Easter is done and dusted, most of the chocolate has been consumed and the children will soon be back at school. I am fervently hoping that with the summer term just around the corner, the weather will now be warm and sunny by day with gentle rain falling overnight. This would really help those who are opening their gardens on Sunday 9th June.

In the Church, April offers us the opportunity to celebrate the lives of an interesting collection of saints, including Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who I mentioned last month (9th), Saint George the patron saint of England (23rd), Mark the Evangelist (25th) and the poet Christina Rossetti author of the beautiful words of the carol, *In the bleak midwinter* (27th).

Every generation throws up both sinners and saints. *Celebrating the Saints*, compiled by Robert Atwell, suggests that St George was probably a soldier living in Palestine at the beginning of the fourth century, martyred at Lydda in about the year 304 and who became known throughout the East as, *The Great Martyr*. St George replaced Edward the Confessor as Patron Saint following the Crusades, when returning soldiers brought back with them a renewed cult of St George. Edward III made St George patron of the Order of the Garter, finally confirming his position in the Calendar of Saints.

Salvation Walkethon

On July 2011 the UK government gave a contract to The Salvation Army to manage support services for adult female and male victims of Human Trafficking.


Greetings to everyone.



Council Tax Reduction in England

From 1 April the present system of council tax benefit in England is being replaced by localised support for council tax. This support will be known as Council Tax Reduction (CTR). Each local authority in England had to prepare its own CTR scheme by 31 January and, if an authority failed to do this, they must adopt a 'default' scheme prescribed by the Government. The default scheme is based on the current council tax benefit rules.

CTR will normally take the form of a discount on a person's normal council tax bill. For some people, this will be a 100 per cent discount.

Because each local authority will have its own scheme there will be differences between them. Pensioners are protected so, although they will receive CTR instead of council tax benefit, they must not receive less help than they would have received if council tax benefit had continued. However, people of working age may not get as much help, even if they previously received full council tax benefit because, for example, they are unemployed.

Someone who currently claims council tax benefit should be transferred to their local authority's Council Tax Reduction

scheme. Their current council tax benefit claim will then close. There are certain transitional provisions relating to council tax benefit claim backlogs and backdating. The government has published regulations which set out provisions that must be included in all schemes. These are provisions that deal, among other things, with:-

- what help pensioners are entitled to and how their income and capital is worked out
- how to apply for CTR
- · how applications are decided
- what changes of circumstances need to be notified
- · backdating of applications
- · extended CTR in some cases.

An appeal about CTR must be made to a valuation tribunal.

It is about "that priest" and his mate Nathan The Prophet and their "goings on" with Solomon. We have been wrestling with them for quite some time and we are pleased to observe that there is no longer the collective groan when Stuart Harding, our revered conductor, asks us to get it out of our folders. Indeed many of us are actually pleased to have the opportunity of taking up cudgels with them again. However there is still the feeling that, whilst we are generally slightly ahead at half time they still have the edge in the second half and we end up with a sort of honourable draw at full time.



Police Report

As ongoing thefts of jewellery and electrical items are still occurring the Police advise that jewellery is protected from being stolen by:

Esuring your home looks occupied when you are out – use a timer switch to set a radio and/or lamp to come on and ensure that jewellery is not left on display.

Ensure that your home has good window and door security, double lock uPVC doors even if going out briefly.

Always activate an alarm system at night and when you leave the property.

Photograph your jewellery. By doing this the police will have a clear description of the items if they are stolen.

Ensure that all of your jewellery is adequately covered by your insurance.

A Listening Far

I was once the chairman of what was known in those days as A Brains Trust. On the panel was a very erudite learned gentleman. What he said was more brilliant than anything that the rest of us could have said. We felt very humbled and insignificant beside him, but although he was forceful, he never really seemed to listen to the questions from the audience. A bit like a politician we may think! I sensed a growing impatience of the audience, this man had the qualifications of a first rate speaker, but he didn't listen.

Listening is a great art with which most of us are born. Babies use their ears to distinguish sounds to learn in their environment. Some will listen to a friend's experience with half an ear because they

are just waiting to relate their own thoughts, thinking of what they are going to say next.

The pulpit is traditionally six feet above contradiction. Will we preachers never learn? The best preachers are those who have learnt to listen so they may give out.

Dale Carnegie's renowned book "How to Make Friends and Influence People" has at its basis - listening. Everybody likes to be liked (even loved). So if we are listening rather than talking, we are encouraging others to like us, (even love us). In his book he relates someone meeting an author friend at the station. After the greeting, the author said "I haven't seen you for ages, tell me all about yourself" Then, after a pause, "What did you think of my latest book?"

Many think of prayer as speaking to God, but it is just as important to listen. How? This simply means opening the door to all kinds of rambling thoughts rushing into our consciousness. But we can prepare the way by reading something from an inspiring book, not least, The Bible. In the silence, rambling thoughts may come tumbling in, but if we persist, other ideas may give us rebuke, encouragement, guidance or the answer to some problem that has been troubling us.

But above all, spend a time each day to listen - to friends - to God. Then you will have a listening ear. Didn't our Lord say "You will not be heard for you much speaking"?





Room by Emma Donoghue

"Room," is the seventh novel by the Irish born novelist Emma Donoghue and recently reached the long list of the Man Booker awards. Its subject is dark and repugnant and at first glance a puzzling choice for a well respected literary novelist. How would a storyline dealing with kidnap, rape, incarceration and mental torture appeal to her readership? But from the first few pages our narrator, Jack, engages us and captures our hearts and we want to know how his story will unfold. We gradually learn that Jack is five years of age and his entire world consists of "Ma" and "Room" and most chillingly "Old Nick", who visits Ma at night, whilst Jack hides in "Wardrobe"

As Jack describes in his simple but perceptive way the pattern of his days, we begin to understand the horror of his mother's experience and how she is trying to normalise this for Jack. We learn that she was kidnapped from off the street by a complete stranger and imprisoned in

an outbuilding twelve feet square. Old Nick, as she calls him, provides the bare minimum for survival; but withdraws this if she is not compliant. She has given birth to two children since her imprisonment but only Jack has survived. She has devoted all her energy into protecting him and nurturing him; devising all sorts of schemes and games to help him develop and to not feel frightened. Room is Jack's world; the only thing he has ever known. It is his normality. Outside, is only glimpsed through a skylight or on T.V.. but to him that is unreal and intangible.

Overall this is an inspiring story of fierce mother love, endurance and the triumph of the human spirit over extreme evil. The social issues it raises for discussion are numerous and made a lively evening for our book group. We rated the novel very highly. It made a distasteful subject approachable and feasible. We found it a fascinating read and recommend it highly.


