"Courage, brother! do not stumble, though thy path is dark as night; there is a star to guide the humble; trust in God and do the Right."





#### July 2012 Plots shows Temperature, Barometer & Rain




#### Weather Conditions for August 2012
