



Ravages of Wood Worm and Dry Rot at Edlesborough REPAIR OF CHURCH TREASURES BEGUN

The Edlesborough Church, standing as a monument to the exquisite craftsmanship of the thirteenth century, is in imminent danger on account

of the onslaughts of the death watch beetle, the wood worm and dry rot, and irreparable damage has already been done to some of its choicest treasures, for the church is exceedingly rich in examples of Early English work. While it was realised that the beautiful edifice was falling into decay, both externally and internally, the full extent of the damage was not wholly appreciated until quite recently, but when the havoc wrought by insect and elements was fully realised, immediate steps were taken to save the treasures.

It is mainly against the ravages of this insect that Mr. Kingaby and his assistants are waging a ruthless warfare, but they have also to contend with the effects of dry rot, which in many cases is due to the porous nature of the Totternhoe chalk-stone, of which the church is built, affecting the woodwork in such a manner that it becomes pulverised, and crumbles away.

Mr: Francis Kingaby, of Dunstable, has for the past three weeks been engaged in the work of restoring the worm-eaten and fast-rotting woodwork - an extremely delicate task - and is making very satisfactory progress, but whether the treasures of this grand old building will be saved in their entirety depends very largely upon the generosity and sympathy of those interested in architectural beauty.

HOW MONKS "STOOD"

Edlesborough's grand old pile, a land mark for many miles round, and particularly noticeable from Dunstable Downs, stands upon an elevation overlooking a glorious expanse of chalk down-land. Its grandeur and dignity are the more prominent on closer inspection, but after ascending the winding path up the knoll to the main porch, one is at once confronted by a sight which

Perhaps one of the most interesting relics the monastic days thus affected is the group of miserere seats, but the wood-worm has also taken toll. It is from these seats that the great beam standing near the porch has been removed, but it is a fortunate feature that although the framework has been practically destroyed, the exquisite carvings between the partitions of the seats are practically untouched

by the passage of time and the onslaughts of the destructive insect. The carvings include a representation of a monkey and the head of a winged sphinx. What is still more remarkable, however, is that the hinged seats have each a semi-circular projection at the opposite end to the swivel, so that when tipped up there was yet another seat for the repose of the monks, who, while conveying the impressions that they were standing, were not actually doing so. Beneath the "standing" seats are more delicate carvings. The rotted portions of the miserere seats have already been removed and replaced by oak timber three hundred years old.

EXQUISITE CARVING

One of the features of the church with which one cannot fail to be impressed is the wonderful old pulpit, of the "wineglass" type, and the still more remarkable canopy above it, the purpose of which is as a sounding board. The latter, which represents some of the finest and most delicate carving of the thirteenth century, was found to be almost as badly damaged as the miserere seats, and has been taken down, cleaned and restored. It is now back in its former place, and the work performed in regard to this subject alone is considered an achievement, for it required very delicate handling.

The pulpit has also been taken down, and the section of the pedestal nearest the floor has been entirely re-modelled, for it was found

that wood worm had made such inroads that within a few years the whole structure would have collapsed, bringing down with it the canopy.

"LIKE BIG MAGGOTS"

Another very impressive part of the church is the old rood screen, but it is also a standing example to the destructive ability of dry rot. The greater is the pity for the reason that its ornamentation and tracery are among the finest in the country. The fan-shaped tracery alone makes it unique, and although this part of the screen has not been minutely examined, there is sufficient evidence of dry rot in the base of the structure to show that its repair is going to be a very difficult matter. Higher up, the wood worm has again been at work, and by chopping away some of the badly infected woodwork, Mr. Kingaby recently had the rare experience of seeing the insect in the wood, and although working practically daily with timber thus affected, it is about five years since he actually saw a wood worm. "Just like big maggots," was the description of Mr. Kingaby's assistant in regard to the insect, and Mr. Kingaby added that some of the worms were one-eighth of an inch in diameter and five-eighths of an inch long.

An equally serious example of dry rot is provided in the choir stalls against the south wall, and this is considered to be due to lack of ventilation and their adjacency to the porous Totternhoe stone, for the stalls on the other side, which are not in contact with the wall, and have plenty of space all round them are unaffected.

REVERSED ROOD SCREEN

It is exceedingly interesting to note that near the rood screen there is a stone staircase which runs right through a pillar, its exit being close to the top of the screen, but without giving access to its wide, flat top. The explanation is that the screen has undoubtedly been reversed, but hitherto the exit from the stairway led directly on to the top of the canopy, and it was from this elevated position that the words of the preacher were delivered. Surmounting the screen, at one time, was a wooden crucifix and other carved figures, but during the reign of Queen Elizabeth the figures were removed and the screen reversed so that it better adapted itself to decoration, for the beautiful paintings on the screen are truly Elizabethan.

Yet another glorious feature of the church is the wonderfully executed paintings on its walls, but the grandest sight of all is the richly coloured wall painting of Christ, represented in a sitting posture and with arms outstretched. This figure is above the arch dividing the choir from the aisle, and cannot fail to make an impression.

Much of the beauty of the church is in the sense of spaciousness it conveys on account of its width and height, and on looking upward the magnificent oak rafters at once impress on account of their obvious strength and proportion. These timbers convey an excellent idea of medieval craftsmanship. A further point of interest is the relieving arches in the aisle, which appear to have been added for structural reasons after the aisles were widened.

EXTERNAL DECAY

Outside the church, so stately and beautiful

when viewed from a distance, a disturbing feature is that the facing stone has crumbled very badly in places, and in other parts of the building repairs have been made by the strengthening of the stonework with cement, but, unfortunately, the colouring contrast detracts from its beauty. However, it is better that there should be a rather disconcerting contrast than that the lovely edifice should become a ruin, and thanks to the foresight of those solid builders of the thirteenth century, it will be a long time before so regrettable a state ensues, for the stout buttresses with which the church is surrounded are its source of strength.

Still further away will be the sad day when Edlesborough Church is in danger of destruction by time, wood worm and dry rot, if the residents and beauty lovers respond generously and with gladness of heart to an appeal which must, of necessity, be urgent, and, for a time, insistent.

Coodbye and Cood Luck!



Avoid those Holiday Seams

Jonathan Vernon Smith is the Sony Award winning midmorning show presenter for BBC Three Counties Radio. During his

consumer hour he helps listeners with their consumer problems and now shares his advice with you.

With the holiday season almost upon us, I thought his month would be a good time for me to warn you about some of the most common holiday related scams that sadly people fall for year after year.

It's seems a basic start, but only book holidays with good reputable companies THAT YOU'VE HEARD OF! It never ceases to amaze me how many people simply google 'Cheap holiday' and then part with hundreds of pounds on some website that may or may not be genuine. Always do your research to make sure you are paying a proper UK based company with a good reputation. It's also advisable to use a company that is both a member of ABTA and ATOL for your protection.

Having booked your holiday with a genuine company, the next mistake some people make is to purchase their travel insurance from scamsters rather than a bona fide company. Again use a quality British insurer that will actually answer the phone if you find yourself in need of making a claim from the poolside in Faliraki.

Whilst you're organising your health protection for your holiday, you should be aware that applying for your EHIC European health insurance card (which provides you with free or reduced health care in European countries) SHOULD be FREE! There are lots of websites out there that will charge you a fee for applying for the card on your behalf. Apply directly with the NHS or the post office and avoid be being ripped off!

If vou're like me, vou'll probably hire a car while away. There are of course various scams to watch out for with hire cars. Only ever use good, recommended firms, avoid the dodgy little backstreet hire car company that charges half the price of anyone else. You'll probably find out why they're so cheap when the wheels fall off. One very important thing to watch out for when hiring a car abroad is that you ensure vou have signed paperwork from the hire car company to confirm the condition of the car. Very often people drop off their hire car in a rush to get their flight home and don't insist on this. It is imperative! I have known several people (sometimes using well-known companies) who have returned to the UK, checked their credit card, only to find a £500 charge for 'damage' to the car. Trying to prove that you didn't cause it, when you're no longer in the country and with no paperwork to support your argument, will be a nightmare.

The final holiday scams you MUST be aware of regard the dreaded 'Timeshares' or 'Holiday Clubs'. I lose track of the number of times I've dealt with complaints from consumers on my radio programme about these.

Picture the scene: You're strolling down the seafront, all bronzed and relaxed when a lovely, attractive (probably British) person approaches you and offers you either an invitation to an event or a scratch card that will provide you with the invite. Your guard is down as you're on holiday so you agree. You'll then be whisked off to a luxury venue, plied with pinot grigio and then forced to endure a hard sell on the advantages of joining their club. Sadly I have known even the most forceful, confident, savvy consumers get caught like this and the results have been awful. Very

often timeshare and holiday club contracts are difficult (and in some cases impossible) to get out of. What many people also fail to recognise is that these holiday club memberships are sometimes to be passed down to your children, meaning many years of misery not only for you, but for your family when you've died!

My advice is that when approached by anyone offering you something 'for free', particularly when your guard is down on holiday – KEEP WALKING!

Ellesborough Book Group Slipstream by Elizabeth Jane Howard

Our interest in the life of Elizabeth Jane Howard was sparked by her death last January, aged 90. As we were familiar with her "Cazalet Chronicles" we thought that her memoir "Slipstream" would be interesting to read. Published in 2002. when she was almost eighty years of age, the book reveals her to be a character full of flaws and self doubt. The memoir seems to divide into three distinct sections, the first is of her early life, born into an upper middle class Edwardian family in 1923. Her grandfather was a famous composer and her mother an ex ballerina in the Ballets Russes. Jane experienced a privileged childhood of nannies and home education, but lacked the maternal affection that she craved, her mother appearing to prefer Jane's two brothers. She adored her handsome, fun loving

father, but was dismayed when, as she blossomed into maturity, his interest became more physical and so she was forced to distance herself from him. This longing for admiration and attention seemed to continue for most of her life and she appears to be a very needy personality often confusing physical love with true commitment. In 1940 she persuades her family to let her train as an actress and secures a place in a repertory company, straight from drama school. During her time there, she meets and marries Peter Scott, the famous wild life artist and founder of The Wildfowl Trust at Slimbridge. Fourteen years her senior and a man of the world, the marriage was unhappy from the start, made even more difficult by his interfering mother, who made no secret of her dislike of Jane. A daughter, Nicola, was born in 1943 but this did not help the failing marriage to survive and soon afterwards Jane left her husband to try to live independently.

Fortunately, she appears to have had many useful contacts in the literary world and gradually, by means of a job as a literary editor, she begins to write. Her first novel "The Beautiful Visit" won the John Llewellyn Rhys memorial prize in 1950, but that didn't seem to boost her self esteem. In fact as she continues her rather rackety existence in London, she always seems to be plagued by self doubt. She is very beautiful at this time and takes many lovers, who are mostly married and is constantly made miserable by failed affairs.

The second part of the book begins in 1962, when she is asked to organise the first literary festival in Cheltenham, during the course of which she meets Kingsley Amis.

They begin an affair, which culminates in their marriage, they are very happy at first, but Jane is soon overwhelmed by the demands of step motherhood and entertaining the constant hordes of visitors. Kingsley Amis's drinking takes a severe toll on their relationship and the marriage breaks down. The good thing that Jane takes from the marriage is the example of the strict discipline Amis applied to his writing. Up to this point, Jane has been very easily distracted from her work but, newly single, she concentrates more seriously.

The final section of the memoir, becomes the most interesting, being more about Jane as she learns to understand herself and to live without a man in her life. She begins to like herself a little more and finally bonds with her much neglected daughter, who has been mainly brought up by Peter Scott and his second wife. This is a rather lengthy memoir of a long life but, the lists of famous people with whom she mixes, sometimes get in the way of an interesting narrative. As one

would expect, it is well written, and the

insights into an author's life are very revealing.

Elizabeth Jane Howard seemed to find contentment at the end of her life, living peacefully in Suffolk, enjoying her garden, her family and friends.



Matthew Arnold described this time of year like this:

"Soon will be the high midsummer pomps come on, Soon will the musk carnations break and swell, Soon we shall have gold dusted snapdragon, Sweet william with its homely cottage smell And stocks in fragrant blow"

Well I like June too, "when the bee is on the wing and on the clustering hazel boughs, the linnets sit and sing!"

Hmm! Roses, garden fetes and barbecues; long sunny days and warm evenings. It's the month when we think of St.Barnabas. Long ago in 1752 "they" changed our calendar in Britain. Before that June 11th was called the longest day of the year, and the saying was "Barnaby bright, all day and no night"; and an old motto advised, "By St. Barnabas, put scythe to grass". So haymaking then began. That is why in old picture books St. Barnabas is often shown carrying a hay rake.

Now the summer solstice takes place on the 21st of June. Another country saying is that "mist in May and heat in June, brings all things into tune". A lovely month, when wild flowers fill the hedgerows, honeysuckle scents the air, gardens come into midsummer glory, the cuckoo changes his tune and we all think of taking our ease, sitting in the sunshine, enjoying our surroundings, and counting our blessings. A wise old gardener once said, "some folk grumble because God put thorns on roses, but I think it's better to thank him for putting roses on the thorns." My garden is a place of memories for a number of the plants are from the gardens of friends and some are the "offspring" of those brought many years ago from my fathers garden. As I behold the beauty of these plants and contemplate their growth I am amazed that after such a wet winter, most had bravely struggled through the

heavy soil and defied the elements, and now are strong and secure.

Isaiah 40;8 "yes, grass withers and flowers fade, but the word of our God endures forever"

Ah! Now that makes me think of my patch of grass or daisy spangled lawn as I like to call it. Daisies symbolise innocence and fidelity. Medicinally the juice of daisy leaves was used in medieval times as a remedy for gout and rheumatism, and it was believed that if heated and inhaled it would cure migraine.

I thought you would like this poem by J M Robertson called.

The Gardeners Nightmare

The azaleas are all failures, and the dahlias are the same

Each lily's willy nilly, looking silly, such a shame. Each asters a disaster, the cotoneaster too.

Morning glory tells a story that's so moribund and blue.


