

November is a month of celebration, remembrance and dark nights. At All Saints Dagnall, on Sunday 4th November at 4pm, we celebrate our Patronal festival followed by tea. Churches dedicated to All Saints can have a field day picking their favourites from the vast array of saintly rôle models although you may not find going and living alone in the desert like Saint Anthony or being burnt at the stake like Saint Polycarp or Joan of Arc quite your thing.

How do we become saints? Those of us who are great thinkers and teachers like St Thomas Aquinas, have mystical experiences like St Catherine of Sienna or defend the church against worldly



powers like St Anselm may be in with a chance. There is also the possibility that if you have a bit of folklore named after you like St Swithun you'll end up with your own special day.

Alternatively, you may do the one thing that unites all of these and all other Christian saints down the ages: follow the teaching and practice of Jesus in your own way and in your own place and time with a true heart. We do not have to make grand gestures, we just need to look beyond ourselves and to love and serve our neighbours as ourselves. In stark contrast to the celebration of All Saints is Remembrance Sunday when this year we gather at the war memorial in Eaton Bray on Sunday 11th at 11am to remember those who died in the two World Wars and think about those who have lost their lives in the conflicts that have continued to rage in the intervening years. (Google, *current areas of conflict in the world*, for the frightening up to date statistics).

At the same time the shops are rapidly filling their shelves with Christmas gifts and produce, all tantalizingly displayed to persuade us to spend, spend, spend. In the current climate it is easy to criticise both retailers and consumers for a spending frenzy but as the days shorten and darkness descends the need for light and hope increase and there's nothing like a little retail therapy to lift the spirits.

And now an appeal: this year please remember the Dunstable Food Bank and add something from the *food bank shopping list* to your shopping basket. Lists are available from St Mary's church or contact me directly and help to bring light and hope into another family's life.

Bucks School Bus Service new charging regime for 16+ students

A growing number of dissatisfied parents are demanding that the discretionary fares for our sixth form students are reviewed. It is penalising and discriminating against those very students who have chosen to continue into sixth form education, causing many Bucks parents who simply can't afford the bus to try and find alternative education provision, usually out of County. We are also challenging the amount of the fare, which can be as much as £1100+ per year for families at this difficult financial time.

We have made some progress with MPs, Councillors and secured attendance at key meetings, but we need to represent the actual number of unhappy parents!

Please sign the on-line petition – We need to let the council know how many of us are unhappy at the huge fares!

Did you realise?

* Charges range between £75 - £1,100 per annum to access the same Bucks School Bus service? Often it is cheaper for out of area youngsters to get to the same schools that in catchment youngsters attend!

* Did you realise that if you pay in termly instalments you are paying more for the year??!

* Buckinghamshire students are amongst the highest fare payers nationwide: e.g. London students get free Oyster Travel and Berkshire students get annual passes for £75 per annum – is this fair?

* Were you consulted or allowed an input into their proposed charging scheme? Did you even know that you are liable to pay for your child attending 6th form and that the "Raising of the School Leaving Age" will not change the Local Authority's position on the "Statutory School Leaving Age of 16"? (in other words, we pay!)

Edlesborough Book Group Book Review The Hare with Amber Eyes by Edmund de Waal

Edmund de Waal is a well known and respected potter living and working in London. His porcelain installations can be seen at the V&A museum and closer to home at Waddesden Manor. He is also a descendant of the Ephrussi family, a fabulously wealthy banking dynasty, who built their business from a humble beginning as grain merchants in Odessa to an international business in the mid nineteenth century.

In 1991 Waal obtained a scholarship to Japan in order to study its techniques and to further his knowledge of Japanese porcelain. Whilst there, he visited his great uncle Ignace, who had settled in Japan after World War Two ended. It was in uncle Iggie's apartment that he first saw the collection of netsuke; 264 tiny carved figures in ivory or wood depicting animals, plants and domestic scenes. Originally, netsuke were functional items, toggles to secure a purse to a belt, each having two tiny holes through which a cord can be threaded and individually signed by the carver. Great uncle Iggie showed the collection to his great nephew, who became fascinated by them and also by their story. When after Iggie's death the collection was bequeathed to de Waal, he set about finding out more about them. He was not only intrigued by the miniature figures, how perfect and tactile they were, but also how the collection had survived intact over so many years of upheaval. This story of how a once hugely wealthy and powerful family could be reduced to nothing is indeed dramatic and the painstaking details with which de Waal pieces it together hold our attention throughout the book.

The netsuke were originally bought as a collection by Charles Ephrussi, a grandson of the bank's founder. He was well known in Parisian society as a dandy, but also as a patron of the arts. When a young cousin in Vienna married, Charles sent the netsuke to them as a wedding gift, where they remained among the sumptuous surroundings of the Ephrussi home. Ignace remembered playing with the netsuke as a child, as they were kept in a vitrine in his mother's dressing room. How they survived the Nazi regime and the repossession of all Jewish property is told vividly and dramatically.

This is a very idiosyncratic book, both in its story and the way in which de Waal writes. The majority of our group enjoyed it and although a few found it hard going to begin with, their perseverance was rewarded. A highly recommended book.


Thank You Geoff

News from Avril Davies

County Councillor Ivinghoe Division Bucks County Council Police commissioner elections November 15th

You will be receiving polling cards shortly to elect a Police and Crime Commissioner for the Thames Valley on November 15th. The job of the Commissioner is to hold the Chief Constable to account on behalf of the voters. The Commissioner is also answerable to a Police and Crime Panel consisting of one councillor from each local authority in the Thames Valley area and two independent members. It has taken a long time to build up a local force of officers and PCSOs who are highly visible in our area and responsive to residents and regularly attend parish councils and the Local Area Forum. I hope that any new commissioner will still give the same priority to local accountability and policing in rural areas.

Community Speedwatch

The County Council with the local Police have supported all local parishes wanting to tackle vehicle speeding concerns raised by residents. You may have seen small bands of volunteers including myself in high vis jackets on the village verges demonstrating the new electronic equipment, aimed at getting residents along to take part in speed checking their own streets. Speedwatch is able to record drivers exceeding the limit, inform police, and if high numbers of motorists are found to be speeding, alert the police enforcement team. Next month the teams will meet up with experts at the Local Area Forum to share their learning and put forward any recommendations to help with speed management.

61 bus changes

On 6th November new(ish) buses will run on the 61 route at long last. The reason this route has suffered such old buses for so long is because the new ones cannot make it over the canal bridges and get grounded. The new route will be along Westfield Road Pitstone. I am still in negotiations about routing the early and late buses via Tring Station. There will be some adjustment to the 164 Cheddington buses to compensate for the changes affecting Marsworth.

Police and Crime Commissioners – Coming Soon

On 15 November 2012, for the first time ever, the public across England and Wales (excluding London) will be able to head to the polls to elect a police and crime commissioner who will be accountable for how crime is tackled in their police force areas.

Nick Herbert, the Minister for Policing and Criminal Justice, says that 'The arrival of Police and Crime Commissioners will be the most significant democratic reform of policing in our lifetime.

'Communities will have a stronger voice in how their streets are policed and will be able to turn to their PCC to hold the police to account on their behalf.'

Police and Crime Commissioners (PCCs) will aim to cut crime and deliver an effective and efficient police service within their area.

To provide stronger and more transparent accountability of the police, PCCs will be elected by the public to hold chief constables and the police force to account; effectively making the police answerable to the communities they serve.

PCCs will ensure community needs are met as effectively as possible, and will improve local relationships through building confidence and restoring trust. They will also work in partnership across a range of agencies at local and national level to ensure there is a unified approach to preventing and reducing crime.

PCCs will not be expected to run their local police, nor will they replace the Chief Constable who will still be responsible for operational policing.

The role of the PCC is to be the voice of the people and hold the police to account.

I looked at paint, and wallpaper, bathroom fittings, furniture, ceramics, and glassware, finally I found myself in the section where artificial flowers and plants were. There were giant size chrysanthemums and poppies and the like. A woman standing by exclaimed "Aren't they lovely?" But to me they were unreal, not of this world, the roses though were so real looking that I was inclined to lean over and sniff at them but good manners prevented that. After this I wandered into the garden centre and there I looked at living roses; such a difference. Unless we are alive and have the Spirit of God dwelling in us, we are like the artificial flowers. We appear, we think, perfect. But time shows up our imperfections and lack of life.

It is the same when wallpapering; first you prepare the walls, filling in the cracks, rubbing down the lumps and bumps, sanding down to a smooth finish... then pasting on a good lining paper, finishing with the chosen wallcovering itself. At last, perfection. How wrong can one he?

It is much the same story in our lives, we try to cover up our weaknesses through our own efforts, make the best of a bad job; instead of acknowledging to God what is wrong and letting him help us to put right what we ourselves try to tackle alone.

In Jeremiah ch.18. the Lord told him to go to the potters house and watch him work. He did that and saw that whenever a piece of pottery turned out to be imperfect the

potter took the clay and remolded it into something else.

God can do that with us. Trust Him. Talk to him and He will turn your life around 'til the past mistakes that we have rued over will in God's eyes be forgotten, and we can then make good the present and look forward to the future. 

At our latest meeting Ann Brinklow was presented with the cup she received for winning the W.I. golf tournament at Mentmore Golf Course.

Christine Yates spoke of the cup and certificate she had accepted on behalf of Edlesborough for coming first in the best kept village in Buckinghamshire competition. The planters of colourful flowers, sponsored by local businesses, and the recently erected village sign – all the work of EDaN were among many aspects of Edlesborough which had impressed the judges. It's a proud time for the people of the village to see their care rewarded.

Jane Hirstwood was our speaker that evening, on the subject of bats. Jane is a member of the Bedfordshire Bats Group. There are many such groups in Britain, and all work in their own way. Buckinghamshire has two groups. The Beds group is of mixed ages. As well as studying bats, they work for conservation, educate & advise the public and care for injured bats. There are 1,100 species of bats, and this is more than any other group of mammals, apart from rodents. They are found worldwide, except in the polar and tundra regions. Britain has eighteen species, eleven of which are found in Beds. They are the only flying mammals and have fur and a high body temperature. In Britain they eat insects. A European law protects them from being killed or damage to their roosts. Neither should they be handled.

Jane showed us slides of many bat species such as the bumble bee bat which, at two grams in weight and 1.1 inches in length, is the world's smallest. When born a baby bat is one third of its mother's body weight, and it arrives in a maternity roost where the mothers gather. Churches and trees are the main habitats for bats, and they hibernate for part of the year. The names of species are very varied such as: pipistrelles, myots, daubentons, bechsteins, leisters, to name but a few.

During the last ten years the North Bucks group has conducted a fact finding project. One thing learned was that the HS2 line will go through the habitat of the rare bechsteins bat.

At the end of her talk Jane answered numerous questions put by members, proving it had obviously been a very popular subject.
