Perhaps you have completed your planting but the way things are going I'm likely to have new potatoes in September and not because the seasons are changing!


Reading the material for the 2014 Christian Aid Week I was reminded once again about how fortunate we are in this country and how we often take the good things we have, including our homes, food, education, health services and peace, for granted. In stark contrast to our lives are the growing number of people across the world for whom the horror of war is part of their daily lives. It's not just the danger and the fear but the total devastation of their homes and communities, their food supply and sources of clean water. It is estimated that 42 million people men, women and children have been driven from their homes because of conflict and are in desperate need.

The familiar Christian Aid red and white envelope will drop through your letter box this May and the hope is that every household will contribute something to helping our brothers and sisters across the world in dire need.

I have no idea what it is like to be hungry, homeless or a refugee because of war or natural disaster so have decided to *Live below the Line* between the 12th and 16th of May. This means that I must spend no more than £5 on food and drink that week and am not allowed to use what I already have available at home. This will give me an excuse to compare supermarket and local shop food prices, try to buy very specific quantities and waste nothing.

The Christian Aid web site has excellent top tips to help anybody who is going to attempt to *Live below the line*. I have persuaded my husband Ralph and daughter Mary to join me but Winnie, the Jack Russell, is excused. Having £15 will make shopping easier but I will have to plan carefully. Sadly there will be no produce available from my garden. The difference between the £15 and my average weekly food bill I will donate to Christian Aid.

Let's be an instrument of God's peace this year Give, act and pray this Christian Aid week.



that the Holy Spirit brings to our lives.







Buying and Selling Houses the Savvy Way!

Jonathan Vernon Smith is the Sony Award winning mid-morning show presenter for BBC Three Counties Radio. During his consumer hour he helps listeners with their consumer problems and now shares his advice with you.

They say that death of a loved one and divorce are the top two most stressful experiences in your life. Well number three must be moving house! Anyone who has moved will remember the stomach churning worry and the logistical nightmare that is buying and selling houses. However, there are some things you can do to not only make the process easier, but also demonstrate that you're a savvy consumer. Here are my top tips:

When you decide that you want to move (please really do make sure you do as there's nothing as unfair as a seller who changes their mind when emotions and money have been spent), assess the market. Is it a buyers or a seller's environment? At the moment, property prices in most areas are increasing, which for sellers is great, but means buyers are having to dig deeper into their pockets to secure a deal. During tough economic times, property prices tend to fall which means a savvy buyer can bag a bargain.

Always get at least three good, reputable, local agents round to value your house. Ask them for a sensible price at which to market your property and ask them what they will do to get those prospective buyers through the door. Always establish their fee and NEVER agree to pay any money upfront. Always ensure that you pay their fee on completion of a deal and for goodness sake, haggle! If one of the agents is prepared to market the property

for a 1% fee as opposed to the other two who want 1.5%, why would you even consider paying more? Get them to agree to match the other agent's fee. If they're not prepared to reduce their fee, then they're not hungry enough for their commission and will not try hard enough to find a buyer. Look at their pictures on websites like Rightmove and Zoopla to ensure that they make other houses and flats look nice and ensure their descriptions are nicely written.

Generally it's better to sell your property before you agree to buy somewhere. Ultimately until you know how much you can achieve for your property, you don't really know how much you can afford to spend on another. You should stipulate to your estate agents though that any buyer will afford you reasonable patience while you find somewhere to buy.

Always employ the services of a totally independent mortgage advisor with access to all companies and who is prepared to recommend the best mortgage for you and NOT for them

You will find that most estate agents will try to persuade you to use the services of their own conveyancing solicitor. I personally do not like the idea of this. To me, it's a complete conflict of interest (particularly if both the buyer and seller use the same solicitor). You need a legal advisor who is completely independent and looking out for your interests, not someone who is under pressure from an estate agent to hurry up and complete a sale. My advice is to ask friends and family members who have moved recently to recommend a good conveyancing solicitor to you. Also, remember that you should get some different quotes for this service and never be afraid to haggle with them.

When it comes to you putting in an offer for the house of your dreams, you will need to again assess the market environment you're working within. If the market is good and there are not many properties available, but lots of buyers competing, then it's normally better to go in with a high offer on the basis that marketing of the property is ceased immediately. In a falling market, then a cheeky, low offer may just bag you a bargain.

One final piece of advice I would like to share with you, is to be open and honest with people. Sadly property deals in this country can be messy, unpleasant affairs. However, I do not think we should sink to the levels of others. Be upfront with both your buyers and the vendors of the property you're buying and treat them in the way you would like to be treated.

Better Backs for Cardeners



Spring has finally sprung and the sunshine has sent us into our gardens in droves. Although gardening can be good for the mind, it can pay havoc with your body. Follow our tips for better backs and don't let an injury spoil your fun.

- Before doing any physical exercise, warm up first with a walk and some gentle stretching.
- Take regular breaks and change position between jobs to avoid tiredness, overuse and injury.
- Keep your back straight when lifting and use your knees, thighs and arms to help.

- Avoid overstretching when pruning by using long-handled shears and use secateurs with a cut and hold action.
- If using electric hedge trimmers don't hold them too far in front of you.
- Consider the planning of your garden raised flower beds may save you twinges in the long run.

Weather Conditions for March 2014



For the first few days a deep low was centred over us, carried over from the continuous bad weather of February but it was not long before the weather settled down and remained calm for the rest of the month. The temperature only dropped below zero degrees on 2 days and, with only 31mm (just over an inch) of rain in the month compared with what we have suffered over the last 3 months, it was almost a drought.

Edlesborough Book Group 1913 The Year Before the Storm by Florian Illes

1913 The Year before the Storm, is a book that defies categorisation. In it, Florian Illes, a journalist for the Berlin newspaper, Die Zeit, has gathered fragments of information and documented them month by month through 1913 giving a diary of world events for that year. He concentrates mainly on the emergence of new ideas in the worlds of arts and science and he peoples the narrative with famous names such as Picasso, Matisse, Kafka, Hitler and Stalin. Many, soon to be household names, seem to be gathered in Vienna in 1913 and we read of the dramas and love affairs played out between them.

With such a multitude of characters and

detail, one can only admire the hours of research that went into creating this book. But, because of its huge range and constant barrage of facts, at its conclusion one has retained very little. This is unfortunate, because the book as a concept is brilliant and could have been much more successful if the stories had some link or cohesion.

We chose this book hoping, that in this centenary year of the Great War, we would learn more about the world and the circumstance in which it began. Alas, it did not have that effect and overall we were disappointed by Mr Illes.

quite another to be childlike. Do not lose sight of the difference. In

the honesty, innocence and simple trust of the very young there is something very precious, if only we could preserve those qualities throughout the ravages of time.

By the time you read these words Easter will be past and gone, and summer will be on its way. I hope the "sun" will shine on you, and its warmth will brighten your days, and that the light of the Lord will be shining on you also.
