

Jonathan Vernon Smith is the Sony Award winning mid-morning show presenter for BBC Three Counties Radio. During his consumer hour he helps listeners with their consumer problems and now shares his advice with you.

I've been fighting for consumer rights on my radio programme for many years now, and there's one message I have been repeating constantly - PAY BY CREDIT CARD!

Whenever I repeat this mantra, I receive so many calls and emails of complaint from people saying that I'm encouraging debt, I lose the will to live. However, I simply refuse to be silenced.

But why do I get on my high horse? I'll tell you why. If you pay for goods or services by credit card you are protected in so many ways. The woman who paid £1,000 by cheque for a bed that never turned up because the company went bust, the young man who put down a £500 deposit in cash for a new car only to find the dealer had misrepresented the kind of vehicle it was. These consumers could have received all of their money back with one phone call if only they'd paid by credit card.

You see under the Consumer credit act of 1974, the credit card company is equally liable for "for any breach of contract or misrepresentation by a supplier of goods or services on credit".

As long as the product or service costs between £100 and £30,000, you are covered for most unfortunate events.

There's also absolutely no need to get into debt when paying by credit card. If you were proposing to pay by cheque, cash or debit card then simply pay by credit card instead and pay the bill off in full the very next day.

So next time you plan to buy that new sofa, car, holiday or conservatory, FOR GOODNESS SAKE – PAY BY CREDIT CARD!

# All Encourages Edlesborough (Thildren to Wolk to School

Hello from Edlesborough School and The Junior Road Safety officers (JRSOs) Ollie, Georgia, Esme, Bryony, Natalia and Alistair. We are pupils at Edlesborough School and with our Safer Routes to School team we are always looking for ways to encourage families to walk to school. Over the last year we have thought of all sorts of fun ways to help us do this.

#### Walk to School week

Every year we have two walk to school weeks where we ask people to leave their car at home, or a further distance from school, and walk instead. We believe this is a good thing as it makes the road safer to cross, it's a healthy way to start the day and it helps the environment cutting CO2 emissions. Alf, always attends walk to school week and he can be found walking through the village with the children or welcoming us at the school gate.

During walk to school week we collect data on how many children walk to school and there is no doubt when we are all thinking about this more children walk. During our last week we saw a 30% - 35% increase on the number of children walking.

We understand not everyone can walk, as some children live a long way from school, so we added a 'Crocodile Walk' to the last Walk to School week. It's fun to walk with your friends and the crocodiles are led by parents who have been trained to walk us safely to school. When we have looked at the feedback we may make it a permanent 'Crocodile Walk.'

#### March for March

We decided to extend our walk to school idea for longer than a week so during March we had WoW days. WoW stood for Walk on Wednesday! If children walked to school on Wednesday they were allowed to wear silly socks! It really worked: usually 70-80 children walk to school but on WoW days up to 93 children walked, a brilliant response!

#### **Parking Patrollers**

We also worked with our Community Police Officer who trained us to be Parking Patrollers. We wore special jackets and caps and patrolled the parking area outside school. If anyone was parking incorrectly we placed a note asking them to think about parking properly next time. We enjoy being JRSOs, with Alf and all our other helpers we are sure more children will continue to walk to school.



# The Sense of an Ending by Julian Barnes

The winner of the 2011 Man Booker Prize, The Sense of an Ending by Julian Barnes is short, but quite elegantly written. Its beauty lies in its brevity and a complicated plot, covering many themes, is told concisely and with great precision. The story is told in the first person by Anthony Webster, retired, but still in contact with his ex wife and daughter and resigned to living a single life. One day, he receives a solicitor's letter telling him of a bequest from someone he barely knew, fifty years ago, when at college. She was the mother of his first serious girl friend, Veronica, who when their relationship ended, began seeing one of his closest friends.

Intrigued by this unexpected legacy, he starts to recollect his youth and his friends of those days. As the memories flood

back, he realises that with the passage of time the memory can become blurred, sometimes blocking the reality of what really happened. As we learn more about Tony, his schooldays and his adult life, we realise that he has made many mistakes and misjudgements of which he seems unaware.

Julian Barnes feeds us information very gradually and builds a mystery, which is solved only in the final pages of the book. This is a fine piece of story telling which is beautifully written and easy to read. It questions mainly the validity of memory and how, sometimes, our actions, long forgotten, can have serious repercussions on other peoples' lives.

A another very good book for discussion, it was received well by the book group members.

#### Chairman's Report 2013

Another year and a lot achieved. We now have a separate fund-raising committee and a new recreation committee starting up.

We have now been granted some money from the Lottery fund again so we will be making good use of it to improve the Village Hall.

I would like to say a big thank you to everyone who has given up their time in the last year, the fund raising team helpers and the Village Hall Committee and of course, the elected members – Sharon, Liz and Brian for all of their hard work every month.

Let's hope that during the next twelve months, we can go from strength to strength.

#### Treasurers Report 2013 AGM

We have not had any project work during this last Village Hall year, nor have we had any significant maintenance work. However, if you look at the balance sheet you will see that we have only just held 'our own' with regard to income over expenditure i.e. income £9463 expenditure £9233 a surplus of £230. Whilst a surplus is better than a loss this is nothing to be proud of. There is no margin for error nor is there any chance of building up a 'sinking fund' to cover any future

significant maintenance items or any self funded capital projects.

Looking at these numbers in percentage terms compared with the previous year shows income DOWN 11.09% and expenditure UP 11.12% i.e. a 22% spread this is very significant and alarming.

Hall hire was down 4.73% and fund raising was down by 26.87%. Expenditure on utilities has gone up significantly with oil up 21.57%, electricity up 21.80% and water up 18.37%

We now have an active fund raising committee and hopefully this coming year should see some financial benefits from this

As you can see from the balance sheet we currently have end of year funds of Bank general a/c £5678.99, Cash box £150.93, Sports & Recreation £986.87, 100 Club £176.00, Fete a/c £3.93.

This makes our funds down on the year by £505.83.

## Fab Fit for Physical Tips from St Judes

Now to get you into serious summer mood take a peek at our fret free summer tips.

Gardening – The first part of the year didn't allow such time for one of the nations favourite past times. So when faced with the mountainous back log of jobs just remember not to do in haste and repent at leisure.

Break up tasks and take breaks - Tackle some jobs like weeding at a low height and cutting back of plants at a higher height. Take regular complete breaks, your joints will thank you for it.

Happy Feet – We see a definite increase in plantar fasciitis cases in the summer and we often put this down to summer footwear. The ordinary flip flop affords no support and little shock absorbency and so the fascia under the foot, it's a bit like a piece of gristle that acts like a bow string to lift the arch of the foot, unsupported can experience too much load and tear. It can feel like you're walking on sharp stones and if not treated properly can take ages to

clear once established – so flip those flip flops in the bin!

## Edlesborough Parish Council

#### Chairman's Report - continued from the June issue of Focus

Turning now to some of the amenities provided by the Parish Council:

 Following the Edlesborough School last summer some progress has been made in finding new hirers for Edlesborough Memorial Hall (EMH). However. these efforts should be enhanced by the planned replacement of the existing chairs with new, more comfortable upholstered chairs in May 2013. The Council is very grateful for generous donations from the Burghope Trust and Edlesborough WI to pay for 50 and 10 of these new chairs respectively. leaving just the balance of 20 chairs to be funded by the Council.

The total gross cost of operating the Hall during the year was £9,279; the total income was £7,358, leaving a net cost of £1,921 for 2012/13.

- Edlesborough Green: in addition to the normal meticulous cutting of the grass and hedges, the Parish Council, for the first time in many years, invested additional money in a programme of aerating, feeding and 'community friendly' weed treatment of the grass. Despite an extremely wet summer, the grass and ground conditions were much improved, and the Council has arranged for a similar programme for 2013.
- In view of some damage to the Green caused by the 2012 Carnival, the Carnival Committee has worked very hard over recent months to develop a 'Bad Weather Contingency Plan', a new 'Green sensitive' layout of stalls and Vehicular Movement Plans which vary according to the weather and ground conditions. All of these plans should avoid any similar problems in 2013.

The Council is currently investigating the costs and benefits of replacing the bark chippings in the existing play ground with a 'wet pour safety surface', similar to that used at the Northall Village Hall Play area.

A great deal of the Council's time over the year was spent in preparing the Commons Act 2006 Section 38 **Application** to Defra for approval to extend the children's play ground, and for retrospective approval of the basket ball stand and tarmac pad, and the pedestrian entry/exit and facilitating strip extension to the Memorial Hall car park. The Application was processed by The Planning Inspectorate on behalf of Defra, and their responses will be considered by the Council immediately following this Annual Parish Meeting. In any event, the Parish Council will continue its investigations into the validity of the original 1965 common land registration of the Pebblemoor end of the Green. This registration also included all the land now occupied by The Pastures. The fact that this registration was shown to be invalid and The Pastures area was subsequently cancelled, suggests that the registration of Pebblemoor end of the Green was also incorrect. The Council is keen to have the whole of the Green registered as 'Village Green', which provides all the necessary safeguards without the bureaucracy of the Commons Act.

The total cost of maintaining the Green during the year was £10,434 (including £1,773 cost of maintaining and insuring the play ground). This was offset by some income of £1,100, leaving a net cost of £9,334.

- 2012/13 were:
  - Street lighting: £9.293
  - Dog Hygiene bin emptying: £3.862
  - Cemetery: £3.294, offset by income of £1.110, leaving a net cost of £2.184
  - Churchvard maintenance: £3,383
  - Pavilion: £2.789, offset by income of £1.309, leaving a net cost of £1,480
  - Allotments: £2,166. offset bv income of £1,548, leaving a net cost of £618
  - War Memorial regular clearing & tidving-up: £551
- The Parish Council also gave its normal annual donations of £1.500 to each of the Hall Management Committees at Dagnall and Northall to help them with the running and maintenance of their halls and play grounds.

Those Parishioners who have attended Council meetings over the past few years have realised the difficult task the Council has in trying to find the money to pay for all these day to day costs, as well as endeavouring to fund new and improved amenities. The Council is very keen to spend more of its time on future improvements to amenities/facilities rather than just coping with the day to day maintenance issues

So, the Budget and Precept for 2013/14 was the subject of much discussion by the Council over recent months due to a number of factors.

- the cumulative adverse impact of having held its Council Tax Precept at £64,000 for the past 3 years
- the Council's continuing aim of trying to keep the Precept as low as possible, compatible with providing Parishioners with well maintained - and where possible, improving – amenities

- Some of the other amenity costs in bench-marking with other local AVDC narishes
  - the uncertainty of the Government's concerning fundamental proposals changes in its 'Localised Council Tax Support (LCTS)
  - the complicated relationship which was likely to emerge, from 2013 onwards, between what used to be called 'Precept' and the total Council Tax income for parish and town councils, as a result of changes in LCTS
  - every possibility that the Government might cap any increase in Precept as from 2014
  - the Parish Council's Budget for 2013/14 requiring a total Council Tax income of £74,109

At its meeting on 17th January 2013, the Council finally agreed to set its Precept at £68,000.00 for 2013/14 on the understanding that this would be toppedup in 2013/14 by £5,803 of LCTS and £306 from AVDC. It was understood that the Government's LCTS would probably be reduced in future years, and that the top-up from AVDC was for one year only. The total of £74,109 in 2013/14 is the equivalent to £58.25 per year of Council Tax for a Band D property, compared with £49.85 in 2012. The new Band D rate of £58.25 is still lower than that payable in all but one of the other seven AVDC local parishes. (Cheddington £74.37; Ivinghoe £72.58; Slapton £66.34; Wing £65.11; Mentmore £63.48; Pitstone £61.39; and Marsworth £49.17).

After all those figures, I am pleased to report that the Rural Exception Scheme for eight affordable homes in Edlesborough has now reached the stage where the owners of several possible sites are being approached to determine if one of them would be prepared to sell some of their land. This would have to be at a price which would be higher than its agricultural value, but substantially lower than the free market price for commercial housing.

My thanks and those of the whole Council and, I am sure, of all Parishioners, continue to go to all the Wing South Neighbourhood team of Thames Valley Police whose work in the Parish has become so much more visible and effective over recent vears. In October the Parish Council was delighted to congratulate our own PCSO. Jackie Dodson, on having received the award for Police Community Support Officer of the Year for the whole of Buckinghamshire.

Your Parish Council continues to take a very active interest in the proposals to expand operations at Luton Airport. These proposals could considerably worsen the noise disturbance experienced by parishioners, especially if the flight paths have to be modified to accommodate the additional traffic and if there was any increase in night time flights.

I am also very grateful for the tremendous time and input from Chris Poll, our District Councillor who attends every Council meeting and who has kept it well informed of AVDC matters, and who is always on hand to offer real help, advice and experience.

I would also like to place on record our appreciation of the help and support we receive from Mrs Avril Davies, our County Councillor.

As I mentioned in my Report last year, the Council is literally inundated on a weekly basis with policy and consultative papers from the Government, AVDC, BCC and a myriad of other organisations which have, or could have, a bearing on the lives of parishioners. Much unseen work is therefore undertaken by Councillors in reviewing these documents Parish Council 18th April 2013

and submitting the Council's views and comments

I would like to remind all parishioners that. in working tirelessly for the benefit of the local community, all the Councillors do so completely on a voluntary basis. If anyone feels that they would like to contribute to the development of the parish, may I suggest they stand as a candidate at the next Parish Council election in 2015. In the meantime however, we are currently short of the second councillor for Dagnall and the Council would welcome any nominations for co-option on to the Council to cover this vacancy.





### Highlights from the Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting/Annual Meeting of Eaton Bray Parish Council on Monday 13th May

#### **Public Open Forum**

Items brought to the Parish Council's attention:

- 1. Are the grass verges the responsibility of the Parish Council? No the Parish Council are responsible for certain areas of grass within the parish, the verges are the responsibility of Central Bedfordshire council.
- 2. Village Hall Payments how many payments are still to be made with regards to the loan taken out by the Parish Council to support the hall's refurbishment? The loan was taken out in 2004, with a ten year loan period. The final payment to be made in August 2014.
- 3. Local demand for allotments? Currently the demand for plots is small. There are allotment plots at The Meads, off School Lane (Holmans Field) and Bower Lane plot designated as allotments.
- 4. All-Weather training pitch following concerns were raised with the Parish Council regarding the proposed development:
- Do not believe residents of the village were informed about this proposal.
- Believe the notice in Focus did not give enough details about the proposal.
- Residents living near the area believe did not received communication about these proposals.
- Residents living near the area did not receive communications from Central Bedfordshire Council regarding planning application.
- Concerns with the planning application - details within it.
- Concerns with the proposed lighting for the pitch.

Council with residents

- Concerned the facilities would not be legal, i.e. cleaning/toilet facilities? And would like the Parish Council to look into this
- Do not feel the Parish Council were acting for the community when proposing this development.
- · Would like a meeting to look at the proposals, i.e. Scheme of Use, etc.
- 5. Pavillion/Sports & Social Club does the council have the funds/budgeted for the costs towards the demolition of this building? Yes
- 6. Traffic and Parking Issues? The Parish council are awaiting details of the speed monitor that was set up in the village. The Parish Council do not have traffic power; this is the responsibility of Central Bedfordshire Council.
- 7. Would like more detail regarding council fixed assets

### Salvation Sound

### Shed and Carage Security

The Community Safety Partnership (CSP) monitors crime to identify any emerging trends in offences across Aylesbury Vale, which with practical advice may reduce. As such, we have seen an increase in break-ins to sheds and garages in areas of Aylesbury Vale. Padlocks on sheds have been cut/garage doors forced open.

We would ask that you are extra vigilant and take simple steps to ensure that your shed or garage is secure and tools inside are security marked.

Please take a minute to read the following crime reduction tips:

- Use a hasp and staple padlock to secure doors and windows, replacing ordinary screws on outbuilding doors with non-return screws or coach bolts (the latter have smooth heads that cannot be undone with a screwdriver or spanner and increase security).
- Secure up-and-over garage doors with padlocks through the inside runners, or fit a padlock (with hasp and staple) on either side of the door.
- Fit a padlock alarm. These are available in many hardware shops.
- Thorny shrubs growing under windows or against access routes such as drainpipes, walls and fences create an effective natural barrier. Berberis, blackthorn, rubus and pyracantha are all good for this and are readily available from your garden centre.
- Fix a grill to steel plates inside garage and shed windows.
- Keep your outbuildings in good condition. Burglars looking for an easy way in will target split, rotten or warped doors and window frames.
- Mark all your property with your postcode and house number or name.

Make a note of serial numbers.

This will help prove ownership if your property is stolen and then recovered.

• Please be vigilant in your neighbourhood and report any suspicious activity straight away to your local neighbourhood team on 101 or if you believe a crime is in progress call 999. If you would like to pass on information but wish to remain anonymous then call Crimestoppers on **0800 500 111**.


#### **Weather Conditions for May 2013**
