Letter to the Editor...



...addressing the scenes I witnessed at the Eaton Bray Public Consultation regarding the all-weather training pitch proposition.

Dear Editor,

A brawling crowd spitting venomous quips. Unprecedented, obnoxious demands hurtled at each other. Unjustified rudeness and an obvious absence of empathy from this alleged team. Am I attending a football match? No. I am sat amongst my fellow parishioners in Eaton Bray's Village Hall.

I have lived in School Lane my entire life. Never have I witnessed such open aggression within this parish. At one point, I observed a teenage boy iniquitously shrieked down for merely attempting to put across his view. Parishioners spitefully demanded often futile and unanswerable questions from the parish council. Rude, indignant and wholly unnecessary under breath insults were made at any point put forward. Needless to say, I left the village hall feeling disgusted and physically sick at the exhibit I was unfortunate enough to spectate.

Whether the all weather football pitch is built in Eaton Bray now seems irrelevant to me, what saddens me is that as a village we are incapable of retaining politeness and consideration in addressing each other on something we evidently are passionate about. The Hope of Advent

November 7th: Charity Christmas catalogues have been tumbling through my letterbox for months, shops have all their Christmas treats out well before the beginning of December, I've planned the Christmas services and sent the *Churches Together* Christmas card off to the printers. I hope to make the Christmas cake and pudding sometime this week and maybe do some Christmas shopping.

I want to recover the hope of Advent this year, the hope that the prophet Isaiah talks about, *The root of Jesse shall spring up, one who will arise to rule over the nations; in him the Gentiles shall hope* (Romans15:12).

November 10th: the Remembrance services, well attended and dignified, are over. It was lovely to see so many young people from the uniformed organisations in our villages at Edlesborough War Memorial. Grateful thanks go to all those leaders who give up their time to work with these young people; our hope for the future.

Over the same weekend disaster hit the Philippines, this time not man made, as nature unleashed a power over which we have little control. Typhoon Haiyan devastated the city of Tacloban and three-quarters of the area of Leyte Province. An estimated 10,000 people died, many more are missing. Thankfully aid agencies the world over went into action within hours bringing hope and much needed medical, food and shelter relief.

November 11th: What is the hope of Advent? Advent is the time in the church's year when we remember that the story of Jesus Christ that we read in the Gospels is not yet finished. We know Jesus was born in Bethlehem; spent three years teaching the gospel of God's kingdom; was passionate about those in need, the rejected, those on the margins of society and was a thorn in the flesh of those in power until they put an end to him on a cross. Finally there's the resurrection, appearing to his friends and ascending into heaven. So, what next? The early Christians looked to the future awaiting his return and right at the end of the Bible are the words, *Come Lord Jesus!* (Rev. 22:20).

I believe the future belongs to Jesus. I may not be here to see it but you and I can catch glimpses of it in those who dedicate their lives to helping the poor and needy, responding instantly to the disasters in the world and those who devote themselves to nurturing others for no personal gain.

Waste Dumped in and around Achridge Estate

2013 has seen several incidents of illegal waste dumping in and around the Ashridge National Trust Estate.

This has included large scale dumping of mixed wastes in woodland and farmland. Several loads of carpet underlay have been dumped in the Stocks Road car park between Ivinghoe and Aldbury.

The dumping has also included the leaving of significant quantities of litter near parking areas where visitors appear to have had barbeques.

This dumping blights the area and can harm wildlife and farm animals. Waste may also contain invasive 'pest' species, such as Japanese Knot Weed or Spanish Blue Bells which have very negative impact on local flora and fauna. These also damage the Biological Site of Special Scientific Interest that covers most of the Estate.

The vast majority of visitors to the estate appreciate and value the beautiful

The idea was to help Community Impact Bucks complete a survey on how people got to the hospital that day and what, if any, problems they encountered regarding their method of transportation. We then had to let them know about all the other methods of community transport that are available in their area, including community transport schemes like ours.

Rosemary Halt, Viv Hill and myself helped Impact Community Bucks cover the session and I think I can safely say that we all worked very hard and really enjoyed promoting our scheme and any other methods of community transport that were relevant to the person involved.

Edlesborough Book Group The Great Gatsby by F. Scott Fitzgerald

Written in 1924 by F. Scott Fitzgerald, The Great Gatsby is thought to be his greatest work. Its narrator is Nick Carraway, who would appear to be Fitzgerald's spokesman, as he observes the shallowness and decadence of America's bright young things in the Prohibition Era.

Nick is a young mid Westerner, who has moved to the town of West Egg on Long Island. He rents a small house there and is intrigued by his immediate neighbour Jay Gatsby. Gatsby's home is immense, a huge mansion, and Gatsby is an enigma, apparently fabulously wealthy but with little known about the man himself or his background. Each weekend, Nick observes the extravagant parties held next door, attended by flocks of young people, but also sees that Gatsby never seems to mingle with his guests, standing aloof from the scene that he has created.

In New York, Nick has made the acquaintance of a young couple, Tom and Daisy Buchanan, who live across the bay in the wealthy area of East Egg. They are young, rich, indolent and are at ease with their way of life. Tom is a philanderer and treats his beautiful young wife very badly;

but Daisy seems to tolerate being thought of as a possession, in exchange for her pampered lifestyle.

Nick is intrigued by the sight of Gatsby, constantly gazing out across the water towards the house that belongs to the Buchanans. Gradually, as Nick befriends him, Gatsby confides that once he and Daisy were in love and were separated by the war. Gatsby has bought the house, dreaming that one day he and Daisy could meet. He asks Nick to invite Daisy to tea one afternoon, so that he can appear to meet her again by chance. Nick does this and Gatsby and Daisy rekindle their affair, with disastrous consequences for all concerned

Francis Scott Fitzgerald wrote from the heart about the Jazz Age, he and his wife were part of it and he was very aware, as his writing shows, of the corruption and loose morals around him. He writes sparely and brilliantly, his descriptions of the parties and the people there, come alive and glitter on the pages. He died aged only forty four, having tasted the bitter side of the American Dream.



How to Purchase Safely on the Winter-Web

Jonathan Vernon Smith is the Sony Award winning mid-

morning show presenter for BBC Three Counties Radio. During his consumer hour he helps listeners with their consumer problems and now shares his advice with you.

The internet has been with us since the mid 90s. Whilst it has of course brought some fantastic benefits to our lives, it has also created some absolute headaches as well.

The fact the entire world is accessible in our homes is a wonderful thing, but it is worth noting that there are lots of internet companies out there, particularly those in other countries that can provide a less than desirable service. So how can you protect yourself against these companies, particularly when making purchases for Christmas?

The most important thing you can do, is to of course avoid buying items from dodgy internet companies in the first place. It sounds simple, but you'd be amazed how many people still find some weird company online that nobody's ever heard of and hand over hundreds of pounds. They are then amazed when they find themselves out of pocket without the goods they've ordered.

Therefore, always make sure you research the internet company you are planning to buy from. Find out where they're based, look for a UK telephone number, check reviews and complaints about them so you know exactly who you're dealing with. Ensure that their delivery timeframe will ensure your gifts will arrive in plenty of time for Christmas.

Make sure you're paying a sensible price. If a company is selling an item at

a ridiculously low price compared to all other companies, there's usually a reason why. Often the items are fake. Over the years I've dealt with my fair share of customers who thought they were getting a great deal with 'Ugg boots' or 'GHD hair straighteners', only to find they've bought fakes from a company abroad.

You should always pay for goods by credit card but particularly when buying over the internet. It is worth noting that you are not protected by the consumer credit act unless you're paying over £100, but vou're still more likely to get your money back using a credit card rather than debit card, cheque or bank transfer. I would go so far as to say you should NEVER buy goods from a company that asks you to transfer money directly into their account. If you decide you're going to buy Christmas presents from an online auction site like ebay, it is worth familiarising yourself with their safety advice. You generally have fewer rights when buying goods in this way, particularly if they are second hand. Paying by paypal and ensuring that you NEVER collect items in person will go some way to protecting Only buy from highly rated vourself. sellers based in the UK

It is worth remembering that when you buy brand new items over the internet, you are protected by the distance selling regulations. Because you haven't had the chance to see the item in the flesh, you have 7 days from delivery to change your mind and send it back for a full refund. Unless the company specifies their returns postage policy, then they are liable for the postage too. Make sure you order things online in plenty of time to allow for this, after all, you don't want unhappy friends and relatives whose presents are NOT under the tree.


