#### St Mary's Village Carnival 2013

ScI-FI This year's Carnival is now a dim and distant memory for many of you, but members of the Organising Committee have continued busy and I must report on one of the real pleasures of the year – distributing money raised to local good causes. This year we have £13,000 to distribute, equalling the records sum raised in 2011 and bringing the total amount raised in the 25 years that

Carnival has been held on Edlesborough Green to over £200,000.

My first task is therefore to say a huge 'Thank you' to everyone who helped in any way in advance of Carnival, on Carnival day and afterwards to achieve such a total and especially to the Organising Committee who work so hard to make St Mary's Village Carnival such a wonderful community event.

The procedure for distributing the money is well publicised - half the money raised by the Carnival Committee supports St Mary's Fabric Fund, whilst the other half is distributed among local good causes. Each year we donate one quarter of the money raised between one or more

nominated charities; this year our principal charities were Farm Crisis Network and The Pepper Foundation.

I have a bumper crop of apples and pears this year on the remnant of the orchard that once graced the vicarage garden. In its hey day it must have been amazing and before the advent of the home freezer I have visions of large preserving pans with jam and chutney bubbling away and shelves laden with the finished preserves.

I am sure that very little of the garden and orchard produce was wasted and hopefully parishioners benefited from any surplus. Sadly in the United Kingdom about 15 million tonnes of food is thrown away every year and almost 50% comes from our homes.

Why the waste? There are two main reasons why we throw away good food - we cook or prepare too much and we don't use it in time. The foods we waste most are fresh vegetables and salad, fresh fruit and bakery items such as bread and cakes.

The United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation estimated that 1 in 8 people were suffering from chronic 'under nourishment' in 2010-2012 and almost all of these people lived in developing countries. What are the causes of this hunger? World Food Day, October 16th 2012, highlighted the following:

- · War and conflict
- · Weather and climate change
- · Agricultural practices
- · Population growth
- Poverty

Yet the world does produce enough food to feed everyone.

So let us all do our bit by being more careful with the quantities we buy of perishable foods and also by making sure we use up those scraps before they get forgotten at the back of the fridge.

church and I will also pray for them at Evening Prayer (5pm) on All Soul's Day, Saturday 2nd November - you are very welcome to join me.



#### IIB Lions FC All-Weather Training Fitch Update

As we start the new 2013-14 season, the club is getting ready

to celebrate our 20th year of supporting and nurturing children's football in the local villages. Quite an achievement and this season we have 25 teams and over 300 local youngsters signed on with over 50 managers, a tireless and enthusiastic committee and countless parents supporting the club.

The club's ethos remains as strong as ever, to bringing the benefits of team sport to as many local children as possible, getting them outdoors, keeping fit and learning the important values of teamwork and respect for others.

Our fundraising for the all weather pitch continues to grow, standing at over £35,000 which opens the door to significant FA funding and grants to cover the cost of the build for this much needed local facility, as we face another winter of having to drive children away from the villages to train.

You will see in this month's Focus the Eaton Bray Parish Council are holding a public consultation to gather views on the project and the preferred location. We would urge as many local residents and club supporters to participate as possible. The club has worked closely with the Parish Council over the last 18 months on the plans to find a suitable location to bring this fantastic resource for children to the village which will also protect the grass surfaces for villagers' enjoyment.

Both The Rye and Holman's Field, the proposed locations, are used by the club currently. The all-weather surface will sit alongside; preserving the presently over used grass pitches for competitive matches.



#### Edlesborough Pavilion Steering Group

The Public Meeting held in Edlesborough Memorial Hall on 13th June 2013 to discuss the future of Edlesborough Pavilion, attracted over 90 people.

Following a series of presentations from the sports clubs, Sport England and social interests, everyone was invited to share their ideas and thoughts on the future. The result was a magnificent total of 110 yellow 'post-it' notes!

The meeting then went on to form a Steering Group comprising of a representative from each of the existing 4 sports clubs, 5 parishioners (Mrs Gill Woodhouse; Mr Bryan Hammons; Mr Barrie Boon; Mr Ken Holloway and Mr John Howells), and 2 Parish Councillors. The Steering Group took a stall at the Carnival on 6th July to publicise its project and to seek any further ideas. Including responses from questionnaires subsequently delivered to houses in the village, another 22 suggestions were made.

Together with the 23 idea categories which emanated from the work previously carried out by David Brown in 2010/11, the overall total of 155 ideas and comments clearly demonstrates parishioners' interests in the future of the Green and the Pavilion.

The Steering Group held its first meeting on 15th August and reviewed the 155 ideas and comments. It soon became clear that:

- 1. The Steering Group needed to reassure all parishioners from the outset that it would not be proposing to cover large parts of the Green in concrete, tarmac, structures or dedicated sports areas etc. Indeed, all the members of the Steering Group are as proud of the Green as anyone.
- 2. The existing Pavilion is no longer fit for considerations, and who have then gone on



its original purpose and definitely needs to be completely refurbished to make it viable going forward. It probably needs to be extended to provide additional storage space and to accommodate more modern facilities to bring it in line with current best practice and user expectations.

- 3. The key issue is whether the parish should go to the next step and take the opportunity to replace the building with a new multi use hub for the community.
- 4. Many parishioners had expressed an interest in using a pavilion as a venue for table tennis, bridge and badminton amongst others. These activities could be pursued without having to wait for a new pavilion. Edlesborough Memorial Hall is a fine village asset currently under-utilised. and Accordingly, the Steering Group will offer all its support to those groups wishing to pursue these and any other relevant interests, including help with applications for funding the purchase of equipments etc. Please contact steeringgroup@edthepav.org

Over the next few weeks, members of the Steering Group will be visiting other villages to see what can be learned from their experiences in dealing with similar considerations, and who have then gone on to build and run new facilities successfully for the benefit of parishioners.

The next Steering Group meeting will be held on Thursday 3rd October 2013 when it will review the outcome of the various visits and plan its next step. It will publish

its Report No. 2 on its website www. edthepav.org and in the November edition of 'Focus'

# Public Consultation All-weather Training Pitch in Eaton Bray

Following an initiative from EB Lions, our village childrens' Football Club, Eaton Bray Parish Council (EBPC) is considering a proposal to build a community all-weather training pitch.

In 2011, a site in Bower Lane was deemed unsuitable by Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) planning officers. However the demand for such a facility was understood and supported.

In 2012, The Rye Recreation Ground was identified as an alternative site and following a public consultation, a successful planning application was made.

During and subsequent to the planning process there has been some local opposition to siting the facility at The Rye Recreation Ground. EB Lions have therefore suggested that Holman's Field, (the field behind Eaton Bray Academy, School Lane) also be considered.

Eaton Bray Parish Council is now undertaking a wider public consultation and invites parishioners of Eaton Bray to give their views on the proposal to build such a facility and the two possible sites under consideration;

EITHER

a) The Rye Recreation Ground

OR

b) Holman's Field

#### What is it?

- The facility is a "state of the art" 3G green artificial grass pitch.
- It is enclosed by a 3m / 4.5m high dark green plastic mesh perimeter fence.
- Floodlighting will enable use in winter evenings and is provided by 6 lamps sited on 8m poles, with approved lighting at 120 lux (Eaton Bray Tennis Club courts are lit at 400 Lux) and with minimal light spill.
- The enclosed site dimensions will be; Holman's Field 60m x 40m / The Rye 50m x 30m
- · Cycle parking spaces will be provided to encourage environmental benefits



## Broadband Boost on the Cards for Thousands of Local Residents

A project to improve broadband speeds around Central Bedfordshire took a major step forward today when Central Bedfordshire Council - in partnership with Bedford Borough and Milton Keynes Councils - signed a new contract with BT Openreach.

BT Openreach is already upgrading its existing network across Central Bedfordshire as part of a nationwide commercial rollout. This will deliver 'superfast' broadband infrastructure to the majority of homes and businesses but this commercial rollout will not reach every property in the area including some more rural locations

The council's goal is for 90 per cent of homes and businesses to have access to superfast broadband (24Mbps or above) and 100 per cent to access a speed of at least 2Mbps. Central Bedfordshire Council is investing an additional £1.2 million to make this happen.

In 2011, Central Bedfordshire Council, Bedford Borough Council and Milton Keynes Council formed a partnership which successfully bid for a share of the £530m government fund to support 'non commercial' broadband improvement.

The three councils have chosen BT Openreach to work on the next phase of the joint broadband infrastructure programme following an extensive procurement process.

BT Openreach will invest £2.6m in addition to the funding from government and each local authority.

Councillor Richard Wenham, Deputy Executive Member for Corporate Resources said: "We have been listening to local residents and businesses, who say they want better broadband. These processes take time but today's contract signing is a crucial step towards making that a reality.

"We are committed to improving infrastructure In Central Bedfordshire and superfast broadband is part of that. Rolling it out will have huge benefits - it will mean improved access to services for our residents and strengthen the local economy by opening up new markets and helping local business to grow and innovate."

BT Openreach engineers will now begin to assess the areas which will receive improved broadband from 2014.

Bill Murphy, managing director NGA for BT, added: "This is great news for the people living in these areas. It is important to support local economies, as well as helping households in these communities. This is where fibre broadband can play an essential role by revitalising towns, villages and hamlets, helping businesses to be connected in these locations."

### London Luton Airport

Should you Take out an
December Westernay?

Jonathan Vernon Smith is the Sony Award winning mid-

morning show presenter for BBC Three Counties Radio. During his consumer hour he helps listeners with their consumer problems and now shares his advice with you.

It doesn't seem to matter what product you're buying, there's now an extended warranty available for everything.

The question people often ask me on my radio show is whether it's a good idea to pay the extra and take one out?

My answer is generally a big, fat NO! Under vour statutory rights you are protected for a 'reasonable' amount of time if a manufacturing defect occurs with a product. Depending on the item and the initial cost, this is generally as long as an extended warranty would last anyway. Remember when the retailer says that after 12 months there's nothing they can do, they're fobbing you off. The extended warranty is normally a way of charging you for something you really don't need. Sadly some consumers are so trusting of retailers that they believe the company's advice to be sound. I went to a well known shop once and bought a radio for £15.99. The retailer tried very hard to sell me a 3 year extended warranty for £20. I explained that if the radio failed after a couple of years I would simply purchase a new one at another cost of £15.99. The shop assistant seemed amazed that I was so hostile to the idea. Sadly I would imagine many people go ahead and pay an additional £20 that's totally pointless. You should however remember that often when claiming under your statutory rights that a battle will probably ensue. A battle that will require you to hold your nerve.

For most things I would urge you to fight that battle (and call me if you need help), but for other essential products (stairlifts / electric wheelchairs etc) you may consider buying the extended warranty just to give you hassle free piece of mind, and you know what? I wouldn't blame you.

The rule of thumb is always think long and hard before you hand over your money for something you probably don't need.

It is also worth looking into the idea of purchasing insurance policies that cover all of your white goods for mechanical failure. For consumers looking for hassle free piece of mind at a lower cost these can be a good alternative to the 'extended warranty. Please read the terms and conditions though beforehand and understand exactly what the policy will cover

#### Many Happy Returns!

So, you go to a clothes shop, buy a pair of jeans, get them home and decide that actually you're not that keen on them after all. Simple! You can return them, yes? NOT NECESSARILY! Indeed one subject often up for discussion on my radio show concerns the successful returning of goods to a retailer.

Let me make it very clear. If goods are FAULTY then of course you have the right to return them and depending on the length of time you have had them (usually only a couple of weeks), you should be entitled to your money back in full. If you've had the item for longer, then you can ask the retailer to either repair the item (if possible) or replace it. As I've said in previous articles, this applies long after the 12 month period, so don't be fobbed off by cheeky shop assistants!

Where you don't automatically have the right to return items is when you simply change your mind. Whilst many retailers operate a 'good will' returns policy and will happily take items back as long as they are in perfect condition. the law does not guarantee this. Always check the returns policy of the individual company before you make a purchase if vou're not 100% confident vou'll keep the item. Failure to do this could cause a very embarrassing scene in the shop and a generous splattering of egg on your face. There is an exception to all of this though, and this exception is even more important now than ever before considering how many purchases are made online. When buying a new product from an internet or mail order company, you are covered by 'distance selling regulations'. These dictate that because you haven't had the opportunity to see the item you're buying in the flesh (as it were), you have 7 working days, from receipt of the goods,

to return them for a full refund. Always confirm that you are returning the items by email to obtain a date stamp and please note there are exceptions to this including CDs, DVDs, perishable goods and underwear etc. Always check the sellers' returns postage policy as if they don't state who is liable for the p&p, then they automatically are!

Finally, always keep your receipts and if you don't, remember that a bank statement or credit card bill should act as proof of purchase instead.

than on the playing fields of Eaton (Bray). The club reformed in 1919, and has since gone on to win various league titles, the first being the Leighton and District in 1924 and the last being the Four Counties in 2009.





## Edlesborough Gricket Glub Eatiling Back

In its second season since reforming, Edlesborough CC was able to field two teams, with the new Second XI joining Division 7 of the Four Counties Cricket League (FCCL).

#### First XI

The 2013 season saw the First XI take the first steps towards returning to the higher reaches of the FCCL, by winning promotion to Division 5.

The demise of the club several years ago meant that, when the club was reformed in 2012, it had to start in the bottom division of the league, Division 6. In that first season the team achieved a creditable top half finish with six wins from 11 games, losing only two games along the way. With further new teams joining the FCCL for the 2013 season (including our own Second XI) the FCCL restructured the divisions, and the First XI found themselves in Division 6 of 7.

Second place, and promotion to Division 5, was secured in dramatic circumstances on the final day of the season. Much of the season was spent in the top half of the division, and the First XI were always in touch with the promotion front-runners. However, the only time the team actually got into the top two was on the last weekend of the season.

ECC's game against Bletchley Town was conceded late on the Friday night, gifting ECC a vital 30 points (albeit it had been a game the team had expected to win), then second placed Old Bradwell lost to the league leaders St Andrews, and ECC finished second by 9 points.

The team registered only two defeats all season, both against deserving champions St Andrews, who swept all before them. The batting let the team down in both of these games, not least at home, where an excellent bowling performance meant St Andrews were bowled out for 134, their lowest league score of the season - which should have enabled us to inflict on them their one and only defeat of the season.

Thankfully the rest of the season saw the team perform strongly with the bat, particularly when batting first. In four of these matches positive and stylish batting enabled the team to register high scores quickly and declare early. This gave the team extra overs to bowl at the opposition and the opportunity to attack and put pressure on, and two of the games went on to be won in the last couple of overs. Those four games produced 110 of our 234 points, which ultimately proved vital in securing promotion.

All of the squad put in good quality performances over the course of the season, and whilst it is not possible to mention them all in this review but there are four that must be highlighted. Chris Kimpton deserves great credit for his consistently strong batting performances, and his 270 league runs at an average of 54 were scored stylishly and quickly. Andy Tyne was promoted to open the batting and stepped up to the challenge admirably, scoring 291 runs at an average of 32.33, including an unbeaten 104 at Bletchley Town. Scott George led the bowling attack very effectively. His nagging length and line led to him being the division's leading wicket taker going into the last match. He ended the league season with 24 wickets at an average of 11.38. Finally great credit should go to Ali Thorn in his first full season, which included many useful batting contributions and a particularly significant 5-27 late innings bowling performance that helped the side to a crucial victory over Little Horwood. Division 5 should hold no fears for the team, and strengthening in a couple of areas should ensure the First XI enjoys another successful season.

#### Second XI

As a brand new side the Second XI's main objective was to field a full team every week, whilst also attracting and nurturing some new players to strengthen the First XI. With that in mind the 2013 season has to be regarded as a successful one.

Early indications were that it would be a difficult summer, as the first game brought a very heavy and disappointing defeat – yet whilst the Second XI went on to suffer a couple more big reversals during the season, performances did improved significantly. Paul Shepherd anchored the innings stoically throughout the year, not least during the win at Aston Clinton where he batted through the entire innings in a low scoring game to guide the team to victory. That win sent the 2nd XI to the giddy heights of 4th in the league.

Nearly pulling off a notable victory at

Stoke Hammond in June, where the hosts got over the line with one wicket left and two overs to spare, gave the second XI the confidence to push on and achieve the secondary goal of not finishing bottom of the league. Although victories were few and far between, the Second XI remained unbeaten during the last month of the season. And they avoided the wooden spoon with a win over eventual bottom placed Ivinghoe & Pitstone, where

Paul James confirmed his place as leading wicket taker for the season with 4-26, before leading run scorer Paul Shepherd once again shone with the bat, making 63 and only losing his wicket when the win was in sight.

The promotion won by the First XI, gives the Second XI a new target for next year - their own promotion (they couldn't be promoted from Division 7 with the First XI still in Division 6), and the recruitment of younger players is starting to show signs of fruition, and further improvement is an achievable target for 2014.

#### **Summary**

All in all 2013 can be regarded as a very successful one for ECC, the First XI won promotion and the new Second XI is now firmly established. Indoor cricket nets for the 2014 season will begin in February, and the club would warmly welcome any parishioners who wished to play cricket to join us there.

#### Post Mortem by Patricia Cornwell

Patricia Cornwell's famous character Dr Kay Scarpetta was introduced to the world in this, her debut novel. At the time of publication in 1990. Ms. Cornwell was working as a computer analyst at the Chief Medical Examiner's offices in Richmond Virginia, which she used as the setting for her story. The book went on to win many awards and since then Patricia Cornwell has had her work published all over the world, bringing her huge financial success. This book is the start of a series which spotlights the work of forensic science and its part in the process of crime solving. The story is told by Dr Kay Scarpetta, the Chief Medical Examiner for Richmond. Virginia, and begins with a call to examine the body of a lone woman who has been brutally murdered in the early hours of that morning by an intruder. This is the fourth woman's body that has been found in similar circumstances and Scarpetta is beginning to find an emerging pattern. Although brilliant and painstaking at her job, all she can do is present her findings and theories to the detective force and is continually frustrated by their chauvinistic attitudes and prejudices against a woman in such a senior position. Gradually, she forms a working relationship with Pete Marino, a tough detective who comes to respect her intelligence and together they start to unravel the mystery surrounding the murders of these vulnerable young women who, at first sight, have no connection. Kay Scarpetta's on/off love affair and her niece, Lucy, provide sub plots and interest to the main story and on the whole this is an easy page turner of a book to read.

Although the book is well constructed and Dr. Scarpetta was a brilliantly conceived

character, our group was disappointed by the rather contrived ending. We had followed the clues and red herrings, as we were meant to do, and which made us want to find the killer's identity. The solution, when it came, seemed rather a letdown. We presumed, because of her books' popularity, that Cornwell's writing has become stronger but we would only read them as a very light holiday read. However, the book gave us a good opportunity to discuss the issues raised about feminism and the treatment of women working in a masculine environment.

#### One Thousand Chestnut Trees by Mira Stout

Anna has grown up in Vermont in an artistic environment. Her Korean mother is a famous violinist and her father is an American. Her mother rarely speaks of her background and her frequent concert tours has brought about a distance between them. Although Anna is brought up as an American, she is very conscious that her mixed blood makes her different from her schoolfellows. When an uncle visits from Korea, his behaviour emphasises the difference between the two cultures and Anna realises how little she understands about that part of herself. After an unsuccessful attempt to establish herself as an artist in New York, she decides to pay an extended visit to Korea to try to learn more about her heritage. The history of Anna's family is a noble one. In the past, her great grandfather ruled over vast amounts of land until continual Japanese invasions eroded the family's power and possessions. The book's title refers to a temple built high in the mountains by Anna's great grandfather, as a gesture of defiance to the Japanese invaders. He surrounded it with the chestnut trees to shield it from view. Anna feels that she must find the temple, in order to reach across the generations and connect to her Korean identity.

This is a debut novel, published in 1999 and information about Mira Stout is scanty. But from the little there is, it is easy to see that this story is semi-autobiographical. It is written in three time frames; by Anna, her mother and her grandfather and by this device, the brutal history of Korea unfolds

Our group was unfamiliar with the history and customs of Korea and found that part of the book fascinating and educational, however we thought the writing style let it down. Only two members of the group enjoyed the book over all, the rest were grateful for the detailed information but found the writing overblown. We also thought that the author had written the book as an exercise to examine her own mixed Korean/American identity and an interesting discussion emerged from that.



#### July 2013 Plots shows Temperature & Rain


