#### Whoopee!

The British Board of Film Classification is to review its guidelines for certification saying that it would pay particular attention to the impact of gore and strong visuals in its deliberations, as well as acknowledging that the sexualisation of young women in film and music videos is a major concern.

The BBFC has also said it will give greater weight to the theme and tone of films which are issued with parental guidance (PG) and those suitable for 12 year olds and over (12A).

Changes to the guidelines will come into force on the 24th February but the BBFC admitted that there will be ongoing work with regard to the 12A classification as it continues to confuse many viewers.

It was interesting and heartening to read some of the online discussion. Responses included concern that the average teenager is exposed to far worse on the internet, on the news and in their everyday life than anything they would find in the cinema. I cheered on reading the comment that society has a duty to protect children.





# EB Lions Astro Children Denied Training Pitch

At the December meeting of the Eaton Bray Parish Council (EBPC) the decision to proceed with the building of an all-weather training facility in the village was quashed which effectively means that the project will not go ahead. E B Lions provides football to the children in and around all the villages and this season is our most successful ever – 25 teams and over 320 players spanning U5's to U17, including 4 successful Girls teams and a new U21 team

For the past 3 years EB Lions have been working tirelessly, professionally and persistently on plans to obtain planning permission and then to build an all-weather 3G training pitch following clear indications of support by EBPC for a joint project.

This was an ambitious project, costing over £275,000 but with the support of Beds FA and skill of the Club, the project was viable and achievable at **no cost** to the parish council. Moreover, it needed no external 'non-village' use to make it financially viable as it was entirely self-funding. A joint planning application was initially made on a site in Bower Lane, which despite convincing the planners of the worthiness and benefit, was eventually agreed that the site was just not right given Highway issues so alternative sites in the village were sought.

The site favoured by EBPC and EB Lions was on the Recreation Ground at The Rye and in November 2012 planning permission was granted, subject to agreement of the operational details. By this point a small local opposition became so vehement, even to the extent of making spurious legal threats that EBPC's

resolve began to evaporate. At this late stage, EB Lions suggested to EBPC that one of the previously identified sites, Holman's Field (School Lane) could be considered as an alternative. That suggestion and the opposition led EBPC to a full public consultation process that culminated in a shameful public meeting in October at which supposedly sane adults were seen and heard shouting at children in attempting to give creditability to irrelevant arguments, half-truths and distortions that have been continually repeated.

The formal public consultation vote was a clear YES, rather inconvenient to the EBPC and opponents but nevertheless, being only a consultation has been conveniently ignored.

The practical result of this decision for the club may well mean a reduction in the number of teams due to a lack of training playing surfaces which means fewer children in our villages playing sport but the full consequences of this decision will only become evident over the coming years. The community has lost the opportunity to have a fully funded top quality sports facility. EBPC councillors have bowed to a small number of noisy complainers and despite some individual members rather embarrassingly commending EB Lions of doing a fine job at the same time as killing the project, have let down the community they serve. Progress is destined to fail while it remains so much easier to say "No" than to embrace opportunity and change. The Olympic spirit has now left Eaton Bray for good.

Floodlights would only be used through the dark Winter/Spring Nights and then as far as I understand only until about 9.30.p.m, so would affect no one. As to noise, rather the sound of children playing than the quiet of kids with NOTHING better to do than hanging around on street corners planning their next burglary or drug fix.

These were enjoyed by members present. Thanks go to them.



### Precept 2014/15

The Council has agreed a Precept of £82,155 for 2014/15. This means that the rate for a Band D property will be £66.05 compared to £58.25 in 2013/14, giving an increase of £7.80 per annum (13.4%). This increase is primarily due to two factors. Firstly, the Government's 'Localised Council Tax Support' is being reduced from last year's £5,803 to £1,845 in 2014/15. Secondly, the first payment will need to be paid into a 'sinking fund' which needs to be built-up over the next few years to pay for the upgrading of the Parish's 143 street lights, and the replacement of some of the poles.

# Council Seeks Residents' Views on Spending Plans

Central Bedfordshire has published its draft 2014/15 budget and has launched a public consultation on its proposals for spending £186 million next year as well as suggested savings and investments.

In keeping with a previous pledge, the draft budget is based on freezing the Council's proportion of council tax for a fourth year running and protecting front line services.

The greatest proportion of funds – 58 per cent of the overall budget - are earmarked for services for children and social care for vulnerable members of our communities, reflecting increasing demands on these services. The draft budget includes proposals for making funds stretch further, such as using local rather than expensive out-county care placements for children and providing alternatives to costly residential and social care services for adults

As well as accommodating increased demands on services, the council needs to make further savings because, in common with local authorities across England, funding for the Council has been reduced by more than a quarter. The savings needed for £2014/15 stand at £17.4 million, with a further £25.6 million needed over the following three years.

Proposed savings include reductions in building-related costs, councillor expenses and non-front line services such as consultants and agency staff. There are also plans to secure better deals when retendering contracts.

The budget proposals also include plans for investment, including £48 million from the Housing Revenue Account over the next four years to improve accommodation for older people and build new facilities such as the new Priory View extra care scheme in Dunstable. Investments of over £91 million are proposed from the capital budget to provide more school places, better waste treatment facilities and improve the road network.

Investing in technology will help services run more cost-effectively, while capital spending to upgrade leisure centres will generate additional income that will cover costs.

A number of other measures are being proposed to increase income offset the need for further savings. These include charging for pest control services, increasing rents on council owned commercial properties and farms. improving debt recovery and generating more advertising and sponsorship income. Executive Member for Corporate Resources and Deputy Leader of the Council, Cllr Maurice Jones says: "We have a proven track record of delivering savings, having delivered £60 million of efficiencies since the council came into existence in 2009

"We remain determined to deliver value for money, so we have carefully scrutinised our spending to look at where further efficiency savings can be made or income generated and have put together a budget that allows us to maintain essential services.

"We also remain committed to listening to our residents and I hope that people will take time to look at our proposals and give us their views."

The council's spending plans are open for public consultation until Friday, 31

January 2014. Further information and a budget survey are available online at www.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/consultations. Paper copies of the consultation documents are also available at the council's Priory House and Watling House offices.

The Executive will use the feedback

from the public consultation to finalise its budget proposals which will be considered by full Council on 20 February.

# Effective Book Group When God was a Rabbit by Sarah Winman

The intriguing title of this book is soon explained. Elly Portman, its narrator, is remembering her childhood living in a suburban neighbourhood of Essex, with her parents and older brother. She is an intelligent, observant little girl, who feels different from her contemporaries and more at ease with adults. Joe, her brother, with whom she has a close bond, realises her isolation and presents her with a pet rabbit. When she is told that the rabbit cannot be named Eleanor she promptly christens him God.

The book has two parts. The first tells of Elly's childhood in Essex and of the uprooting of the family to Cornwall, where her parents turn a beautiful old house into a successful B and B. The second half starts when she is twenty seven and follows her life in London,

where she is trying to establish herself and also her visits to her brother, who lives in New York. Her story covers the period from 1968 to 2001 and brings in most of the major events of those years. The many peripheral characters circling Elly and Joe are varied and colourful and add humour and pathos to their story. Essentially though, it is the story of a family and the value of love in its many forms.

Sarah Winman wrote this, her first novel, after life as an actress and after a writing course at the University of East Anglia. When God was a Rabbit is well written and easy to read. There is a lot to commend it and all but two members of the reading group enjoyed the book. Our criticism was that it was easy to read and very easy to forget.

# The Eest Way to Buy a Car



BBC Three Counties Radio. During his consumer hour he helps listeners with their consumer problems and now shares his advice with you.

Mobile phones, internet connections and cars are the three products I receive the most calls about on my consumer radio show. Today I'd like to help you avoid problems with the latter – cars! Buying a good, reliable car rather than a nightmare vehicle that will eat into your wallet is a good way to start.

The first important thing you must understand is that unless you buy a car from a proper retailer, you have no comeback if the car develops a fault. The minute you drive a new car away from a private seller, you're on your own if it breaks down. I therefore always suggest buying cars from good, reputable garages, and if you can stretch to it, main dealers. They, generally (and I use that word with caution - some are awful!), offer the best after sales service.

Secondly, you must do your research. Use the internet to find the most suitable car for you. Look at reliability scores, running costs and insurance. Don't rush into purchasing a car you know nothing about on the forecourt, just because you think you'll look good in it. Find something that's the right size, has a good reputation for reliability and isn't going to cost the earth to run.

The third thing you must do is to buy LOCALLY. Please don't make the mistake that so many people make these days. They go to a search website, enter the car of their dreams, find that the only independent garage that has one available

in the colour they like is 300 miles away and travel up by train to buy it. If you have a problem with that vehicle it will be YOUR responsibility to get it back to them to repair. That's going to be a very expensive journey on a recovery vehicle all the way to Manchester! Use the internet to research garages and the people that run them.

Fourthly, if you don't know anything about cars, then for goodness sake, take someone with you who does! A friendly mechanic is best. If you don't know anyone who is an expert, then I would strongly advise having an independent check on the vehicle by an organisation such as the RAC. It may cost a couple of hundred quid, but it's worth every penny if it prevents you from buying a complete lemon. A car is normally the second most expensive thing you purchase after a house, I lose track of the number of people who spend £15,000+ on something they know and understand absolutely nothing about and then wonder why they have problems.

Please remember that when you find a car that you like, DO NOT PUT A DEPOSIT DOWN UNLESS YOU REALLY INTEND TO BUY IT. When you agree to pay a deposit, you normally enter into a legally binding contract to purchase the product. If you change your mind, you not only risk losing the deposit, you could be forced by the garage to take the car and pay the full amount owing on it. Salesmen and women often suggest the deposit in a relaxed manner. Don't be fooled, when you change your mind, the relaxed manner will probably fly right out of the window.

up with some room for negotiation. If you pay the price on the windscreen, you're probably paying over the odds. Remember car salesmen and women are employed partly because of their ability to get as much money out of you as possible and make the company as much profit. Bear this in mind at all times when agreeing a price to pay. If you're hopeless at doing a deal, then take someone with you who is good at it!

Finally, if you follow all of my advice and you STILL have a problem with it or the garage, then you can contact me at BBC Three Counties Radio and I'll do my best to try and help you.

# Knowing when to go to Courti

Thankfully most consumer disputes can be settled through effective and firm dialogue. If not, there are programmes such as mine that offer additional assistance for people who are finding it difficult to resolve their consumer complaint.

However, some cases just cannot be resolved, no matter how hard one or both parties try. It is for these cases that the small claims court can be very helpful.

This month, I will outline how to use the small claims court system to obtain the best results.

Firstly, DO NOT RUSH TO COURT. In my experience, judges often look unfavourably at customers who are seen to take a company to court too quickly. It makes the consumer look unreasonable which never bodes well. Therefore always try as hard as you can to resolve the complaint between yourselves first. Consider the small claims court your last resort and it is essential that you have kept a record of your conversations and correspondence.

When you reach the conclusion that (within 6 years of the dispute and for amounts up to £10,000) the company or tradesman is not prepared to resolve the problem, you must write a letter of intention. Make it clear in the letter that you have tried hard to offer them opportunities to resolve the problem and that you would like to offer them one final opportunity. Allow them one month from receipt of the letter to respond, and make it clear that if you do not hear from them, you will lodge papers with the small claims court. Send the letter recorded delivery and ensure they have received it and signed for it.

If they still show no interest in resolving the dispute, then you have an important decision to make. Will you go through with your threat of court action or not? If you decide on the former, you must go into it with your eyes open. You can always lose as well as win, however it may not cost you as much as you may think. The fee is dependent on how much you are suing for, but this will be outlined when you proceed with the action. If you are successful, the defendant will have to pay your costs as well as the amount you are claiming for.

It is also worth noting that you do not need a lawyer to take someone to the small claims court. It's relatively straight forward, and as long as you've been reasonable and sensible in your dealings with the company or tradesman, you stand a good chance of getting a favourable judgement.

In many cases, mediation is offered as a way of agreeing a course of action. The result of this is not legally binding, and most often I would advise you to proceed with this where offered. It doesn't prevent you progressing a case to a judge if unsuccessful. However, turning it down can made you look unreasonable.

If things go your way, the judge will award in your favour and will request that the defendant pays you a sum of money (either the whole of the amount you're seeking, or a proportion of it). They will be given instructions as to how to pay it, and if they fail to do so, you can instruct county court bailiffs to recover the money. You can also escalate the case to the high court for a further fee and instruct the high court enforcement officers to chase your money.

Taking a company to court can be a daunting prospect, and I would always suggest obtaining advice from your local citizens advice bureau who will give you tailor-made advice on your specific case.






With ski season coming up we have put together some useful pointers to help you have a safe and happy holiday

- **Prepare yourself** at least six weeks before you go, tailor your fitness regime towards skiing. Power, endurance, flexibility and agility are ALL important with skiing.
- For strength, try quarter squats or knee bends. (You should be cautious if you have any knee problems!) Core is core consider Pilates-style exercises to help improve your core stability.
- For endurance, try stepping up and down off the bottom stair whilst maintaining a good spinal posture, or simply take the stairs rather than the lift.
- For agility, try placing your feet together with your knees slightly bent as if skiing and now jump from side to side, keeping the knees "soft" (slightly bent.)
- For flexibility, concentrate on quadriceps (front of thigh) hamstrings (back of thigh) and calf muscles.
- For your core, try Ski Fit Pilates after a thorough assessment of your needs, exercises are tailored to your requirements (see www.stjudesclinic.com.)

### On the slopes



- Fuel Stops don't skip meals keep your energy up with a good carbohydrate intake. Take muesli bars for snacks in rest periods.
- **Keep Hydrated** with water.
- **Finally** don't get in "just one last ski run" fatigue, combined with cold, can lead to poor judgement and accidents.

If you do get injured, stop skiing, follow the basic first aid guidelines of RICE (Rest, Ice, Compression and Elevation) and seek medical advice from a doctor or Chartered Physiotherapist.

**November** started on the mild wet side, it was not until the night of 19th when we had our first real frosts -3.1°c which was the lowest temperature of the month. The second half of the month became drier with average temperatures for November.

**December** was an exceptionally mild month. It started calmly with high pressure systems in play and was moderately dry up to the 15th when we moved into a period of low pressure systems which continued following each other to the end of the month (see plot below). These systems brought heavy rain and high winds from the south keeping the temperatures mild. Facts: the temperature never dropped below Zero all month. We recorded wind speed above 40 miles per hour on 7 separate days. The average mean temperature was 6.4°c which is a significant high figure as the 5 year average for December is only 3.3°c




