There was a time when the seasons seemed to fly by. Winter, often dark and cheerless but lifted by the Christmas festivities is followed fairly quickly by spring, my favourite season. Spring usually provides at least a small bunch of daffodils ready for picking to celebrate St David's day on March 1st before we head towards summer and warmer temperatures. Today, April 9th, my first daffodils have only just come into bloom and the vegetable patch is a wasteland. Opening a glorious garden to the public at the beginning of June is a distant dream.

May is, however, just around the corner and as you read this the weather **will** have improved, the trees will be in blossom and the flowers blooming. I really hope so because the wedding season at St Mary's will be in full swing and my fervent prayer is that it will be warm and sunny for couples who have spent ages meticulously planning as they vow to commit themselves to one another for life.

May Day heralds the coming of summer, especially in rural towns and villages. In many parts of the country the village green is resplendent with Morris or Maypole dancing at the traditional *May Fayre*. This year the North Chilterns Group will be celebrating its thirtieth anniversary with a Pentecost Praise service at St Mary's on the 19th at 4pm. There will be lots of singing and possibly standing room only.

God has made us one in Christ. He has set a seal upon us and, as a pledge of what is to come, has given the spirit to dwell in our hearts. Alleluia and the peace of the Lord be always with you.

What a season of music we have to offer you at St Mary's, Eaton Bray this summer. Starting in May we have one of the top ladies choirs in the region – **Cantata Ladies Choir**. A final date for your diary is **17 August**, when **Saxes en Q**, a saxophone quartet, will be entertaining us with a varied programme including jazz and music by George Gershwin. The concert will also feature the soprano Min-Min Peaker, whom many of you will remember from last year's Poppy Prom. Tickets for this year's Poppy Prom will go on sale during the Saxes en Q concert.

EDAN Community Transport

EDaN Community Transport provides a service to the people of Edleshorough

Dagnall Northall who and are disadvantaged by local public transport. The service is made up of volunteers who give their time to help others in need of this service. We only charge for the fuel we use and £1 admin fee to cover admin costs etc.

Community Transport carried its first passenger on 23rd March 2011 and so we celebrated our 2nd birthday on 23rd March 2013.

At our initial meeting to sign up drivers we had 28 people who showed an interest. Of those 16 returned their application form along with insurance documents etc. Unfortunately we lost a few drivers because they had problems with their insurance company when they contacted them to tell them they were involved with Community Transport.

The majority of insurance companies do not make a charge for you to take part in driving for Community Transport. If you do experience a problem with your insurance company please let me know as at the moment we have a small amount of money to re-imburse you. If you make the change at renewal time for your policy there should be no charges.

At the moment we have 16 drivers on our books. They are made up as follows: 12 Dagnall, 3 Edlesborough, 1 Eaton Bray. If you know of anyone you think would like to join the scheme, particularly from Northall, please give me their details and I will get in touch with them.

We welcome all drivers, please do let us know if you would prefer only to do short trips and equally it is helpful to us if we know that you are happy to do longer trips. We are also very grateful if you can only drive occasionally, this is still a big help to us. Please don't be put off because you think you can't drive very often.

We have 43 registered passengers, and we have made 424 trips since we first started in March 2011. In January 2013 we made 43 trips, a record month!

In January 75% of trips made were for medical appointments. Trips have been made to the following hospitals, Stoke Mandeville, L&D, High Wycombe, Hemel Hempstead, Mount Vernon, Spire Harpenden, John Radcliff and Churchill in Oxford.

We are getting very good feedback from our passengers who have remarked" How did we ever manage before we had Community Transport". We continue to provide essential transport within the villages of Edlesborough, Dagnall & Northall

It doesn't matter how old you are - everyone benefits from good foot care.

Cracked heels or fissures are caused by dry skin, prolonged standing or malalignment of the foot or walking pattern. Use a pumice stone to reduce the hard skin and massage in a suitable foot cream. Avoid wearing thin soled or open backed shoes and choose shoes with a good shock absorbing sole.

Corns are caused by localised thickening of the skin often on top of the toes caused by pressure of the shoe, but also on the sole of the feet and even between the toes. These may be swollen and painful to direct pressure. Often caused by ill-fitting shoes, you should avoid tight shoes and hosiery. Use a pumice stone to remove excess skin and moisturise with a good foot cream. Don't use corn plasters as these can destroy healthy skin.

Sweaty and smelly feet can be caused by hormonal changes such as hyperhidrosis (excessive sweating) and being on your feet all day. Wear cotton socks and rotate your shoe usage. Wash and dry your feet carefully every day. Surgical spirit or witch hazel between the toes may help.

1st Paton Bray & Edlesborough Scout Proop 100 years of Scouting in the Villages



1st Eaton Bray & Edlesborough Scout • In 1954 a trust was group is celebrating the little known fact that Scouting has been in the Villages for 100 years. Our records show that the original group - then called 1st Eaton Brav 27th Beds Scout Group was formed in 1913 by Mrs Wallace of Poplar Farm.

• By 1915 the troop boasted its own band and held their first camp on the recreation ground in the Rye.



- In 1924 Mrs Wallace led a contingent of Scouts from Beds (including some from 27th Beds) to a world Jamboree in Denmark. Little more is known of the group after 1930 (but we would welcome any input to fill in our gaps in information).
- In 1946 the Group was restarted as 1st Edlesborough & Eaton Bray Scouts by Percy Pitkin, operating from Edlesborough village hall and a stable at the Old Vicarage.
- The Group was re-registered in 1952 as 1st Eaton Bray & Edlesborough changing the order of the villages as the then Aylesbury District team refused to travel from Aylesbury to Edlesborough and the Beds District would only come if the name changed because Eaton Bray was in Beds!!!

- set up to purchase the land next to the Village Hall and to raise funds to build the current Scout Hut
- The hut was finally finished and opened in 1959 by Lord Baden Powell's son Peter. To commemorate the opening Peter planted the tree in front of the hut – which is now the subject of a tree preservation order.



The Group flourished in the fifties and sixties and with much assistance from personnel from RAF Edlesborough, maintained this strength into the seventies.

Our Group has continued to enjoy success to this day and we have been able to source the list of many past and present village residents who have in some way made a fantastic contribution to keep our Scouting adventure going for the benefit of the village youth - we would like to thank you all!

Today, in 2013, we are able to report to District that all our sections Beavers, Cubs & Scouts are full, with waiting lists and that we have an excellent crop of trained leaders who enjoy fantastic support from the Committee and the parents. We are

planning our Centenary Camp in July and so far we will be a group in excess of 75!!! - should keep the catering team busy.

2013 has also brought us planning permission: granted to extend the hut forward by some 3 meters. This means we hope to finally modernise the toilets and kitchen and improve storage facilities,

freeing up valuable space in the main hall. 
the Yeomen of the Guard, some carrying the alms, and the dignitaries of the Royal Almonry.



A Chosely Tale

Have you ever noticed the impressive mansion on the hill as you drive towards Markyate, known as Markyate Cell.


It is best known for its notorious inhabitant Lady Katherine Ferrers. This wayward. spirited female, famously known as "The Wicked Lady", inhabited the mansion of Markvate Cell by day but after dark she would secretly don the cloak and mask of a highway robber and thus disguised as a man, mounted on a coal black horse. would rob travellers on the treacherous roads of Hertfordshire. Katherine, Lady Fanshawe, nee Ferrers, maintained this double life for some time, undiscovered until a fateful encounter near Nomansland at Wheathamstead where she was shot and fatally wounded. Her horse managed to take her back to the secret doorway leading to her chamber, where she was found lying dead on the stairway. The doorway was subsequently bricked up and remained so until after a fire in 1840 when a hired gang of labourers from London broke it down. It was these workmen who claimed to have seen the ghost of Lady Ferrers swinging herself on a branch of a large sycamore tree standing near the house. A substantial amount of treasure is fabled to be buried under the said sycamore tree, immortalised in a local rhyme.

Near the Cell there is a Well Near the Well there is a Tree And 'neath the Tree The Treasure be.

Lady Ferrers was also seen near the kitchen chimney of the Cell and in recent times, a cloaked figure on horseback has been glimpsed pelting across the barren Normansland Common, near Wheathamstead, and surrounding countryside on moonlit nights. It appears builders are a very psychic bunch. In the

late 1850s, more builders were working at Markyate Cell, this time repairing a wall, when they saw the figure of a nun walking in the direction of a gate in the wall. She then disappeared. Knowing that this gate had not been in use for years, the men made an inspection and found that the gate had not been opened for a long time. However, the nun was seen frequently after this at the Cell and walking in the avenue in the grounds near St.John's church.

The Cell stands on the site which was once the Priory of Benedictine nuns, founded in 1145 and dissolved in 1537. Much alteration has taken place to this manor house over the years, but the original building dates from around 1539. Perhaps the nun that was seen by the builders has been walking for nearly a thousand years! A report in a scrapbook of local newspaper cuttings claims that a baronet staving at the Cell fell asleep one evening, only to be rudely awoken feeling that someone had placed their hands on his shoulders and was trying to force him from his chair. Angrily resenting the intrusion, he swung his arm round to push the hands away but to his amazement encountered nothing. The grip on him released and he stood up and looked around. There was nobody in the room. The report ends with the statement: 'What better evidence of ghosts can be needed?' What indeed...


Weather Conditions for March 2013

March was dominated by the low temperatures, making it one of the coldest Marchs on record with a mean/average temperature of only 2.8°c. With wind blowing for most of the month from the east brought the cold air from north Europe and Russia, making it feel much colder. We recorded temperatures below zero on 19 days of the month, only the 6th 7th 8th were slightly warmer, the rest hovered just above the zero mark. It was also a wet month with 70.6mm of rain/snow. Snowing on the 23rd -24th on cold ground resulted in this laying there for the rest of the month. Comparing March 2013 with 2012 it seemed it was a different world. When we last met we **INSPIRING WOMEN** had to say goodbye to Mavis Purcell, who was soon to move to Eastbourne. Mavis has done a large amount of work for our institute since 1969, and we shall miss her. She was presented with a card, signed by everyone, to remind her of the happy times spent with us. We were reminded by Christine Yates that the EDaN Beautification Team are to hold a car boot sale on Edlesborough Green on 6th May (May Day). When the birthday cards and plants were presented, Margaret Hacking received 'special' birthday good wishes.

Jean Yates, the Dunstable historian, was our speaker. Her talk was on the subject of Medieval Dunstable, and she had an amazing amount of facts to relate. This year is the 800th anniversary of the dedication of Priory Church, and Jean and more than 100 unpaid volunteers have set up the Medieval Dunstable Project. As many medieval events will be taking place in Dunstable this year, the project team are working on research about these times. They have been successful in obtaining money from the lottery to help their work. Also, they have made contact with a translator of medieval diaries who lives in the near area. Archaeologists are working in Priory Gardens every Sunday and, from drawings made, it appears that the Priory is now only one third of its original size.

The Priory, we learned, owned churches and land in Bedfordshire and some other local areas. Some property was owned in Leicestershire, and land and sheep in Derbyshire were given to Dunstable in 1205. It is believed that Priory House was probably built with the profits from this. At that time, wool was England's big export, and merchants came to Dunstable from abroad to buy it. Priory Church supported many travellers and the poor of the day. During medieval times many tournaments took place in Dunstable. Hundreds of people came to watch the entertainment such as jousting, acrobats, dancers, etc.

Research is still going on for this project, and all the information will help in the summer of medieval events this year. Dunstable Heritage Centre is to hold a new exhibition, and there will be battle reenactments, organ recitals, guided tours around the Priory, etc. Jean told us that a book about this research is to be published at a later date. Judging by the interest shown at our meeting, this book will be very popular.

As well as hearing all the facts about medieval Dunstable, we had three outings. Firstly, we had a really enjoyable coffee morning at Caroline Colleran's home, and thank Caroline for acting as hostess. As well as this, we have had our annual pub lunch - this time at the Bridgewater Arms, and a committee lunch at Chez Jerome. As always, these were very popular events.
