Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved and said to them, "they have taken the Lord out of the tomb and we do not know where they have laid him." John 20:1-2 NRSV

Easter Sunday, the Feast of the Resurrection of Christ, is the greatest and oldest feast day of the Christian Church. It is a moveable feast in that its date is set by the moon. Easter always falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon on or after the Spring equinox. If you want to research it there is a wealth of information on the web.

The rules for setting the date may be a bit complicated but basically Easter coincides with Spring. Dormant trees come to life and a succession of Spring flowers brighten the hedgerows, woodlands and formal borders. Following a cold, dark, exceedingly blustery and very wet winter it is easy to connect the creative power of God with the glory of resurrection. However, there is a difference. Spring bulbs have a natural dormant period deep in the soil of the earth or planted in pots and for much of the year they are invisible. Yet in the Spring the green shoots begin to appear followed by a profusion of colourful blossom. This is perfectly natural - nature at work. Resurrection on the other hand is unnatural. When a person dies we do not expect them to reappear, we say goodbye, pay our respects and get on with our lives.

On Easter morning Christians the world over will listen to the story from John's Gospel of Mary Magdalene coming to the tomb perhaps to pay her respects or to convince herself that it was true - Jesus was dead. She finds that the stone had been moved and the tomb empty. What could she do? She turns away from the tomb and speaks to the gardener, *tell me where have you laid him and I will take him away*. He calls her Mary and she recognises him, it is Jesus and he says to her, "*do not hold on to me because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God*" John 20:17-18. Mary is not upset by this, she has good news for the disciples, "*I have seen the Master and this is what he said*".

We'll be celebrating Easter Sunday at 8am and 10am (with an Easter egg hunt) at St

Mary's and 9am at All Saints Dagnall. Check the Easter card delivered with this edition of FOCUS for details of Easter services and activities in the four villages. I hope that you have a good Easter weekend.

I feel it also only fair to thank the contractors some of who worked over weekends and well into the night to enable the hall to get back into service so quickly. Thank you all and we now have an even better hall.

### Beton Brev From an article written in 1968

Eaton Bray, a large village of some 2000 acres lies in the south-eastern section of the **Ouzel Basin** The main stream that runs through the village (its source derived from the springs in the Chilterns) forms a tributary of the River Ouzel at the far end of the village. This river acts as a boundary line Buckinghamshire between and **Bedfordshire** 

It is these factors which in the Middle Ages determined the site of this prosperous village - the advantages to be gained permanent water were а supply and a natural drainage system in the fertile farmland.

centuries it has afforded a good living for the large populace.

Eaton (the name Bray, a prominent family in the time of Henry VII, came much later) is a corruption of Eytona or Eitone, meaning Town on the Water, and clearly shows how much importance those early settlers placed on this vital stream. Even before the industrious Anglo-Saxons powered their corn grinding mills, this village, lying in the shadow and shelter of the vast Chilterns, was populated. Flint implements of the Neolithic and Palaeolithic age have been found, as have traces of the Romans' occupation, who did not build forts here, but used the rich land in much the same way that it is used today, to grow corn and to feed cattle.

Now, with the added interest of industry and social activities, this has become a desirable place to live, as many people who love the country, but desire also the

amenities and social life of a small town have found out to their pleasure.

Eaton Bray has neither declined or stagnated with the changing patterns of time. on the contrary, it has expanded and widened its scope. During the first part of this century it had a bad setback with the end of the straw plaiting home industry, it reverted once more to its rural state. After the great war came a new awakening, when townspeople, aware of the many advantages to be gained from living in a large

The soil is rich and productive and for rural village with a railway close by and the splendid Downs in the background, moved here and gave it a new lease of life.

> What was once the Market Square. where the straw plaiters sold their wares on a Friday, is now the village green; probably the prettiest part of the village. It is dominated by the lovely 13th century Church of St. Mary the Virgin. Although it is not particularly imposing from the outside the interior has been said to be as not unfit to grace that of a Cathedral. Certainly the fluted pillared stonework is remarkably fine for a church of this size. Other interesting features are the 13th century font, and the wrought iron scroll work attributed to the famous Bedfordshire ironworker of the 13th century, Thomas of Leighton, who was responsible for the grille round the tomb of Queen Eleanor in Westminster Abbey. The chief benefactor and builder of the Church was the Norman Baron, William de Canteloup, who

commenced the work in 1205 and finished it in 1221. It is believed to be rebuilt from an earlier church made of daub and wattle. He also built Eaton Bray's castle, which became famous in the time of Henry VII, when it was given by the monarch to the eminent architect Sir Reginald Bray, who built St. George's Chapel at Windsor. He too was a benefactor of the Church.

Another notable feature is the full list of clergy from 1235 until the present day one, the Rev. G.B. Austin (1968)

Behind the church lies the splendid village hall, erected in July, 1966. Its chief instigator was the previous vicar, the Rev. Peter Graham, who is now the rector of Harpenden. It was he who helped to get the project on the way by forming the Village Hall Management Committee, made up from representatives from all the village organisations. Due to their combined efforts and with the aid of a Government grant, this expensive (costing  $\pounds 22.000$ ). but necessary hall was built and paid for. The Committee still exists to further the interests of the community. A car park to the hall is now well on the way to being completed, and a scheme to provide cutlery and furnishings, etc., is also being carried out.

The hall is used for all age groups. Once a week the youth club meets, it has 65 members and was formed about six years ago. The success of this club is shown by the remarks of the youth leader, Police Constable Basham, who firmly states that there is no hooliganism in Eaton Bray. These young people hold a barbecue in the summer to raise funds to provide every old age pensioner in the village with a Christmas parcel.

Other popular activities include the 45-year-old Women's Institute, with its fine drama group, an Old Time dance club, badminton, and soon to be started, a judo

club.

Another society who meet in the hall is the Local Produce Association. They hold an annual horticultural show, have lectures and visits to gardens throughout the year.

Mrs. P. S. Oates is the show secretary, and a daughter of the Grand Old Man of the village, the late W. E. Wallace, who in 1886 founded the famous carnation nurseries in the High Street. Before the war it was the main source of employment in the village. It started with four small glasshouses, today these cover eight acres.

Mrs. E. Grey, another daughter of the founder, is a director. The firm employs 100 workers. Once it grew only carnations, for which it is famous, but now it has added potted plants. Although the plants are irrigated with five million gallons of water, none is drawn from the mains. Its supply is 300-foot deep arterial wells, which brings us back once more to the importance of Eaton Bray's abundant water supply.

Other industries include an egg packing station and the Betta Manufacturing Company - chemical engravers and makers of scientific instruments. Engaged on the production of range-finding equipment during the last war, they moved here from Enfield to avoid the bombing of London. The firm has expanded recently and installed expensive unique machinery, of which there are only three of this kind in the whole country. Two hundred people are employed here, some of them come from outlying towns and villages.

One firm, the 'Silent Travel Company' makes insulation for cars, to cut down noise and vibration. It started a few years ago in the old fire station. It is run by Richard Grant, son of the inventor, and incorporates another firm of G.T. Car Wheels and Accessories. This business has enlarged to the extent of necessitating a move to a large mill, once used to make flour.

This dynamic young man, not content with an expanding home market, travels the world to exhibit and sell his goods. His export trade covers all the major countries with the exception of China and Russia. Next year he will exhibit in Belgrade. In 1963 he was one of the first of the small businessmen to exhibit in New York.

In the mill house next door, a new business venture has been started. 'Bygones', an apt name for a shop that has no pretensions to the antique trade. Thought up by two enterprising housewives, Mrs. R. Thorn and Mrs. P. Tooley, who, after furnishing their own homes with old, interesting, but not necessarily antique, furniture, bought at house sales and auction rooms, were quick to realise the advantages to be gained by giving a service to the housewife who did not wish to purchase the more expensive antiques. They deal mostly in Victoriana and what they term as bric-a-brac, which as they say, could be anything, and may even possibly be very old.

Two lovely old pubs stand on one side of the village green. The White Horse is believed to date from the Queen Anne period. Its name is derived from an old legend connected with the nearby castle, of which only the moat and mounds remain.

It is said that the ghost of a lady on a white horse has been seen on the site.

The cosy, low-beamed saloon bar, with its shining brass and copper, reminds one of a Dickensian Christmas scene. Mr. George Reeves a sprightly 83-year-old, has held the licence for 40 years. His daughter Hilda, a jolly, motherly person, helps to look after the bar and the catering. They serve anything from snacks at the bar to a full course meal in the charming, small dining room.

The Five Bells, smaller, but of no less importance, was built possibly by a rival brewery. The interesting features of this old, pleasant inn are the iron bars of the windows in the saloon bar. Presumably there to protect the straw plaiters' merchants, who carried out their business there. The original fireplace has recently been discovered, in good condition, with its inglenook seat and baking oven intact.

Eaton Bray is a place where the woman play an important role in the running of village affairs. When I asked Hilda of the White Horse if there had been much change in the past 40 years, her reply was "Hardly at all". From the window of the inn she can still see the same people cycle to their work at the nurseries, only now they have reached the third generation. Only the horse and carts are missing. Perhaps this is the secret of why Eaton Bray successfully combines all the pleasures of a rural existence with the progress of our modern times.

Connells, Estate Agents with several branches in this area, have two estates under development in Eaton Bray. Twenty, three-bedroomed houses. with two reception rooms, kitchen, bathroom, gasfired central heating and garage, are being built on the Moor End Estate. Each house has a small garden backing on to the Mill Stream. The prices of the semi-detached houses are  $\pounds 5.250$  and the detached are £5.750. A smaller estate of eight houses is being developed on a private and secluded road just off the main road running through Eaton Bray. This development is called The Comp. There are two types of detached house here at a price of £8,500. Each house has four bedrooms, two reception rooms, kitchen, bathroom, a downstairs cloakroom and gas-fired central heating. Garages are attached. The 200-foot gardens back on to an orchard belonging to Mr. Gray, and from the garden views can be obtained of Totternhoe Knolls and Ivinghoe Beacon.

#### Cats Protection

Luton, Dunstable & District Cats Protection

is operated by a small but dedicated group of volunteers. The areas covered by our branch is from postcodes LU1 to LU7 & MK45 (South of A507, Westoning, Flitwick & Barton-le-Clay)

We operate from a network of volunteer fosterers throughout South Bedfordshire who care for the cats in their own homes either in a purpose built cat pen in the garden or a spare room within their home. Each cat receives a very high standard of care whilst with us we never overcrowd cat pens or mix cats from differing household together. On admission every cat and kitten is vet checked, fully vaccinated, neutered (if old enough) micro-chipped and treated for fleas and worms, all this costs well over £150 per cat. Love and one-to-one attention comes free! Cats Protection will Never put a health cat to sleep, there is always a new home for every cat – some just take longer than others to find it!

It's our aim to help as many unwanted and abandoned cats and kittens as possible by rehabilitating and re-homing to permanent, loving new homes. The areas we work in and the people and cats we deal with are all diverse. We will rescue and re-home cats for various reasons, sometimes people move and leave their cat behind, sometimes their owner dies, sometimes cats are found wandering or injured and sometimes they are just given up when people can't cope anymore!

But the work of our volunteers doesn't stop there and includes many other roles and activities, we also seek to alleviate the problem of unwanted cats, by offering information and advice about responsible cat ownership. Promoting and assisting families on low incomes with the cost of neutering as the only effective long term solution to reduce

the number of cats in the future. Raising awareness and funds at various community events during rain or shine to mention just a few of the other roles covered by our volunteers!

It costs a lot of money each day to keep a cat at one of our foster homes, in addition to all the basics such as food, litter, heating, we have to pay for all the medical bills, plus the flea treatments, blood tests when necessary, neutering, micro-chipping, and vaccinations, amongst other things. This is why we rely so heavily on the kindness and generosity of the local people.

The children had an exciting week starting with the sharing of their Favourite books. We wrote book reviews, character studies and looked at the features of non-fiction books.


On Shrove Tuesday we had a reading breakfast including the reading of pancake recipes and poems which the children took home.

## Would you like any Cashback Today?

Jonathan Vernon Smith is the Sony Award winning mid-

morning show presenter for BBC Three Counties Radio. During his consumer hour he helps listeners with their consumer problems and now shares his advice with you.

The internet has of course brought some unwanted problems, but it has also brought some incredible benefits to us consumers. One of those benefits is the creation of 'Cashback' websites. Gosh I love them! In fact, I frequently bore people senseless telling them about the important of logging on and saving ££££ on your purchases.

If you haven't come across the likes of 'Quidco' or 'TopCashback' before, let me explain how they work:

Cashback websites pay you a cash fee when purchasing goods or services via their website. The amount of cashback is generally a percentage of the total you spend with the retailer.

They tend to make their fee from the companies that they suggest on their site. Many of these are well known high street branches, some are lesser known retailers. They normally transfer the cashback you've earned directly into your bank account as soon as they receive it. So it's a win win for the consumer.

They also provide voucher codes for thousands of retailers so you can gain discounts at the online checkout.

All you have to do is:

- 1. Register with one or more cashback site.
- 2. When you decide you want to make an online purchase of a product or service, log into the cashback site, search the cashback rates available and follow the

link to the company's website.

3. Make the purchase, and wait for the cashback to arrive in your bank account (it normally takes at least a few weeks and should be tracked automatically).

Let me give you a couple of examples (chosen at random at the time of writing): It's time to renew your car insurance. You get some online quotes and find that Tesco Insurance is offering you the best deal. You could of course just take out a policy with them directly on their website. That would be fairly silly though, because by going to Tesco Insurance via a cashback website, you would receive a cashback lump sum payment of £75 after completing the purchase. By going to them directly, you would have missed out on a £75 saving.

You need a new washing machine. You find one you like at Currys. Again, you could just purchase it directly on the Currys website, but by going via a cashback website like Quidco or TopCashBack, you would stand to make 2% cashback on the total purchase price. That would be £8 back on a £400 washing machine. Better than a slap round the face with a wet fish eh?!

You can make additional money by referring your friends and relatives to the sites as well.

I always say that you don't get anything in this world for free. So how do the companies that offer the cashback benefit from this? Well, they gain because you're more likely to buy from the retailers that are listed with those cashback sites.

The important thing is to remember to use the site. Whichever online purchase you need to make: flights, insurance, electrical goods, perfume, clothes, wine or groceries, always go via a cashback website and start saving. I always remember and since I started using cashback websites 2 years ago and have already made £237.38. So go get yourself some free cashback!

Back in 1999, with three boys under the age of 5, my wife suggested I pop round the Scout hut and volunteer to help on the Scout Committee to ensure that there were sufficient parents on board to keep the Group going – so re-starting my Scouting adventure which I had previously thoroughly enjoyed as a child.

In 2002 the group faced imminent closure of both its Cub and Scout sections due to a lack of leaders. As my eldest was just joining cubs at the time I felt it only natural to step up and become the Cub and Scout leader. The summer of 2014 will therefore be a bitter-sweet time for me as I finally hang up my necker.

Asked why I stuck at it so long I could only answer that it was a hugely enjoyable and rewarding period.

Why? – because I got to see the children of the village have a ball, challenging themselves and growing with their achievements. We were able to build up an incredible group of leaders and Committee members (although currently in need of a Chairman) and were able to work as a team to put on some wonderful activities.

Our aim is simple – to have fun!

As well as all the usual core Scouting skills camping, hiking etc we have been fortunate to:

Sleep overnight on HMS Belfast, the Science Museum, the Natural History Museum, Gilwell Park at minus 6 degrees and at Wicksteed Park. Summer camps in Dorset (visiting Brownsea Island), the New Forest, Sherwood Forest and the Wye Valley.

We have abseiled, climbed – both rock and ice wall, shooting - both rifle and pistol, archery, high ropes and "leap of faith" zip- wired, canoed (down the Wye Valley), kayaked, dragon boated, built rafts, sailed, fished (including sea fishing) wake-boarded, wind-surfed, body surfed, skied, pot-holed, ice skated, white water rafted, been gliding, skinned and cooked rabbit, pheasant and quail and even sheared sheep!!

The children would not have had the opportunity to do these things without the huge amount of support the group gets from all the leaders and parents who give up their time willingly to come along and help.

It is therefore quite sad that as our Scout Leader is moving from the area shortly, we have been unable to find anyone to step up to help. Consequently - as in 2002 - the Scout section now faces closure. We know it can be a difficult decision to commit to doing something like this but we are trying to build up a team of people – not just one – to share the load. Anyone thinking of volunteering would get all the back up and support they need from other leaders, our District, the committee and the parents.

Come on – have a go – don't let the children down – it really is most rewarding!

Wet, windy and mild, that was February 2014, with 131.4mm of rain which was  $2\frac{1}{2}$  times more than last year. The station recorded the highest ever wind speed at 56mph on the 14th of the month.


The month was unbelievably mild with temperatures that didn't drop below  $1.3^{\circ}$ c during February

Over first two months of this year, January- February, we recorded 292 mm of rain, this was 263% of the last 6 years' average. Taking that average figure in a normal year we would not have reached 292mm of rain until the third week in June, that's how extraordinary this winter has been.

Deirdrea welcomed the members two new visitors

and Rev Coralie and her husband Ralph McClusky to the March meeting. There were no minutes from the previous meeting to be read.

The members were very appreciative of last month's speaker Sheila Beal, who showed her pictures of the family holiday in Namibia. Both the photography and the commentary were excellent, and were enjoyed by all.

After discussion, it was decided that the outing would not be to Stamford and Burghley but that another area would be chosen, the Committee would arrange this. Various correspondence from WI Federation and National Federation. consisting of notices of future events, were read out. A new tea rota had been drawn up by Deirdrea and a notice of all future events were given to members.

Deirdrea introduced Rev Coralie as the speaker (with her personal technician Ralph at hand).

Coralie is the Rural Chaplain of Bedfordshire of the Farming Community Network. She showed part of a DVD outlining some of the situations that arise within the farming community. Farming is a lonely business, many hours are spent working alone, giving rise to isolation and without an opportunity to discuss any difficulties they are encountering. Left unchecked, these can cause personal distress, as one set of problems causes another. Coralie then went on to explain the work that she does, coming from a farming background, she is able to provide practical support and pastoral care as well as a listening ear to those with problems. She unloaded her FCN bag that she takes everywhere, wellingtons, fleece, waterproofs, bible, small cross, mobile

phone and water.

FCN is a Christian organisation and registered charity and there is a national telephone helpline available every day of the year. A quarter of all farming families are living on or below the poverty line. Many farmers have their health their families and their future because of the care and support and friendship they have received from an FCN volunteer. Farming has a high incidence of suicide, so this work is vital as the volunteers 'walk beside them', until they are able to cope. With Coralie's caring and concerned nature, it was easy to see that she was perfect for the job that she did. It was a very sensitive and touching talk and the members had many questions to be answered Deirdrea thanked Coralie for a very enlightening talk on a subject of which so little seemed to be known. A cheque was given to her for the FCN fund.

The next meeting is on 7th April at 7.30pm, when the demonstrator will be Carol Jones with her Easter cooking of hot X buns and other goodies. Teas by Marion and Anne Salmon.

Suggestions of a canal cruise with a cream tea and a visit to St Alban's Cathedral for the Flower Festival in September, were suggested. Social time followed with the teas and refreshments provided by Joan Horne and Joan Thorne. The raffle followed.

## Salvation Sound

"There is sweet music that softer falls Than petals from blown roses on the grass, Or night-dew on the still waters between walls

Of shadowy granite, in a gleaming pass; Music that gentler on the spirit lies Than tired evelids upon tired eyes."

Lord Tennyson. Music: it brings you the gift of tranquility and relaxation; a calm inner stillness that refreshes the mind and finds a home in your heart and promotes your dreams. It brings healing, and peaceful enjoyment; a place where you can escape from the stresses and strains of modern living.

One of the delights of spring is listening to the sound of the birds as they sing the dawn chorus; especially if you get up really early and go to the middle of a wood, well away from the sounds of traffic in the morning rush hour. Another is the sound of church bells calling people to worship on sunday morning. A large orchestra, or the gentle soft sound of a single cello. Choir boys, singing praise, or a welsh male voice choir. The chant of monks in an abbey, or the nuns singing "surrexit christus" (give thanks to the Lord). Brass bands, the sound of a grand piano, well played. We are surrounded by music Each time we turn on our radio or television set we have music. No matter what the programme is, there is always music in the background. We have to be in tune with our surroundings as well as in step with each other if we are to keep up with the rhythm of life.

Do you watch "dancing on ice"? Dancing is a marvellous discipline, it gives certain freedoms to the individual, but also it does have limitations. You are dependent on the music and the beat to which you are moving. The concept of dance was very much part of early Christian worship. The hymn "Lord of the Dance" sees the life and death of Jesus as dance.

The bible speaks often of music, in Judges Ch.5 v3 it says "I will sing, I will play music.to the Lord". The psalms speak to us of David's songs (Psalm 59 v16); singing encouraged him: the lyrics in them can lift our spirits.

Whatever sort of day we may face, someone, somewhere has written a song or music that will match our mood. The power of music is a gift from God. As Paul said in his letter to the Ephesians, "sing and make music in your hearts to the Lord, give thanks to God for everything". Good advice - think you can't sing?
