Making sense of Ash Wednesday:

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent in Western Christianity. Lent ends at the ninth hour of Maundy Thursday or on Easter Saturday. The six Sundays in Lent are not counted among the forty days because each Sunday represents a 'mini-Easter', a celebration of Jesus's victory over sin and death. Ash Wednesday is a day of penitence to clean the soul before the Lenten fast.

Ash Wednesday services:

Roman Catholic, Anglican and other Western Christian denominations may hold services at which worshippers are marked with ashes as a symbol of penitence. Ashes were used in ancient times, according to the Bible, to express mourning. Dusting oneself with ashes was the penitent's way of expressing sorrow for sins and faults and was sometimes accompanied by the wearing of sackcloth and of fasting.

The mark of ashes:

On Ash Wednesday people are marked on the forehead with a cross of ashes. The use of ashes, made by burning palm crosses from the previous Palm Sunday is symbolic. The palms were blessed on Palm Sunday the previous year to celebrate Jesus's triumphal entry into Jerusalem and the ash symbolises His death on the cross. The ash is sometimes mixed with anointing oil, this leaves a good mark but the use of oil also reminds us of God's blessing and of the anointing or marking with a cross at Baptism.

Traditional Ash Wednesday prayer:


As each person is marked with the cross on the forehead the Minister says, 'Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ.' This prayer is based on God's sentence on Adam in Genesis 3:19.

Keeping the mark:

At some churches the worshippers leave with the mark still on their forehead so that they carry the sign of the cross out into the world. At other churches the service ends with the ashes being washed off as a sign that the participants have been cleansed of their sin.

There are Services of Holy Communion with the Imposition of Ashes at St Mary's on Ash Wednesday at 10am and 8pm.

Details of Lent courses will be on the St Mary's web site and on posters in the local churches.



Bletchley Park's Secret Sisters

Bletchley Park's Secret Sisters Psychological Warfare in World War 11 John A. Taylor

Bletchley Park will be forever associated with the secret intelligence activities of World War

Two. Yet in addition to the incredible achievements of the code breakers, only a few miles away several other secret organisations were also achieving clandestine success, with operations that were conducted from centres hidden in the local countryside. This region had been chosen by the Government because it was remote from the London Blitz yet still maintained good road and rail communications with the Capital - but what did these secret organisations do?

In a highly subversive campaign, propaganda played an early and effective role, selecting recruits from amongst the refugees fleeing Nazi oppression. Gathered in large, local houses, there they would write and rehearse propaganda scripts for radio broadcasts to enemy territory. At a secret studio, these broadcasts were then recorded onto discs and taken by the Secret Service to radio transmitting stations, hidden in the local

countryside.

Under the control of the Communications Section of the Secret Intelligence Service, another radio station transmitted decoded information from Bletchley Park to Allied military commanders overseas. Further radio stations maintained contact with secret agents, sent on missions deep inside Occupied Europe. In hidden workshops, advanced radio equipment for their use was designed and manufactured and in various country houses specialised training schools were set up.

Later in the war, not far from Woburn Abbey an ultra modern recording and broadcast studio was then built which, when linked to the most powerful radio transmitter in Europe, began use in sophisticated operations that would completely deceive and confuse the Germans.

This book now tells the little known story of all these other secret activities, the fascinating story of Bletchley Park's 'Secret Sisters'.

Did you know...

World famous racing driver John Surtees OBE had his first solo bike meeting in EATON BRAY.

John was born in Tatsfield Surrey in 1934, the eldest of three children. Their father, Jack, owned a motor cycle shop in Tamworth Rd, West Croydon. Close to their home was Monks Orchard Primary school, which John attended before moving on to Ashbourne Senior School in Addiscombe. John was a talented and keen competitor in whichever sport he was participating. He was captain of the football team, a competent cross-country runner and also liked a bout in the boxing ring.

With his father in the motor cycle business, there was no shortage of encouragement for John to pursue a career connected in some way. John's first ride on a motorcycle was in 1947 aged 13. This was a Wallace-Blackburne speedway bike which he rode on a cinder footpath on the outside of the Brands Hatch circuit and according to his father, Jack, went round and round until he ran out of petrol.

His parents were both involved in motorcycle sport throughout the year. During the summer Jack would be at a grass track or road race meeting with a variety of 'ballast' in the sidecar, including his son, John.

Hence came John's first solo meeting in 1949, a grass track meeting at EATON BRAY. He wore a pair of his fathers' leathers, which were enormous on a fifteen year old. The bike was too big and heavy, a B14 Excelsior JAP, from his father's shop, now in Forest Hill. It proved to be difficult for the young novice to handle and he apparently fell off on more than one occasion, but did have the satisfaction of finishing the race!



John's road racing debut was at Brands Hatch in 1950, with a Triumph Tiger 70. He came third, but fell off whilst in second place on the last lap. He began his apprenticeship at the Vincent motorcycle factory in Stevenage in 1951, but had already acquired a Vincent Grey Flash bike. At the end of 1951, John had entered sixteen races, won five, come second in five and third place in two.

The next year, having a hard time on his Grey Flash, he decided to purchase a Featherbed Manx Norton. He was sold it on condition he entered a world championship event; this he did and came sixth, earning his first World Championship points.

During the next three years (1953-55), John entered 192 races, he won 147, came second in 13 and third in 7. By the end of 1960 he had won seven World Championships, won Sportsman of the Year Award from the Sports Writers Association and most famously, the BBC Sportsview Personality of the Year.

After some persuasion from the car racing fraternity, he then turned his full attention to cars, and in 1963 he won a Motor Racing World Championship. John Surtees then became the only man in history to win World Championships on both two and four wheels. During his motor racing career, he drove in several classes and models until his retirement in a Surtees Cosworth in October 1972.



The deadline for this piece was 8th January. Just in time to wish everyone all the best for 2013, and to make some new year resolutions.

My first resolution was to set up a new website independent of the County Council at http://avrildavies.mycouncillor.org.uk/ (done) and write something every week as well as carry on tweeting @avrilpitstone The down side of new year is reviewing the list of 2012 unfinished business. The cycleway to Tring Station being set to hang around for a while longer I think, but still very much a live issue on this side of the County boundary. And the cost of travel to school remains a bone of contention with me and many parents. By perseverance, using formal channels of the scrutiny committee, getting the views of head teachers, and with the help of others I have secured the promise of a complete review of the policy early this year, but I need reassurance it is going to really happen.

It's a bad time of year for potholes. Early in December I spent a morning with the County Council highways technician reviewing all the roads in the Division to prioritise planned maintenance for the next financial year. Since then a lot of unplanned maintenance, ie potholes, created by early frosts and relentless rain, not to mention heavy badly loaded vehicles, poor reinstatement by gas and electric work, and inadequate maintenance in the past, has totally changed the appearance of local roads.

There is good news. The Beacon road was repaired in 2012, and the Travellers Rest roundabout and B488 are priorities for next year. The County, jointly with Herts, has also achieved funding for a high speed broadband programme. Ivinghoe Library, now the Beacon Community Library, has agreed its funding with Bucks County Council, Ivinghoe Village Centre has done a deal also on very favourable terms with the County Council which has enabled it to successfully apply for a big lottery grant to look after the fabric, money the County Council could neither afford, or gain access to. The Freight Quality Partnership Beacon FOP persuaded the cabinet member for transportation that having a strategy for the movement of freight on the roads was a good idea, and has been acted on.

The Great Brickhill, Wing and Ivinghoe Local Area Forum of which I am joint Chair has been very successful in 2012. The priorities workshop brought people from all the parishes together to join together on projects to reduce speeding, improve footpaths, and facilities for young people. Innovative ways have been found to achieve projects, very often using pooled resources and money from several council services and outside grant giving bodies. The community speedwatch has taken off thanks to dedicated volunteers and shown that as well as speed restrictions, other road safety measures are essential. There are some speeding and danger hotspots, for example in Wing and in Edlesborough, which the speed limit review failed to address. In 2012 the Local Area Forum is going to tackle these matters through the speeding sub group, and footpaths and cycleways through another working group.

This year I will continue to serve on the Strategic Planning Committee and the Economy and Business Development Scrutiny Committee at Aylesbury Vale District Council where I am deputy group

leader and shadow spokesperson for economic development; and on the County on both the Scrutiny Commissioning Committee and the Health Overview and Scrutiny Committee where I am also deputy group leader and shadow spokesperson for Health and Wellbeing. Personal Robbery in Aylesbury Vale

The Community Safety Partnership traditionally see an increase in personal robbery offences during the winter months

Aylesbury Vale is a low crime area and Thames Valley Police and AVDC are working to prevent future offences. The partnership would like to remind residents of the following crime prevention tips:

- Don't advertise expensive belongings such as mobile phones and mp3 players.
- Always be aware of your surroundings
 turn off IPods & mp3s so you're more alert.
- Property mark your valuables with a UV Pen - if your belongings are stolen and later recovered your valuables can be returned to you.
- Register your phone/mp3 for free at Immobilise.com - this helps the police to recover your phone if it's stolen and capture thieves.
- Use cash machines during the daytime if possible. It is best to use a well-lit cash point. Avoid dimly-lit and deserted areas.
- Make sure that you put your card and cash away quickly - don't keep them on display. If you are carrying money, carry only what you need.
- Try and avoid isolated areas such as dark pathways, alleyways and avoid walking alone.
- If someone is trying to snatch your bag, let it go. You may get hurt holding on to it. Try to get a description of the attacker and tell the police immediately call 999. It is an emergency when: a crime is being committed, there is a risk of injury, or there is a risk of serious damage to property. In a non-emergency, call





In fact, Silbury Hill near Avebury is the largest such mound in Europe. The Ridgeway area has a diversity of wildlife, including fungi. monkey orchids. butterflies and barn owls. It has many famous sights, such as the 3,000 year old White Horse of Uffington.

The Pirsuit of Love by Nancy Mitford

The Pursuit of Love by Nancy Mitford, was first published in 1945 and describes the hopes and fears of young adolescents soon to enter the adult world and become independent, in an atmosphere experienced just before the outbreak of a world war. It is narrated in the first person by Fanny who, having been abandoned by her feckless mother, is being brought up by her Aunt Emily. She spends most of her school holidays with her cousins, the Radletts, a very large aristocratic family, at their country estate.

Fanny is quieter than her boisterous cousins and she tells the story more from an observer's point of view rather than being the main character. Her focus is on her cousin Linda, who is beautiful, impulsive, extremely romantic and is obsessed with finding her Prince Charming. We follow her adventures in the pursuit of love through the wise eyes of Fanny who, although fearful for her cousin, is never judgmental.

There is a lot of humour in the book, mainly from the characterisation of the eccentric Radlett family. The patriarch, Uncle Matthew is a curmudgeonly joy as he blusters and shouts his un p.c. opinions and rules his family with a Victorian rod of iron. As Linda proceeds helter skelter through her multiple marriages and liaisons one hopes that someday her life will become more ordered and she will find happiness.

Nancy Mitford was born into a privileged background herself and her family life has been well documented. In this book she satirises her own background, with a lightness of touch which leaves the reader to appreciate the darker aspects of its humour. We found the book enjoyable and easy to read. It gave us an insight into a world that is now lost to us and also showed how ambivalent feelings were about Germany in the 1930's.

November started on the cooler side with some frosts. The 4th was a particularly wet day with 17.22 mm of rain. After the first week the pressure rose, bringing us into a milder period, but this was followed by even more rain totalling 109.2mm — that's up 34% on the five year average.

More striking is that in November 2011, we only had 30mm of rain, so on that figure represents a 270% increase, year on year.

almost every day: I recorded rain on 25 days. All this and little sunshine made it a dull damp affair.


2012 was a year of contrasts with the first three months being very dry and warmer than normal, with temperatures in May being only 2 degrees down on the maximum in August. That was followed by a wet summer and an even wetter autumn, with a total of 967.3 mm of rain (38.08ins), 35% above our normal amount

Here, in Dagnall, we should think ourselves lucky that we had a lot lower rainfall than the average for the country. As we sit on a chalk bed, the water seeps away quickly, but by the end of the year, the ground was saturated meaning the puddles and flooded areas were not draining as they usually do.
